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## **Chapter 1**

# **SHOULD CHRISTIANS USE JEWELLERIES?**

I have been constantly asked concerning the matter of gold and jewellery, and I finally decided to do a teaching on this seemingly controversial discourse. Let's get into the Scriptures and see what it has to say.

### **GOLD IS GOOD!**

The Bible reveals that God created gold and that gold is good. If God calls it good, then we should not call it evil.

**GENESIS 2:10-12**

**10 A river flows out of Eden to water the garden and from there divides into four rivers.**

**11 The first is named Pishon; it flows through Havilah WHERE THERE IS GOLD.**

**12 THE GOLD OF THIS LAND IS GOOD.** The land is also known for a sweet-scented resin and the onyx stone.

The above passage is the first time that gold is mentioned in the Bible.

The second time the Bible speaks of gold is the first time silver is mentioned. It says that Abraham had an abundance of gold and silver, but nothing was said about what he was using them for; *"And Abram was very rich in cattle, in silver, and in gold"* (Genesis 13:2).

The third time that the Bible mentions gold is when Isaac, the son of Abraham wanted to marry Rebekah. So, the first use of gold recorded in the Bible is in connection with a marriage proposal to a woman and her adornment for the wedding. Not building of a house or temple as some would have us believe today. *"So it was, when the camels had finished drinking, that the man took a golden nose ring weighing half a shekel, and two bracelets for her wrists weighing ten shekels of gold, and said, "Whose daughter are you? Tell me, please, is there room in your father's house for us to lodge?"* (Genesis 24:22-23).

God doesn't see anything wrong with that. In fact, He later gave a picture of how He

would adorn His own bride with gold and jewellery in Ezekiel 16.

### **AN ILLUSTRATION OF ELECTRICITY**

Gold is not evil in itself, it is a good gift from God. When people use it to beautify things moderately and glorify God, it isn't a problem, but when they turn it into idols, it becomes a problem.

Take for example, electricity isn't evil in itself, but what one does with it could be good or evil. If you fry a meal for someone using electricity, you've done well, but if you fry that person with electricity, you've done evil. Either way, electricity has done nothing, you've only used it to do what's in your own heart.

Also, electricity cannot refuse you because it is your subject. Hence, the problem isn't with electricity but with you. Electricity isn't a demon! One way people corrupt God's gifts is by using them to serve their selfish interest. That's how they turn God's blessing into a curse. Remember

Lucifer, a beautiful angel that was transformed to the most devious of demons when he chose to worship himself with the gifts that God gave him.

We must be very careful that we do not allow the blessings and gifts of God to distract us from worshipping Him.

**DEUTERONOMY 8:14-18**

**14 "When your heart is lifted up, and you forget the LORD your God who brought you out of the land of Egypt, from the house of bondage;**

**15 "who led you through that great and terrible wilderness, in which were fiery serpents and scorpions and thirsty land where there was no water; who brought water for you out of the flinty rock;**

**16 "who fed you in the wilderness with manna, which your fathers did not know, that He might humble you and that He might test you, to do you good in the end-**

**17 "then you say in your heart, 'My power and the might of my hand have gained me this wealth.'**

**18 "AND YOU SHALL REMEMBER THE LORD YOUR GOD, FOR IT IS HE WHO GIVES YOU POWER TO GET WEALTH, that He may establish His covenant which He swore to your fathers, as it is this day**

## **Chapter 2**

# **THE GOLDEN CALF**

We read in the Bible the incident of a golden calf. God's people melted their golds into an idol to replace God (Exodus 32). However, we later see them contributing their gold and treasures to build God's house (Exodus 35:4).

When they worshipped gold it was evil, but when they used gold to worship God by giving it into the building of His house, it was good. Either way, gold did nothing, the people did everything. They only used gold to do whatever was in their heart. Therefore, it wasn't gold's fault. Gold is not a demon!

In Exodus 33:1-6, after the incident of the golden calf, the Lord told the children of Israel to strip off their jewellery. That was because they had made an idol out of those things. Just because God asked them to do that on one occasion doesn't make it a law

binding all people at all times, and in all places.

Secondly, God asked the children of Israel to go and collect the jewellery of the Egyptians the night before they departed from Egypt (See Exodus 12:35). It is also important to realize that God is the One who created silver and gold, and He didn't create them for the devil but for His children (Genesis 2:11-12).

In addition, it is clear from the Scriptures that God made His city in heaven with gold and precious gems of the highest celestial quality (Revelation 21).

### **HOW WOULD GOD ADORN HIS OWN BRIDE?**

In Genesis 24, an expensive nose ring and a bracelet were given to Rebecca as a token of favour and love. It was to show that she was the chosen one for Isaac. The Lord also blessed Isaac with silver and gold. He doesn't bless His people with sin.

Even God Almighty gave us a picture of how He would nurture and decorate His own

bride with gold and jewellery in the following passage:

**EZEKIEL 16:4-14 (MSG)**

**4 On the day you were born your umbilical cord was not cut, you weren't bathed and cleaned up, you weren't rubbed with salt, you weren't wrapped in a baby blanket.**

**5 No one cared a fig for you. No one did one thing to care for you tenderly in these ways. You were thrown out into a vacant lot and left there, dirty and unwashed--a newborn nobody wanted.**

**6 And then I came by. I saw you all miserable and bloody. Yes, I said to you, lying there helpless and filthy, "Live!**

**7 Grow up like a plant in the field!" And you did. You grew up. You grew tall and matured as a woman, full-breasted, with flowing hair. But you were naked and vulnerable, fragile and exposed.**

**8 I came by again and saw you, saw that you were ready for love and a lover. I took care of you, dressed you and protected you. I promised you my love and entered the covenant of marriage with you. I, GOD, the Master, gave my word. You became mine.**

**9 I gave you a good bath, washing off all that old blood, and anointed you with aromatic oils.**

**10 I dressed you in a colorful gown and put leather sandals on your feet. I gave you linen blouses and a fashionable wardrobe of expensive clothing.**

**11 I ADORNED YOU WITH JEWELLERY: I PLACED BRACELETS ON YOUR WRISTS, FITTED YOU OUT WITH A NECKLACE,**

**12 EMERALD RINGS, SAPPHIRE EARRINGS, AND A DIAMOND TIARA.**

**13 You were provided with everything precious and beautiful: with exquisite clothes and elegant food, garnished with honey and oil. You were absolutely stunning. You were a queen!**

**14 You became world-famous, a legendary beauty brought to perfection by my adornments. Decree of GOD, the Master.**

Even though the adorned bride in the previous text later rebelled, God did not say that it was because of how she was adorned. He also did not condemn such adornment for women.

## **Chapter 3**

# **A BACKGROUND STORY OF THE SHECHEM INCIDENT**

After Rachael had stolen her father's household gods which were probably made of gold in Genesis 31, something happened. Genesis 35 records that Jacob didn't want anything that will hinder him from God's presence. And as such, he asked all his household to get rid of all idols and jewellery that were with them, and he buried them under the oak at Shechem.

**GENESIS 35:2-4 (AMP)**

**2** Then Jacob said to his household and to all who were with him, "Get rid of the [idols and images of] foreign gods that are among you, and ceremonially purify yourselves and change [into fresh] clothes; **3** then let us get up and go up to Bethel, and I will make an altar there to God, who answered me in the day of my distress and has been with me wherever I have gone."

**4** So they gave Jacob all the [idols and images of the] foreign gods they had and the rings which

were in their ears [worn as charms against evil], and Jacob buried them under the oak tree near Shechem.

The Bible did not say that it was God who asked Jacob to do that. It should be noted that in ancient times, people wear jewellery as amulets or symbols of worship and devotion to their idols and false gods. Some of them even had the name or symbol of those gods they idolized on their jewellery.

The truth is that God doesn't have any issue with His children owning or using gold. The problem is when they let gold become their obsession and idol. Moderation is the emphasis, not abstinence. Today, many people spend a fortune on their appearance but ignore their spiritual life. They do not commit to spiritual growth and development.

### **DO NOT BE MATERIALISTIC**

Gold isn't a sin or an evil thing in itself, but how one goes about the use of it could be sinful. Some people use gold to compete. They want the most expensive so they could

consider other people as inferior and look down upon them with a very high mind. They let their heart get exalted above measure. Loving gold more than they love God and the things of the flesh more than spiritual things.

Some church folks would rather buy \$1000 jewellery than give \$50 to evangelism or the work of God. The heart taken by gold is not submitted to God. Even a common hairdo could become a hindrance or distraction from spiritual growth.

Many women spend more time on their appearance than they do with God's Word and spiritual things. Some of them could devote up to 10 hours to the fixing or weaving of their hair, but they would not even tarry in prayer for 1 hour or study their Bible for 30 minutes.

It is easy to find an educated woman. A beautiful lady isn't scarce, but a praying woman is a favour from God.

Whatever we attend to more than we attend to God and the things of the Spirit has

become our distraction. If women will spend half the time they spend on their appearance to develop their spiritual life, they'll be so on fire for God!

While it is okay to appear beautiful, it is unwise to ignore the hidden person of the heart, that ornament of a meek and quiet spirit (1Peter 3:1-6). Some will spend so much money on makeups and physical wears and ignore their spirit. Ask yourself how many books and tapes you have to keep your spirit fit. If you spend three hours making your hair, how long do you spend in prayer and meditation on God's Word?

Don't wait until you can kneel before you pray, you can be praying in the Holy Spirit even while doing your domestic chores. Make prayer a lifestyle. Become intimate with God's Word.

A virtuous woman is a spiritual one. *"A wife of noble character who can find? She is worth far more than rubies. Her husband has full confidence in her and lacks nothing of*

*value. She brings him good, not harm, all the days of her life”* (Proverbs 31:10-12). Invest on the inside!

The Bible says that people look at the outward, but God looks at the inward (1Samuel 16:7). God’s pleasure is derived from the state of your heart, but people pay attention to your appearance. You cannot dress like a rascal, dying your hair in all sorts of odd colours and wearing indecent clothing and then expect people to take you seriously. I’ve seen believers who go to preach putting on an appearance that even unbelievers will criticize. We are not sent to angels but humans. Our appearance should not become a hindrance to the gospel. We must not become a stumbling block to others.

In this plastic generation, anybody can buy beauty from cosmetic stores and boutiques. A good character is what is scarce, and it is more precious than a diamond.

## Chapter 4

### MODERATION OR ABSTINENCE?

God does not condemn the use of jewellery, He only encourages moderation, spiritual commitment, and maturity.

I've seen believers who know and use so many jewelleries but can't even lead prayer or Bible study. They don't know the Word because they do not give their time to it.

The Holy Spirit speaking through Peter said women should invest on the inside. Not just into hair braiding, jewellery, and fashion, but cultivating the ornament of a meek and quiet spirit. He went further to speak concerning a good character and how it could even win an ungodly husband over (1Peter 3:1-6).

1 Peter 3:3 says, "*Whose adorning let it not be that outward [adorning] of PLAITING THE HAIR, and of WEARING OF GOLD, or of PUTTING ON OF APPAREL.*" If we interpret

that verse to mean women should never use jewellery, that will be poor hermeneutics.

If that passage says women should not use jewellery, then it also means that they should not plate their hair or wear clothes. Isn't that ridiculous? The context of that passage and 1Timothy 2:9 is that women should invest more on the inside than the outside. They should spend more time on their character development and spiritual maturity than on their appearance. Not that they should not work on their appearance at all and look shabby and primitive. There is no glorifying God in that.

The New International Version (NIV) puts it this way; *"Your beauty should not come from outward adornments, such as elaborate hairstyles and the wearing of gold jewellery or fine clothes. Rather, it should be that of your inner self, the unfading beauty of a gentle and quiet spirit, which is of great worth in God's sight"* (1Peter 3:3-4).

The New Living Translation (NLT) renders 1Timothy 2:9-10 thus; *“And I want women to be modest in their appearance. They should wear decent and appropriate clothing and not draw attention to themselves by the way they fix their hair or by wearing gold or pearls or expensive clothes. For women who claim to be devoted to God should make themselves attractive by the good things they do.”* The instruction is clear; it is not abstinence but moderation.

I think most marriages that suffer today have ignored that advice. Some women now invest most of their time in external things. They spend more on their body than their spirit. And, even though a beautiful body is good, it isn't what keeps the home. Even if you look as beautiful as one of the goddesses of those Greek myths, a bad character will make you stink and repulsive.

True beauty is a product of godly virtues and not just a sexy body or outward decorations (Proverbs 31:30).

If your heart is ugly, it doesn't matter how beautiful your body is! It is a misplaced priority that causes women to spend heavily on their container (body) while they ignore or starve their content (spirit).

Makeups and cosmetic surgeries cannot improve character. Godliness is not sold in beauty stores. It is cultivated by a life of prayer and submission to the authority of the Holy Spirit and the Scriptures.

It is not spirituality to choose to disobey your husband in your dressing.

I remember a certain Christian woman who used to be on fire for God before something went wrong. She had everything running well for her on the home front and people envied her. One day, this woman went and joined a certain deliverance ministry where they teach against jewellery and good dressing. They even publicize some testimonies of certain people who claim to go to hell and see Christians being tortured because of the use of jewellery and hair

attachments or braids. What an insult upon redemption. How silly is it to think that our blood-bought redemption can be forfeited just by the use of jewellery and braids? Since when has salvation become by works and not by grace? Many have fallen from the grace of God and are now in the game of performance. They're depending on their works of righteousness to take them to heaven. Don't let them pull you over into such bondage. *"For if you are trying to make yourselves right with God by keeping the law, you have been cut off from Christ! You have fallen away from God's grace"* (Galatians 5:4).

The woman in my story discarded all the jewellery that her husband bought for her because they told her she would go to hell if she kept using them. Folks must be careful where they go. She started wearing shabby hair and no longer regarded the hairstyles her husband loved. She even threw away her perfumes. When her husband took offence, the leadership of the church told her not to

follow him to hell. How ridiculous! Eventually, she was ordained as an evangelist and started dressing like an old woman even though she was only thirty.

Even though a Christian should always be modest, this does not mean you shouldn't dress smart. You dressed well to get that man, why can't you dress well to keep him? The woman's husband later chased her out of his house to the church and married another woman. We know that that's unscriptural, but the woman was also walking in rebellion. She was really off the handle.

The last time I saw that woman, she has been taken over by a religious spirit. Her mind was no longer sound. The glow that used to be on her face was gone. She goes about attacking and condemning people instead of sharing the gospel of Christ. You shouldn't let your church doctrine come between you and your husband. Your pastor is not your husband, and if your husband throws you out, your pastor will not marry

you. If your husband wants jewellery and your pastor forbids it, follow your husband. He is your head as Christ is the head of the Church (Ephesians 5:23). Dress for your husband. Wear anything in the room, but when you're going outside, don't put on anything that will provoke others to sin.

The Bible says for women to follow Sarah their mother (1Peter 3). She even obeyed Abraham and consented to a partial lie that she was his sister and not a wife (Genesis 12:13; 20:2). She didn't expose her husband or ridiculed him because of his fearfulness. I am not saying you should follow your husband off the Scriptures or do unscriptural things. Nevertheless, there are common sense issues that shouldn't be allowed to escalate into big problems in the family. Wisdom is profitable to direct.

Learn to keep your husband without going off the Word! Let the Holy Spirit lead you in choosing a Bible-based church where you can grow spiritually (Romans 8:16).

## **EPILOGUE: ARE YOU REALLY SAVED?**

*"If you declare with your mouth, "Jesus is Lord," and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. For it is with your heart that you believe and are justified, and it is with your mouth that you profess your faith and are saved. As Scripture says, "Anyone who believes in Him will never be put to shame"*

*-Romans 10:9-11 (NIV).*

## **BUT I GO TO CHURCH**

Going to church doesn't mean that you automatically have eternal life. If you've not made a conscious decision for Christ, don't think your name is written in the Lamb's book of life just because you attend Church services. You could even be a preacher or Sunday school teacher and not be saved. Salvation isn't an accident or an unconscious decision. It is not something that happens automatically. It is a free gift of God obtainable by faith (Ephesians 2:8). However, God doesn't just write your name in the book of life or regenerate your spirit without your permission. Just that you're presently in the

Church or doing ministry doesn't mean you're born again.

### **BUT I'M A PREACHER**

One could be a Bishop and be unsaved. Salvation isn't a title, it is a decision, a New Creation, a new birth (2Corinthians 5:17-21). It is a very personal thing. I cannot be saved for you. Your parents cannot be born again on your behalf, no matter how much they love you. Salvation isn't earned by doing the work of God. Neither does it come with the title of a pastor, bishop, apostle or any other.

The world is full of many who try to spread the Christ they do not really know.

Jesus is not a story. He is a living Personality that can be known and experienced personally today! If you do not have a personal relationship with Him, you're publicizing Him in vain.

### **SALVATION BY ASSUMPTION**

Don't just assume to be saved. Faith is not a baseless assumption; it is an offshoot of God's Word. Faith is rooted in the Scriptures and there's no biblical basis for assuming to be saved.

Jesus revealed to us from the encounter He had with Nicodemus in John 3 that one could be a superior religious leader and still be unsaved.

Nicodemus must have assumed he was saved until that night with the Saviour Himself. Don't be a Nicodemus and if you've been one, submit to the Word of God today.

### **INHERITED SALVATION?**

Many go to church because they were born into Christianity. Nevertheless, salvation is not physical hereditary. It is not transferable by genetics or heredity from earthly parents to their children. Your father could be a Bishop and you still go to hell. If you search your heart and you find out that you have no memory of ever making a personal decision for Christ, you should do so now. Once that witness of the Holy Spirit is not in your heart or spirit that you're God's child, your eternity is unsure (Romans 8:16). Don't risk missing heaven!

### **BIBLE WAY TO BE SAVED**

Romans 10:9-10 explains how to be saved. It says that you can do so by faith in Christ and confession. Salvation is free, not because it is

worthless, but because it is priceless. Should God put a price on an offer that cost Him the life of His only Son, who can afford it? None can, but in His infinite love and mercy, He decided to give us freely (John 3:16-18).

Here's a prayer of salvation based on that Scripture. I will love you to say it with the whole of your heart. God is listening to you right now:

"Dear God, I confess with my mouth the Lord Jesus Christ and I believe in my heart that you raised Him from the dead, I am saved!"

### **AN ADVICE FOR THE NEWLY SAVED**

If you have said the above prayer, congratulations! You're now a New Creation, your past is gone forever, you're a new person (2Corinthians 5:17). I will advise you to get a Bible and begin to study. A good place to start is the Gospel of John, read and practice what you read. Talk to God, He's your Father now, you're free to discuss with Him every time, in the name of Jesus (John 1:12-13). He loves you and has no memory of any of your sins anymore (Hebrews 8:12). Talk to Him about anything and everything that troubles you. He is interested in all that concerns you. You can also talk to Him

anywhere because He is in your heart and can hear your thoughts and most silent whispers. Your heavenly Father loves you and has given you His Holy Spirit to guide you in all areas of your life, through the Bible.

Also, get plugged into a good local Church around you and be committed. Don't cultivate the habit of ignoring the Church (Hebrews 10:25). It is those who are planted in God's house that will flourish in His court. *"Those who are planted in the house of the LORD Shall flourish in the courts of our God. They shall still bear fruit in old age; They shall be fresh and flourishing, To declare that the LORD is upright; He is my rock, and there is no unrighteousness in Him"* (Psalms 92:13-15).

A good Church is the one that believes and practices the Bible. It is a place where the Holy Spirit is allowed to operate freely, where everything is done to glorify Christ. God has placed people in the Church to help you grow (Ephesians 4:11-16).

There's no perfect Church, but there's one that is perfect for you, where you can grow and be made ready for the Lord's return.

You must be spiritually alert, watching for the Lord and spreading the gospel.

**LUKE 12:35-40 NIV).**

**35 "Be dressed ready for service and keep your lamps burning,**

**36 like servants waiting for their master to return from a wedding banquet, so that when he comes and knocks they can immediately open the door for him.**

**37 It will be good for those servants whose master finds them watching when he comes. Truly I tell you, he will dress himself to serve, will have them recline at the table and will come and wait on them.**

**38 It will be good for those servants whose master finds them ready, even if he comes in the middle of the night or toward daybreak.**

**39 But understand this: If the owner of the house had known at what hour the thief was coming, he would not have let his house be broken into.**

**40 You also must be ready, because the Son of Man will come at an hour when you do not expect him."**
