Food Production Efforts

— Extensive Irrigation Advocated

RECENTLY, a conference on Food Production which lasted six days, brought together experts from about 78 countries. The conference afforded them the opportunity to share their experience in the area of River Basin Development.

The main objective was to ensure increased food production in the Agro-Asian region. Though the conference did not provide all the answers of solutions to the problems of food production in the region, it however came out with concrete recommendations that if adopted and pilot into action, will go a long way to increase the capacity of the Rivers Basins in food production.

It is noteworthy that an all-embracing approach was adopted in studying the theme of the conference which was River Basin Development for food production. The papers presented by experts in this field dealt as much as possible with all aspects of River Basin control and management.

There were contributors from more than 25 countries including Europe and America. There was a general consensus among these diverse people that River Basin Schemes could be efficiently controlled through scientific means to achieve a higher crop yield with the resultant industrial advantages like agro-based Industries, roads and hydro-power projects.

The theme of the conference and the deliberations are perfectly in line with the aspiration of the Nigerian government and in deed the yearning of the people to see the country become self-sufficient in food production as a first step toward economic independence.

Nigeria has in the last ten years or so faced serious food problems which have defied various measures aimed at correcting the anomaly. A thoughtful look at development efforts in the country during the period clearly showed that the nation had not made enough progress in the area of food production. Even the Operation Food the Nation programmes launched by the Military did not make any appreciable impact in this direction.

Liberal, restricted or massive importation of food items have been set in motion at different periods

as the situation demands to prevent imminent food shortages. Successive government have also been known to have spent huge sums of money on the provision of Agricultural Machinery all in an effort to boost food production. It is this same concern for self-sufficiency in food production that led to the introduction of the Green Revolution Programme by the present Federal administration.

Perhaps one area in which this latest effort at producing more food differ from previous programmes is the recognition of the advantages in River Basin Schemes in enhancing crop production. Agricultural experts believe that this scheme is one of the best practical approaches to achieve a greater crop yield. Little wonder then that the country's eleven River Basin Development Authorities, although established in 1976 only became fully and effectively functional under the present government.

So far, all the authorities have put into cultivation more than 56,000 hectares of land for various crop production such as rice, wheat, maize, groundnut, cassava, yam and vegetables. The authorities are expected to put more land into cultivation before the year runs out: Despite these

achievements, the truth is that these authorities are still relatively young. It is in this light therefore that the just concluded conference is of vital importance to their growth.

The River Basin authorities should examine carefully the recommendations of the meeting on the various aspects of River Basin Development which among others include, water management, Seawage Control in Irrigation channels, weed control, salinity, and erosion problems.

There is no doubt that if these recommendations are considered and relevant ones are adapted, they will be of immense value in our bid to be self-sufficient in food production. This is therefore the time for Nigeria to set in motion the necessary machinery to revive agriculture once and for all.

Agro-development may provide the most potent answer to our fluctuating fortunes as a result of our reliance on oil. As was pointed out by the conference, there is a yawning need for developing nations to keep pace with advanced countries and sustain their ever-increasing population. This can be done by boosting Agricultural production through intensive and extensive irrigation to develop their abundant land resources.

Manpower Development

—Farm Settlement To Be Overhauled

IT IS often reported that 75% to 80% of the Nigerian population is engaged in agriculture. Agriculture does not only provide employment but also raw-materials for the agro-based industries.

There is therefore the need for trained, competent agricultural extension and rural development Workers if agriculture is to function well. These trained workers must however be properly utilised to ensure steady agricultural development in Nigeria.

The utilisation of manpower is one thing, its availability is another. The various agricultural projects embarked upon by the Federal and State governments and their parastatals draw staff from the meagre manpower available for the sector. The ratio of Extension Staff to farmers in Nigeria is very low when compared with countries like the United Kingdom, the Netherlands, Norway and even countries such as Kenya and India. This is one of the major factors responsible for the slow progress in the agricultural sector in our country.

With the pride of peace being given to agriculture now, the need to provide adequate and relevant training for personnel working with small farmers is more important than general staff training and manpower development. The little Agricultural manpower development we have in Nigeria today resulted from many years of formal education in schools of Agriculture which were established to meet the manpower needs of those days. Agricultural training is now given at the University, intermediate, vocational/technical and farmer levels.

Of the 13 Universities in Nigeria today, four operate full faculty programmes in Agriculture. These are the Universities of Ibadan, Ife, Nsukka and Ahmadu Bello. About 32 Schools of Agriculture presently exist in the country. Of these, 15 are administered by state governments, 11 are affiliated to the Universities and research institutes and six are Polytechnics and Colleges of Technology teaching agricultural subjects.

The manpower needs at the senior and junior technical levels are not

from these schools which operate different training programmes at both diploma and certificate levels. Generally, the staff/student ratio in these institutions is satisfactory but the distribution of specialisation necessary for satisfactory training of an agricultural extension worker is deficient.

In addition, physical facilities are inadequate especially libraries laboratory space, equipment and field training facilities. The land available is sometimes not adequate to permit individual performance of tasks in the skill acquisition process. All these limit the adequacy of the type of training this manpower cadre receives.

The main employer of trained agricultural manpower in Nigeria is the government. Consequently, manpower development and training programmes are operated by government, especially at the technical and vocational levels. Government also provides leadership in University agricultural education through bursaries and scholarships. The private sector depends on the high attrition rate of government trained staff in meeting its requirements, augmenting the entry knowledge and skill base of such staff with on-the-job training.

Most of the staff deployed at several cadres of the Nigerian agricultural development organization, have training appropriate to their levels of appointment but one alarming characteristic of the manpower situation is the high vacancy and deployed staff undergoing training. Only 69% of the posts at the senior technical level were filled in 1976/76. There is evidence to

suggest that the situation may have deteriorated in recent years due to retirements, withdrawals and resignations.

There is also a high staff turnover in Nigeria's agriculture. A lot of trained staff leave the ministries to serve in Industry, commerce and the distributive business. The recent boom in consultancy services has further worsened the situation. Moreover, there is an uneven distribution of agricultural manpower in Nigeria's agriculture.

The location of training institutions and available places further complicates the issue. The implication of this is that States with no training schools are highly deficient while those with several schools are over-producing staff. Furthermore, trained staff are usually given responsibilities unrelated to their training.

Finally, the category of staff to be trained and how he is trained are influenced heavily by the government's development objectives and policy. For a number of years, Government policy has encouraged agricultural development through the special project approach and specialist advisory systems. Consequently, training institutions have produced specialists rather than general agriculturists.

What has to be done now is to concentrate on the training of the practising farmer to increase his production. The old system of mounting special programmes at training centres and farm settlements must be overhauled. To be effective in present-day Nigeria, it has to be supported with farm visits.

WATER SUPPLY

— Studies For Safe Technique Suggested

TWO major problems that have so far defied solutions in our society are shortages in water and electricity supply.

Though, people can still cope with the frequent black-outs by the National Electric Power Authority, NEPA, it is a different matter when the taps run dry. There is no gain saying that it is impossible for human beings to exist without water.

Despite all the efforts being made by all the governments of the federation, clean pipe-borne water is still restricted to mostly the urban town, while millions of Nigerians living in the rural areas still rely on wells and streams for their daily requirements.

If one goes by a World Health Organisation report, the outlook in this decade which has been declared by the world body as a "decade of water supply for everybody" is not very bright. Nigeria will have to invest ten billion naira within the next ten years if she hopes to meet the World Health Organisation standard of providing 112 litres of water for each person everyday. This is a huge investment which the government cannot shoulder alone if other areas of development are not to be neglected.

It is because of this that the recommendations of the recently concluded national conference on water pollution cannot be over-looked. The theme of the conference was "Water, water everywhere, but none to drink."

This theme is very appropriate when one notes that Nigeria is a country that nature has blessed with abundant rainfall. Apart from this, there are thousands of rivers and streams throughout the length and breadth of the nation, with the southern coast line bordered by the Atlantic Ocean.

But up-till now, inadequate attention has been paid to the development of simple, cheap but reliable techniques to harness rain water and the abundant supply from the rivers for domestic purposes. In fact, the hydrological and meteorological data on the various water resources are not adequate, even when available, for the

planning of water development.

It is, high-time, therefore, that the government should undertake studies on how economic and safe techniques could be evolved to conserve rain-water for the use of our teeming rural population. This study should also take cognizance of the needs of the coastal areas where the supply of clean fresh water is often complicated by salt water intrusion.

It is pertinent to say here that the existing legislation has to be amended if the rate of water supply to the people is to be increased. At the moment, these legislation places the sole responsibility of producing much of our water supply on the state governments. But we all know that most of these state governments are too stropped for funds to be able to meet the increasing demands for clean drinkable water.

Steps should be taken to make the laws covering water supply concurrent since the Federal Government has continued to express its willingness to

participate in water supply schemes by the implementation of the National Bore Hole Programme. This has become necessary because of the important role that water is playing and will continue to play in the country's agricultural and industrial development projects.

The government should therefore take serious note of the recommendation by the Conference that steps be taken to develop and implement water supply extension schemes as part of the rural development programmes.

One other area of public concern touched by the Conference was the problem of water pollution. As the Conference rightly noted, water supply in adequate quantity and quality is a birth-right of every child. But despite the fact that we do not have enough to drink, we are gradually polluting the little that is available.

The gradual industrialisation of the country is worsening the problems of water pollution. Most of these industries do not treat their effluence and these are discharged directly into the soil. The danger in this can be seen in the fact that majority of Nigerians still rely on wells and bore-holes for their water supply. Apart from industrial pollution, the attitude of our people to environmental cleanliness leaves much to be desired.

Steps should therefore be taken by the appropriate bodies to educate the public on how to ensure the quality, purity and wholesomeness of drinking water. As a first step, a week could be set aside as "Water Pollution Week" during which lectures and seminars would be organised on the effects of water pollution.

It could also be used to teach people simple ways of treating water which had been stored over a period of time. This way, we will reduce to a great extent the incidence of communicable diseases associated with water and the health hazards they pose to the society.

Aladja Steel Complex

Nigeria Moves Closer To Technological Era

THE DELTA Direct Reduction Steel Complex at Aladja near Warri has a capacity of producing one million tonnes of steel annually.

As at now, finishing touches are being put to the three rolling mills at Oshogbo, Jos and Katsina so that they can go into production before the end of the year. Indeed, Nigeria, Africa's biggest and fastest developing country, is moving closer to a steel era.

The 2.5 billion Naira Ajaokuta Iron and Steel Complex which is the biggest of Nigeria's steel development programme and whose first phase is projected to produce 1.3 million tonnes of steel per annum is expected to start production any time from the middle of next year. Each of the three inland rolling mills at Oshogbo, Jos and Katsina has an initial capacity of producing 210,000 tonnes per annum.

Meanwhile, the Aladja Direct Reduction Steel Complex which has since begun production has two sections. One section produces finished materials which include wire rods and iron bars. The other produces billets which are to be fed into the three rolling mills, now nearing completion.

When the three inland rolling mills at Oshogbo, Jos and Katsina, go into production in a few months time, each of them will use billets from the Aladja Complex as raw materials to produce various specifications of wire rods and reinforced bars.

Unfortunately the whole concept of steel development in Nigeria is being politicized. Loud criticisms are heard, often from certain interest groups who would not see the rationale behind the huge sums of money being pumped into steel projects especially these days when Nige-

economy is said not to be in a sound state of health. But this notwithstanding, steel development remains a priority programme of the Federal Government and the extension of the projects have been going on according to plan.

In fact, steel development has been taking the second largest vote — next only to the new Federal Capital Development project, Abuja, since the present administration came to power in 1979. This year alone, the President, in his budget proposal to the National Assembly, earmarked a sum of 1.328 billion Naira for it.

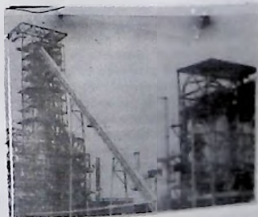
The reality of the situation is that steel development has a long-term advantage. All over the world, its prosecution has always been capital-intensive and no country has ever regretted investing in steel development. It is the real base for any meaningful industrial and technological take-off.

By the time the present steel projects come into full operation, Nigeria will have enough iron bars, wire rods,

angles, channels, beams and structures to prosecute more speedily all the infrastructural and technological programmes. Foreign exchange drain, in steel direction, shall be plugged and the country stands to benefit immensely from expecting steel products which are in all-time demand all over the world.

Barring all odds, the Federal Government is not stopping its steel development effort with Ajaokuta, Aladja and the three inland rolling mills at Oshogbo, Jos and Katsina. According to the Minister for Steel Development, before 1980, additional alloy steel, aluminium smelter, flats and foundry complexes will have been commissioned.

By the time all the projects become operational, Nigeria shall have moved into a steel era and in technological sense, fallen within the brackets of economic 'power brokers' of the world.

Housing Scheme

—Laudable Programme For Workers

THE Housing act No. 54 of 1979 makes it mandatory for an employer with 500 or more employees to provide housing estate for its workers.

For example, the Shell Oil Company and Mobil Nigeria Limited have commissioned their workers housing scheme. Also the Gulf Oil Nigeria Limited and the Daily Times of Nigeria Limited have built housing estates for their employees. And only recently, the Federal Minister of employment, Labour and Productivity commissioned the staff Housing Estate of the Unipetrol Nigeria Limited. The First Bank of Nigeria Limited is equally engaged in a gigantic housing scheme for its workers.

From the above, it can be seen that only very few profit oriented business organisations out of so many who fall under the housing act of 1979 have complied with its provision. Most of these business enterprises make huge turn overs as after tax profit every year that one wonders why they are dilly dalling over the workers housing scheme.

Government has given them several incentives for their business to thrive. Therefore one of the ways through which they can reciprocate this gesture is to supplement governments efforts to provide decent accommodation for the people.

This will to a considerable extent help alleviate the problems of the people as no government can single handedly provide all the basic needs of its populace without the help of individuals and private organization.

On the other hand, employers of labour have some social responsibilities to their employees. These include among others the provision of shelter which is an overt indication of genuine interest in the welfare of these workers.

The importance of the working population in the development of any country cannot be over-emphasized. It is clear that no major socio-economic development can either take place or

be sustained in a country whose labour force live in a poor environment or sub-standard accommodation. Employers of labour should realise that it is in their own interest to show concern over some of the pressing needs of their workers to avoid declining productivity.

But things must not be left to stay as they are at present. The Housing act

No. 54 of 1979 provides for sanction against defaulting employers. To date, no employer has been penalised for flouting the act. Yet many of them have shown more interest in circumventing the law than in obeying it.

We are therefore calling on the appropriate Federal Ministry or its agency charged with the responsibility of implementing the Housing Act of 1979 to execute its provisions to the letter. Exception should however be made of employers with gloomy economic fortunes.

It is also pertinent to call on all employers of labour affected by the provision of the act to pursue the matter of housing with the seriousness and urgency it deserves.

This laudable programme, if wholeheartedly pursued by employers of labour will not only improve workers welfare but also serve as an incentive to refrain workers from drifting from one job to another. Most importantly, it will be a catalyst that will make workers more productive.

NIGERIAN OIL INDUSTRY

—Of Immense Benefit To The Nation

OIL PROSPECTING in Nigeria began nearly half a century ago, in 1936 to be precise and it was Shell/Davoy, the Dutch version of what is now Shell Nigeria Limited, that rammed in the first rig in the quest for the black gold.

The exercise was not an easy one and was almost being written off as a futile effort when in 1956, 20 years after the search took-off, the first oil was struck at Oloibiri. The effort was more rewarded because the find was of commercial significance.

In eleven years of oil Mining, the figure rose gradually and by 1967, Nigeria had hit the half-a-million barrels-a-day mark, which at that time was the greatest thing that ever happened to Nigeria and in fact any African country. By 1979, Nigeria was really in the mid-stream of an oil boom, lifting as much as 2.3 million barrels a day. This figure placed Nigeria on the N200 per capital bracket and guaranteed 8,000 barrels of reserve per head.

In terms of money, Nigeria earned over 64 billion Naira from oil by 1977. This represented over 80% of government revenue and over 90% of the country's foreign exchange earnings.

Owing to the position oil occupies in the economy of the nation and the relative importance it enjoys, the government has a set policy on oil, and this is constantly being up-dated as circumstances demand. Up till 1973, Shell operated purely as a foreign company. But as the importance of oil grew and its weight on the economy became significant, the Nigerian authorities took certain steps to ensure that they had a fuller control on its production.

So, in April 1973, the Federal Government acquired 35% participation in Shell and a further 20% a year later. These interests were transferred to the Nigerian National Petroleum

Company on its inception in 1977 and in July of 1979, the NNPC took a further five per cent participation in Shell's operations, bringing the figure to 60%.

Later in the same year, certain political developments made Nigeria to ask British Petroleum, which was a partner with Shell to pack up its business interests. The NNPC took over its interests which amounted to 20% and as at now, the Federal Government, through the NNPC, has 80% participation with Shell having 20%.

It is pertinent to note here that this participation arrangement is peculiar to Shell alone because of the 1979 acquisition of the assets of British petroleum. In other oil companies operating in the country, the participation is 60%. However, the policy is being reviewed from time to time as local and global developments dictate.

One aspect of the oil mining exercise which has continued to be neglected is the utilisation of natural gas which the country has in colossal deposits. In fact, geological projec-

tions classify Nigeria purely as a gas zone with petroleum lining. But it is regrettable that this huge quantity of gas is being wasted by flaring because the country does not have the means to tap the gas. In this way, millions of Naira are going up in smoke at present.

The fact is that Nigeria is anxious to get her gas reserves tapped and this is borne out in her act which has given a deadline for the tapping of the gas deposits in the country. But the oil companies are not too willing to stick their necks out in this venture which they describe as too, financially perilous to be worth the trouble. Nonetheless, the Federal Government is bent on stopping unnecessary waste of such an invaluable resources.

On the other hand, there are some heart-warming side effects to the oil industry. Apart from the substantial sums of money being paid by the oil companies into the coffers of the government through taxes and royalties, some of them are investing in agriculture and community development programmes for the benefit of their workers and those who bear the hazards of their operations.

For instance, Shell spends between six and 10% of its total investment on any project on preventing pollution. Besides, in Warri area, Shell's community development activities have brought great relief to thousands of villagers. Its community development department has succeeded in developing a specie of cassava plant that is disease resistant and produces six times the crop of the ordinary plant. The Unit is also making bread, cakes, chips and other items from cassava and the process is being passed on to the public through field workers.

This trend should continue so that the country can derive maximum benefits from its oil industry.

Traditional Medicine - 5

— Its Impact On Socio-Economic Problems

DR J. O. MUME, the *Trado-medic* -
alist fifth Lecture: titled, Traditional
medicine — Its Impact On Socio —
Economic And Spiritual Problems re-
produced below, touches on certain
biological requirements which human
beings and animals have to obey in
order to remain healthy.

His fourth lecture treated readers to
 Traditional Medicine, Witchcraft and
 Religion, a talk that made an exciting
 reading in our February edition.

THE critics of traditional medicine
 presume that it is not based on any
 scientific principle. They argue that it
 only provides a temporary psychologi-
 cal relief for people's fears, anxiety,
 ambitions and desires rather than pro-
 vide any therapeutic quality capable of
 curing known physiological disorders.

I would like to state here that all
 these criticisms have no basis. Tradition-
 al medicine is the African science of
 health. It teaches that there are cer-
 tain biological requirements human
 beings and animals have to obey in
 order to remain healthy. The transgres-
 sion of these biological require-
 ments, or what we prefer to call natu-
 ral laws, leads to malfunctioning of
 certain organs and systems of the
 body, the manifestation of which we
 call disease.

Once these abnormalities are
 corrected, the body regains its normal
 functions and health returns. The
 traditional medicine philosophy em-
 braces the most positive approach to
 the achievement and maintenance of
 health. It is not superstitious.

Medical science seeks the cause of
 diseases in germs and viruses, but it
 does not find out whether such dis-
 eases were brought about by evil deeds
 of other people or by incorrect ways
 of living or by the patient's own trans-
 gressions.

People eat what they like, drink
 what they like, and indulge in abuses
 and excesses of all kinds; commit sins
 of all kinds, because such habits and
 practises, it is presumed, have no bear-
 ing on the incidence of disease. There
 are certain diseases which can be
 regarded as culture bound and in treat-

ing such diseases the cultural back-
 ground of the patient must be taken
 into consideration.

There is no doubt that before the
 advent of colonialism in Nigeria and
 Africa as a whole, Africans were exist-
 ing politically, socially, economically
 and industrially. There were commu-
 nity traditional health care services for

the citizens which were very useful to
 them, and such traditional medical
 services have been transmitted down
 to our present generation.

In all parts of the country can be
 found men and women who dedicate
 themselves to upholding the principles
 and practice of traditional medicine as
 used successfully by our forebears.
 Our traditional system of medicine,
 which was now brand as primitive and
 superstitious, was able to cope with
 the health needs of our population in
 pre-colonial times.

Majority of our so-called civilized
 people do not appreciate the good ser-
 vices rendered by our traditional doc-
 tors. They believe that nothing good
 can originate from Africa and forget
 that herbs possess supernatural powers
 which are at times harnessed by the
 adepts to accomplish medical feats.

Diseases such as diabetes, high
 blood pressure and sexually transmitted
 diseases, heart-attack all of which are
 regarded as diseases of civilization are

on the increase inspite of so-called progress in medicine.

People who are deemed to be healthy today are really those with less severe diseases. Real health is a condition of mind and body wherein the individual concerned is in a state of vital, dynamic well-being, a condition far removed from what generally passes for health today.

Apart from physical and mental disorders, traditional medicine helps to solve socio-economic and spiritual problems which could be factors in disease causation. Traditional medicine is a way of life which makes the work of its practitioner an all embracing one. Sometimes it becomes necessary to consult the oracle in order to determine the true cause of a problem and how to go about it.

In big social gatherings, where all sorts of characters gather to celebrate or entertain, traditional medicine men are often called upon to forestall possible commotion, fighting and rioting.

Traditional medical doctors are closely associated with royal institutions and they are always called upon to participate in the appointment and coronation of natural rulers or kings in their respective regions. There is also a branch of traditional medicine which offers good services in the field of weather forecasting and control.

Also, there is a native drug which, when given to a sinner-patient induces him to confess his sins and relieves his

conscience from guilt. This preparation is an important aid in the treatment of mentally depressed patients where guilt is suspected to be a causative factor of the disorder.

There is a native medicine whose metaphysical process can reveal thieves, and all sorts of evil doers. Another preparation can identify a witch, locate missing persons or hidden objects. It can also help to foretell the course of events.

Legends tell us that most of the herbal products used now by native doctors and herbalists were revealed to them by the kind gods of medicine and the god of war. Some herbal remedies were discovered through observation and by imitating how animals treat themselves when they are unwell. A traditional midwife once told me that she got to know a herbal remedy by observing the self-treatment adopted by her nanny goat who was in labour.

After about six hours of labour, the nanny goat ran to a nearby plant and ate some of the leaves. She delivered in less than five minutes. And when some month later the midwife tried the plant on a human being, it proved successful. The plant's leaves have since become registered as good treatment for delayed labour by traditional midwives who know it.

It has been said many times that

nature has in all her kingdoms a remedy for every ailment be it for beast or man. There is a lot of truth in this statement — perhaps more truth than we are actually aware of. In nature's workshop, some of the most important and most efficacious medicines are found. This is particularly true of her vegetable kingdom.

In it, are found roots, barks, leaves, flowers, seeds and all kinds of juices which when judiciously employed can aid in the healing of sick bodies and in the restoration of normal body functions. In it are also found products which can induce artificial sleep, anaesthetize and paralyze body functions and even, in extreme cases, cause death.

There are so many mysteries surrounding African herbal medicine. Some African herbs, around us, possess occultic strength and others have antidote potency that can counteract the actions of diseases caused by witches and wizards. Some native doctors can direct the action of certain herbs to accomplish evil. These herbs contain chemical vibrations which can be directed through energy waves to destroy human beings from a distance.

A lot is now being discovered in the field of herbal medicine in Nigeria and in all parts of the world. Progress in the real knowledge of herbal medicine enables the practitioner to work intelligently by correcting the faulty conditions that underlie disease. As more is being discovered about herbal medicine so the herbal medicine practitioner becomes better able to deal with those derangements called disease.

This knowledge has led the herbalist to discover more herbs and diseases for which they are used and are yielding to their effects. These are few examples of the many traditional methods which have helped Africans to build healthy minds in healthy bodies. The cynic may call these superstitions, but the truth is that they have been demonstrated through the ages and have been established as reality.

In traditional medicine we treat the whole person and take into consideration both the physical and spiritual aspects of the patient's problems. There are certain ailments in which there are no discernible physiological defects

and yet the patient is ailing. In such cases the so-called scientific medical approach may be of little help.

From practical experience, I am convinced that sins can cause diseases, and that invisible forces at times interfere with the course of our physical health.

The tradomedical profession is almost now an 'abandoned' branch of our culture. The traditional doctor should be protected by law in the practice of his profession. I say this

because, the concept of medicine as studied by orthodox doctors is different from that learnt by traditional medicine doctors.

The practice of traditional medicine was handed down to us by our forefathers. And so, we are no pioneers of a new science, but the privileged perpetrators of knowledge that is very old.

The only common basis between the two fraternities for any kind of meaningful interdependence or inter-relationship is the pharmaceutical and

technological development of our herbal products, an exercise in which we can certainly find the services of the pharmaceutical scientist valuable in the standardizing of products of traditional medicine.

In this regard we would need a National Research Institute that will cater for the training of prospective traditional medical doctors, and conduct full scale research into traditional medicines with a view to promoting and enhancing it.

The Unity of God as taught in the Holy Quran By: Hadji Saka Ade. Adedeji — Snr Producer Muslim

THE TEACHINGS of Islam on the Unity of God is contained in the declaration of LA ILAHA ILA-ALLAH, which is generally translated as, "There is no other God but Allah" But the real translation should be — There is nothing that should be worshipped except Allah." Allah is one, unique, premodal, everlasting and eternal.

Chapter 112 of the Holy Quran gives the most beautiful idea of the Almighty God. It reads: "Say, He Allah is one, Allah is the eternal on whom all depends. He begets not, nor is He begotten and none is like unto Him".

MORAL INSTRUCTIONS

— Necessary For Nation's Peace

EVERY country has its own national ideals otherwise known as national ethic. For us in Nigeria, our constitution is quite clear and specific on this, discipline, self-reliance and patriotism form our national ethic.

There is a fair amount of consensus among our people that these are ideals necessary for ensuring peace, progress and stability in the society. In our own case, as people of a nation in a hurry to develop and improve the standard of living of everyone, these national ideals should necessarily form the basis of our actions.

However, in recent times, religious leaders, especially prelates and highly respected moslem preachers have been expressing their grave concern at the pervasive moral laxity in our society. Elders and well-known leaders of thought too have spoken out against various acts of indiscipline and lack of patriotism among a large section of our people. There are those who are justifiably worried that the traditional African respect for elders and constituted authority is giving way to a new concept of defiance against those things that had made our society unique.

In an attempt to get at the root of the problem some people have simply dismissed the issue of moral laxity in our society as one of the prices to be paid for choosing western civilisation. Those who challenged that view have argued that it ought to be possible for us to move into the technological age without giving up our ideals of discipline, self-reliance and patriotism.

The fundamental matter now being raised is that gradually, our society is laying less and less emphasis on moral instructions. Parents are creating the impression that they are too busy to take any closer look at the activities of their children. Some of those who have addressed their minds to the issue equally blame, to some extent, everyone connected with character moulding of our youths for neglecting their sacred duty.

The current debate in the light of all these, is that it is possible to find a

saving grace in the teaching of morals in the schools.

It has been rightly pointed out that our religions in this country have in common, certain moral standards expected of the flock and the rank and file. The injunctions against stealing, cheating and the commission of other crimes can be found virtually in every religion. Even in traditional religions, a reasonable pattern of behaviour is expected of the devotees. As of now, there is apparent failure on the part of

our people to follow those injunctions and to keep to the path of what the society considers to be decent and acceptable behaviour.

Although Nigeria is not a secular state, there is no contradiction in chapter four of the Constitution which guarantees every Nigerian the freedom of thought, conscience and religion. Within the limits of the law, the state can re-introduce the teaching of religious instructions in schools. What may be required is that the state ministries of education would set the guidelines and not any of the religious sects. Equally important is the need to ensure that every child receives such moral instructions in his or her chosen religion in compliance with the constitutional provision. It is strongly believed that it is better for a child to understand the norms of his society during his formative years than to bring him or her up without any guidance as to what would be expected of every member of the society.

Such efforts should complement a determination on the part of all parents to emphasise the ideals of discipline, self-reliance and patriotism among their off-spring. By so doing, we will all be laying a solid foundation for a society of our dream.

13TH AFRICAN CUP OF NATIONS

—How Prepared Are Eagles For The Contest ?

THE 13th Africa Cup of Nations Football Finals will be staged in Libya in March this year. Eight nations including the host country Libya will be competing. Nigeria, current African soccer champions, will be defending the much coveted one year old Africa Unity Cup she won here in Lagos in 1980.

Nigeria is drawn in the same group as Algeria, Zambia and Ethiopia. Libya, Ghana, Cameroun and Tunisia are in one group. Of the lot, Ethiopia won the competition in 1962. Ghana won in 1963, 1965 and 1978 and got the General Mustapha trophy for keeps. Algeria and Cameroun are Africa's representatives in this year's World Cup finals in Spain.

Tunisia will be competing in place of Egypt which withdrew from the competition somewhere along the line. Tunisia is no push-over since she competed in the World Cup Finals in Argentina in 1978 and gave a good account of herself. Ethiopia and Libya have not been in the soccer news of late but they cannot be written off.

All told then, defending champions, the Green Eagles have a formidable task ahead of them and the question that is bothering all Nigerians and their well wishers is: How well prepared are the Eagles to uphold their status as the

current soccer overlords of the African continent?

Well, the Eagles went into camp just before the end of 1981. Their response to this national call to duty was rather lukewarm. Obviously, Algeria's world cup qualifying victory over the Eagles was the major cause for this. Even the handlers of the national team appeared to be in a state of despondency and there were calls from certain quarters of the general public to the effect that Libya must be forgotten,

twenty-four youthful and determined Eagles have now been selected from a list of 37 in camp. The national coach Professor Otto Gloria is back at his post and is being assisted by Senior Coach Eto Amehine and Trainer Rauf Carleso. The well-known Peter Osugo has assumed the port-folio of Team Manager and the players in camp are going through a systematic training schedule that ought to produce results if all concerned discharge their duties with dedication and a singular sense of commitment.

It must be mentioned here that most of the players in Camp are those that were originally picked for grooming for the latter stages of the World Cup African zone qualifying rounds. They are talented and responsive to

coaching. Above all, they are disciplined and are eager to show the nation that they have something to offer.

What perhaps they need at this crucial stage of their preparation is the right psychological frame of mind. And to achieve this, those in authority at the sports commission level, the N.F.A. and the immediate handlers have to close their ranks. After all, they all know that united we stand, divided we fall.

The NFA after a full session this week has presented to the Sports Commission a list of all it requires to ensure victory in Libya. This includes funds for equipment and for arrangements for warm-up matches and also for travelling. The Acting Director-General of the Sports Commission has responded favourably by making funds available to the NFA to meet its immediate and urgent needs.

The NFA has also pleaded with the Sports Commission to do everything possible in order that a general atmosphere of peace, tranquillity and goodwill would prevail to enable all concerned to discharge their responsibilities without hindrance and in the proper frame of mind. And as part of its overall preparations, the national sporting press should not only claim to be constructive in its comments and criticisms but should actually be seen to be doing all that must be done to create the right atmosphere.

In this regard, the general public has a vital role to play: the failures of 1981 should be left behind us and forgotten. A feeling of national unity should be engendered at all levels and the selected Eagles should be given every ounce of moral and material support that can work for victory.

The truth is Nigeria has the talent that makes for soccer excellence and if an atmosphere of co-operation and the will to win prevail until the Eagles take the pitch in Benghazi, Libya nothing can stand between them and victory.

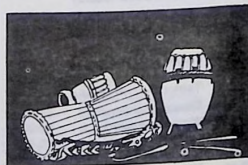

Radio - 2 transmits on the medium wave frequency in Yoruba and English. It is intended mainly for listeners in Ibadan and its environ.

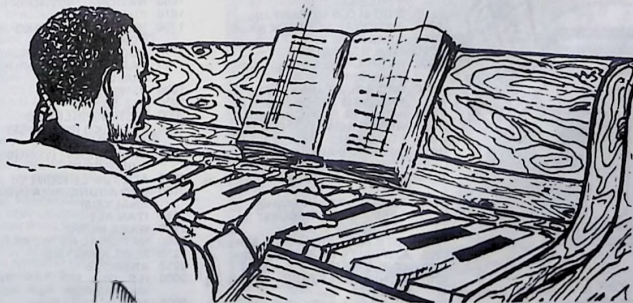

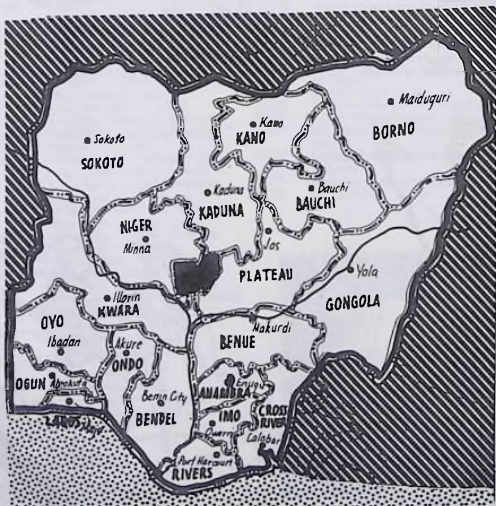
