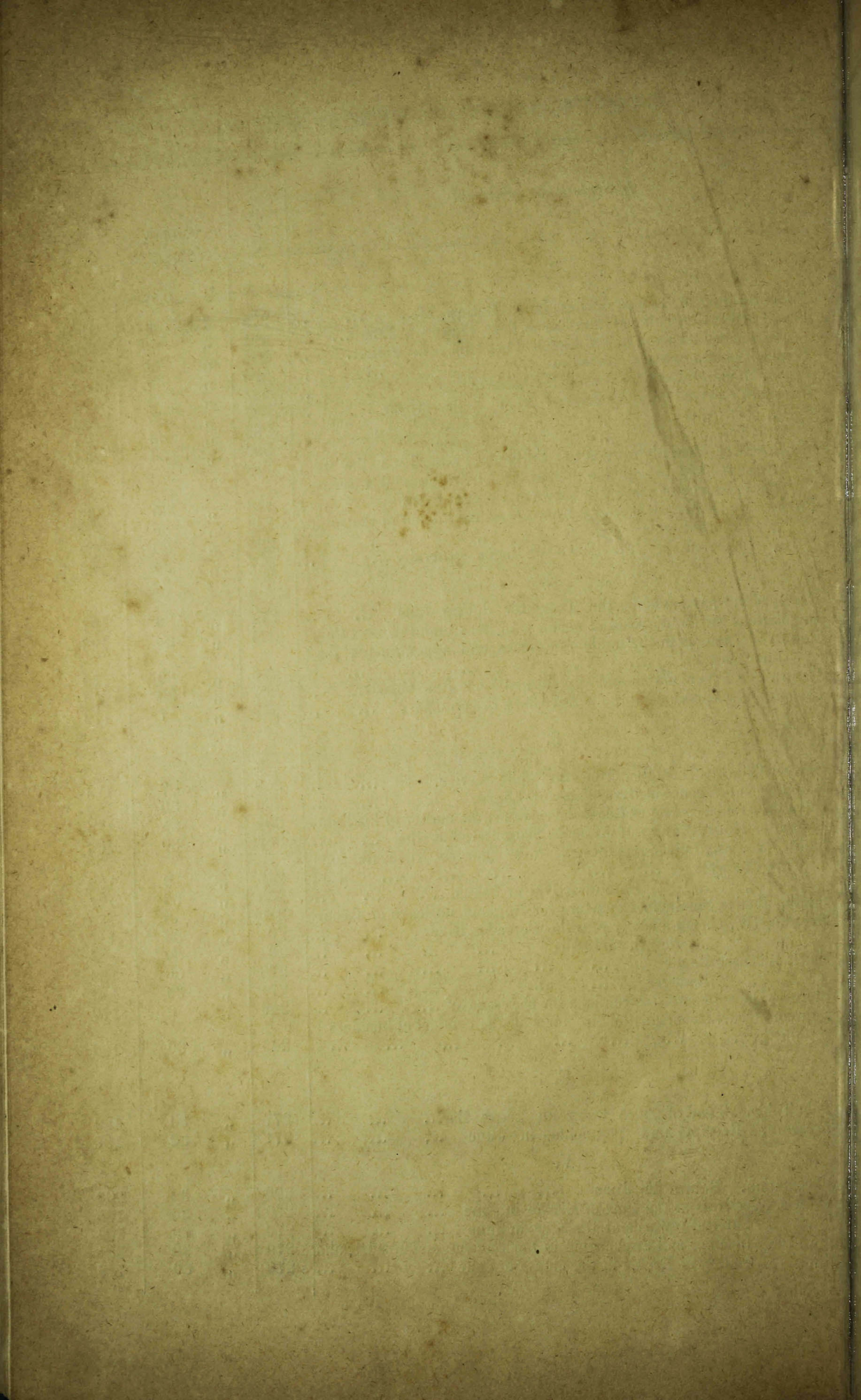

REGULATIONS FOR THE DISPOSAL OF BUSINESS IN THE DISTRICT
COMMISSIONER'S COURT. LAGOS.

1. All *Civil* Summonses that are applied for
On Tuesday or Wednesday will be made returnable for Saturday,
On Thursday or Friday will be made returnable for Tuesday,
On Saturday or Monday will be made returnable for Thursday.
2. All *Criminal* Summonses that are applied for
On Monday or Tuesday will be made returnable for Friday,
On Wednesday or Thursday will be made returnable for Monday,
On Friday or Saturday will be made returnable for Wednesday.
3. When the party applying for the Summons is anxious to have it made returnable on an earlier day than the one indicated above, he can apply through the Deputy Registrar for special leave for the purpose.
4. At each sitting of the Court, Police cases—in which arrests have been made without warrant and the prisoners have not been admitted to bail—will take precedence of all summons cases both civil and Criminal,
5. Before any motion can be made, notice thereof must be given to the Deputy Registrar. The Court will then either dispose of the motion, or fix a day for hearing after notice to the opposite party.
6. Affidavits under Section 12 of "The Marriage Ordinance 1885" will be taken, and consents under Section 21 of that Ordinance will be attested, at the commencement of the sitting of the Court every Wednesday.
7. All other affidavits and declarations will be taken at the commencement of each sitting of the Court.
N.B. It is requested that the Jurats be left blank; they will then be written in by the Deputy Registrar.
8. No affidavit or declaration will be taken, application entertained, or other business transacted, at the residence of District Commissioner, unless the matter be of a particularly urgent nature, and special leave for the purpose be obtained on application through the Deputy Registrar.

IN THE SUPREME COURT OF THE COLONY OF LAGOS.

DEPARTMENTAL DIRECTIONS.

1. No Writs of Summons, or other Summonses, Warrants, Writs of Execution, or Subpœnas shall—except by special order of the Court—be issued, until all the fees payable thereon, including the Hearing fee and the fee for service (if any,) shall have been paid, and an account thereof set forth in the margin and counterfoil of the process.
2. All such fees shall be carried to account immediately on the process being signed by the Judge or District Commissioner as the case may be.
3. All fees and fines shall be paid into the Treasury on Mondays and Thursdays in each week, to be paid on the last day of each calendar month.
4. No Hearing fee or other fee shall under any circumstances be returned except upon a Voucher payable at the Treasury in favour of the party entitled to receive the same signed by the Judge or

District Commissioner, as the case may be, before whom the cause or matter is set down and comes on for hearing.

5. All other fees soever payable in any cause or proceeding before the Court, or upon any motion or application for Judicial relief or assistance, or upon affidavits or certificates, or in respect of any other matter not otherwise or specially provided for, in which any fees are, or may become payable under or by virtue of any Statute or Ordinance now in force, or which may hereafter become law in the Colony, shall be paid and received in the manner following that is to say:—

The Registrar or Deputy Registrar shall affix to the paper or document a stamp or stamps equivalent to the amount of the fee payable thereon and received by him.

In the case of Affidavits, Declarations, Certificates or other Documents, the Judge, District Commissioner, or other Officer before whom the same are taken, sworn, declared or certified, shall forthwith cancel the stamp by writing across the same his initials or name.

Where any paper or document is intended to be brought or tendered in evidence, or otherwise used in any proceeding before the Court, the stamp or stamps representing the fees payable and paid in respect thereof for filing or otherwise shall be affixed by the Registrar or Deputy Registrar as the case may be, and shall remain uncanceled until so presented, used, tendered or brought in evidence before the Judge or District Commissioner who shall forthwith cancel the same.

The paper or document so stamped shall be filed with the records in the cause or proceeding before the Court.

The Registrar shall obtain such stamps as may be required from the Colonial Treasurer upon requisition in the following form:

The Registrar and Deputy Registrar shall from time to time and at such times as shall be required by the Regulations of the Treasury Department or as may be directed by the Court, duly account for the stamps as received and submit their accounts to be audited and settled by the auditor, subject to such Regulations and directions as aforesaid.

6. In all cases where money is paid into Court under the provisions of Order XXII schedule 3 of the Supreme Court Ordinance 1876 the party paying in the same shall be entitled to, and the Registrar or Deputy Registrar as the case may be shall give to such party, a receipt which may be in the form following;

7. When any District Commissioner in the exercise of his jurisdiction in criminal matters shall award to any person a sum of money by way of damages or compensation, the party ordered or directed to pay such sum of money as aforesaid shall pay the same and the same shall be paid, in the first instance, into Court, and shall not be paid out to the party entitled to receive the same until the return of Criminal charges disposed of has been submitted to and approved by the Judge of the Colony, and the District Commissioner shall make a note in his Return in every such instance to the effect that the money has been so paid into Court—*vide* Summary Review Ordinance No. 7 of 1884.

8. The offices of the Supreme Court shall be opened to the Public between the hours of 8 and 11 a.m., and 2 and 4 p.m., on every day of the year, except Sundays, New Year's Day, Good Friday, the Anniversary of the Birth-day of Her Majesty the Queen, The Anniversary of the Birth-day of His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales, Christmas-day, and the 26th of December, and excepting during such times as the Courts shall be sitting.

The offices of the Supreme Court will be closed to the Public on Saturdays at 12.

246 *Rules for the guidance of Departmental Heads responsible for the Custody and issue of Government Stores, for the Colony of Lagos.*

1. There shall be in future a regular system of Store Account, and therefrom a systematic check on the consumption of Public Stores.

2. There shall be, as later laid down, a regular systematic record of their expenditure, and half yearly and surprise surveys or stock takings of balances in hand at Head Quarters and Out-stations. Attached Form marked *A*. shall on such occasions be used.

3. For the safe custody and proper disposal of Government Stores, the Head of the particular department shall be primarily responsible.

4. The Officer in immediate and regular charge of Receipts and Issues shall give Bond in such amount as may be decided by the Governor.

5. There shall be kept by every Officer in immediate charge of daily expenditure a daily record of Receipts and Issues in a journal as per form supplied *B*, from which he will post or see posted the contents, in the General Ledger if at Head Quarters, or in the District Ledger if at an out-station.

6. There shall be kept a Ledger as per form attached *C*, (to be later supplied in Books) in which shall be classified the Receipts and Issues under the respective kinds of stores.

7. Classified Abstracts of Receipts and issues shall be furnished half yearly to the Auditor by the responsible Head, or at such other times as he may desire.

In the case of Stores received, they are represented by supplies through Crown Agents, or local.

As regards former, Receipt Voucher for each debit Entry shall be a certified copy, on Form attached *D*; Invoice; certificate of Issue shall be signed by Collector of Customs at Head Quarters, by his representative at an Out-station. As regards latter, a like form shall be filled up from Counterfoil attached *E*; approved Requisition; certificate of Issue shall be signed by Head and of receipt by Officer in immediate charge.

8. Every Issue should be supported by a Voucher Form *E*. attached.

9. On every issue of stores of any kind from one station to another, one Issue and one Receipt Voucher Form *F* & *G*. should be prepared and signed by the Issuing Officer as letters of advice to the Receiving Officer. The latter will verify and sign both forms, and return the Issue Voucher to the Issuing Officer who will file it as his receipt. The receipt Voucher will be retained and filed by the Receiving Officer.

10. When stores are issued for consumption or final use, the expenditure Voucher will be filled up and signed by the Officer in immediate charge of the work and retained by the Issuing Officer. When stores returned and replaced in Store must be accompanied by a Receipt Voucher to be signed by the Receiving Officer.

11. The Auditor shall have access at any time to the various store accounts both at Head Quarters and the Districts. He shall be at liberty to make surprise surveys at any Station, whenever he may consider such surveys necessary.

12. The Auditor shall furnish annually to the Governor a report on the store accounts of the Colony.

14. It must be clearly understood that local purchases are only allowed as the exception and then only under pressing necessity. In this respect each Departmental Head responsible for the custody and issue of stores shall strictly adhere to C. O. Rule laying down that through the Crown Agents are to be obtained as far as practicable all supplies for the Government.

15. No expenditure represented by local purchases from time to time shall be allowed except on the approval in writing of the Governor. For this purpose each Department is supplied with a counterfoiled requisition Book consecutively numbered.

16. Such an approved requisition shall support the Merchants Bill, and payment Voucher. The Counterfoil shall be locally available for audit.

17. Any stores issued for repairs or conversion, as for instance, Wood issued for Manufacture of "office tables"—should be accounted for on the conversion Voucher Form *H.* attached.

18. As regards the care and disposition of Governmental property, the responsibility of Heads of Departments were pointed out in Circular of 11th February last.

19. In the Quarterly Inventories previously directed to be rendered, there have been added two Columns under the Headings "SERVICEABLE" and UN-SERVICEABLE."

20. Articles spoilt or worn out during a Quarter shall be kept together and be submitted after its close to a Board of Survey consisting of not less than three Public Officers of whom the Colonial Secretary shall in general be President.

21. It will be the duty of such Board to satisfy themselves whether Articles in question are Unserviceable and require to be replaced.

22. Every Board of Survey must furnish the Governor with a report of their proceedings. The Officer of the particular Department must remain debited with the Un-serviceable Articles until disposed of under authority.

23. The Board of Survey must give directions for having regularly sold by Public Auction, when the quantity accumulated in each Department shall render sale expedient, or when of no value otherwise disposed of, Un-serviceable Articles. Treasurer to be advised to ensure recovery.

24. It may happen that articles Un-serviceable in one Department may be utilised with Public advantage and economy in another: such a question shall be decided by the Board.

25. Requisition for this Quarterly Board shall emanate from Colonial Secretary.

26. These Rules shall come into operation on the 1st July, 1886.

27. In these Rules the term "The Governor" includes every person for the time being Administering the Government of the Colony.

At a Legislative Council held on the Seventeenth day of June, in the year of our Lord, one thousand, eight hundred and eighty-six.

Title

AN ORDINANCE to grant facilities for depositing small savings at interest with the security of the Revenue of the Colony of Lagos for due re-payment thereof.

Preamble.

WHEREAS it is expedient to grant facilities for the deposit of small savings and to make the Treasury of this Colony available for that purpose and to give the security of the Revenues of this Colony to every depositor of such savings for re-payment of all monies so deposited by him together with the interest due thereon :

Enacting Clause.

Be it therefore enacted by the Governor of the Colony of Lagos, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows :

Colonial Treasurer to receive deposits.

1. It shall be lawful for the Colonial Treasurer, and he is hereby directed to receive deposits of money to be paid into the Colonial Treasury and to repay the same under such regulations as the Governor, with the concurrence of the Legislative Council, may prescribe in that respect. Provided always that no such deposits shall be of less amount than one shilling.

Legal title of depositor to repayment.

2. Every deposit received by the Colonial Treasurer shall be entered by him, at the time of receiving the same, in the depositor's book, and such entry shall be attested by the Colonial Treasurer and by the dated stamp of his Office, and the attestation by the Colonial Treasurer shall be conclusive evidence of the claim of such depositor to the re-payment of his deposit, with interest thereon, upon demand made by him upon the Colonial Treasurer,

Depositors, entitled to re-payment not later than seven days after demand made.

3. On demand made upon the Colonial Treasurer by the depositor or party legally authorised to claim on account of a deposit made in such form as shall be prescribed in that behalf for re-payment of any deposit or any part thereof the depositor shall be absolutely entitled to re-payment out of the monies in the Colonial Treasury of any sum that may be demanded by and due to him within seven days at furthest after his demand shall be made of the Colonial Treasurer as aforesaid.

Names of depositors &c., not to be disclosed.

4. No person appointed to carry this Ordinance into effect shall disclose the name of any depositor, or the amount which may be deposited or withdrawn by any depositor, except to such person or persons as may be appointed to assist in carrying this Ordinance into operation, and any Officer so offending shall forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding One hundred pounds sterling.

Rate of Interest payable to Depositors.

5. The interest payable to the parties making such deposits shall be at the rate of Two pounds Ten shillings per centum per annum, but such interest shall not be calculated on any amount less than One pound, or sum multiple thereof, and shall not commence until the first day of the calendar month next following the day of deposit, and shall cease on the first day of the calendar month in which such deposit shall be withdrawn.

Interest on deposits shall be calculated on the 31st day of December every year, and shall be added to and become part of the principal money.

Interest how calculated.

The monies paid as aforesaid into the Colonial Treasury under the authority of this Ordinance shall, so far as practicable, be invested in England in such one or more securities yielding interest respectively as Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Colonies shall from time to time name: provided always that no part of such monies shall be applied in any way to the purposes of this Colony, or be invested in any loan of money raised or to be raised in this Colony for any purpose whatever.

Investment of monies received under this Ordinance.

It shall be lawful to raise any sum or sums of money that may from time to time be required for the re-payment as aforesaid of any deposits made in pursuance of this Ordinance by the sale or sales of the whole or a part of such securities as aforesaid. Provided that if at any time or times the monies arising from such sale or sales shall be insufficient to pay the lawful demands of every such depositor as aforesaid the Governor shall cause such deficiency to be paid out of the Revenues of this Colony and the Colonial Treasurer shall certify such deficiency to the Legislative Council without delay.

Securities in which deposits are invested may be sold when necessary.

Deficiency on sale to be made good out of the revenues of this Colony.

The income arising from the said securities shall be placed to the credit of the said Colony and be applied, so far as such income will permit, in the payment of interest as aforesaid on the deposits made under this Ordinance; and the profits (if any) that may from time to time arise in the execution of this Ordinance, shall be carried to the credit of the Revenues of this Colony and be deemed part of such Revenues and be applied accordingly.

Mode of application of income of securities.

The Governor may, with the consent of the Legislative Council of this Colony, make, and from time to time, as he shall see occasion, alter, regulations for superintending, inspecting, and regulating the mode of keeping and examining the accounts of depositors, and with respect to the making of deposits and to the withdrawal of deposits and interest and all other matters essential to the carrying this Ordinance into execution, and all regulations so made shall be binding on the parties interested in the subject-matter thereof in the same manner and to the same extent as if such regulations formed part of this Ordinance.

Governor with consent of Legislative Council to make regulations for keeping accounts.

An annual account of all deposits received and sums of money paid under the authority of this Ordinance, and of the expenses incurred during the year ended on the 31st day of December, together with a statement of the amount due at the close of the year to all depositors, shall be laid by the Colonial Treasurer before the Legislative Council of this Colony not later than the 1st of March ensuing in every year.

Accounts to be laid before Legislative Council.

All expenses incurred in the execution of this Ordinance shall be paid out of the Revenues of this Colony.

Expenses of advance.

This Ordinance may be cited as "The Treasury Savings Bank Ordinance, 1886."

Short title.

This Ordinance shall not come into operation unless and until the Governor Administering the Government notifies by Proclamation that it is Her Majesty's pleasure not to disallow the same, and subject as aforesaid it shall come into operation on the 1st day of January 1887, or as soon after that day as such Proclamation as aforesaid shall be made.

Suspending Clause.

Interpretation of term
"Governor."

15. In this Ordinance, the term "The Governor" shall include every person for the time being Administering the Government of the Colony.

Passed in the Legislative Council this Seventeenth day of June, in the year of our Lord, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six.

It has come to the knowledge of His Excellency that Money Orders for exceptionally large sums are being issued at the Lagos Post Office to one or more individuals. Such Orders have been drawn by one or more local persons payable to one or more elsewhere.

The practice exposed affords reason to fear that the Money Order System is being used by

Mercantile persons in Lagos for trade purposes a use to which it was not intended that Money Orders should be applied.

It will be convenient accordingly to have it generally understood that should it appear later, notwithstanding, that Money Orders are used by Mercantile persons either in the United Kingdom or in the Colony, for the transmission of large sums of money, the Authorities have the power to consider the propriety of increasing the Commission and even to wholly suspend for a time the issue of Money Orders.


