The Plateau State Branch in collaboration with the Jos Book Fair and the Plateau State Library Board, hosted the 2026 Jos Book Fair alongside the commemoration of World Book and Copyright Day from April 22 to 25, 2026, in Jos.

The four-day event featured a series of literary, educational, and interactive activities aimed at promoting reading culture, intellectual engagement, and community development.

Proceedings commenced on April 22 with a road walk across Jos metropolis to sensitize the public on the importance of books and reading, followed by a keynote session at the National Library delivered by Prof. Ahmad Rabi, who emphasized the role of reading in acquiring deep knowledge and fostering personal growth.

Other activities on the opening day included an interactive quiz on African literary classics and a guided tour of the National Library conducted by the Head of Branch, Mrs Sarah Emmanuel.

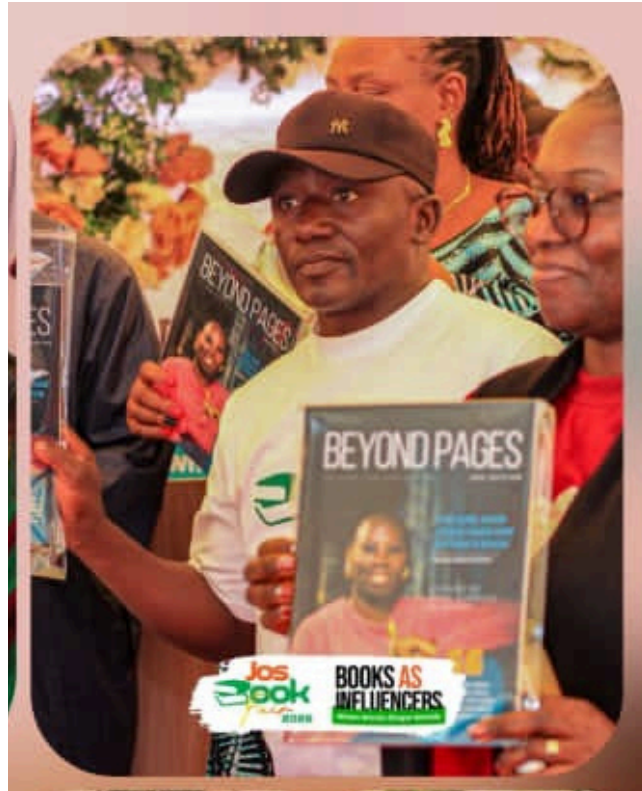
Participants were introduced to the library's services and facilities. The day also provided opportunities for networking and book sales, with vendors expressing satisfaction with audience engagement despite minor challenges.

The second day, April 23, marked the official celebration of World Book and Copyright Day. The event commenced with welcome remarks by the Convener of the Jos Book Fair, Dr. Hankuri T. Gaya, who highlighted the theme, "Reading for Pleasure," noting that reading for enjoyment remains fundamental to learning and influence.

The programme featured a spoken word performance by the Plateau Poetry Society, while the keynote address delivered on behalf of Prof. Lilly Ezeala by Mr. Peter Oye underscored the role of books in preserving culture and shaping society.

A major highlight of the day was the unveiling of the Read Plateau 2026 Project, an initiative designed to promote reading culture among students. As part of the project, books were distributed to 22 secondary schools, with plans to establish book clubs and organize reading competitions.

Additional activities included the launch of Beyond Pages magazine, an authors' meet-and-greet session, and indigenous language presentations by the Summer Institute of Linguistics. Goodwill messages were delivered by dignitaries, while closing remarks by Mrs. Sarah Mshelia Emmanuel emphasized the importance of legal deposit in preserving knowledge and encouraged participants to embrace reading as a lifelong habit.



About 251 participants, including librarians, authors, publishers, poets, students, media representatives, persons with hearing disabilities, and other stakeholders, attended the World Book Day event.

Activities on the third day, April 24, focused on capacity building and knowledge sharing. A session on "How Books Are Made" and "ISBN and Legal Deposits" was delivered by Mrs. Sarah Emmanuel and Mr. Reuben Nengese, providing insights into book production and documentation processes.

This was followed by a panel discussion on "Books as Community Influencers," featuring Mr. Izang Alexander, Dr. Hajjia Jamila, and Mr. Philip Dimka, who discussed the role of books in shaping values and driving social change.

Participants also engaged in a reading session, a networking break, and a writing workshop organized by the Plateau Writers Association of Nigeria (PLAWS) themed "From Idea to Manuscript: Maintaining Originality in an Age of Artificial Intelligence." Facilitators, including Mr. Nathaniel Tanko, Dr. Eric Pam, and Mr. Victor Meshach, guided participants on producing authentic literary content.

Another session titled "Children and Books: Influencing the Future through Books," led by Mrs. Grace Hywere and Miss Stephane Augustine, highlighted the importance of cultivating reading habits among children. The day concluded with a spoken word performance by the Plateau Poetry Society.

The final day, April 25, featured a talk on "Book Marketing for Authors" delivered by Mr. Sam Semako, which provided practical strategies for promoting literary works.

A panel session on "Books as Influencers in the Digital Space" included contributions from Lendung Tungcham, Muyiwa Joseph, Dr. Nanre Nafziger, and Mr. Izang Alexander Haruna, who explored the growing impact of digital platforms on reading and publishing.

Other highlights included a reading session, an inclusive programme titled "Reading and Your Disability" facilitated by Miss Stephane Augustine, and a family reading segment designed to encourage shared literary experiences.

The event concluded with closing formalities and a farewell networking session, bringing the 2026 Jos Book Fair to a successful end.

In a concluding remark, organizers described the convergence of the Jos Book Fair with the global celebration of World Book and Copyright Day, alongside the unveiling of the Read Plateau 2026 Project, as a significant milestone in promoting literacy and strengthening reading culture in Plateau State and beyond.

In her welcome address, the Head of Branch, Mrs. Martina Egwuibe, highlighted the importance of the celebration to the education sector and emphasized the need to promote reading as a catalyst for national development.

Highlights of the event included paper presentations focusing on the role of libraries and reading in education. A Librarian, Gora Rahila Chirai, presented a paper titled "The Use of the Library in Education," where she outlined strategies for developing reading habits among students, the importance of libraries to academic success, and practical steps for establishing functional school libraries. She also addressed common barriers to reading and suggested ways to overcome them, alongside techniques for effective reading within the library environment.

In a second presentation titled "*Rebranding Reading: From Duty to Delight*," Mrs. Martina Egwuibe encouraged students to move beyond viewing reading as a compulsory academic task and instead embrace it as a pleasurable and lifelong activity. She noted that cultivating a reading culture is essential for both individual growth and societal development.

Speaking at the event, NYCN Kaduna State Coordinator, Comr. Bilal Bello, urged students to prioritize reading physical books and develop critical thinking skills, cautioning against excessive reliance on artificial intelligence tools such as ChatGPT at an early stage.

Other NYCN coordinators, including Comr. Sheyin Wakili (Chikun LGA) and Comr. Abdullahi Usman (Kaduna South LGA), also encouraged students to read diligently in order to excel academically and become responsible members of society.

The programme was attended by participants from seven secondary schools, NYCN coordinators from three local government areas, members of the press, NLN staff, and representatives of key literary and professional bodies, including the Publishers Association of Nigeria, the Printers Association, and the Association of Nigerian Authors.

As part of efforts to support reading culture, a publisher donated 50 titles comprising 70 volumes of books. The materials were distributed to the libraries of the participating schools and to students who made presentations during the event.

A total of 71 students received certificates of participation in recognition of their involvement and to encourage sustained reading habits.

The event concluded with a vote of thanks delivered by Librarian Sarafina Adamu, who expressed appreciation to all partners, stakeholders, and participants for their contributions. Guests were subsequently entertained with light refreshments.

Enugu State Branch Host Author Exposition, and Reading Advocacy



The Enugu State Branch of the National Library of Nigeria (NLN) on Thursday, 23 April 2026, marked the World Book and Copyright Day at its branch office, Independence Layout, Enugu with activities aimed at promoting reading culture and intellectual development. The celebration, held under the theme “Go All In,” emphasized the importance of deepening engagement with reading by connecting books to personal interests and passions. The theme also promoted reading for pleasure as a pathway to knowledge, creativity, and lifelong learning.

Nasarawa State Branch Marks World Book and Copyright Day with Awareness Campaign

The Nasarawa State Branch on 23 April 2026, marked the World Book and Copyright Day with activities focused on promoting reading culture and raising awareness on copyright protection. As part of the celebration, the branch organized a display of relevant information resources for library users, showcasing materials across various subject areas to encourage reading and knowledge acquisition. The library also engaged the public through a radio sensitization programme aired on Agate Radio, aimed at increasing awareness of the importance of books and intellectual property rights. During the programme, emphasis was placed on the importance of copyright as a legal protection granted to authors, publishers, and other creators, giving them exclusive rights to



reproduce, publish, and benefit from their works. Participants were sensitized on the need to respect intellectual property, as copyright laws serve to motivate writers and creators by safeguarding their efforts from unauthorized use. The branch highlighted that copyright protection applies only to works expressed in tangible form, such as written texts, music recordings, and artistic creations, and does not extend to mere ideas. It also addressed common forms of copyright infringement, including plagiarism, piracy, counterfeiting, and unauthorized reproduction through reprography. The branch reaffirmed its commitment to promoting literacy, protecting intellectual property rights, and enhancing access to information for sustainable national development.

The event aimed to expose girls and young women to opportunities in Information and Communication Technology (ICT), promote digital literacy, and reinforce the role of the library as a hub for inclusive technology education, in line with the Sustainable Development Goals (SDG 4 and SDG 5).

In her remarks, the Head of Branch, Mrs. Martina Egwuibe, reaffirmed the National Library's commitment to bridging the digital gender divide through improved access to electronic resources, coding tools, and digital literacy programmes. She emphasized the importance of equipping girls with relevant technological skills to thrive in a rapidly evolving digital world.

Also speaking, the Coordinator of IHSAN Initiative encouraged participants to embrace Artificial Intelligence (AI) and Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics (STEM) fields as pathways to innovation and economic empowerment.

The programme featured two presentations which highlighted the role of ICT in enhancing teaching and learning, as well as the evolving function of modern libraries in supporting digital skills acquisition.

Participants, mostly students, actively engaged in an interactive question-and-answer session, raising concerns on cybersecurity, AI career opportunities, and online safety.

Key outcomes of the event included the sensitization of 70 girls on ICT career prospects and the ethical use of AI, increased awareness of the National Library's digital services among attendees, and strengthened collaboration between the NLN and IHSAN Initiative for future girl-child development programmes.

President Bola Ahmed Tinubu approves the renewal of the tenure of NLN DG

President Tinubu approved the renewal of the tenure of Prof. Chinwe Veronica Anunobi as CEO of the National Library of Nigeria for a final term of five years. She was first appointed on 2nd September, 2021.

Since assuming office, Prof. Anunobi has led several institutional reforms aimed at repositioning the National Library as a modern technology-driven knowledge institution, including the development and operationalisation of the National Repository of Nigeria, the Newspaper and Magazine Locator, the Index and Abstract to Nigerian Newspapers, and the National Virtual Library of Nigeria.

She has also played a strategic role in advancing the long-awaited completion of the National Library Headquarters project and in initiating plans to migrate heritage collections from the 34 state branches to the new headquarters in Abuja.

The President expects that the renewal of her tenure would ensure continuity in the implementation of ongoing reforms, completion of the National Library Headquarters project, and execution of the 2025-2030 Strategic Plan of the institution.

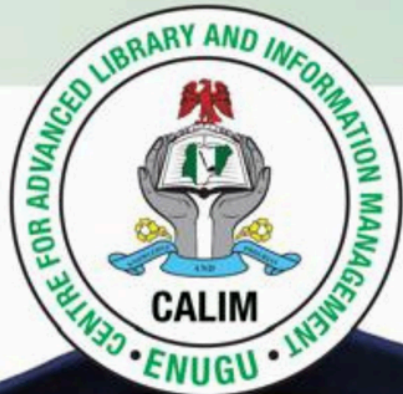
