IN THE FORTY-NINTH YEAR OF THE REIGN OF
HER MAJESTY QUEEN VICTORIA.

At a Legislative Council held on the 13th day of February, in the year of our Lord, one thousand, eight hundred and eighty six.

An Ordinance to extend to the Colony of Lagos the Ordinances of the Gold Coast Colony and of the Settlement of Lagos hitherto in force in the Settlement of Lagos and adjacent territories.

Whereas by Letters Patent, dated the 13th January, 1886, passed under the Great Seal of the United Kingdom, the Settlement of Lagos was erected into a separate Colony called the Colony of Lagos and the office of Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the said Colony was thereby constituted.

And whereas by a Commission, dated 14th January, 1886, passed under the Royal Sign Manual and Signet, CORNELIUS ALFRED MOLONEY, Esquire, C.M.G., was appointed Administrator of the Colony of Lagos.

And whereas it is expedient to make provision for the Administration of the Law in the said Colony of Lagos:—

Be it therefore enacted by the Governor of the Colony of Lagos, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

1. All the Ordinances, Rules and Orders of the Gold Coast Colony, and of the Settlement of Lagos, which have hitherto been in force within the Settlement of Lagos

and the adjacent territories, shall so far as the same and the provisions thereof are consistent with the hereinbefore recited Letters Patent of the 13th January, 1886, and the limitations and provisos therein contained, be and remain in full force and effect in the Colony of Lagos.

An Ordinance to provide for the Service of the Colony of Lagos, during the year One thousand eight hundred and eighty-six.

[15TH MARCH, 1886.]

Whereas it is requisite to make provision for the expenses of the Civil Government of the Colony of Lagos during the year 1886;

Be it enacted by the Governor of the Colony of Lagos, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

1. So much of the Ordinance No. 5 of 1885, entitled—"An Ordinance to provide for the service of the Gold Coast Colony, during the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six," and of the Schedule thereto annexed, as by virtue of the Ordinance No. 1 of 1886, entitled—"An Ordinance to extend to the Colony of Lagos the Ordinances of the Gold Coast Colony,

and of the Settlement of Lagos hitherto in force in the Settlement of Lagos and adjacent territories," relates to the Colony of Lagos or acquired force and effect therein is hereby repealed.

Expenditure of £55,317 12 0 authorised.

2. The Treasurer may on the warrant of the Governor or Officer Administering the Government pay out the Revenue of the Colony of Lagos, the sum of *Fifty five thousand, three hundred and seventeen pounds, and Twelve shillings*, and apply the same to the service of the year ending on the 31st day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six.

Appropriation of £55,317 12 0 as per Schedule.

3. The said sum of *Fifty five thousand, three hundred and seventeen pounds and Twelve shillings*, shall be appropriated in the manner and for the purposes expressed in the Schedule annexed to this Ordinance; and the said Schedule shall be deemed to be part of this Ordinance in the same manner as if it had been contained in the body thereof.

4. The sums granted by this Ordinance are for the services which will come in course of payment within the year ending on the thirty-first day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty six; and any balances remaining, un-issued at the close of the year shall lapse and not be available for meeting payments in a subsequent year.

Sums voted are for the Services of 1886, balances un-issued shall lapse.

5. This Ordinance may be cited as the supply Ordinance, Colony of Lagos, 1886, Short title.

Passed in the Legislative Council this 15th day of March, in the year of our Lord, one thousand, eight hundred and eighty-six.

DEPARTMENTAL INSTRUCTION.

As regards the care and disposition of Governmental property, the responsibility of Heads of Departments were pointed out in Circular of 11th February last.

In the Quarterly Inventories directed to be rendered, there shall be added two Columns under the Headings "SERVICEABLE" and "UN-SERVICEABLE."

Articles spoilt or worn out during a Quarter shall be kept together and be submitted after its close to a board of Survey consisting of not less than three Public Officers of whom the Colonial Secretary shall in general be president.

It will be the duty of such Board to satisfy themselves whether articles in question are Un-serviceable and require to be replaced.

Every Board of Survey must furnish the Governor with a report of their proceedings. The Officer of the particular Department must remain debited with the Un-serviceable Articles until disposed of under authority.

The Board of Survey must give directions for having regularly sold by Public Auction, when the quantity accumulated in each Department shall render sale expedient, or when of no value otherwise disposed of, Un-serviceable Articles.

It may happen that Articles Un-serviceable in one Department may be utilised with Public advantage and economy in another: such a question shall be decided by the Board.

Requisition for this Quarterly Board shall emanate from Colonial Secretary.

To remove any misapprehension on the subjects and thereby to obviate irregularities, it is hereby notified that Governmental Employés of any grade and in any Branch of the Colonial service are to be kept, unless otherwise exceptionally authorised by the Governor or Officer acting as such, strictly to the work of the Government for which each such Employé is paid from the Public Chest.

As to the occupation of Criminal and other Prisoners, the provisions of the Prisons Ordinance 1876, and such other Rules and Regulations as to their employment and labour as may from time to time be issued by the Governor in Council are to be rigidly observed. It must not be over-looked that Prisoners are housed and maintained by the Public tax-payers, and it must be accordingly always understood that their labour should be solely utilised as is and may be legally directed.

The Gaoler shall strictly conform to the law relating to Prisons and to the Prison Regulations and shall be responsible for the due observance of them by others.

In no case shall a paid Governmental Employé, whilst his services are at the disposal of and required by the State, or a Prisoner Criminal or Debtor, tried or untried, be used for private purposes.
