WHEREAS by the Ordinance entitled No. 5, of

1886, "An Ordinance providing for a subsidy in aid of the construction of a certain Telegraph Line out of the Revenue of the Colony," it was enacted that there should be granted to the Imperial Government out of the Revenue of the Colony, One thousand Pounds sterling per annum for twenty years as a subsidy in aid of the construction from the Island of St. Vincent to the West Coast of Africa, and the annual payment of such sum for the period aforesaid should be a charge upon the Revenue of the Colony from a date to be declared by the Governor in writing under his hand to be published in Government Gazette of the Colony;

AND WHEREAS it is expedient that the payment of the said subsidy should commence from the 4th day of September, 1886.

NOW THEREFORE, be it known to all whom it may concern that the payment of the said subsidy shall commence from the said 4th day of September, 1886.

The following letter from Sir James Marshall, C.M.G., Executive Commissioner, Colonial and Indian Exhibition is published for general information.

His Excellency the Acting Administrator trusts that those interested in the trade and prosperity of Lagos will give careful consideration to Sir James Marshall's remarks in reference to the products of the Colony as it would appear to His Excellency that much may be done to develop a remunerative trade in many of the articles enumerated.

Sir,

I have much pleasure in acknowledging the receipt of your Excellency's telegram of September 21st, conveying to me the information that government gave its adhesion to the scheme for a permanent Imperial Institute.

I at once forwarded this telegram to Sir Philip Cunliffe Owen, who laid it before His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales, and I am authorised by Sir Philip to inform you that the Prince expressed his gratification and pleasure at the manner in which Lagos has responded to his appeal.

2. I beg also to express my own great pleasure and satisfaction at the contents of the telegram which is an additional proof of the public spirit which has characterised Lagos throughout the Exhibition.

3. No details of the formation and management of the proposed Institute have yet been furnished to me but I feel confident that an Institute of the kind will prove of great use in the way of developing trade in the productions and industries of Lagos and its neighbourhood.

4. I beg your Excellency will take means to advise the people at once to prepare to stock the future Lagos Court with such articles as they wish to find a market for.

There is a good opening for the sale of cloths and similar fabrics provided the colours are obtained by vegetable dyes—Unfortunately many of them now here prove to be coloured with aniline dyes which makes them of no commercial value.

With the exception of the blue, almost all the other dyes appear to be of the aniline kind.

5. The grass cloths and mats are much admired and will I expect find a good market, and carved calabashes.

6. The baskets are in request and if they can be packed so as to avoid heavy freight I think they may prove profitable to the Senders.

7. In the way of produce I advise attention being given to fibres and vegetable dyes as well as oils and rubber, samples may continue to be sent directed to me here, as well as any letters asking for or giving information. But of course samples will not be of use unless orders can be executed for a supply in bulk.

8. Curiosities in the way of Masks, figures, brass work &c., will also command a sale at all events for a time.

9. I must not omit the leather work which is also admired especially as the colours are genuine.

10. I do not yet know when the Exhibition will be re-opened but as soon as I have information on that and other points I will let it be known.

WHEREAS by the "Foreign Deserters Act, 1852," it is provided that, whenever it is made to appear to Her Majesty that due facilities are or will be given for recovering and apprehending seamen who desert from British merchant ships in the territories of any foreign power, Her Majesty may by Order in Council, stating that such facilities are or will be given, declare that seamen, not being slaves, who desert from merchant ships belonging to a subject of such power, when within Her Majesty's dominions, shall be liable to be apprehended, and carried on board their respective ships, and may limit the operation of such order, and may render the operation thereof subject to such conditions and qualifications, if any, as may be deemed expedient.

And whereas it has been made to appear to Her Majesty that due facilities will be given for recovering and apprehending seamen who desert from British merchant ships in the dominions and possessions of the Republic of the Equator.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by virtue of the power vested in Her by the said "Foreign Deserters Act, 1852," and by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to order and declare and it is hereby ordered and declared, that from and after the publication hereof in the *London Gazette*, seamen, not being slaves, and not being British Subjects, who, within Her Majesty's dominions, desert from merchant ships belonging to the Republic of the Equator, shall be liable to be apprehended and carried on board their respective ships.

Provided always, that if any such deserter has committed any crime in Her Majesty's dominions, he may be detained till he has been tried by a competent court, and until his sentence, if any, has been carried into effect.

And the Secretary of State for the Home Department, the Secretary of State for the Colonies, and the Secretary of State for India in Council, are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

## PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty has been pleased to make an Order in Council constituting the Supreme Court of Judicature of the Gold Coast Colony a Court of Appeal for hearing and determining Appeals from the Judgments, Decrees, Orders, sentences and decisions of the Supreme Court of Judicature of the Colony of Lagos, and directing that the said Order shall be proclaimed in the Colony of Lagos at such time and at such place as the Officer Administering the Government thereof shall direct.

NOW, THEREFORE, I do hereby Proclaim, publish and make known the said Order in Council to all whom it may concern.

AT THE COURT AT BALMORAL,

The 24th day of September, 1886.

PRESENT,

THE QUEEN'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by certain Letters Patent bearing date the 13th day of January 1886, Her Majesty was pleased to make separate provision for the Government of Her Settlement of Lagos theretofore comprised within the Gold Coast Colony, and to erect the said Settlement into a separate Colony to be called the Colony of Lagos:

AND WHEREAS by certain other Letters Patent also bearing date the 13th day of January, 1886, Her Majesty was pleased to declare that the Gold Coast Colony should consist of Her Settlements on the Gold Coast as therein described and did thereby make provision for the Government thereof:

AND WHEREAS in and by each of the said Letters Patent, Her Majesty did reserve to Herself, Her heirs and successors, Her and their undoubted right, with the advice of Her or their Privy Council, from time to time to make all such Laws or Ordinances as might appear to Her or them ne-

cessary for the peace, order, and good Government of the Colony to which the said Letters Patent respectively related:

AND WHEREAS it appears to Her Majesty necessary to constitute the Supreme Court of Judicature of the Gold Coast Colony, a Court of Appeal for hearing and determining appeals from the judgments, decrees, orders, sentences, and decisions of the Supreme Court of Judicature of the Colony of Lagos, and that from and after the Proclamation of such Order in Council in each of the said Colonies, any person or persons may appeal from any judgment, decree, order, sentence, or decision of the Supreme Court of Judicature of the Colony of Lagos to the Supreme Court of Judicature of the Gold Coast Colony, and that such last-mentioned Court shall have jurisdiction to hear and determine such appeals, in such manner, within such time, and under and subject to such rules and limitations as the last-mentioned Court, with the approval of one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, shall from time to time prescribe or appoint.

NOW THEREFORE it is hereby ordered by the QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty with the advice of Her Privy Council, as follows:

1. The Supreme Court of Judicature of the Gold Coast Colony is hereby constituted a Court of Appeal for hearing and determining appeals from the judgments, decrees, orders, sentences, and decisions of the Supreme Court of Judicature of the Colony of Lagos.

2. This Order shall be proclaimed in the Gold Coast Colony and in the Colony of Lagos, at such time and at such place as the Governor, Lieutenant-Governor, or other officer administering the Government thereof respectively shall direct, and from and after the date of the latest of such Proclamations the said Court of Appeal shall have jurisdiction to hear and determine appeals from any judgment, decree, order, sentence, or decision of the Supreme Court of Judicature of Lagos thereafter given or pronounced for or in respect of any sum or matter at issue of, or above the amount or value of fifty pounds sterling (50*l.*), or involving directly or indirectly any claim, demand, or question to or respecting property or any civil right amounting to or of the value of fifty pounds sterling (50*l.*).

3. Any person or persons may appeal in any such case to the said Court in such manner within such time and subject to such rules and limitations as the same Court, with the approval of one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State shall from time to time prescribe or appoint.

4. Nothing herein contained doth or shall extend or be construed to extend to take away or abridge the undoubted right and authority of Her Majesty, Her heirs, and successors, upon the humble petition of any person or persons aggrieved by any judgment or determination of the said Supreme Court of Judicature of Lagos at any time

to admitt his, her, or their appeal therefrom, upon such terms and upon such securities, limitations, restrictions, and regulations, as Her Majesty Her heirs and successors shall think fit, and to reverse, correct, or vary such judgment or determination as to Her Majesty, Her heirs, and successors shall seem meet.

And the Right Honorable EDWARD STANHOPE one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
