Peace-Keeping In Chad

-OAU Set On Action Programme

PERHAPS on Vital Message that emerged from the Lagos meeting is that Africa cannot afford to abandon its responsibility and pledged to Chad. From the recent developments in Chad itself, it was apparent that the various delegations realized the purpose of their mission, and the urgency of their assignment.

That explained why there was no exchange of rhetorics, but realistic ideas and principles. The Foreign Ministers did appreciate that their call to session was for solution and action on a situation that demanded an immediate and positive response.

It was therefore to the credit of Africa and its friends that they came out with a deserving programme of action to set the machinery for an eventual deployment of OAU troops to Chad. Under the programme, part of which took off shortly, a 14-member military team went to Chad mid-November to assess the situation on the spot. Nigeria in addition to accepting to provide transportation to the team, also nominated a Commander-General for the

OAU Neutral Force. It does also seem that Nigeria will have to provide the largest single contingent for the Chadian operation.

In keeping with the relevant sections of the OAU resolution on the Neutral Force, the role of the OAU Force would be to maintain law and order, ensure the free movement of people and security of life and property. In addition, the Force has responsibility for the re-organization or re-establishment of an Armed Force for Chad and that of assisting in the supervision of general elections.

From its structure and programme of operation, the task before the Force would surely not be an easy one to accomplish. Its overall success would largely depend on the level of commitment and discipline of its leadership and the entire military personnel. They should see their assignment in Chad as a call to serve Africa in a capacity that would give the continent and indeed the OAU the world-wide recognition for competence and capability to handle and solve our prob-

lems.

Although, the situation in Chad is basically an African problem, it should be emphasised that the world community to which Chad and her people rightly belong must not be seen to be indifferent to the initiative of the OAU. This means that the OAU should be given every possible assistance by the United Nations, other International organisations and friendly countries that believe in the restoration of permanent peace and normalcy to that country.

But in seeking for and accepting such assistance, it should be made very clear that for the transitional period of the presence of the OAU Neutral Force in Chad, any indication for help must be properly channelled through the appropriate designated machinery. This is to ensure that there would be no conflicts in their purpose of intent. As the OAU goes through the final phase of sending its troops to Chad, one point that seems distressing however is the reported fighting at a section of the country.

No matter the intentions of those responsible for such renewed unpleasant incidents, their action needs to be totally condemned by all peace loving people. In the interest of peace and concord in Chad, all differences and conflicts, whether influenced from within or outside Chad, must be abandoned to create a healthy atmosphere for the reconstruction and rehabilitation of the country and its economy. after 15 years of bitter fighting among political rivals.

One point that needs to be stressed is that the Government in Chad at the moment is a transitional administration. This means that when the right atmosphere is restored, hopefully in the next few months, the people of Chad would be assisted to elect a permanent government.

WAEC And Its Problems

-Need For Shake-Up Stressed

FOR some time now the conduct of examinations by the West African Examinations Council (WAEC) has generated a lot of concern all over the country. It has been the subject of debate in most of our legislative houses, and it has warranted uncompromising remarks from members of the public.

The argument by the House was that many candidates for the last examination were just receiving their results and those of them who were not successful should have the opportunity of sitting for the next examinations. But on a much larger scale, many people already have shaky confidence in WAEC because of the spate of exam leakages in the country. This has been of great concern to the generality of Nigerians. Coupled with this are the incessant delays in the release of examinations results.

The issue of Examination leakages reached an alarming proportion in

1977, and consequently provoked the Federal Government to institute the Sogbétun Judicial Commission to inquire into the activities of the Council. The Judicial Commission made far-reaching recommendations, among which was the suggestion that WAEC be relieved of some of its onerous responsibilities for the conduct of certain examinations.

Towards this end, the responsibility for the conduct of the first school Leaving Certificate examinations and the Public Service examinations were passed on to the various ministries of education and the administrative staff College of Nigeria (ASCON) respectively. But this has failed so far to provide the expected solution and therefore the problems of the Council has continued unabated. A careful diagnosis of the problem of the Council reveals some of its root causes.

One of the major problems of WAEC can be attributed to the phenomenal growth in the number of

candidates taking the Council's conducted examination. By last year, WAEC was conducting examinations for more than 187,000 candidates while this year the Council examined more than 240,000 candidates.

It is envisaged that the number will continue to rise astronomically. Coupled with this problem is the great number of examinations the Council conducts. Even though it has been relieved of the burden for the conduct of some of these examinations, there is no doubt that the Council still has more than what it can shew. This is one area that should be properly examined again.

Right now, it is being suggested that the Federal Government can set up parallel examination bodies to handle some of the examinations currently being conducted by the Council. This would relieve WAEC of its heavy work load and increase its overall efficiency thereby enhancing its ability to monitor properly the conduct of its examinations.

Even with that, WAEC will still have to work out a better arrangement with its examiners. While many of them are highly efficient, it is known that some of them had failed in the past to return examination scripts to WAEC in time for compilation of results. There have been occasions in the past when the Council had to resort to press publications, to track down some of its examiners. Such situations had proved embarrassing to the Council, the examiners concerned and the nation as a whole.

On the whole, it would appear as if the time has indeed come to subject the WAEC to a new scrutiny and if found desirable, a whole new legislation could be passed to regulate its activities. The suggestion is borne out of the pervasive feeling that it should be possible for any examination body in this country to be made to justify the confidence reposed in it.

Home Made Goods

—Exhibition Staged To Stimulate Interest

THE FIRST made-in-Nigeria Consumer and Industrial goods trade fair has ended in Lagos leaving foreigners and even Nigerians better informed about the quality and variety of made-in-Nigeria products as well as the level of industrialisation of the Nigerian economy.

The Fair, which was organised by the Federal Ministry of Commerce in conjunction with the manufacturers Association of Nigeria aimed at stimulating public interest in products manufactured in Nigeria to enhance patronage for them.

Looking at the various goods displayed, at their stands, many visitors to the exhibition soon realised that Nigeria had come a long way technologically. This is evident from the fact that in 1959, the contribution of the manufacturing sectors to the gross domestic products (GDP) was a meagre 81 million Naira or four per cent of the GDP.

Activities in this sector were primarily concerned with the processing of raw materials like rubber cropping and palm oil for exports. However, a decade later, the value had risen to 25.8 million Naira or 8.4% of the GDP.

Today the contribution of the sector to the gross domestic product has reached ten per cent. More important is the fact that Nigeria has changed from a manufacturer of raw materials to such goods as refrigerator, television, textile materials, food, beverages,

tobacco, chemical products and other manufacturing activities.

These products too have attained a high degree of sophistication that could not have been expected a few years back. This fact is still unknown to some Nigerians. Because of this ignorance of the industrial capabilities of the country on the part of some consuming public, there is a regrettable tendency among Nigerians to show preference for foreign goods.

There is also a wide-spread unfounded belief that Nigerian made goods are of poor quality. This misconception can be attributed to insufficient enlightenment on the part of the people. The truth is that most locally manufactured goods compared favourably with those produced abroad.

This is, as it should be, as most goods are produced under licence agreement with internationally renowned companies which have a stake in seeing that the licences maintain high standards. A few companies might deviate from the expected standards, this is understandable, realising that as a new-comer to the world of industry, Nigeria is bound to go through some initial problems.

There is a need for consumers to understand the problems of the manufacturers and to give them their full support by patronising their products. The question of patronage brings to mind the case of Japan. Some years back, goods made in Japan were of

very poor quality yet, many Japanese patronised locally made goods if only on grounds of patriotism. Today, Japan is a leading producer of quality goods. Nigerians should now curb their taste for imported goods and buy made-in-Nigeria goods.

After all, Nigerians stand to gain more if this stand is taken. For one thing, the move will help conserve foreign exchange as the amount of imported goods will be reduced considerably and the amount so gained can be spent on providing needed amenities.

These people who feel their Nigerian goods are inferior should buy these goods and taste of the inferiority of defect if any, and pass their complaints to the Nigerian Standard Organisation or Manufacturers' Association. Such suggestions and complaints will assist the manufacturers to improve on their product to the satisfaction of all.

By and large, it will help eliminate the activities of these people who smuggle shoddy goods into the country. Imported items keep people from that country gainfully employed while it encourages the closure of some local factories, resulting in unemployment of many Nigerians. This is the time for Nigerians to be proud of home made products. The manufacturers must be encouraged or else, the noble objectives of the Nigeria Enterprises Promotion Decree of 1977 would be defeated.

THE MASS MEDIA

—What Should Be Their Societal Role

FOR MOST people at the helm of affairs in this country, the mass media can make all the difference in their political career. This perception of the power of the media has increasingly brought a lot of pressure to bear on the mass media practitioners. It has even intensified the race towards the proliferation of mass media since everybody wants to be heard.

From all these, what has come out in bold relief is a kind of controversy over the behaviour of government-owned mass media. The attention is specifically focused on those media because of the general feeling that they are being run with the tax-payers' money. The position of some privately owned media is understandable as they are supposed to be serving the interest of particular pressure groups.

In the case of government-owned media, there are those people who held the view that they are not playing the role expected of them. By and large, the trend of the arguments suggests that opinions are divided on what the Federal and State government mass media ought to be doing.

On the one hand, we have politicians who believe that the Federal government-owned media deliberately block them out while making all the space there is available to Federal government functionaries. Those people have also complained that any time their stories had a chance of getting into those media, they were distorted. This is the view held by the governors who meet once a month. In fact, there is hardly any of their communication that does not contain their complaints against the Federal government owned mass media.

On the other side are those who would like to draw the attention of the reading and listening public to the behaviour of some state-government-controlled media. These particular media organisations, they argued, are the hatchet lot which have never had a second thought about assailing every step taken by the Federal government. It is their considered opinion that these media practise nothing but adversary journalism.

Another aspect of the debate over

mass media performance in this country centres around the extent of control each government has on its media. Somehow, it is the Federal government that is always accused of exercising unlimited control on the operations of its mass media. The situation is such that the Presidential Adviser on Information had to state on many occasions that no one in the Federal government dictates to the media being accused of taking directives from the government.

It is in the light of this that some people have said that for the sake of balanced argument, how many editors of the state-owned media could afford to give prominence to stories emanating from people who hold alternative views apart from the ones held by the party in power in the states? The question is whether or not these editors can do so and get away with it.

In the midst of this controversy, it is becoming increasingly difficult to rely on just one source to find out what is exactly happening in the country. While a few mass media strive to tell the stories like they are, there are others which do not hesitate to tilt the balance of the stories to favour their sponsors.

The fear now is that the whole approach may be affecting profes-

sionalism in journalism. Already, the Vice President has complained that the standard of journalistic reporting may be falling in that less and less attention is being paid to grammar and syntax or the development of proper themes in stories.

What all these amount to is that media practitioners ought to find a more neutral ground on which they can operate even more effectively. That ground is the one that is usually stressed by policy makers and politicians. It is the one that enjoins media practitioners to drop the idea to publish and be damned and revert to the principle of publish to unite the nation.

COCK CROW AT DAWN

— Bongos Ikwue's Latest Success

BONGOS IKWE'S latest album 'Cock Crow at Dawn' has received a tremendous appeal from the public.

One noticeable point about this album is the strong effect of the sound of waterfall in the first track, which gives rise to a tingling taste of the tele-serial itself. This lingers on and fades off, as the spin glides into such supplementary tracks as 'Thank you', 'Show Me A Virgin' and 'What Right is Right'.

It is not surprising therefore to find the album topping the November chart as the best selling record just few weeks after its release. There is no doubt that the effective publicity given to the album has helped it to the top of the chart.

Ikwue has through this album proved that there are still a lot in stock, yet unreleased, to manifest his enviable strength in musical skill.

A six-track album, "Cock Crow At

Dawn" has strong melodies and lyrics with LARA! seemingly emerging as the strongest out. The orchestration is tight and gripping, for which quality the Groovies deserve much of the credit particularly Willie Nfor and Richard Cole (bass and drums), Reladay (lead-guitar) and Roul Sodji (rhythm guitar). There is also some tasty sound from Leslie Brunner (fender Rhodes piano) and Ayo Adeyemi (synthesizer).

The little track introduces and draws the curtain on the album. In between, are Lara!, Thank You, Show Me A Virgin, and What Right is Right. "Show Me A Virgin" is a sort of melange of every imaginable funk cliché, both lyrical and instrumental. The highlight of the album is without doubt Ikwue's vocal which is very soft and reflective, with Leslie Brunner's piano setting a delicate tranquil mood.

Ikwue's music is apt and unobstru-

sive, the tunes are model and monophonic while the rhythms are simple. Both elements are occasionally punctuated by refreshing little turns and surprises.

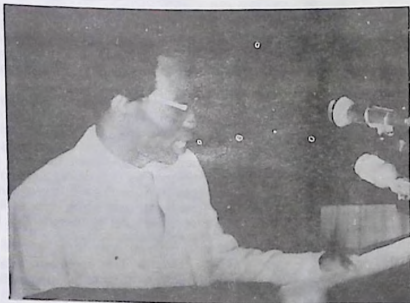

Traditional Medicine —Its Practitioner And Civilization

IN the second of his six-part serials of October Lectures, Dr. J. O. Mume, the Trade Medicalist and also the 1981 October Lecturer, treated readers to various therapies in Nigerian traditional medicine.

Readers are treated in this third part of the lectures to how civilization has given men a lot amenities and necessary pleasures of life with the left hand and how this same civilization has snatched them back with the right hand.

CIVILIZATION has been defined as the 'state of human society regarded as having reached a high level of intellectual, social, and cultural development'. To be civilized means to cause to come out of a savage or barbarous state! Civilization therefore becomes the very opposite of barbarism and should have education, culture, refinement, justice and truth at its very core.

But a look at the modern world causes one to reflect on the arresting question: Is civilization really a blessing or a curse to the human race? 'Despite his claim to civilization, man preys on man instead of concentrating his effort on the elimination of nature's

irregularities.

Modern science, with its so-called scientific achievements, has given man skyscrapers, television, the aeroplane and many other things. It has boosted medicine and enhanced our standard of living, all of which we regard as blessings to mankind. But is it not the same civilization, the so-called scientific achievements that have escalated modern warfare and man's brutality to man? Civilization has given us many amenities and all necessary pleasures of life with the left hand and snatched them back with the right hand. With the aid of modern civilization, war gets more terrible than ever before.

What is civilized about a world with an unchecked plight of crime? What is civilized about nations of people that lack will-power and self control? Drug addiction flourishes and alcoholism afflicts the world. Scientific medicine is a product of modern civilization. Non-existent centuries ago, it has now blossomed into an academic science and an art which people of ancient times never dreamt of.

Strange as it is, as the skill of medical scientists and doctors increase, so have diseases increased too. The health

condition of the people of the world is worse today, in spite of the marvellous skill and efforts of modern medical men.

Centuries ago, when man had neither been exposed to modern civilization nor deviated from the system of healing, he lived longer. He has deviated from the path of cure to adopt the wonder drug system of synthetic products of scientific medicine.

If you are a regular reader of the obituary and 'in memoriam' columns of our national newspapers, your heart will be grieved at the high rate of mortality among our highly educated personalities? Can you imagine the causes of their premature deaths.

Most of these educated Nigerians die young, in spite of their financial positions; with all the modern amenities around them to make life pleasurable and the ready cash that is always available for them to seek proper medical care. Why do they have to die young. When their fathers who live in primitive surroundings are still living virile lives in the villages? If you ponder over these questions, perhaps you may have your own answers to give.

Why is it that our elite die young? Sometime ago, I consciously engaged in a sort of research work and was able to come out with the answer as to why

the mortality rate in present day society, with all its modern facilities, continues to be higher and higher than that of the peasant class of our fathers to whom the so-called blessings of modern living are unknown.

I have within the past 30 years of my life developed a strong faith in the efficacy of the methods and simple natural living advocated in traditional medicine in relation to longevity, civilization and the laws of nature. The more civilized a person becomes the more he tends to drift from the path of nature. It was King Solomon who said that "he who increaseth knowledge increaseth sorrow".

The modern trend of life which we now regard as civilization with its superficial amenities and the deviation from simple natural living are chiefly responsible for the premature deaths of our elites. Among some primitive races where the mode of life is simple and based on natural dieting, the people's health has been so remarkable that most people live to a ripe old age. The so-called civilized western way of living introduced in Africa has much to do with the increased incidence of elite mortality in our country today.

What is helping to kill the civilized race today can be summarised as follows: eating of devitalized and processed foods; bad working conditions; the stresses and strains encountered in industry and commerce, the activities of the individual himself, such as wrong habits of living; over indulgence in eating, drinking, sex, excessive ambition and drugs.

In contrast, the empirical record of the confident, purposeful lives of our fathers who live in rural areas, as well as the lives of those who follow the path of natural living today, proves that good health and longevity depend upon obedience to natural law. Our fathers slept beside the fire to encourage heat in the body. Heat is a source of energy and longevity. Heat emanating from fire can stimulate the vital force of the body. When the vital force of the individual is functioning actively it can overcome disease and death.

When the life force becomes inactive, diseases of civilization such as diabetes, hypertension, obesity, stomach ulcers, nervous breakdown, follow sooner or later. These diseases are not common among our fathers who live in the villages. The peasant village dwellers obey the laws of tradition and nature more than the

so called civilized and educated people of today.

These diseases are not common among our fathers who live in the villages. The peasant village dwellers obey the laws of traditional and nature more than the so-called civilized and educated people of today. They deliberately, out of pride, violate the most essential rules of health, enslaving themselves in artificialism which help to kill them.

Our fathers in the villages drink stream and well water and eat more of traditional foods, yet they are stronger and live longer than those who drink fluoridized pipeborne water and keep all the rules of hygiene. Our fathers when sick would prefer to go to the forest and use plants and trees to seek a cure, for they believe that nature cures more than drugs.

Drugs destroy the vital force of the body. Herbs stimulate it. No one can cheat nature and get away freely. However, another of the causes of premature death of our elites can be found in the fact that the more prosperous and well placed a man becomes, the more he becomes the target of envy and an object of diabolic attack by evil men and women.

Critics might say that traditional medicine cannot be documented as a body of scientific knowledge; that

much of it is oral tradition and that its practice is a trial and error affair. Traditional doctors, they argue, lack the know-how and technical facilities for accurate diagnosis of disease; and that they rely mostly on guess work which proves inaccurate at times.

Traditional doctors and the millions of their clients and patients know that these criticisms are baseless and un-informed. Traditional doctors are not as ignorant as their critics would want the public to believe. Traditional doctors have a system of teaching anatomy, physiology, and pathology in their mother tongues and if interpreted into universal language will be accepted by all scholars.

A traditional system of diagnosing diseases which is simple and reliable has been long established. Traditional medicine diagnoses disease through its outward manifestations, and every disease, be it cancer, gonorrhoea, insanity, jaundice has its own outward manifestations which can easily be recognised by an experienced traditional medical doctor.

Despite the enormous scientific knowledge and technical facilities at the disposal of orthodox medical doctors, the fact still remains that diagnoses carried out independently and separately on one patient with modern scientific equipment can sometimes be conflicting.

The ancient world stood out as superior in its time, because it struck faithfully to the frame-work of the

knowledge and the truth in the law given through our culture and through nature, which civilized man now scorns.

Thousands of ailing men and women strive in vain for better health by

depending entirely on drugs. Our quest for better health should be based on obedience to the laws of nature and a strict adherence to a good way of living. Alcoholic drinks, smoking, eating of refined and processed food

should be avoided.

There is no topic pertaining to health that is of greater interest to me than the question of diet. I believe that the right kind and correct amounts of food taken at regular hours are useful curative agents. Not only the sick but also the healthy must have the right kind of food if they wish to retain a high standard of good health.

Hatred, jealousy, strife and aggressive attitude can have adverse effect on our health. To develop and preserve good health, we must learn to love one another. We must learn to live in peace. Some people have had heart attacks and nervous breakdowns because of anxiety, worry and the inordinate ambition to become great. Others have become too business conscious and bent on getting rich overnight that they hardly find time to sleep or relax. Relaxation is, without doubt, very essential to good health!

Marital problems and quarrels between a man and his wife can ruin the health of both of them and so these must be avoided as much as possible.

Unless we learn to find answers to these problems and to live simple and temperate lives, our health is bound to suffer and it will be an unfortunate price to pay for modern civilization which we all seem to be enjoying without really counting the cost.

ENUGU SEMINAR

- Periscoping Technological Future

THE IMPORTANCE of the Enugu Seminar lies in the fact that it was another attempt to focus attention on the significance of technology as a veritable tool of nation building.

It is necessary to readily concede the fact that present global inequalities have been greatly influenced and complicated by the level of technological development between the developed and developing nations. It has often been argued that much of the relative backwardness of the so-called third world is consequent upon the inability to harness local resources for the development of relevant technology.

Much has also been said about the need for the transfer of technology from the developed countries of the West to the third world. However, the point being missed in such talks is that the phrase transfer of technology is a confused and sometimes ambiguous term. Ordinarily the transfer of technology would involve the acquisition of knowledge and equipment.

Technological equipment can easily be purchased and transferred from one country to another provided the financial resources for such purchase are

readily available. On the other hand technical knowledge can only be transferred through a process of learning, adaptation and application, depending on the resourcefulness of the people in question.

However, it is important to note that the technological expertise of the developed countries was not transferred from anywhere. This is a fact that must never be overlooked in our continued quest for the transfer of technology. The technical expertise of the developed countries was achieved through the resourcefulness of the peoples concerned and by a continuous process of learning and the harnessing of local resources. This ingenuity is what has been lacking in most third world countries.

In the case of Nigeria, there is a readily available local base that needs to be harnessed and adapted to ensure further development. Quite unfortunately the apparent total embrace of foreign technology and cultural values has over the years resulted in the neglect of indigenous methods and crafts. For instance in medicine, there has been significant official ridicule and contempt for our traditional health

care methods,

Even though it is known that traditional health care methods have succeeded in many cases where the application of modern medicine has proved futile. This apparent neglect is in the face of attempts by the World Health Organisation (WHO) at emphasising the need to incorporate relevant traditional medicine with modern health care methods. In fact, the regional office of WHO for Africa had a meeting in Accra, Ghana and an important outcome of the meeting was the call for more research into traditional medicine in Africa.

Apart from this neglect of local technology, there is also lack of encouragement of local scientific talents. In the recent past, there have been

reports about some of these talents building such complex equipment as radio transmitters and aeroplanes entirely through personal effort. In all such cases, the financial resources to develop and improve upon their inventions has been lacking. Research Institutions that ought to locate these people and prop them on hardly show much interest.

Nevertheless, all is not lost as the relatively new Federal Ministry of Science and Technology will be expected to deal with this question of the development of indigenous technology. Also, there is little doubt that the private sector has an important role to play. What the government needs to do is to take the initiative of encouraging private companies to invest some percentage of their annual profits in research harnessing of local technology.

At least it has been suggested that there is much that the rest of the world can learn and acquire from Nigerian indigenous technology. But the development of such crafts and technology depends on Nigerians. It must however be noted that for such forums to achieve any relevance, they must be organised regularly in various parts of the country.

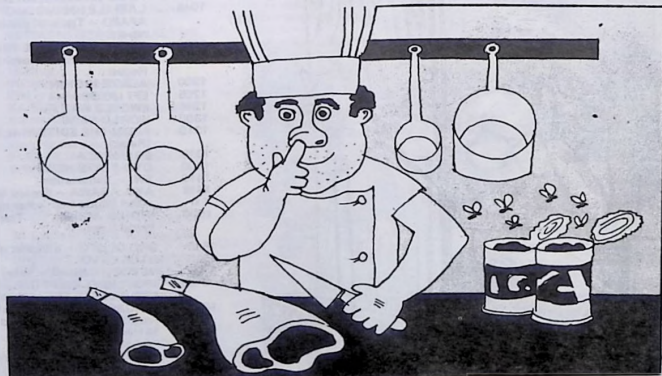

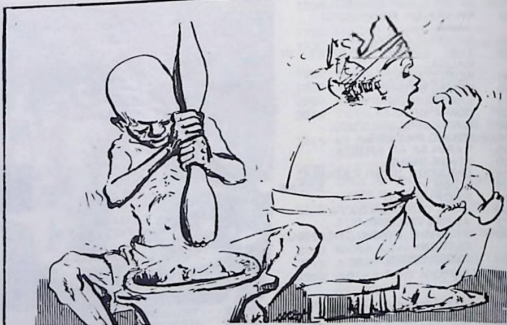

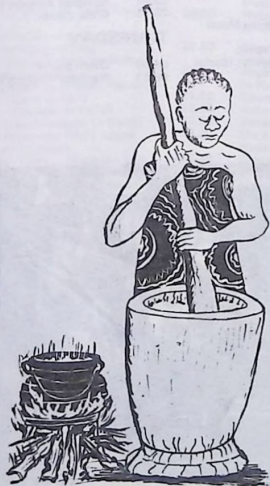
