NIGERIA'S LEADERSHIP ROLE

- Committed To Africa's Liberation

NIGERIA and indeed Africa has come of age. For more than two decades now, most of the countries in the continent had been breathing the air of political freedom, and have been managing their own affairs. But despite this, Africa today, still faces a lot of problem and challenges. The most important being the liberation of the remaining areas still under colonial servitude and domination and racial discrimination.

There is also the perennial inter and intra-state conflicts and more importantly the problem of economic under development. It is perhaps because of these peculiar problems that Nigeria, has rightly made Africa the centre-piece of her foreign policy.

This policy in essence includes a fundamental commitment to the eradication of the last vestiges of colonialism and imperialism, an uncompromising stand against all forms of racial discrimination and prejudice, the rapid uninhibited economic, cultural and political advancement of the continent and the promotion and maintenance of peace, unity and co-operation among the diverse peoples of Africa.

In pursuance of this policy, Nigeria has been playing a very active role in African Affairs. Nigeria has demonstrated in practical terms her commitment to the liberation of those areas still under colonial and racist subjugations.

One recalls vividly Nigeria's role in the Angolan independence crisis. The then Federal military government came out decisively on the side of the patriotic MPLA government and gave it the necessary diplomatic and financial support that to a large extent led to the resolution of that crisis, and the consolidation of the Angolan Independence.

It was also Nigeria's unyielding stance and bold decisions that helped shape the events which eventually culminated in the independence of Zimbabwe. And at present, it is this

refusal to compromise their fate of the blackman that has put Nigeria in the vanguard of diplomatic efforts to achieve independence for Namibia. The same patriotic concerns for African interests motivated Nigeria to nationalise British Petroleum, Barclays Bank, when it was discovered that they were aiding the apartheid South African regime.

On the whole Nigeria has been giving immense financial and diplomatic aid to all the liberation movements in Africa in their liberation war against colonialism, and imperialism. It was probably in recognition of all these efforts, that Nigeria was made a member of the frontline states, even though she is far removed from frontiers of the liberation war. It was probably for the same consideration that the emergency mini-summit of the frontline states was held in Lagos last September.

Nigeria's leadership role in Africa is not limited to liberation struggles alone. Nigeria is equally concerned with the peaceful resolution of inter and intra African conflicts and the promotion of unity among African countries.

Towards this end, Nigeria has been playing an active role in finding a lasting solution to the Chadian crisis, which has become an intractable problem for the organisation of African United (OAU). Nigeria has hosted two conferences in Chad and has partici-

pated in almost all the African meetings on Chad.

Recently she has together with some other African countries contributed to the inter-African Peace Keeping Force for Chad which is currently trying to ensure peace in Chad.

Nigeria is also a member of the committee of wisemen charged with the responsibility of reconciling the various parties to the Western Saharan dispute. Nigerian demonstrated her maturity and leadership qualities when last year, in the face of provocation, she calmly averted a major crisis with the Republic of the Cameroun.

The way the Federal Government handled that crisis is a lesson to other African countries - that most of the crisis in the continent can be resolved peacefully without necessarily resulting to force of arms.

Nigeria has also been striving hard to ensure the economic advancement of the continent. She was instrumental to the establishment of the Economic Community of West African States (ECOWAS)

Nigeria has also in her little way, as her resources allow given aid to more needy African countries, and has joined several joint economic commissions aimed at promoting the economic development of Africa. So far Nigeria has played a creditable role in Africa, which had made her a force to reckon with in the continent.

Armed Robbery In Nigeria

GOING by the trend of the incidence of armed robbery in Nigeria within the past decade, a comprehensive and detailed report of the crime would no doubt contain several volumes of books on armed robbery in Nigeria.

Nevertheless, in his book, "Armed Robbery in Nigeria" the author Sina Idowu in 118 pages attempts to explain the causes of the crime and to offer solution to it. He also suggests other preventive measures that citizens could apply when they are attacked by armed robbers.

The author goes further to give series of advice on how car owners, commercial vehicle drivers, as well as banking and commercial houses could outfit armed gangs in case of an attack. He tells all these in a simple straight forward english languages that the average reader could easily understand.

Pictures of condemned armed robbers in the book reminds one of the prize an armed robber should pay. The author touches on the ugly incidence of lynching of suspects and calls for its eradication, pointing out that as a matter of fact the citizens have no

right to lynch a suspect without giving him the opportunity to defend himself before the law courts. On aliens in our mist, he suggests that Nigeria should accommodate those of them that are holding on responsible jobs and are legally permitted to reside in the country.

One would agree with Idowu that any economic system that permits the existence of object and unmitigated poverty side by side with the extremes of affluence, that allows one man and his family to feed continuously everyday on sub-standard and insufficient diet whilst another family consumes overspiced and nourished food half of which is thrown into the dustbin as waste; that allows one man to wear rags, whilst another one wears a N10,000 outfit for only one outing; that permits the children of one man to die of a minor disease as convulsion, whilst another one can afford to send his child to London or Geneva for the treatment of tonsillitis; that allows a

total of 100 passengers, to ride in bus, sweating, choking, and suffering for several hours, in the traffic hold-up whilst another man sits in regal comfort at the back of a chauffeur driven N30,000 Mercedes Benz car fully air-conditioned, is a callous and inhuman system, from which one can never succeed in wiping out such deadly crimes as armed robbery.

The book outlines a reasonable minimum standard of living below which nobody could fall. This includes easy access to acquire education up to any level by a Nigerian citizen without cost to his/her parents and easy access to free health care, to mention only a few.

The emphasis in the book is on safety of life, not much of property, since property can be acquired but life once lost is lost for ever. "Armed Robbery in Nigeria" makes quite interesting reading.

Nigerian Economy In 1981

—Need To Re-vitalize Agriculture

THE completion of the Aladja Steel Complex is the most spectacular achievement of Nigeria on the economic front in 1981. It should be hoped that other complementary bed-rock industries such as the machine-tool and the petro-chemical will be built with similar dispatch.

Nigeria is yet to come to terms with itself in the economic sphere. So far our economic reach is beyond our economic grasp and as we plod along towards the second year of our Fourth National Development Plan, both the public and the private sectors are still groping for the magic formula with which to translate our immense economic potential into reality. Mass poverty is still a fact of contemporary life in Nigeria and this poses the supreme challenge of our age.

It is possible that the 1981 oil glut might still turn out to be a blessing to us in disguise if it induces critical self-examination and promotes discipline and a serious and sustained analysis of fundamental underlying problems of the economy.

Policy measures in our country now ought to focus on the short, the medium and the long-terms. In the immediate future, Nigeria needs to produce more food in order to reduce the import of basic foodstuffs, save substantial foreign exchange and shield herself from domination and exploitation by nations which possess and use food power.

Furthermore, Nigeria in the short-run must design and implement a well-articulated and sound energy policy to cope with the volatility of the oil market. If we must depend on oil for our survival in the immediate future, then we should strike now to master the dynamics of the market thoroughly.

The lesson of the 1981 oil glut is that in future, Nigeria must adjust her petroleum price as realistically and as soon as possible to the prevailing market conditions without undermining the integrity and solidarity of OPEC.

Another critical area in which immediate policy actions must be taken is that of data collection, collation and analysis. Reliable and current data on our economic performance are hard to come by. But as our economy grows, so the need for adequate basic statistics becomes more crucial to our planning efforts.

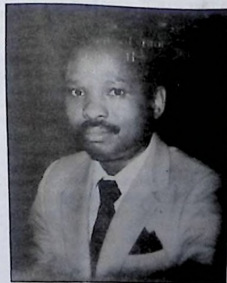
The National Economic Council should seriously look into this issues and come up with immediate and feasible solutions. The National Economic Council and the National Assembly should also design appropriate policy measures to break the boom and bust syndrome which is now characteristic of our oil-fueled economy and which has been threatening every now and then to cast a pall on our economic future.

In the medium-term, Nigeria should firmly build the economic infrastructures on which a sound super-structure can be established. In order to accelerate industrial growth and thrust our economy onto a self-sustaining state of development based on self-reliance, we must establish basic industries such

as Iron and Steel, Machine-tool and petro-chemical. The public utilities must be efficient and adequate while transport and telecommunications facilities ought to be reasonably developed.

Over the long-haul, this nation must re-vitalise agriculture in its entirety by promoting integrated rural development, developing rural infrastructures and focusing on the peasant farmers who are central to the farming cycle and produce the bulk of food we consume. The Nigerian economy needs to be diversified and moved away from the present mono-cultural type of economy which depends almost absolutely on oil fortunes, far better or for worse.

All said and done, the Nigerian economy could not be given a clean bill of health in 1981. Happily, the last quarter of the year showed positive signs of an up-turn in economic activity. It is also gratifying that in the face of great odds in 1981, all the government of the Federation are still holding tenaciously to their declared programmes. One prays and hopes that Nigeria's stock will soar again in the new year.

U.N. Secretary-General

- His Duties And Responsibilities

The Secretary-General of the United Nations occupies one of the most enviable positions in the world. At the same time, this post is one of the most difficult that has ever existed.

When this post is declared vacant, there can be as many as six or seven top-level diplomats vying for it as shown by the recent example when the former incumbent, Dr. Kurt Waldheim, and the Tanzanian Foreign Minister, Mr. Salim Ahmed Salim, each contested but failed to be elected.

Five other candidates immediately emerged, among whom was Mr. Javier Perez de Cuellar of Peru who was eventually elected in December 1981 as the new UN boss. This 61-year old diplomat will hold office for a period of five years beginning from 1 January 1982 to 31 December 1986.

Until now, the United Nations Organisation has had four Secretaries-General. They were Trygve Lie of Norway, Dag Hammarskjöld of Sweden, U Thant of Burma and Kurt Waldheim of Austria.

The failure of Mr. Salim Ahmed Salim of Tanzania to win the post of the Secretary-General is now a bygone issue. But in retrospect, it is obvious that the Organisation of African Unit (OAU), must have felt disappointed that Mr. Salim's candidature which they sponsored did not succeed.

During the elections to the post at the Security Council meetings in November last year, the United States of America vetoed Mr. Salim's candidature each time the votes were cast. In fact, of the five permanent members in the U.N. Security Council: Britain, China, France, the United States of America and the Soviet Union, only China supported Mr. Salim. China also supported the African view that since the previous Secretaries-General had come from both Europe and Asia, it was now Africa's turn to occupy that post. But the United States and its Western allies did not support this view.

Their refusal of Mr. Salim's can-

didature was not because he is a Tanzanian but because he is an African. The Western powers were deep in the belief that a U.N. Secretary-General of African origin could commit the United Nations to a violent confrontation with their South African friend over its apartheid policy.

Even when it became obvious that neither Mr. Salim nor Dr. Waldheim could win the election as a result of China's veto of Waldheim's candidature, a compromise plan by China that the next five-year term be divided between the two candidates was turned down by the other four permanent members of the Security Council.

As of now, the OAU can take solace in the fact that the new Secretary-General who is a Peruvian national is still from a Third World Country and that he will recognize third world problems in their real perspective. An outsider might wonder why all the fuss over this post.

As the Chief Administrative Officer to the United Nations Secretariat, the Secretary-General must be present at the meetings of the General Assembly,

the Security Council, the Economic and Social Council and the Trusteeship Council. He must also make an annual report to the General Assembly on the work of the organization.

The Secretary-General is also an important diplomatic figure. During his travels away from New York, he is accorded the status of a Head of State although it is a well known fact that the United Nations is not a world government. Back in his office at the 38th floor of the United Nations Plaza in New York, the secretary-General receives and examines the credentials of new diplomats accredited to the United Nations, a function which is equally performed by Heads of State or Government of sovereign states.

By Article 99 of the U. N. Charter, the Secretary-General may bring a situation to the attention of the Security Council if he believes that it constitutes a threat to the maintenance of international peace and security. He may also decide to use his good offices publicly or privately to help in settling the dispute. Should this be the case, he has to pilot his peace efforts by consultation with the countries to the dispute so as to find a lasting solution to the burning issue or issues.

The new Secretary-General, Mr. Perez de Cuellar, has assumed office at a time when the United Nations is confronted with critical global problems more serious than the challenges of the past two decades. These problems include the frightening arms race, the North-South dialogue that has never reached any appreciable conclusion, decolonization and apartheid in South Africa, the Palestinian situation, peace-making and peace keeping in Lebanon and the Middle East.

A great number of these problems can be solved within a very short time if member countries continue to support the social, political and humanitarian programmes of the world body and co-operating fully with the Organization's Chief Executive.

Politics & Politicians

—People's Interest To Be Paramount

ALTHOUGH the art of politics involves the authoritative and rational allocation of scarce resources to meet societal demands, this could only be done in a conducive political climate.

A look into the past will reveal that the game of politics is still very much characterised by intrigues, intra-party rivalry and the unbridled lust for power at all costs. In doing so, some of our politicians threw overboard the simple ethics of politics which is tolerance to the extent of engaging themselves in physical duels.

To some politicians, immorality does not count in playing the art of politics. Politics to them is the personal receipt of the largest possible share of benefits in the shortest period of time. In achieving this selfish and sinister aim, they would prefer to become conflict generators rather than conflict managers.

Political parties never became symbols of national unity, instead they were laden with tribal vision, bitterness and antagonism. But the question now is when will this negative attitude to politics in this country change into one of healthy game of political argument and discussion.

Perhaps in the new year an answer could be found if our politicians develop or create a common political culture oriented toward the nation, its structures and processes. There is now the compelling need for our politicians to encourage the growth of a sentiment of national cohesion in order to unite disparate elements within the country.

Our leaders must not only try to create new economic and political institutions but they should also create appropriate cultural values. The interests of the party leaders must not be allowed to supplant public interests.

In fact, the only valid guide for our politicians in the new year will

have to be the people's interest. Their achievements will be judged by the way the makers respond to and realise the concrete interest and aspiration of the people of this country.

The year 1982 is likely to revolve around two major issues preparation for the 1983 elections and the increased agitation for the creation of new states. With the approach of the 1983 elections, there is no doubt that all political parties will intensify their campaigns either surreptitiously or overtly.

Legislators who belong to these political parties will not be left out. Even the Executive is not unaffected. But judging from past experiences in the country, campaign periods had always been trying periods. This is because of the uncontrolled penchant of most of our politicians to over-dramatise issues and allow their emotions to take charge of their actions.

There is the need, therefore, for caution on the part of politicians and political parties, if the country is not to be thrown once again into the abyss of political confusion. Our legislators both at Federal and State levels should try to decipher national interests from party interests. They should not let their legislative duties suffer in their bid to retain their seats in 1983.

For, in the final analysis, it is the adequate and efficient performance of

their functions that will determine whether or not they would be re-elected in the 1983 elections. The same advice goes to the Executives.

In preparing for the 1983 elections, the issue of political realignment cannot be relegated to the background. Political realignment, coalitions or mergers are normally allowed in politics. But it should not be allowed to degenerate into political conflagration since every party has a right to seek either parliamentary or electoral alliance.

Another crucial issue that is bound to dominate the political scene in the New Year is that of States creation. Already several groups have made presentations for the creation of new states. But the fear is that proliferation will lead to a weakening of states size and power conditioned by an increasing dependence on resources transferred from the centre. It is a result of all these, that one would appeal to our politicians to allow reason prevail in the demand for new states.

Although there are very strong arguments for the creation of more states out of the present 19, but there is a limit to the number of component states that could be created beyond which Federalism will lose its essence and meaning. It will only show the maturity of our politicians if this exercise could be accomplished devoid of all political wranglings. It has been suggested that the various political leaders should come together to discuss this very vital issue. This will be a good basis to start from.

All the above issues could be resolved only in a healthy political environment devoid of rancour, bitterness and hatred. The year 1982 should therefore be a year of national political re-examination for our politicians as the 1983 elections draw nearer and nearer.

ASSETS DECLARATION

-When Will It Be Enforced?

THE men and women who drew up the supreme law of the land, that is the constitution, had in their wisdom laid down certain guidelines on the issue of accountability among public officers.

Section 11 of the Fifth Schedule of the Constitution stipulated that every public officer shall within three months after the coming into force of the code of conduct or immediately after a written declaration of all his properties, assets and liabilities and thereafter at the end of every four years and at the end of his term of office. He is also required to submit those of his spouse, and unmarried children under the age of 21 years.

In spite of this very unambiguous constitutional provision, it is surprising that with the exception of the President and the Vice President, no other public officer has declared his assets. This is more embarrassing because in the third year of the operation of the presidential system of government in this country, almost every public officer is yet to declare his asset.

It is as a result of this that one would commend the directives of the Speaker of Kaduna State Assembly though belated, that members of the House should declare their assets, to enforce the Code of Conduct among them.

Public officers may easily attribute their inability to declare their assets to the delay in the passing of the Code of Conduct Procedure Bill now before the Senate. This however, is not sufficient reason for failing to declare their assets after two years of coming into power.

After all, the constitution says that where the Code of Conduct is not in force, public officers should declare their assets immediately after taking office. They seem to be oblivious to this aspect of the constitutional pro-

vision.

One would have thought that members of the National Assembly, realising the importance of the Code of Conduct Bureau, would expedite action on the passage of the Bill, moreso that the issue of public accountability is entrenched in our constitution. This in essence demands public officers to be accountable to the people who elected them into office. If this noble objective of the Constitution is to be realised, then the very first step towards achieving this is the declaration of assets.

It should be realised that the major cause of upheaval in many countries had been blatant misappropriation of public fund to the detriment of the suffering masses. No meaningful development can be achieved without fund. It is to check the misuse of public funds that led to provision being made for the setting up of the Code of Conduct Bureau in the constitution.

One question that agitates one's mind is how authentic will be declaration of assets by public officers now that they have spent over two years

in office? Will all the assets of the last two years both from known and unknown sources be faithfully declared by our elected representatives?

These questions become necessary because of the non-challant attitude of some of our public officers to the issue of assets declaration. But what could have caused the delay in passing the Code of Conduct Procedure Bill up till now?

The need to pass this bill as quickly as possible could be seen from the fact that some public officers who came into office in 1979 had either resigned or been withdrawn from government without declaring their assets and liabilities. To say the least, this is a mockery of our Constitution. It is also not an inspiring situation.

There is therefore the urgent need for both the National Assembly and other State Assemblies to emulate the steps taken by the Kaduna State House of Assembly.

INDUSTRIAL PEACE

—Call For Give-Take Spirit

IF one was looking for a caption for the year 1981 that has just rolled by, it could be described in Nigeria as the year of unrest.

There was hardly any sector of the economy that was not affected by work stoppages and trade disputes. So also both the Federal Government and nearly all the 19 State Governments had to contend with one strike action or another.

Local governments also were not spared the angers of the working masses as their employees in several states embarked on wild-cat strikes. But the real danger of these strike actions and work stoppages could be seen when they are analysed.

In the Health sector, work stoppages by doctors, nurses and other para-medical staff led to the untimely deaths of thousands of Nigerians.

The industrial action by members of the Academic Staff Union of Nigerian Universities nearly paralysed the Education sector as it delayed resumption of the 1981/82 academic year by more than two months. And in many States of the Federation, teachers in various institutions of learning downed their chalks for every conceivable reasons.

In the strategic banking sector, the Central Bank workers, because of their pivotal position in this sector, virtually paralysed the financial market during their trade dispute with the government. And as families all over the country were preparing for the Christmas festivities, employees of the Union Bank struck, causing untold hardship to millions of Nigerians. All these were apart from the general strike called by the Nigerian Labour Congress.

It will be an under-statement to say that the cost of these trade disputes and work-stoppages are enormous in terms of man-days lost to the economy. Available statistics showed that in 1978, Nigeria lost 875,137 days through work-stoppages.

This figure rose to 2,038,855 man days in 1979 the last year of the military regime.

The first full year of the civilian

administration in 1980 witnessed another astronomical increase to 2,350,998. Obviously the figure for 1981, with the long catalogue of strikes and lock-outs would be alarming when released.

These statistics reveal a disturbing trend in industrial relations in the country, which calls for an urgent and concerted efforts by both the Federal and State governments, the National Assembly, private employers and the trade Unions.

It is universally agreed that the strike weapon is the most potent weapon at the disposal of workers in the

quest for better remunerations and conditions of service. But it is a weapon that should be reverted to only when all other avenues for seeking redress have been exhausted. This is because in the end both the worker and the employer become losers since no nation's economy can thrive in an unstable climate.

It is also pertinent to remind our labour leaders that it is not only by calling workers out on strike that they could show responsible and effective leadership. Experience has shown that there is no dispute which cannot be amicably settled on the bargaining table if there is a free flow of meaningful exchanges and the spirit of give and take on both sides. In fact there had been no industrial dispute that was not finally settled through bargaining.

Employers, whether government or private, should also in the new year show more interest in the well-fare of their workers. A responsible and responsive Management should not wait until workers declare trade disputes before thinking about how to improve their conditions.

The time has also come that employers should place more emphasis on fringe benefits such as housing and transportation rather than on salary increases which mean little to workers because of the effect of worldwide inflation. Employers and labour leaders should be reminded that the economic welfare of the nation is the responsibility of all.

Moreover, there are established avenues for settling labour disputes if negotiations between management and Union leaders fail. There will in fact be no need for strikes and lock-outs if these laid down procedures are followed.

And as we move forward in the new year, employers of labour and the labour force should find common grounds on which to work together in an atmosphere of industrial peace and harmony.

It is only in such an atmosphere that the economy of the country can remain buoyant and the standard of living of the people improved.

MEDICINE, WITCHCRAFT, AND RELIGION

IN the third series of his talks, Dr J.O. Mume treated readers to how civilization has given men a lot of amenities and necessary pleasures of life with the left hand and snatched them back with the right hand.

His fourth lecture, the text of which is reproduced below deals with Traditional Medicine, Witchcraft and Religion.

I AM starting this fourth talk with a discussion of witchcraft which is the black magic practised by those who possess super-natural powers and are in union with demon spirit forces. The practice of witchcraft is diabolical in the main, but instances exist where witchcraft has been used to the advantage of man.

Throughout history, the existence of witchcraft has been a matter of controversy, despite the fact that history is replete with instances of diseases, death and general misfortune wrought about through its influence.

The intensity of the belief in the existence of witchcraft has varied with different communities and different stages of civilization. Scores of literature have been produced on the subject of witchcraft, while majority of these agree that witchcraft does exist, there is also a minority who hold the view that belief in witchcraft is nothing but a falacy.

Some profess disbelief in the existence of witchcraft merely as a show of sophistication, but their hypocritical attitude is easily betrayed in times of great danger or misfortune. The nature of my profession and contact with people have made me believe strongly in the existence of witchcraft.

There is no nation in the world, however civilized, that does not have its share of the problem of witchcraft. Both the church and secular authorities have in the past tried to eradicate witchcraft from the face of the earth. Suspects were either prosecuted or executed. But so far; they have only

succeeded in driving the practice of witchcraft underground and so rendering it more potentially dangerous to humanity.

The most astonishing aspect of it all is the fact that those who are most vocal in the condemnation of witchcraft have at one time or the other been proved ardent adherents of the cult. Some even turn to witchcraft for help. King Saul of Israel was a glaring example. When the going was smooth with him he mustered all the forces at his disposal to oppose and attempt the extermination of all the witches and wizards in the territory of Israel.

But when the going was rough, he turned round to seek advice from the witch of Endor, a one-time victim of his persecution. A French monarch once publicly condemned witchcraft but when she was faced with severe political rivalry from her own son, she resorted to secret witchcraft.

To try to exhibit disbelief in witchcraft can be regarded by the well initiated as the peak of ignorance. Witches are the agents of the millions of the unseen spirits or spirit beings who occupy the spirit world. They can meddle in the affairs of men

either for good or bad.

The belief in witchcraft is not confined to the African continent or rural populations alone but it embraces both rich and poor, educated and non-educated citizens, black or white. The only difference is that it is more intense in some parts of the world.

Therefore, to infer that witchcraft belongs to the African continent alone is most unfair to the Africans. Witchcraft has been known to exist in all the countries of Europe and Asia long before the beginning of the slave trade which brought African culture in contact with that of European and Asian countries. Uptill today, there are still covens situated all over Great Britain where the witches convene to practise their art.

Our mere refusal to accept their existence cannot make them non-existent, nor can it nullify the fact that they exert considerable influence on the lives of men. Witches use their super-natural powers on innocent citizens whether they deserve it or not. It can happen in the form of disease which may be short or prolonged, a sudden death, misfortune in business or academic pursuits, failure in matri-

monial or love affairs, sterility, impotence or undeserved hatred by people.

Therefore, the practice of traditional medicine cannot be complete if it fails to take into consideration the incidence of diseases and misfortunes caused through the influence of witchcraft. So in diagnosing a disease, the traditional medicine doctor takes all these factors into consideration.

However, I wish to sound a note of warning that not every disease or misfortune that befalls a man is attributable to witchcraft. There are natural laws that govern and regulate the process of our health and success in life, the violation of which can cause anguish among men.

Now with regard to traditional medicine and religion, I believe one cannot be mentioned without the other.

Man is a religious being, irrespective of what he professes to be, atheist or otherwise; religion is the dominant force in him. His idol may be god or a goddess, wealth, science, personality, profession or self. There is a vacuum in his life if he has nothing to worship or idolize.

So with all that civilization has given to man, an appropriate substitute has not yet been found to take the place of man's innate propensity to worship something. His beliefs may be found either in the Holy Bible, the Holy Koran, the Vedas, the Five Classics or in wealth and fame.

African traditional medicine, is

therefore, not completely divested from religion. The two are interwoven and it is not easy to separate one from the other. The African culture itself makes sure that this should be so.

Africans believe in the existence of one central God whom they seek to worship through the medium of some other representations, which they believe are the agents or representatives of the Almighty God. Africans believe that the eyes of God are everywhere, watching and seeing whatever you do whether it be good or bad.

Although, there has not been a central Canon for African religious beliefs, yet through the ages, many codes of conduct have been evolved to help the African build a healthy conscience. I believe the conscience is the controlling factor in man's physiological, psychological and behavioural patterns, and when a man with a healthy conscience transgresses the dictates of his conscience, it rebels and sends dangerous signals to the cells and organs of the body which may result in the abnormal functioning of the organs and systems of the body — the manifestation of which we call disease. There is no man without a conscience, but the difference is that some have healthy consciences while others have sick ones.

The African believes that there is life after death and that in death, the deceased is transformed from the physical state to a spiritual state in the

spirit world, which is believed to be within the vicinity of the earth or somewhere around. There, he becomes more powerful, wiser and more mobile. He can either punish or reward the living according to their deeds.

There, in the world beyond, the dead ancestors are believed to have formed themselves, to a formidable invisible, incorruptible "police force" which looks after the affairs of the families and communities they left behind here on earth. They can arrest, prosecute or even execute unrepentant sinners. Added to these are the many family and community gods, believed to be part of this invisible 'constabulary'.

In the good old days when our culture had not been adulterated with foreign concepts, every aspect of life of the African was patterned in accordance with the principles of these oral scriptures. The peoples' mode of life and sense of value were regulated by the principles set down by religion.

For example, a married African woman was expected to be obedient and fully submissive to her husband as head of the family, so that she could bring forth useful responsible and obedient children. No matter the circumstances she was not expected to seek pleasure from outside nor profane herself by any means.

If by inadvertence she contravenes any of these rules, she had to sacrifice an animal to appease the offended gods and ancestors. In the event of sickness, or where mishap threatens, a traditional medicine doctor is consulted. The offender is made to confess her sins and then, the appropriate rites are performed.

This aspect of traditional medicine is considered essential for the physical and spiritual well-being of the patient. The woman was not regarded as a slave in her matrimonial home as some would like to believe, rather, she was a useful partner in progress and an important member of the household. She was happy and contented with this role.

To rebel and take an insubordinate stand against the authority of the husband was regarded as an abomination in an African community. The gods were always watching. Her

health, that of her husband and children as well as the welfare of the family as a unit was always paramount in her mind.

The independence of the so-called modern woman, the way she behaves, dresses, speaks and the atmosphere of rivalry that pervades her whole actions has done much to harm the health of the African man. It is my belief that many of the social ills of today which are now telling seriously on our general health, derive from the desperate effort of the menfolk to satisfy the 'modern woman's craze

for ostentation and artificialism.

The sanity that was once the basis of manhood has now been profaned. Men to-day are but poor replicas of men who lived a hundred years ago.

Most African religions abhor stealing, lying, cheating, adultery, prostitution and many other human vices. People are expected to live decent lives in obedience to their religious laws, which were also the laws of good health and longevity.

The western type of culture which the so-called civilized members of our

society are trying to infuse into our culture does not encourage genuine religiousness. It tends to breed a completely Godless society of people with all its attendant evils and adverse effect on our health.

In the practice of traditional medicine, therefore, consideration is always given to witchcraft and religion when diagnosing and treating diseases. This is so because traditional medicine teaches that disease can be caused by witchcraft as well as by violation of religious and natural laws of living.

PRISON REFORMS

-Aiming At Correcting Offenders

THE exercise is as a result of an urgent and compelling need to modernize and humanise the prison services in Nigeria to bring them to the level and standard in decent human societies all over the world.

This is because imprisonment has become an instrument of social reform against those who deviate from the established norms of the society. But as a result of the astronomical increase in the rate of crime in Nigeria coupled with the almost riotous situation in our prison yards, it has become imperative not only to bring about a discernible improvement in the present facilities but also provide other alternatives to imprisonment in line with the existing criminal procedures.

It is therefore necessary to encourage the use of non-institutionalised forms of punishment depending on the gravity of the offence committed. This could take the form of fines in place of imprisonment or parols for offenders serving long years in jail who have shown sufficient signs of remorse. The system of suspended sentence can also be introduced for crimes which are not likely to cause a breach of public peace.

Records from other countries have shown that these modes of punishment are proving to be quite effective in offender correction. Furthermore,

given the attitude of society towards ex-convicts, these measures will to a considerable extent play down on the negative impression associated with imprisonment. Arrangement should be made as a matter of necessity to provide educational and

vocational training for inmates. This is with a view to facilitating the usual problem of adjustment to normal life and subsequent rehabilitation of the prisoner when released.

The need for this should not be over-emphasised. Experience has shown that some prisoners upon their release revert to the life of crime because they have nothing to occupy their time. These are long term proposals which require formal legislation by the National Assembly before they can be implemented. But in the interim, some internal changes could be effected to improve prison services.

In the first, it is a common knowledge that rather than serve as reformatory agencies that they are established for, our prison yards have turned out to be places that harden inmates. Therefore, the current practice whereby both first offenders and die-hard criminals are put under lock and key together should be de-emphasised. Investigation has shown that most criminals leave the prison worse than they went in. This is because of the corrupting influence of those who are versed in the art of crime.

In addition to that, the excesses of some prison officials must be checked. This is because some unscrupulous ones among them condone different forms of vices on the part of prisoners. For example, it is not uncommon to find weeds suspected to be Indian Hemp in many of our prison yards that one wonders how they could have reached the in-mates without the connivance of some prison officials.

There is also need to give some form of para-military training to some categories of prison staff. This is due to the increasing tendency to resort to violence by some prisoners and their incessant attempts to escape from prison. The recent attempts by in-mates in the Benin and Ilorin prisons along this line easily come to mind. Finally, concerted efforts should be made to improve the feeding and living conditions in all our prisons as these have often led to cases of unrest among prisoners.



SELF-HELP PROJECT

-Not Alien To Nigerian Culture

THE philosophy of self-help or communal projects is not alien to our culture. It is in fact, the basis on which our traditional society had once rested every man was his brother's keeper.

But the coming of Western democracy and its peculiar forms of government seemed to stifle that very spirit which earlier had sustained village life and development. The once shared communal responsibility of proving for necessary projects like roads, civics centres or bridges across streams were then left to the government to shoulder.

The presumption could be that since the colonial intruders had to impose their foreign ideas and way of life, they might as well shoulder all the communities burdensome responsibilities. The simple basis for this belief seems to be that the huge sums of money collected in taxation and other revenue sources had to be visibly justified.

To an extent, the then British rulers provided some tangible proof with some few basic amenities. Consequently by the time the colonial intruders left, the common man's assumption that the development of the country was the sole responsibility of the unfortunate in terms of progress, and was to take a long time before it could be successfully dispelled.

Another matter that further complicated issues was the shortcomings of Nigeria's leaders in the post independence era. The leaders in their electioneering campaigns often and indiscreetly raised the hopes of the average man to unattainable heights, and so everyone came to expect more than the government could possibly give. The glowing tales painted of the birth-to-death welfare programmes by Nigerian students returning from Britain, Europe or the United States, did not in the least help matters.

It only served to make them worse.

Perhaps, it could be said that this communal spirit dissipated because of the depressing realisation that the meagre resources of individuals or the

community could not adequately finance a standard project in the modern sense. The standards, specification and price of modern development were a little beyond the reach of the average rural communities. Perhaps this was the real reason that made the people withdraw into a shell, hence leaving all the responsibility to the government.

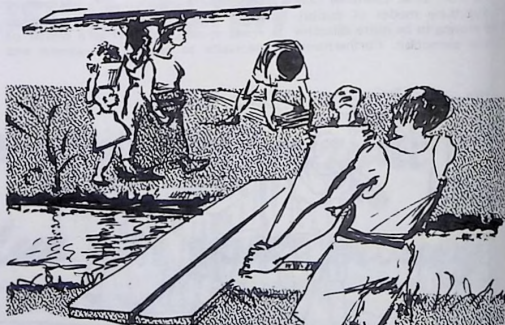
However, as the nation became enlightened through education, it gradually dawned on various communities that the government's pace seemed

be tortuously glow.

Probably it was the manifold problems such as the general level of under-development in and the sheer geographical size of the country, the low literacy level coupled with the numerous conflicts from various interest groups which the government had to contend with, that slowed down the pace. But eventually it dawned on many communities that the government alone could not cope with the needs of all.

In recent times, there have been a spate of self-help projects going on throughout the Federation. This is commendable indeed. And the call by President on communities to develop the spirit of self-help should be seen as a timely one.

Both the Federal and the state government should do everything possible to encourage this selfless attitude. Any community that raised a certain sum of money for self-help projects should receive a matching grant from the state government. This will serve as an inducement to the communities concerned and go a long way to encourage others to do likewise.

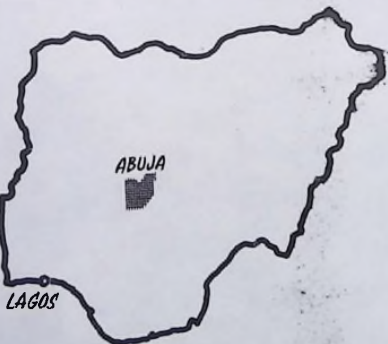

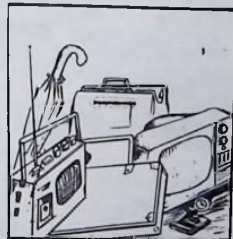
