



# Untold story of Amotekun, herders' clash in Oyo community

¶riday's attack on a Fulani **⋠** settlement in Igangan in Ibarapa North Local Government Area of Oyo State, after the expiration of the sevenday ultimatum given by a youth leader and secessionist, Sunday Adeyemo, popularly known as Sunday Igboho, was the climax of two weeks of tension that had pervaded the Ibarapa axis.

A week after the purported clash between the operatives of the Oyo State Security Network, Amotekun, and herders in Okebi settlement of Ibarapa North, Sunday Igboho stormed Igangan, specifically the settlement of Serikin Fulani, Alhaji Abdulkadir Salihu, and asked them to vacate their land.

This was at a time the dust raised by the purported 'clash' where three Fulani herders were killed was vet to settle.

What was the mission of Amotekun operatives in Okebi Fulani settlement in Tapa on Saturday, January 9, 2021?

This is a poser that has been generating ripples, deepening the tension among the herders and farmers in the community.

Daily Trust reports that dozens of Amotekun operatives stormed Okebi village on the fateful Saturday in what the outfit called a clash between it and herders suspected to be kidnappers terrorising communities in the

But the Fulani herders, majority of whom have lived in the village for decades, insist the attack was premeditated, saying the claim that it was a clash with kidnappers was unfounded.

Amidst the claim and counterclaim, the state police command has commenced investigation into the purported clash even as the state governor, Seyi Makinde, sent a delegation led by his Executive Assistant on Security Matters, Mr Sunday Odukoya, to the scene of the attack to ascertain what went wrong.

The Commandant Amotekun Corps in Oyo State, retired Col. Olayinka Olayanju, said there was no clash between his men and Fulani herdsmen. He told newsmen in Ibadan that his men launched six operations in four local government areas but that the team at Aiyete was attacked in the forest by suspected bandits and three of them were killed by his men.

According to him, the operations were fully supported by Fulani leaders living in the areas, adding that a number of Miyetti Allah members were part of the operations.

He said, "When our men entered the forest at Aiyete, they were attacked, leading to a gun battle where three of the attackers died. One of our men sustained injuries.'

But during a visit to Okebi Fulani settlement (Gaa Okebi) which was about two kilometres from Aiyete town, the residents claimed those killed were not bandits but herders who have lived in the village for decades without any criminal record.

Those killed were one Alhaji Usman Okebi who was said to be the deputy Sarkin Fulani of Oyo State, Abdullahi Usman, a Fulani farmer and one Saidu Usman.

Residents of the settlement who are said to have been living there for decades are still mourning the death of their kinsmen who lost their lives in penultimate Saturday attack. They said linking them to kidnappers amounted to painting the Fulani in bad light.

Besides, they said on the day of the incident, preparations were on for the wedding ceremony of one of the children of the deceased Alhaji Usman.

One of the sons of Alhaii Usman, Ahmadu Usman, who spoke with Daily Trust in Gaa Okebi insisted that there was no kidnapper in their midst.

He took our correspondent round the settlement where several houses were burnt down by Amotekun. According to him, the attack came to them as a surprise.

He said, "On the morning of Saturday, we were hearing gunshot as we were preparing for the wedding of Alhaji Usman's daughter but to our surprise, we saw that they have shot at Saidu and Alhaji Usman came to the rescue with Abdullahi to provide some help but they shot at him and Abdullahi who was carrying him on his bike and they died immediately.

"Another victim of the incident, Bello, is currently at the Federal Medical Centre (FMC) Abeokuta receiving treatment. Two others have been discharged."

He disclosed that Saidu, who was alleged to be a kidnapper, was attacked at his settlement known as Gaa Gege.

Also, Fatima Usman, whose husband, Alhaji Usman, was killed by Amotekun, said she was yet to recover from the shock of what happened that day, insisting that her husband is not a kidnapper.

From Gaa Okebi, correspondent went to Okebi village occupied by the Yoruba speaking people to get their perspective on Saturday's incident.

The Baale of Okebi, Azeez Busari, who spoke with one of our correspondents said he was not in the village on the day the incident happened. He said Alhaji Usman, who was the leader of Okebi settlement, had been living with them peacefully.

Asked if they were aware of kidnappers hiding in the settlement, he said it could be possible but they have no proof about that.

'Our fear over Amotekun coming to reality'

Our correspondent also met the Sarkin Fulani of Oyo State at his palace in Igangan before it was razed down on Friday. The palace was about one kilometre away from Gaa Okebi where the attack by Amotekun took place.

Alhaji Saliu Abdulkadir, who was sitting in his palace at Igangan, expressed worry over the killing of Alhaji Usman whom, he said, was his deputy.

He said while the Fulani herders have no problem with Amotekun, recent killings attributed to the operatives is a cause for concern.

"We feel strongly that Amotekun operatives established to confront Fulani herdsmen and stereotype us. We have criminals everywhere and we have instances where Yoruba people were arrested either as kidnappers or armed robbers and they were confirmed to be indigenes of Ibarapa here," he said.

Abdulkadir, however, appealed to herders in Oyo State to remain calm and law-abiding even as he assured that the Fulani community would continue to support security operatives by exposing criminals irrespective of their tribe. But he said the recent incident must be thoroughly investigated while culprits must be brought to book.

"Amotekun remains saviour"

Locals from Igbo Ora, Aiyete, Tapa and other communities in Ibarapa Central and Ibarapa North told Daily Trust that they have been having sleepless nights due to the activities of kidnappers and armed robbers. They said many cases of kidnapping have been reported in the past few weeks allegedly perpetrated by herders.

The increased kidnapping activities is the latest dimension in the long-standing tension fanning the farmers-herders' crisis which led to the shutting down of two cattle markets in the Igbo Ora-Ideere axis. This was due to the suspicion that some suspected kidnappers could mingle freely with herders after perpetrating their crime.

Despite the closure of the markets, they said kidnapping activities allegedly perpetrated by herders have been on the increase.

Meanwhile, the traditional ruler of Aiyete, headquarters of Ibarapa North Local Government, Asao of Aiyete, Emmanuel Okeniyi Borisabunmi, said Amotekun is a blessing to them despite recent criticisms against the outfit.

Oba Borisabunmi who spoke with Daily Trust in his palace said the seven communities under Ibarapa had series of attacks in recent times from kidnappers and bandits and many innocent people died while many others

lost fortunes paid in ransom.

He said, "This is a bad occurrence which we are contending with and all our people who were kidnapped said their abductors were Fulanis. Though we were also told they are not from Ibarapa here, that they come from Chad, Niger and Sokoto to carry out their nefarious activities but all we know from the various accounts of the victims is that they are herders and they have been terrorising our people down to Oke Ogun.'

According to him, Amotekun has come to stay and must be supported by all and sundry to curb the rate of kidnapping and banditry in Ibarapa land.

Why Fulani can't be part of Amotekun?

Balogun Asawo of Aiyete land, Chief Raheem Gafari, who was also annoyed with the increasing activities of kidnappers in Ibarapa, said *Amotekun* remains a laudable initiative.

But he is of the view that their operation must be harmonised with the existing Operation Burst Unit made up of Army operating in the community.

"I would want the government to involve the Army in this Amotekun because they know the skills and tactics of handling arms. They can train these people so that they don't misuse the arms and ammunition given to them," he said.

The chief however said Fulani indigenes cannot be part of Amotekun because they don't understand the traditions of Yorubaland, wondering if there was any Yoruba in Hisbah which is a variant of *Amotekun* in parts of the North.

#### Igboho, Akeredolu The ultimatums

But in a twist to the incident, after Sunday Igboho stormed Igangan to issue his seven-day quit ultimatum, he went ahead to implement it as the palace of the Sarki was razed while several properties including cars were burnt down. Children and women in the settlement were all displaced with some of them unaccounted for.

While the dust in Oyo is yet to settle, Ondo State Governor Rotimi Akeredolu also gave the Fulani herders in the state seven days to vacate the state's forest reserves.

Akeredolu also banned night and under-aged grazing, saying children of less than 18 vears should not be involved in

> He urged the government of Ondo and Oyo States to give peace a chance and rescind the quit notice order; while those whose property was destroyed should be compensated accordingly.

> "The governor of Ondo State, being a learned person, is expected to know better. AYCF will not support any group that engages in any form of criminality and such people should not be identified by their religion, tribe or ethnicity but should be treated as a criminal.

"The subsequent attack that followed the quit notice in Oyo State is rather uncalled for and condemnable'. The perpetrators must be brought to book and made to face the full wrath of the law.

"AYCF supports constitutional ways of every state protecting her citizens but quit notice should be out of it and must not be considered under any circumstance. Nigeria is an indivisible entity and whatever has the tendency like happenings in Ondo and Oyo must be discouraged in the interest of peaceful coexistence and one Nigeria."

The Oodua People's Congress also yesterday warned the Presidency and the Arewa Consultative Forum against playing politics and ethnicity with what it called "the worrisome state of security

in the southwest."

It also offered to assist Governor Rotimi Akeredolu in enforcing the deadline issued to herdsmen to vacate forest reserves in Ondo State. It said the Presidency's

We'll enforce Akeredolu's order-OPC

opposition to Akeredolu's order was divisive, provocative and ill-advised as well as an insult to the country's federalism and the separation of powers principle of the constitution.

Otunba Wasiu Afolabi, Deputy President to the late OPC founder, Frederick Fasehun, stated this after an emergency meeting of OPC leaders held in Lagos.

He said no southerner would dare go to the north and carry out killing, kidnapping and banditry that Fulani criminals have allegedly unleashed on southern communities and highways.

Afolabi, however, assured that "millions of law-abiding Fulani men and women" living in the Yorubaland "have absolutely no cause for alarm. Fulani criminals hiding under the cloak of being herdsmen to perpetrate evil against law-abiding citizens should know their time is up. Henceforth, it'll be fire for fire."

Afolabi expressed his group's backing for the pronouncement issued by Akeredolu that herdsmen should leave forests for open areas by Monday.

The OPC also described the manhunt launched by the police for the Yoruba activist, Sunday Igboho, as misguided and provocative.

Also yesterday, the Aareonakakanfo of Yorubaland, Gani Adams, cautioned the Arewa Consultative Forum and the Miyetti Allah Cattle Breeders Association of Nigeria to be mindful of utterances that could fuel more crisis in the country.

He said the threat of reprisals following Friday's attack on a Fulani settlement by Sunday Igboho was a joke taken too far.

In a statement by his spokesman, Kehinde Aderemi, Adams warned threats of attack on the southwest could fuel further crisis in Ibarapa,Oyo and Ondo and would certainly affect the entire nation.

He said: "There are reports that the Fulani herdsmen have, in the past five years, killed over 300 Yoruba people from different communities while several other people have been kidnapped with abductors paying several billions as ransom".

Meanwhile, the Ondo State Government yesterday asked the media to exercise restraint and allow security agents to "manage security".

In a chat with our correspondent, Jimoh Dojumo, the Senior Special Adviser (Security Matters) to the Ondo State Governor, said the state government would wait for the expiration of the seven-day ultimatum given to herdsmen illegally occupying forest reserves before it "will know the next step".

# Makinde, Oyo CP meet Fulani leaders, others

Oyo State Govenor Seyi Makinde and the Commissioner of Police, Ngozi Onadeko, yesterday visited Igangan, Ibarapa North Local Government Area of the state to ensure peace returned to the troubled community.

Youths at Igangan had on Friday razed the house of Sarkin Fulani of Oyo State, Alhaji Saliu Abdulkadir, accusing the Fulani community of complicity in kidnappings and killings of the people of the area.

The delegation also visited the

The delegation also visited the razed home of the Sarkin Fulani in Igangan to assess the damage and promised thorough investigation.

Addressing a gathering of traditional rulers, government officials and Fulani leaders in Igangan, the CP called for calm.

"I want to assure you that all the cases you brought up, a thorough investigation will be done on them and you'll see that justice will be delivered. We'll be having more of this interactive session and consultative gathering so that we'll be able to sit down, talk and iron things out together without resorting to violence, which does not pay.

"Please, don't take laws into your hands. Just tell us. Let's have peace and everything, by the grace of God, will be okay for all of us."

Speaking at a town hall meeting where traditional rulers and community leaders were present, Makinde, represented by his Special Adviser on Security, Fatai Owoseni, appealed to all the residents of the town to find a way to return communal tolerance and understanding to fight off attacks from bandits and kidnappers.

He further sued for peace in troubled areas of the state, asking all stakeholders to embrace dialogue and desist from the wanton destruction of lives and livelihood.

Owoseni said 51 suspected criminals linked to kidnapping and other crimes committed in Oke Ogun and Ibarapa areas were in police custody; while some were already charged to court.

He said: "Let's put sentiments and politics aside, from what we heard, it's not as if the Ibarapa community is against one ethnic group. What they're claiming and the allegation they've made is that a particular person, who they're now seeing to symbolise an entire ethnic group, has been misbehaving. It's just like what the governor has been saying that there's trust-deficit between the people and the government, mistrust between the people and law enforcement agencies.

"If you look at the catalogue of what has been said, they feel they've not been given justice and they feel that someone has been stalling justice.

"They feel that someone has been dropping names to oppress the community. I believe that with the steps taken to mend all these gaps and with the assurance that the Commissioner of Police has given that they'll look at all the cases again, there'll be a change."

Pollowing the expiration of Ondo State Governor Rotimi Akeredolu's order asking herdsmen to leave the state's forest reserves within seven days, governors from the Southwest will meet with national and zonal leaders of the Miyetti Allah Cattle Breeders

Association of Nigeria today. A source told *Daily Trust* yesterday that the meeting, billed to hold in Akure, Ondo State capital, would also be attended by the governors of Jigawa and Kebbi States as well as all Commissioners of Police in the south-western states.

He said the meeting was convened to discuss the ultimatum and address the security challenges in the southwest.

The chairman of the Mayetti Allah in Ondo State, Alhaji Bello Garuba, said MACBAN leaders had arrived Akure for the meeting.

Meanwhile, the Arewa Youth Consultative Forum yesterday demanded reversal of the last Monday's order by the Ondo State governor.

AYCF President Shettima Yerima, in a statement, said: "We must guide against any act that will create a war-like situation in Nigeria, we must learn from mistakes of the past and avoid a repeat because its consequences may be unimaginable," he said.

He noted that the constitution of Nigeria guarantees every Nigerian to live in any part of this

# Foreign rice floods Nigerian markets

Imported rice has flooded Nigerian markets despite the ban imposed on the product by the federal government to encourage local production and self-sufficiency, *Daily Trust* reports. Findings have revealed that the recent reopening of some land borders has aggravated the illegal importation of the commodity.

Stakeholders in the value chain, including local processors and growers, have expressed dismay over the development, saying it would reverse the gains recorded in the last few years.

However, some observers have blamed millers for mopping up paddy rice and processing it in piecemeal, to attract more profit, thereby sabotaging the effort of the federal government in making rice affordable to Nigerians.

President Muhammadu Buhari had in December, 2020, directed that the four borders that were closed in 2019 be reopened. Some traders told our correspondents that even while the border closure lasted, the commodity was a common sight in almost every shop.

The new trend is now a source of worry not only to processors who are struggling to compete with their counterparts abroad in terms of quality, but also growers who are apprehensive that if the trend continues, they may be forced out of business.

#### Situation in states Lagos

Reports from Lagos along the Mile 2 Badagry Expressway up to the Daleko Rice Market revealed a remarkable presence of foreign rice. The product is being illegally imported from the neighbouring Benin Republic before being repackaged for distribution to different parts of the country.

The centres for rebagging are opposite the Adeniran Ogunsanya College of Education (ACOED), Iyana-Era; the Igbolerin Junction by Jolag; and the Alaba Rago Market, all along the Mile 2- Badagry Expressway.

At these centres, smugglers, mainly women, bring in foreign rice in small bags which they repackage in bigger ones for onward distribution.

At the Igbolerin Junction, one of the smugglers told our correspondent, who disguised as a customer, that they ferried the rice from Benin Republic into Nigeria through unapproved routes near the Seme Border after paying tokens to urchins known as "crossers".

The smuggler explained that, "It is the crossers who will then bring the rice to J-5 Park at Seme, from where they are handed over to their owners. At J-5 Park, owners are charged by the bus drivers according to quantity. It costs at least N2,000 to transport

a bag of rice from Seme to the Alaba Rago Market."

At the Rago market, which is a big distribution point for foreign rice, merchants said the profit they got far outweighed what they got from local rice and our reporter saw foreign rice in bags with local names aimed to beat customs officers.

According to a Ketu-based marketer, Khadija Amar, Nigerian rice is no longer selling, saying many people have lost interest in consuming it.

Amar said, "A bag of local rice which we ought to sell at over N20,000 is now being sold at N17,500. Some of us have N3,000 shortage, and for others, it's N4,000. So we prefer to deal in foreign rice. Another dealer, Miss Ibeh Mary Abigail, said, "We have foreign rice everywhere in the market because it moves faster than local rice."

#### Rivers

Reports from Port Harcourt in Rivers State showed that many markets and shops now have large quantities of foreign rice in stock. At the Mile 1, Mile 3, Borokiri, New Road, Oyigbo and Eleme markets, foreign brands of rice are gradually taking over the markets and are openly displayed without any challenge.

A trader at Mile 1 who pleaded anonymity, said the rice was brought in from Lagos and Calabar.

#### **Plateau**

In Plateau State, our correspondent who visited the Yankwalli Market reported that foreign rice had flooded the market with many shop owners displaying it unchallenged.

Aminu Mubi, a dealer in the market, told Daily Trust that although there was foreign rice in the market even before the ban on border was lifted, the product was flooding the market now and threatening local rice.

Mubi explained that, "When the border was closed the price of a bag reached N27,000, but it has dropped to N23,000, and there is a possibility that it will drop further."

#### Kano

In some supermarkets in Kano, foreign rice is now freely on display unlike in previous months, but the price has dropped. At the Singer Commodity Market, a 50kg bag of foreign rice is now selling at N23,500 instead of N26,000.


A dealer at the market, Sanusi Hassan, said, "The local rice is now endangered as people prefer to buy foreign rice which is sold at almost the same price as the local rice."

Hassan added that, "Government must do something to salvage the situation and protect the local industry."

#### Abuja |

A visit to some markets in Abuja indicated that foreign rice is still sold in large quantities with traders displaying it outside their stalls.

A trader at the Wuse Market, Agatha Ezekiel, said she sold a bag of foreign rice at N26,000 and

# local rice at N19,500. **Katsina**

In Katsina, our reporter observed an influx of foreign rice, but some of the traders said it had nothing to do with the recent border reopening, as Nigeria's border with Niger Republic at Jibia, Kwangwalam and Mai'adua were still closed.

A trader, Tasiu Sani, said, "All our goods are old stock and that is what we are selling."

Daily Trust gathered that the goods come in piecemeal on daily basis through bush paths under the name "Hatsin Hajiya" in which a bag is divided into three to pass checkpoints.

#### **Growers lament**

Some rice farmers said they watched with dismay the resurfacing of foreign rice in many markets across the country despite the effort to sustain local drive. Abdullahi Lapai from Niger State attributed the ugly situation to the activities of smugglers, who he said were gradually having a free time following the border reopening. Lapai said, "If the local processors are unable to sell their produce, it will affect the price of paddy, which will in turn discourage local farmers from more production.'

The National President of the All Farmers Association of Nigeria (AFAN), Kabir Ibrahim, said bringing in foreign rice would draw the country back from the gains made so far.

According to him, smuggling does not really happen often unless it is aided by law enforcement agents and the citizenry. Ibrahim said, "If there is any contraband displayed in a shop and it is freely sold, then it goes beyond government and the officers charged with border control. The entire citizenry must stand against it for it to stop."

### Processors on edge

A rice processor, Alhaji Nasiru Yahaya, raised alarm that many local processors were in shock following the influx of foreign rice, adding that the situation was affecting local producers.

Alhaji Yahaya further said most of the processors borrowed money to invest when the government announced the country's rice sufficiency drive.

He explained that, "This is not about us only, millions of direct and indirect jobs will be lost if local brands are relegated to the previous position."

A small holder miller in Sabon Wuse, a Niger State community along the Abuja-Kaduna Expressway, Nuru Jiya, said the volume of local rice sales had reduced drastically following the presence of foreign rice in many shops.

# 'Nemesis catching up with processors'

An agriculturist, Ibrahim Kunle, said although there was the need for relevant authorities to check any form of smuggling, local rice processors should get no one's sympathy, noting that they were the architects of the current hike in the price of local brands. Kunle alleged that, "We all know when some of these processors are deliberately causing artificial scarcity of local brands with the aim of hiking price.

"What they do is to mop up paddy from farmers and store them instead of milling them and selling. This is causing serious concerns even to the government."

Another agriculturist, Mallam Audu Ishak, said, "These people will go and take money from the government, promising heaven, but let me tell you, they are part of the problem, and thank God government is now realising that."

A stakeholder who craved anonymity, said government was being careful in giving money to some of the processors because of the way some of them betrayed agreements.

Although these claims against the processors have not been confirmed, a source at the Federal Ministry of Agriculture told our reporter that government was concerned about the continued rise in the price of local rice despite the huge effort and resources being committed to rice production in the country.

The Director General of the Rice Processors Association of Nigeria (RIPAN), Andy Ekwelem, promised to get back to our reporter when a call was put across to him but did not up to the time of filing this report.

#### What should be done Experts

Experts in the sector want relevant security outfits to intensify border patrol to further check the activities of smugglers.

Mathew Inawole, an agric economist, said effective border control would go a long way in reducing the volume of foreign rice crossing into the country, adding that there should be a total clampdown on those selling the foreign brands as they were contraband.

Mallam Abdullahi Baba, an agriculturist, said government should orientate the citizens on

the dangers involved in eating some smuggled items.

#### **Customs react**

The Public Relations Officer (PRO) of the Federal Operations Unit (FOU) of the Nigeria Customs Service (NCS), Zone A, Theophilus Sunita, in a telephone interview, said the zone, as an enforcement unit of NCS in charge of Lagos and Ogun states, had always been on top of its game.

Sunita said several thousands of bags of foreign rice had been seized by operatives from the zone from diehard smugglers.

He added that, "However, we rely on members of the public to avail us with useful and timely information."

# We're working with security agencies to clamp down on smugglers - CBN

Responding to the allegation that rice millers could not successfully bring down the price of the commodity because the apex bank had collected the loans given to them, the Central Bank of Nigeria's (CBN) acting Director, Corporate Communication, Nwanisobi, said, "Rice millers are not funded under the Anchor Borrower Programme (ABP) as the programme is to encourage production by smallholder farmers.'

Nwanisobi explained that, "The bank established the Paddy Aggregation Scheme (PAS) to provide working capital requirement for rice millers to off-take paddy during the peak season and help moderate prices during peak and off-peak seasons.

"The PAS is a short-term facility that allows millers to mop up paddy at harvest and control a significant stock that can guarantee production during the off-peak season. The millers are also qualified to access the Commercial Agriculture Credit Scheme (CACS) to finance their operations."

On disbursements, he said, "N321.96bn has been disbursed to 1,709,249 farmers that cultivated 1,830,511 hectares in 36 states and the FCT as of end of 2020."

On paddy rice hoarding, Nwanisobi said, "The news of paddy hoarding by millers has been going round since November 2020, and the bank has actively engaged the millers and measures have been taken to sanction defaulters."

He added that, "Our holistic strategy is to enhance efficiency along the value chain and facilitate seamless transition of paddy from the farmers to the millers. The CBN has also requested beneficiaries of the ABP to repay the loan using output of their farms so that millers can have access to paddy quickly."

He reiterated that, "The CBN has been working with security agencies and fiscal authorities to clamp down on smugglers and the effects of those collaborations will be felt in the market in the shortest possible time."

# Restructuring: Why? When? How?

Teommend the Daily Trust Media Group for keeping up with this dialogue series for the past 18 years. As a media organization you have been doing a lot to contribute to nation building, although some of your editorials are sometimes tough on leaders. I had my fair share during my time as President.

I understand that all was in a bid to guide the efforts towards building a greater country for us all. And as leaders, we have a duty and responsibility to listen to all voices no matter how bitter some might sound.

Today you have brought us together to have a conversation on restructuring which is one of the major issues in our national discourse.

I am happy that the discussants here are eminent personalities that would do justice to the topic. I commend the *Daily Trust* Media Group for bringing these eminent Nigerians together to brainstorm on this topical issue that has seized the attention of our country.

Chief Ayo Adebanjo, a highly distinguished Nigerian was a national leader of Afenifere and key member of the Zikist Movement. He also participated in the 1978 and 2014 National Conferences as a distinguished member.

Chief John Nnia Nwodo is an eminent Nigerian, having served as a Minister of the Federal Republic of Nigeria at a very youthful age and later President General of the Ohaneze Ndigbo cultural organisation. Let me use this opportunity to congratulate him on his new assignment, as National Coordinator of the Southern and Middle Belt Leaders Forum.

Attahiru Jega, a professor of political science, is a former Chairman of the Independent National Electoral Commission (INEC) and a former President of the Academic Staff Union of Universities (ASUU) as well as former Vice-Chancellor of Bayero University, Kano.

The concept of restructuring is not new to us as Nigerians. Before the Civil War Nigeria operated with four regions. At the onset of the war, Gen. Yakubu Gowon, then Head of State, thought that running Nigeria under the regional structure posed a threat to the unity and sovereignty of our country, so he opted to restructure Nigeria into twelve states. There were mixed reactions, for and against, across the nation by our people. But in the end, the 12 states structure stayed.

What Gen. Gowon did, in a war situation, preserved our nation and saved us from disintegration.

A nation is an organic being whose life is characterized by reforms, adaptation

and structural changes. At Independence in 1960, the population of Nigeria was 45 million, and our early leaders and the British colonial government, decided that the young nation was too vast and complex to be governed centrally from Lagos.

Thus, they bequeathed a federal system of government with strong regional autonomy and a unifying central government. This arrangement was also accepted and reaffirmed by the Republican Constitution of 1963.

years Sixty-one independence, our population is now estimated to have exploded to over 200 million. In the same vein, the call for restructuring has continued to grow louder. Within these six decades, our political space has assumed many colorations. We had gone from the three regions to 36 states and 774 local councils. Yet, all that did not seem to have provided the answers to the questions on the administrative structure of our country and how best it should be governed.

As President I had the privilege of celebrating our nation's golden jubilee in 2010 and the centenary of our amalgamation in 2014.

When we were to celebrate these milestones, some Nigerians challenged our intentions, arguing that the amalgamation was faulty. They insisted that there were no reasons to celebrate because they believe that the amalgamation has not helped the growth of our country.

My belief is that all nations have their unique history; the amalgamation is not the problem. Rather, there was too much emphasis on divisive politics and this has greatly affected our nation's unity.

It was the need to address these issues that my administration elected six years ago to convene the 2014 National Conference, which I inaugurated on March 17, 2014 in Abuja for the specific purpose of addressing some of the issues that have been agitating the minds of Nigerians.

As a country, we have our peculiar challenges and we should device means of solving them, but we should not continue to vent our spleen on the amalgamation. As Shakespeare in Julius Caesar said, the fault is not in our stars, but in ourselves.

My conviction is that discussion on restructuring will not help except we restructure our minds because some of the challenging issues at the national level still exist at the state and local levels.

For instance, in some states, it is not easy for some persons to win an election because of the area they come from, the language they speak or their religious belief.

Take a look at how local government elections are conducted at the state level. Why is it very difficult for an opposition party to win a chairmanship or councillorship seat in a state, despite the fact that the same party probably secured seats in the State Assembly and National Assembly elections, organized by a federal election management body?

This shows that restructuring alone may not solve all the anomalies in the system.

I believe that restructuring for a better nation is good but there are other fundamental issues we should also address. We cannot restructure in isolation without tackling the challenges that polarize our nation. These includes nepotism, ethnic and religious differences as well as lack of patriotism.

The issues of tribe and religion have continued to limit our unity and progress, as a nation.

Leadership is like giving care to a sick patient. If someone is ill, he will receive different phases of treatment regardless of which doctor is on duty until the patient recovers fully and is discharged. I think the

same is applicable in nation building.

I would like to refer us to the experience of two African countries which attempted to tackle the problem of diversity from a different perspective than ours at independence; Tanzania under the leadership of Julius Nyerere and Ghana under Kwame Nkrumah.

They went to the extreme to advocate one party state which leaned to the left of the centre. Both leaders emphasized strong national governments to promote national unity and patriotism which departed from our own regional approach which was based on strong regional parties and political competition for power between regions.

Let me state for the records that I strongly oppose both the philosophy and the idea of one party state as well as a unitary system of government as a solution to ethnic and cultural diversity. I believe that federalism and liberal multiparty democracy offer by far the best opportunities for good governance in our multi-ethnic nation. Yet, it is obvious that the initial emphasis of Tanzania and Ghana on promoting national unity, patriotism among citizens, and strong national parties that cut across ethnic, regional and religious divides; and leadership orientation that promotes fairness, justice for all, and love of country, have helped both Ghana and Tanzania in their journey of progress.

It has helped them to better manage some of the extreme ethnic and religious divisions that have dampened the unity and progress of Nigeria.

Rwanda is another recent example where polarization on ethnic lines nearly destroyed that beautiful country in 1994, leading to extreme interethnic hatred, anarchy, violence and killings.

Today Rwanda has stepped back from ethnic bigotry and divisions to a system that emphasizes national unity and leadership performance and patriotism. Rwanda has made tremendous progress along this path.

These three countries are by no means the only models or even the ideals for our country to copy and paste, but there are lessons which we should learn, in our democratic dialogue for national restructuring.

The point I am emphasising is that restructuring on its own without love of country, national unity, unifying leadership and building of strong institutions and values may not take us to our destination.

As leaders at different levels we should encourage a healthy conversation on restructuring and reforms that stir national pride and love and faith of our citizens in our beloved country.

Nigeria is still the greatest gift history has bestowed on us, with her huge potential for greatness, prosperity and happiness for all our people and future generations.

Nigeria is a country of great men of intellect across the globe. We have arable land with abundant rain that grows almost everything. There are rich mineral resources buried under the soil across the entire landscape. We are a gateway to the Atlantic that habours the wealth of nations. There is no part of our country that has nothing to offer the nation, if we do things right. Let us nurture what we have for the good of all our people.

Like every other nation, Nigeria is a project in progress and should confidently discuss her experiences and fashion out solutions to improve on her performance and the well being of all citizens. We should all do our little best in our little corners to overcome the challenges we face, and work hard to reposition our country for a greater and more prosperous tomorrow for our children.

This cannot be achieved without deliberate effort to promote national unity and love of country by all our leaders and citizens. We owe ourselves and the coming generations a duty to reduce the bile and embrace one another so that restructuring for a better and greater Nigeria can be meaningful and guarantee the nation's economic development and citizen's welfare.

We should never lose hope in our nation for the future is bright. With the robust character of our people and the unbeatable resilience of our spirit, I have no doubt that our country will become greater.

May this platform shed more light on our path forward as a nation.

"I know some politicians will not be able to contribute ideas if they are not called upon to do so by those who currently have governmental responsibility to do so. However, please don't keep quiet when called upon.

"We must all intervene as patriots and forget our

personal interests. For the sake of our forebears who handed over this country to us, we must work hard to make things better so that when we meet them, we'll have a good account to give that we improved on what was handed over to us.

"In the meantime, let all stakeholders speak up on the danger confronting and diminishing our great country. The attitude of keeping quiet and 'Sidon look' while waiting for the next election to start making promises will not help

anyone. What type of election or country are we going to have in 2023 if the current situation persists? A stitch in time saves nine," he added.

Saraki also called on Senate President Ahmed Lawan and House of Representatives Speaker Femi Gbajabiamila to provide far-reaching legislative intervention that would help the executive arm in the search for peace.

"This is a period that require all hands to be on deck. This is not the time to talk of APC or PDP. It's a time for all to work for Nigeria. This is a problem for all and should be solved by all."

# Ex-AGF Abdullahi Ibrahim dies

A former Attorney-General of the Federation and Minister of Justice, Abdullahi Ibrahim, is dead.

The former chairman of the Body of Benchers was called to the English Bar in 1963 after which he practised in chambers in England before returning to Nigeria where he was called to the Bar in 1964.

He served as Attorney-General of the Federation and Minister of Justice of Nigeria between 1997 and 1999.

Meanwhile, President

Muhammadu Buhari yesterday commiserated with the government and people of Kogi State over the death of Abdullahi Ibrahim, his first Minister of Education, Science and Technology as military Head of State, who later served in the Ministry of Transportation.

Buhari, in a statement by his spokesman, Garba Shehu, also extended condolences and sympathies to the bereaved family on behalf of his family and the entire nation.

He described the deceased as an "exemplary lawyer and statesman with impeccable integrity who will be remembered for his selfless service to the country."

# Woman dies after death of 3 children in Ondo crash

Three of the victims of the Saturday's crash at the gate of Adekunle Ajasin University, Akungba, Ondo State, were siblings. Two of them were final year students of the university.

Daily Trust gathered that their mother collapsed and died on hearing the news of their death.

The crash reportedly occurred when a Dangote truck carrying cement lost control owing to brake failure and rammed into business centres and shops near the institution's gate, leaving many people dead and others

injured.

A former students' union president of the university and final year Law student, Adesomoju Tobi, was among the victims.

The university's management yesterday ordered closure of the institution till further notice.

Acting Vice Chancellor Prof. Olugbenga Ige, who visited the scene, commiserated with the victims' families, describing the incident as a tragedy.

Meanwhile, the Corps Marshal of the Federal Road Safety Corps, Boboye Oyeyemi, according to a statement yesterday by FRSC spokesman, Bisi Kazeem, had deployed safety engineers to Akungba, Ondo State, to ascertain the causes and to incessant trailer crashes that have bedeviled that particular route of the highway and recommend solutions.

The National Association of Nigerian Students yesterday condemned the killing of six students and others by the Dangote truck last Saturday in Akugba-Akoko, Ondo State.

NANS President Sunday Asefon, in a statement, called on the Federal Government to caution Dangote Company over incessant killings of Nigerians by its heavy duty trucks in every part of the country.

# Fire guts part of Corporal quarters at Zaria Army depot

A fire incident has occurred at the Nigerian Army Depot in Zaria, Kaduna State.

The fire, which *Daily Trust* gathered started at 9 pm on Saturday burnt the second floor of a two-storey building housing soldiers of the rank of corporal and below and their families.

The public relations officer of the Depot, Captain Arigu Audu who confirmed the incident to our correspondent said there were no casualties as occupants of the affected quarters were able to evacuate the building on time While attributing the cause of the fire to an electrical fault, he said investigation has commenced to ascertain the cause of the fire.

He added, "The fire incident happened on Saturday night at block 15 of the Corporal below Quarters around 9 pm. No life was lost. The combined team of Depot Nigerian Army, Nigerian Military School firefighters and Kaduna State Fire Service, Zaria branch were able to curtail the situation. Only the last floor of the building was damaged."

*Daily Trust* reports that the depot is used by the army for the training of recruits.

# Gunmen kill timber contractor in Nasarawa

A family member said the deceased was ambushed when returning from a forest.

The Ohimegye of Opanda-Umaisha Kingdom, Alhaji Abdullahi Usman, confirmed the incident via telephone interview with our reporter. Chairman, Toto Local Government Area, Nuhu Adamu Dauda, also confirmed the incident, saying he had alerted security agents.

The spokesman of the state police command, Ramhan Nansel, neither answered phone calls nor replied a text message our reporter sent to him for comment.

# Cultists raze 35 houses, market in Enugu

There was commotion as a man was injured while over 35 houses and a market were razed by gunmen said to be cultists in Oruku community, Nkanu East LGA of Enugu

Daily Trust gathered that the incident happened between 6:30pm on Saturday and 7:30am on Sunday.

When the new State Commissioner of Police, Mohammed Aliyu, alongside newsmen, visited the troubled community, some houses were still burning. A former chairman of Nkanu East Local Government, Mr. Ejike Ani, who conducted the commissioner round the torched houses, said he got the information that some group of people were going to attack the community and reported it to their council chairman.

Ani said the chairman, Mr. Uchenna Nwobodo, assured him that he had informed the police but unfortunately, the community was attacked and over 35 houses and market were burnt.

However, the chairman of Oruku Neighbourhood

Watch, Mr Emmanuel Ani, appealed to both federal and state governments for urgent intervention to rescue the community from those who have refused to give peace a chance.

He attributed the crisis

in the community to the alleged connivance of the commander of the Inspector General Police of Special Tactical Squad, whom he said, disarmed the neighbourhood watch and released hoodlums they arrested and handed over to the police in the state, to continue to terrorise them.

# 3,000 displaced as bandits kill 6, abduct 5 in Niger

bout 3,000 persons are said to have **L**been displaced as bandits killed six persons and abducted five others with over 20 others sustaining various degrees of injuries in another attack in 12 villages in Paikoro LGA of Niger State. Daily Trust learnt that the bandits began the attack on the villages on Saturday, and carried on their brutal operation till Sunday afternoon.

A resident of one of

the villages attacked, Abubakar Azaido, said in a telephone interview that over 20 injured persons were taken to the General Hospital in Kaffin Koro.

He said: "The bandits were many, they were over 200 and they invaded the villages on motorcycles. They carted away all the spare parts in the shop of a motorcycle spare parts dealer in Amale village."

He said while four persons were killed in Gwajau village, two others were murdered in Amale, adding that four persons were kidnapped in Dakolo and one pastor in Nani village.

He listed the communities attacked by the bandits as Amale, Beni, Barakwai, Kakuri, Gudani, Abolo, Nani, Gwajau, Kubi, Zakolo, Kado and Dakolo, adding that our people have deserted the villages.

The spokesman of the Niger State police command, ASP Abiodun Wasiu, could not be reached for comments as at the time of filing this report.

# Oyo communal clash claims 2, police van, monarch's palace vandalised

Two young men from Tede and Ago-are in Atisbo LGA of Oyo State have been killed in a clash between the two towns on Sunday.

As at Sunday evening, men of the 244 Battalion of the Nigerian Army, Asabari Barracks Saki, have taken over the two warring towns.


Our correspondent gathered that the clash was due to a plan to relocate a cattle market located at the border of the two communities to another location in Tede.

# 8 killed, in Ebonyi communal clash

Eight persons were yesterday killed, many others seriously injured and properties worth billions of Naira destroyed in Effium community in Ohakwu LGA of Ebonyi State following a communal clash in the area at the weekend.

Also, thousands of residents in the area mainly women and children have deserted the area and are now taking refuge in a division police station in the area and in neighbouring communities.

The crisis erupted on Saturday among members of the National Union of Road Transport Workers at the motor park in the area who were engaged in leadership tussle which later spread to the community.

Earlier, the state Commissioner for Internal Security and Conflict Resolution, Mr. Stanley Okoro Emegha, blamed the leadership of the NURTW for allowing politicians in the area to meddle in the affairs of the union.

"And we are going to deal with anybody found wanting in this matter no matter his position in government," he explained.

But, following the incident, the Ebonyi State government on Friday announced a ban on activities of the NURTW in Effium Motor Park.

However, the state Commissioner of Police, Mr. Aliyu Garba, who led the Deputy Governor, Barr. Kelechi Igwe, on spot assessment to the affected community, said the command, in conjunction with her sister agencies, has arrested over 60 persons in connection to the crisis.



# Go after criminals, don't label herders

was just amazed last week Monday when I read the statement from the Ondo State Government giving a one week notice to herders to vacate its forest reserves. This, I gathered, was due to incidences of kidnapping and banditry associated with kinsmen of the herders. Prominent citizens of the state had fallen into the hands of the bandits and kidnappers, who are suspected to be herders living in settlements. Despite denials, by the weekend, this war cry went beyond Ondo to neighbouring Oyo State, with the expected tragic consequences.

In Oyo State, a noted separatist and agitator for Oodua Republic, Sunday Igboho, visited the Igangan community in the Ibarapa North Local Government Area and took it upon himself to give herders, settled in the area for generations, a 7-day ultimatum to leave. When the ultimatum became public there was an outcry. Despite a broadcast by the Oyo State Governor, Makinde, which was far more restrained, some misguided youths, edged on by the demagogic Sunday Igboho, attacked the herders' settlement and razed it to the ground. Many were killed, their herds desecrated and those who survived are still running around dazed in the forest hiding in fear for their lives. I listened to one of them who was interviewed on BBC Hausa service. His heart-wrenching account is really an indication of the failure of governance all round.

No doubt, the Igangan tragedy is a direct result of the spurious ultimatum given by Governor Akeredolu. It is a bogus ultimatum because the governor knows he cannot stop any citizen of Nigeria from living in Ondo State, as every law-abiding Nigerian has the inalienable right to live anywhere in the country without let or hindrance. Probably for reasons best known to him, the Ondo State governor resorted to rabble-rousing to up passions and engineer ethnic tensions. He knows very well that you cannot put an ethnic label to crime. Those herding settlements have been in those forests for as long as any living person can recall. And herding settlements are not exclusive to Nigeria. They are spread across many countries from as far as Guinea to the Central Africa Republic.

Of course, there is the usual age-old farmer/herder problem, which communities have over time got evolved mechanisms to resolve them. Undoubtedly, the clashes have escalated in the last many years for many reasons and governments across the nation have been touting strategies to settle herders as means to stop them roaming about with their animals. Considering the fact that herders are key custodians of a national asset that contributes

to the nation's GDP, with their supply of meat and sundry dairy products, one would expect that their livelihood and that of their herds would be given a deserved attention. Unfortunately, what we have are just empty rhetoric, paper proposals and projects with nothing ever on the ground.

We have failed the herding communities. Majority them are uneducated and their settlements devoid of any modern appurtenances. Their settlements are pre-historic in nature and outlook. The worst part is that the economic potentials of their herds, a heavy national asset, is left unexploited both for their own good and the nation at large. They are left running an important business in the most rudimentary fashion you can imagine, as their fathers and grandfathers have run

The forests, where they roam about with their cattle, are virtually ungoverned spaces. With the proliferation of small arms in the whole of the West African region, plus the availability of hard drugs, the herding communities living in the forests are vulnerable to the antics of bandits and rustlers. It is also no wonder that some of them. particularly those who have lost a stake in their way of life, took to crimes. And because they are adept to the ways of the forests their crimes are more difficult to detect and solve. But that's for the security men to flush them out and prosecute them. It is not the business of communities or their leaders to evict their neighbours for the crimes others have committed.

It even baffled me that the eviction order came from none other than Governor Akeredolu a lawyer of over 40 years standing, and a thoroughbred one for that matter, having attained the rank of a Senior Advocate of Nigeria (SAN) in 1998 - a title one earns distinguishing himself in the legal profession. Though he began his legal career in the private sector in the Law firm of Olujinmi & Akeredolu, he is not a fresh face to public office in the Nigerian space - he was once the President of the Nigerian Bar Association (NBA), from 2008 to 2010 and he is known to have held office as Attorney-General and Commissioner of Justice, Ondo State, 1997-1999. Also his Law firm partner, Akin Olujinmi was once the Attorney- General and Minister of Justice of the Federation (2003-05). One, therefore, finds it rather incongruous for a public figure with such a pedigree and network to allow such an intemperate pronouncement from his office.

What is needed to be done now is for the federal government to act firmly, decisively, and with dispatch. Every Nigerian is entitled to the Nigerian space and should be protected to assert that right.

# How green is FG'S Green Imperative Project (GIP)?

ne of the greatest news for Nigerian agriculture recently is the Green Imperative Project (GIP) of the federal government. This is a \$1.1 billion project funded by the Brazilian Government through a loan from the Deutsche Bank (DB), Brazilian Exim Bank (BNDES) and Islamic Development Bank. It is designed to be a national initiative to create marketoriented, private sector-driven agricultural service hubs operated at the grassroots LGA level called Service Centres. Under the project, a total of 780 service centres deployed nationally will comprise 632 centres offering mechanised leasing services and capacity building production services to smallholder farmers and 148 service centres providing industrial processing of basic production from the first 632 centres. Amidst my excitement, I have been wondering in environmental sustainability terms, just how green is the Green Imperative Project?

In the present age of impending environmental challenges, environmental sustainability is a very vital topic. It refers to decisions and actions aimed at protecting and preserving the environment in order to support human and other lives. Businesses and individuals have over the years contributed to the degradation of the environment. Conscious efforts are made now to reduce the level of negative impact on the environment. This involves the usage of renewable energies, sustainable architecture, waste management, etc.

Environmental sustainability questions the human actions that have caused such problems as deforestation and pollution. It continuously seeks to create measured decisions and actions that will reduce the negative impacts we have on the environment. Environmental sustainability spans across many fields and disciplines in its stand to address all the economic, social, technological and institutional aspects related to the challenges of the environment. Governments and organisations such as the United Nations are continuously making policies and laws regarding environmental sustainability.

Businesses, which play the biggest role in environmental degradation, are the ones vehemently exploring the environmental sustainability world in order to doublecheck the long term impact they have on the environment. They devise new means of using natural resources such as land, agricultural produce and energy. As regards energy, most companies are turning towards renewable energies as opposed to fossil fuels that cause a serious threat to the environment. Also, the long term maintenance of this consciousness is necessary to validate environmental sustainability decisions and actions. Thus, ways are devised to make production and other processes of business completely sustainable.

Experts agree that sustainability is a process, which tells of a development of all aspects of human life affecting sustenance. It, inarguably, involves resolving the conflict between the various competing goals and involves the simultaneous pursuit of economic prosperity, environmental quality and social equity. Therefore, it is a continually evolving process. The activities involved in achieving sustainability are hence very vital as the only vehicles of getting there.

In other words, Environmental sustainability is the process of making sure

current processes of interaction with the environment are pursued with the idea of keeping the environment as pristine as naturally possible. Thus, environmental sustainability demands that society designs activities to meet human needs while indefinitely preserving the life support systems of the planet. This, for example, entails using water sustainably, only utilising renewable energy, and sustainable material supplies (e.g. harvesting wood from forests at a rate that maintains the biomass and biodiversity).

There can be a case of an "unsustainable situation" when the sum total of nature's resources is used up faster than it can be replenished. Sustainability requires that human activity only uses nature's resources at a rate at which they can be replenished naturally. Inherently, the concept of sustainable development is intertwined with the concept of carrying capacity. Theoretically, the long-term result of environmental degradation is the inability to sustain human life. Such degradation on a global scale could imply extinction for humanity.

These fears have led to the development of numerous approaches to sustainable development as it regards the environment. Sustainable living, for instance, exemplified by small-scale urban transition towns and rural ecovillages, seeks to create self-reliant communities based on principles of simple living, which maximise self-sufficiency, particularly in food production. These principles, on a broader scale, underpin the concept of a bioregional economy.


Perhaps, the most vital aspect of environmental sustainability is energy. The sun's energy, stored by plants during photosynthesis, passes through the food chain to other organisms to ultimately power all living processes. Since the industrial revolution the concentrated energy of the sun stored in fossilised plants as fossil fuels have been a major driver of technology which, in turn, has been the source of both economic and political power. Since 2007, climate scientists of the IPCC concluded that there was at least a 90 per cent probability that atmospheric increase in CO2 was human-induced, mostly as a result of fossil fuel emissions but, to a lesser extent from changes in land use. Drastic cuts in emissions must occur in order to stabilise the world's climate.

Lastly, agriculture places a serious burden on the environment in the process of providing humanity with food and fibres. According to FAO, agriculture is the largest consumer of water and the main source of nitrate pollution of groundwater and surface water, as well as the principal source of ammonia pollution. It is a major contributor to the phosphate pollution of waterways and to the release of the powerful greenhouse gases (GHGs) methane and nitrous oxide into the atmosphere. With all this in mind, I could not help but scrutinise the Green Imperative Project for environmental sustainability, which should be prominent for a project with a billion-dollar price tag. Despite its heavy reliance on mechanisation and industrial processing to achieve agricultural productivity, there is not much evidence of environmental sustainability in the GIP. However, agriculture must be sustainable for a healthy planet and to achieve that, actions are needed at the global, regional, national and local level.

# Museveni's contentious sixth term

neventy-six-year-old Yoweri Museveni, who has ruled Uganda for four decades, won a controversial presidential election; a re-election tainted with allegations of fraud, intimidation, deaths and detention of opposition supporters. With his re-election on January 16, 2021, Museveni, who came to power after winning a guerilla warfare in 1986, shall hold sway in Uganda until 2026, when he would have clocked 81 years of age. It is not clear if the amended Ugandan constitution would stop him from contesting for another five-year term at the expiration of this sixth term.

The presidential election result announced by Uganda's Electoral Commission said incumbent Museveni got 58.64 per cent of the vote, while his closest challenger and singer, 38-year-old Robert Kyagulanyi, popularly known as Bobi Wine, won 34.83 per cent of the vote. The Electoral Commission Chairman, Simon Byakabama said Museveni polled 5.85 million votes, as against Wine's 3.475 million votes. However, the credibility of the results is in doubt. It has not been clearly corroborated by independent election monitors, and Bobi Wine has said the results were doctored in favour of Museveni.

In 1986 when he came to power in a guerrilla warfare, Museveni was widely hailed for liberating the country from rebels and bringing about a measure of stability. Uganda was to witness economic growth over a period, and its response to HIV/AIDS pandemic was praised as one of the continent's effective approaches. Perhaps, it was for this reason that older Ugandans who may be haunted by the memories of the catastrophe and violence in the 1970s supported his reelection against the 78 per cent of the population that is below the age of 30. Today, Uganda is plagued by massive youth unemployment and its attendant frustrations, as those who are well-off survive on political patronage, corruption and mismanagement made possible by ineffective government.

Looking at the shadow of terrorism around Uganda, especially in the Democratic Republic of Congo, South Sudan, and Rwanda, Museveni believes only he is in a position to protect Uganda. With this thinking, he has slid into the errors of Zimbabwe's Robert Mugabe, Libya's Muammar Ghaddafi, Iraqi's Saddam Hussein and Egypt's Hosni Mubarak, who overstayed their welcome in power, and made heroes of those who fought them out of the exalted seat. Though Museveni is protected by state security forces, the opposition is real and could overwhelm the weapons of Ugandan police and military.

Museveni's re-election on January 16 was marred by the death of at least 54 persons who were killed by police bullets in a crackdown on opposition supporters. In the brutality in December 2020, Bobi Wine's bodyguard was run down and crushed by an army truck. Many other opposition supporters are said to have been hurled into prison in an attempt to provide Museveni a thoroughfare in the election. During the election, officials barred many foreign election observers and refused to accredit foreign media outlets. The Ugandan Government also shut down the Internet, making it impossible for the opposition and journalists to effectively monitor the election and share evidence of fraud. Security agents prevented Bobi Wine from moving out of his house and barred his supporters from visiting him at home. From all indications, the process of Museveni's re-election was not free and fair.

Bobi Wine's National Unity Party (NUP) has said it would challenge Museveni's victory in the court of law. We support the use of legal instruments in dealing with the suspected illegalities and call on the opposition to resist any temptation to take the law into their hands. Also, we call for the release of all opposition supporters from police detention or prison. If any of them has committed any offence, he/she should be tried in an appropriate court of law, instead of being arbitrarily punished because of political affiliation. It is also important for governments and international actors to put pressure on Museveni to halt the persecution of the opposition and give Ugandan courts the free hand to deal with post-election cases. Instead of attacking opposition elements, Museveni and other African leaders, should resist the temptation to perpetuate themselves in office, and learn the right lessons from their unpopularity.

ixty-three years on Monday, January 25th, a former governor of Ogun State and senator representing Central, Amosun, remains an issue in the annals of his state's body polity and even more, the nation, where his influence has continued to expand to the awe of his rivals and the opposition alike.

Senator Ibikunle Oyelaja Amosun has always been in a different class - a class distinguished by examples of personal discipline, generosity, compassion, hard work and unbendable principles.

Either in his private or public life, the former governor of Ogun State and senator currently representing the people of Ogun Central, is very much atypical. From his sartorial preferences to leadership style, he stands pretty tall and far away from the archetypal lot.

In his private life, his choices aren't just desirable; they are equally not the familiar demeanour of the average family man. You can't but crave his love for family. In the public sphere - one largely typified by thorough and unique political ideology - no one is yet to come close to Amosun in his turf of play.

more, with an What upbringing cemented sound family values, uncompromised religious doctrines, solid educational background and constant personal developments, it couldn't have taken much to infer that Amosun would go far in life, so long he wouldn't step away from those guiding principles.

A tough political juggernaut, albeit reasonable at demanding bends, there's a reality about Amosun that is beginning to dawn on his supporters and rivals alike and it is the need to understudy his survival strategy. It is nothing close to what they've seen before.

Living with the enemies and surviving their antics without betraying emotions, is not an option for the faint-hearted. But Amosun has become an authority in that strange discipline, mastered the craft and has continued to trump his traducers, even at their game. Call him a political life coach and you just might be spot-on!

Nothing, however, underscores his strengths as much as his capacity to move on from the 'not-toopleasant' situations that life seldom throws at him. He never allows a bad result to weigh him down. Instead, he picks up the pieces, learns from his mistakes and begins again even more intelligently. Whenever he loses, he never forgets the lessons therein.

Arguably the one politician in Ogun State today with the

largest and biggest following, complemented unmatched political structure, enviable grassroots appeal, how Amosun has been able to keep his political family close and shockingly impenetrable, is the puzzle that has continued to confound his rivals and the opposition alike.

It is public knowledge that Amosun could be pervicacious, albeit on principle, this he always balances with his religious doctrines, which recognise the God-factor in all his undertakings. This, perhaps, can also explain away why his crowd of supporters never wanes, much as he is an incurable giver.

Another thing that has kept this man of focus going is his rich network of influence and contacts across all strata of life – political and social circles especially. He finds networking

easy and leverages the very essence as a noted politician, who realises the weight of such an advantage.

Of course, this further explains his reach and the capacity to move across the northern and southern divides without flaunting his 'human net-worth'. It's an asset; he does not need to impress anyone by opening it up. But when the debate is about national influence and capital, he can only be underrated at the detriment of his opponents.

It was, therefore, not much of a bother to a reasonable few, when at the beginning of the Muhammadu Buhari administration his relationship with the president stirred some uneasy calm - both in some identifiable camps and the lives of a few characters that are still suffering the entitlement mentality.

But, that's not a badge he loves to adorn to spite anyone.

Even then, he would not let the sheer envy of a few vitiate a relationship that has stood the tests of many seasons. Striking that balance, although by choice, says even more about his native intelligence. Amosun is by every definition a loyal individual and always looks out for his friends.

After his initial four years as a senator, four years in the lurch, eight years as governor and the current representation in the ninth senate, it would take another intentional character like "Ajiri omo oye" as close allies choose to call Amosun, to challenge his legacies, many of which are spread across different human interests.

Even more instructive is the fact that his legacies have never been denoted only by politics or public office. With personal foundations and certain humanitarian exercises anchored on compassion and sincere intentions that are wont to outlive him, Amosun has a very good relationship with his people of Ogun State that would take more than a 'bread and butter politics' or fleeting inducement to undo.

Honest, straightforward, blunt and simple, both in principle and disposition, there's no gainsaying the fact that Amosun's lifestyle has been guided more by his closeness to God and kindness to fellow humans, which is why he has successfully meandered through some of the many traps of life, characterised by treachery, betrayal and outright envy.


Amosun is an exemplary family man, not just by sheer characterisation, but also by conscious choices that could cause some positive stir in many other homes. The quality of wife (Olufunsho) he is blessed with also attests to how far he has come with his preferences and of course, where life is taking him in the future yet unseen. In the 1970s, many will recall that in Kano when you go towards Bompai and you pass the Central Hotel, the sounds and sights and smells of industries were so pervasive," said Engineer Ahmed Mansur, President of the Manufacturers Association of Nigeria (MAN).

Mansur said this at a recent sensitisation meeting on the Kano State Turnaround Project as he recalled the industrialisation era of Nigeria's Centre of Commerce.

However, most of the industries have been a shadow of their past, declining since the past two decades. But the state government said it has devised a means to cause a rebound of industrialisation in the state.

To kick-start this process, the state recently announced that the Central Bank Nigeria (CBN) has approved N10 billion funds to revive ailing industries in the state, with hopes for more funding.

At the stakeholder meeting, Governor Abdullahi Ganduje minced no words when he delved into the issues that resulted in the closure of major industries in the state.

He said, "We all know why our industries went down many years ago. Many people have talked about electricity, which is a reality; smuggling, bringing cheaper goods from foreign countries. No matter how much electricity you have and how much you produce, you cannot sell at the prices of those smuggled goods."

The governor also said some managers of the failed industries mismanaged resources. "We are all used to a one-man show and we were used to when the competition was less and the protection from the government was more; therefore, industries were flourishing but the management of the industries could not compete with evolving challenges in the production chain; some could not cope with the change of the technology and were left behind."

On the part of the MAN leader, he envisaged a return of the industries because "industrialisation brings jobs, income and peace."

Although he lauded the efforts of the state government, Mansur advised that there was a need to get "old investors in the state for many decades to restore their investments".

He said the intervention of CBN through the Kano Turnaround Project,

is expected to help Micro Small and Medium scale Enterprises (MSMEs) to reactivate and transform them.

The project which is the first of such in the north is a collaborative effort of Kano State Investment Promotion Agency (KanInvest), MAN, and LINKS, a programme of the Foreign, Commonwealth and Development Office (FCDO) to catalyse economic growth in the north.

Chairman of KanInvest, Alhaji Isyaku Umar Tofa said manufacturers in Kano have been given a questionnaire to state their challenges.

"This alone is a great satisfaction for all of us manufacturers that for the first time somebody is asking us 'what are your problems."

The Director-General of KanInvest, Hajiya Hama Ali Muhammad, who revealed the N10bn CBN intervention, said the apex bank promised more funds for the ailing industries through the project which targets about 50 companies in the state.

She said forms for Expression of Interest (EoI) are available till February 25 for industry operators. The applicants would have interactions with the authorities in the next stage to access the fund. "You should understand that this is

an opportunity that needs to be utilized in a manner that will ensure maximum benefits for your investments," Muhammad urged the industrialists.

"Our doors will be open to any company, until the application reaches at least 50, then we will see if they can whavet the NIO billion or not."

exhaust the N10 billion or not." Poor electricity still a hurdle

Beside the effects of the COVID-19 on the economy, the operators and MSME owners said poor power supply remains the major challenge for the industries.

The president of Kano Chamber of Commerce, Industry, Mines and Agriculture (KACCIMA), Alhaji Dalhatu Abubakar, gave an illustration of how he was earlier paying about N7 million every month for electricity charges but now pays about N20m due to rise in electricity tariff.

The manufacturers appealed to the government to assist them in addressing the electricity tariff issue, noting that they pay up to N20 higher for every unit of electricity compared with other manufacturers in the south.

But the KanInvest officials said the project also considered the cost of electricity by ensuring that each beneficiary will include this in their proposals. Governor Ganduje, in his response, said his administration has made several interventions but no result yet in some national policies on electricity generation.

The governor said his administration has issued Certificates of Occupancy to five companies including Dangote to generate solar energy, but three years later, the projects are stuck due to the policy of the federal government on power generation.

Workers advised against fund misuse

Daily Trust reports that this is not the first intervention effort of the federal government towards reviving moribund industries.

For instance, textile industries, of which several are situated in Kano in the recent past benefited from a N100bn intervention fund.

A top official of the Nigerian Union of Textile and Garment Workers of Nigeria (NUTGWN) said 38 firms showed little or no result after they benefited from the federal government's N100billion Cotton Textile and Garment Revival Scheme in 2012

Governor Ganduje has also warned the manufacturers in the state to steer off mismanagement, saying such era was over.

Ganduje said: "I am happy with the new system that this project is introducing is one-one talk. The days when you can collect loans from banks and go and buy additional vehicles and marry additional wives... this was what happened.

"Even the funds for the textile industry, if the government should investigate what happened to those billions of naira and yet the textile industry is not on because people collected the money and did not use the money to revive the industry. I am sure if investigation is being carried out, some people will be put to shame," the governor recalled.

As the turnaround project progresses, business experts, Kano residents and the entire country await the results of the intervention with the hopes that it will not be subsumed like the previous ones, but become a catalyst towards restoring the state to its true state as - a centre of commerce.

# **CEO INTERVIEW**

The federal government has been making efforts to revive the Ajaokuta Steel Complex, what is your assessment of this?

I have taken my time to study and assessed the Federal Government's efforts to resuscitate Ajaokuta Steel Company Limited and my conclusion is that it may be difficult for any foreign investor to successfully Ajaokuta Steel operate Complex without the full support of the local industry operators.

The drive to revive Ajaokuta Steel Complex is to set the stage for Nigeria as the leading industrial nation in the continent as earlier envisioned, which is being driven through the development of the Steel sector under the able leadership of the Honourable Minister of Mines Steel Development, Arc. Olamilekan Adegbite; who has demonstrated passion and capability in promoting the steel sector in Nigeria, through his resolve that there is the need for the Federal Government to declare Iron and Steel as National Products for Rapid Economic Growth.

However, the process of resuscitating Ajaokuta Steel Company which is our nation's heritage was not properly structured. What should have been done, was to consult with owners of existing steel plants who would have given clearer narrations of the issues in the industry. But this important aspect was jettisoned by the Presidential Committee constituted by the Federal Government on Ajaokuta. However, some of the indigenous stakeholders had since drew the attention of Government to this gap.

I however must commend the efforts of His Excellency, President Muhammadu Buhari, and the Honourable Minister for Mines and Steel Development, Arc. Adegibte Olamilekan for their astuteness and determination to resolve the age-long problem and make the Ajaokuta Steel Complex a dream that comes to reality in an effort to industrialize the country.


The government has been negotiating with foreign investors, do you think that would help to revive the complex?

No, foreign investors can bring Ajaokuta Steel Company back to operation. What the Federal Government needs to do is to adopt the model used by the Peoples of Republic of China which later transformed the country's Steel industry within 25 years which led to massive development of the industrial sector in China.

What the Chinese Government did was to

indigenize one of the country's major industries -the Iron and Steel, into the hands of their people with the Government holding only 25% interest while local investors were allowed to own 75% stake. This created opportunities for the local investors and ensured that the wealth remained within the country, without repatriation of capital as well as dividends. This led to development of local skills and other multiplier effects that finally resulted in what the world is witnessing today as the industrial explosion in

I urge Nigerian government to redirect its policy on the industry because haven expended close to 40 years experimenting a particular model without result, it should be clear and in fact obvious that the commercial interest of the offshore investors does not match the developmental interest of the Government of Nigeria as well as the industrial aspiration of her citizens.

With my over 30 years' experience in the iron and steel business, I can confidently provide a workable template, which of course could also show that no foreign investor can fix Ajaokuta Steel Company.

Any attempt to invite foreign investors to resuscitate the Ajaokuta Steel Company will result in the said foreign interest depriving us of our national heritage; as any proceed realized from the sales, will be repatriated by such interests to their countries and would consequently have negative effects on Government's policy of backward integration and the corresponding objective of conserving the scarce foreign exchange with dare consequences on the current and future well-being of our economy.

Therefore, it is only indigenous investors that can make it happen so that the proceeds can remain here in Nigeria and we can re-invest this into the economy. This we have all seen, was the case in the cement industry and with Nigeria now taking another giant stride in refinery and petrochemicals.

What are the issues hampering the iron and steel sector despite all efforts?

Well, for more than two decades, government had not paid the desired attention to the steel sector which is the primary basis for industrial growth and development of any nation.

Iron and steel sector is suffering as a result of what is happening to Ajaokuta Steel Company. For an industry that is driven by committed and persevering investors, what government needs to do in the immediate circumstance is to mandate commercial banks and Development

banks through the Central Bank of Nigeria (CBN), to focus and direct attention to giving adequate support to the steel industry due to the capital-intensive nature of the business.

Steel sector plays similar role as that of cement, sugar, fertilizer and petrochemical industries, all of which can provide the needed tripod-support for the development of other light industries in the country. The incremental and progressive results being witnessed by them was the outcome of the success story of the indigenous players in the cement industry over the past nine years and with reduced stake from the offshore investors.

The best model is to indigenize and empower Nigerians and ensure that the strategy as encapsulated in the Nigeria Industrialization Revolution Plan (NIRP), creates avenues for whosoever wishes to partner with the local giants who have verifiable track record in the industry to do so

How did the steel sector benefits from the Real Sector Support Fund (RSSF)?

Despite CBN's announcement on diversification and creating of a window for Real Sector Support Fund (RSSF), some of the commercial banks are not willing to support genuine industrialists, probably due to lack of key project appraisal management skills.

We expect that Bank of Industry (BoI), which is created to support industrialization in Nigeria should have intervened but it seems the Bank have changed its windows of operations, which Central Bank needs look into.

The ensuing confusion is that commercial banks are no longer comfortable with this arrangement as they believe BOI is not sharing the risk with them and hence, the consequent abandonment of the needed support from BOI, which some real sector operators believed has created and classed them into financial orphans, with no 'care-giver' in the financial market!

What then do you think is the way out for the sector?

One way that could be easily employed is for the Government to urgently

channel the Comprehensive Import Supervisory Scheme (CISS) charges paid to the Nigeria Customs Service, (NCS) over the years, to providing bailout and support to the steel sector. Such money should be utilized to drive the industrial revolution process that will galvanize national industrial development.

There will be no reason for the government to borrow money to bring Ajaokuta back to life. We have the resources as a nation and we also have expertise who can make it work. We don't need foreign investors to do it. Ajaokuta can be back again to produce machines that are needed by other steel industries in their production processes.

You will agree with me that with the gigantic size of Ajaokuta, the complex should not focus on the middlesteel production, which are massively available around Nigeria and West Africa. Rather, it should focus on the configuration of a high class production of steel products such as Slab Caster, Hot Rolled Coils and Plates, and Foundry for the production of the required machinery and tools in the country, since 50 per cent requirement for these high-class configurations are already available in Ajaokuta.

How do you see the prospects for Nigeria with the take-off of AfCFTA?

The only way Nigeria can participate successfully in the African Continental Free Trade Area (AfCFTA) and successfully compete among countries in the continent is to develop our giant industries. We can look at China, which always underwrite their capital projects under Sinosure (China Credit Insurance Corporation).

The Federal Government should also borrow a leaf from other developed nations as well as some African countries; by creating platforms for Credit Insurance Underwriters in order to reduce the huge risks involved in capital projects. Government also needs to create more funding windows and other support infrastructure to elicit rapid industrial development.

There cannot be significant growth in the sector without the intervention of the Federal Government where and when necessary.

# Scores await N45,000 airport car operators' fund as payment begins

undreds of Nigerian airports car hire operators are still waiting for their 'palliatives' two weeks after the disbursement of the fund started.

The federal government had released a N5 billion aviation industry grant for airlines, ground handling firms, caterers and other allied aviation service providers. The airlines got N4bn, while the other section shared N1bn, with the Airport Car Hire Association of Nigeria (ACHAN) getting N100 million.

Last weekend, a lot of the operators confirmed they have received N45,000 about two weeks ago, but there scores of others who had filled the forms but yet benefit from the palliative.

Some of these affected operators said they were beginning to get anxious and not certain if they will still receive their share of the grant.

ACHAN had informed registered members to fill forms with over 2,000 of them complying. However as at Sunday, it was learnt that only a fraction of the airport car hire operators have benefitted.

"I filled a form and I made sure my account details were correctly written but as I am talking to you, I have not received an alert.

"Some of our colleagues have received but I don't know what is happening. Again, many people could not even get the form and we don't know what is happening with the payment because it is over two weeks already," one of the affected operators said.

Alfred Odion who operates at the Murtala Muhammed Airport Two (MMA2) in Lagos said only ACHAN members benefited from the palliative while other executive airport cab operators were exempted. "We also applied but we are yet to get anything and all of us were at home during the COVID-19 lockdown doing nothing but I don't know why the government is being selective," he said.

A former chairman of the Association of Airport Limousine Bus Operator (ALBO), Mr. Tijani Jelili, also said bus operators were excluded from the palliative.

"I can tell you we have not collected a dime. They didn't even give us the form which those who have benefitted filled."

# AMCON seizes Inducon assets over N1.3bn debt

The Asset Management Corporation of Nigeria (AMCON) at the weekend took over an asset belonging to Dr. John Warimeme Abebe, the Chief Promoter of Inducon Nigeria Limited over a staggering indebtedness of over N1.3 billion

The Head, Corporate Communications Department of AMCON, Jude Nwauzor, said it followed an order of Justice Aikawa of the Federal High Court Lagos,

AMCON at the weekend took effective possession of the property situated at Plot12, Block 108 Lekki Peninsula Residential Scheme, Lagos, through its Debt Recovery Agent - Ogunsola Shonibare L.P.

The Court also ordered that the bank accounts of the company and its Directors, Dr. John Warimeme Abebe, Mr. Olawole Fatimilehin and Ademola Buraimoh be frozen pending the final determination of the suit.

The case of Inducon Nigeria Limited and its promoters has been interminable shortly after the loan was purchased by AMCON during the 1st phase of Eligible Bank Asset (EBA) purchases from the defunct FinBank (now FCMB) since 2011.

Since the purchase, AMCON alleged it has offered the obligor several concessions and explored all avenues to resolve the debt harmoniously, but the obligor and his company have remained recalcitrant and unenthusiastic to repay the huge debt to AMCON.

"They have consistently reneged on several promises they made in the past during negotiations. This prompted the debt recovery agency to evoke the Corporation's asset tracing powers granted it under the AMCON (Amendment No. 2) Act, 2019."

Traders at the Bauchi Central Market are worried over an order by the Bauchi State Road Transport Agency (BAROTA) that bans the day-time offloading of goods in the market.

Malam Ibrahim Arab's fear is when the rains come. "During the rainy season, our commodities would be drenched. In fact, this order is unfavourable to us and we want the government to reconsider it."

The traders appealed to the state government to decongest the market by providing a befitting parking space. They also called on the agency to allow them to offload their commodities between 6am and 12noon.

When contacted, Chairman of BAROTA, Air Commodore Tijjani Gamawa (rtd) said the order came as a result of traffic congestion caused by vehicles in the market.

He also said the agency and the state government consulted with the leadership of the market and the executives of the Bauchi state market traders and artisans association who unanimously endorsed the ban.

# Calabar youths protest at tourism hub

The popular Marina Resort, a onestop tourism hub, which includes a slave history museum has been shut by protesting youths in Calabar of alleged cases of mismanagement.

The youths of Bayside in Calabar South LGA accused the Managing Director, Tourism Bureau, Utsu John of allegedly diverting revenues of the resort.

Reacting, Mr Utsu said the allegations were unfounded. "The records of transactions are accessible. It is not also true that the resort is no longer operational."

The state Commissioner for tourism and culture, Eric Anderson, also denied the allegations noting that he only plays a supervisory role at the resort and that the Tourism Bureau head does not report to his ministry.



# Two men nabbed for stealing remains of veterans from cemetery in Florida for 'ritual'



remains of U.S. military veterans from a Florida cemetery for use in a skull-filled "ritual" associated with an Afro-Caribbean religious movement. Detectives began looking for possible robbers in December after they found that four graves had been vandalised at Edgewood Cemetery in Mount Dora, the Orlando Sentinel reported in December. Three of the four graves belonged to veterans. Investigators sent cigars discovered at the scene for DNA testing, the Lake County Sheriff's Office stated in a press release. The DNA matched with that of Brian Montalvo Tolentino, 43, of Davenport. Police in Lake County contacted the Polk County Sheriff's Office, who obtained a warrant to take a mouth swab from Tolentino for a direct DNA comparison. When investigators questioned him, he allegedly confessed to going to the cemetery with his friend, 39-year-old Juan Burgos Lopez. Investigators went to Lopez's home on Wednesday, where they allegedly discovered "six skulls, a hand, partial arm, and multiple other large bones within what appeared to be some sort of religious shrine." Police said Lopez admitted that four of the skulls were from Edgewood Cemetery, while the other two were "obtained from other practitioners." A fake skull was also found at the scene, as were a baby alligator head, goat heads, goat skulls, turtle shells, chicken bones, raccoon skulls, and religious artifacts, authorities said at a Friday press conference. Lopez is part-owner of local businesses which sells essential oils and items used in Palo Mayombe rituals, according to a Polk County Sheriff's Department press release. BY GINA TRON







# **Hygiene: FCTA warns veterinary staff, butchers**

By Terkula Igidi

he Agriculture and Rural Development Secretariat of the Federal Capital Territory Administration (FCTA) has restated its resolve to promote and enforce hygienic meat handling in abattoirs across the FCT.

The Acting Secretary of the Secretariat, Mr. Ibe Prospect Chwukuemeka, therefore warned that there would be sanctions for veterinary health officials and butchers if standard hygiene practices were not adhered to in FCT abattoirs.

He made the declaration during an early morning unscheduled inspection visit to Karu and Kubwa abattoirs to assess the level of compliance to safety standards set by the secretariat.

He expressed concern over frequent complaints of unhealthy practices in the processing of meat, describing that as unacceptable. The Secretariat, he maintained, will no longer condone activities that constitute hazards to the public, disclosing that it is working towards introducing new measures to enhance effective monitoring of activities in abattoirs.

"Going forward, we will be introducing new measures that will enable us to monitor every activity taking place in the abattoirs; from the point of meat inspection and supervision by our veterinary officials to compliance to hygienic processes by the butchers in the abattoirs; as well as introduce new technologies to strengthen the surveillance to address reports of the use of tyres to roast meat as well as drug peddling," hw said,

The acting secretary told the butchers to desist from the use of unclean bare floors in the butchering of meat, advising them to make use of thick leather sheets to prevent contamination.

He also said the secretariat is working in collaboration with the Abuja Environmental Protection Board (AEPB) and would engage the services of reputable cleaning services companies for cleaning and evacuation of waste in the various abattoirs.

The construction of incinerators, according to him, will also help in effective waste management.

He, however, appealed for the support and cooperation of the area councils in improving services at slaughter slabs.

# Quit order to herders has implications for national security, Northern obas tell Akeredolu

The association of traditional leaders/Obas of the 19 northern states and the Federal Capital Territory (FCT), have told Governor Rotimi Akeredolu of Ondo State that the quit order given to herders has implications for national security.

The governor had last week given a seven-day quit order to Fulani herders to vacate forest reserves in the state, which expires today.

The association advised

that the criminals involved in kidnapping and committing other crimes in the state should be fished out and prosecuted based on their crimes, saying criminalising the whole Fulani herders was not the best approach.

In a statement signed by the secretary-general of the association, His Highness Oba (Dr) Alani Kolawole Adeyemi, made available to newsmen in Abuja, yesterday, the obas noted that the menace of kidnapping and other violent crimes, which have become a nightmare for Nigerians, requires a holistic approach.

Oba Adeyemi, who is also the Sarkin Yoruba of Guyaku in Adamawa State, stressed that the Ondo State governor, though a seasoned administrator and a Senior Advocate of Nigeria (SAN), needs not be lectured on the implications of the quit order on national security, adding that "the Fulani herders are also citizens of his state whose welfare and well-being are part of his responsibilities."

The statement advised that concerted efforts should be

made so that both the security apparatus of the state, the leaders of Fulani herders in the state and at the national level, as well as all well-meaning Nigerians work towards bringing amicable resolution to the crisis.

The obas reiterated that the Fulani herders have the inalienable constitutional rights to live and work peacefully in any part of the country, hence they appealed to revered paramount traditional rulers across the country to immediately wade into the matter.

# Gunmen invade orphanage, kidnap 11 in FCT council

unmen suspected to be kidnappers invaded Rachael's Orphanage Home, opposite UBE Junior Secondary School in Naharati, Abaji Area Council, Federal Capital Territory (FCT) and abducted seven orphans and a security guard of the home.

Daily Trust also learnt that three persons, Mrs Rukayyat Salihu, Mrs Suwaiba Momoh and Momoh Jimoh, who reside behind the orphanage were abducted by the kidnappers.

The kidnapped orphans were identified

as Elizabeth Andrew, Dayo Udeh, Jacob Ukpas, Melody Ijeh, Benard Itim, Isaac Mathew and Laruba Emmanuel as well as the security guard of the home, Joseph Mathew.

A resident of the area, who preferred anonymity, said the gunmen invaded the orphanage on Saturday around 1. am

He said the armed men forced their way through the gate and went straight into the rooms of the orphans and whisked away seven of them, alongside the security guard.

"They came in large numbers heavily armed, though they did not shoot as they carried out the operation before they proceeded to neighbouring houses," he said

A victim, Mohammed Nurudeen, whose wife, Rukayyat Salihu, was abducted by the gunmen, said he was asleep when gunmen came and forcefully opened the door and whisked his wife away.

"I was awoken by them and they threatened to shoot me if I didn't open the door but I refused until they forced the door open and entered the room and whisked my wife away," he said.

Nurudeen, who sustained a bullet wound from a shot by one of the armed men said the gunmen didn't finish him off after they discovered that he was bleeding profusely.

The Chairman of the Council, Alhaji Abdulrahman Ajiya, confirmed the incident via telephone interview with our reporter, saying he had alerted security agents on the incident.

When contacted, the spokesperson of the FCT Police Command, ASP Maryam Yusuf, confirmed the incident. She said six persons were kidnapped while one was rescued.

She said the command had deployed its men to the neighbouring forest to ensure that other victims were rescued.

# Internet scam: We are students, not criminals, arrested Osun youths insist

Daily Trust reports that one of the suspects was set ablaze by a mob in front of LGEA Primary School in Wurukum while the other suspect was said to have met his death at Gyado Villa when he attempted to dispossess a commercial rider of his bike.

A witness told our correspondent at the scene of the Wurukum incident that the suspect was killed and burnt with tyres after he made an unsuccessful effort to snatch a motorcycle from its owner.

The witness, a food vendor, whose makeshift shop was situated close to the scene of the incident, further said it was about 5:20 am when a commercial motorcyclist and his two passengers alighted at the gate of the primary school.

"An argument ensued between them after the motorcyclist noted that he was yet to arrive where the duo told him was their destination. The two passengers had earlier forced him to drop them at the primary school at gunpoint and then demanded the key of the bike.

"But, the motorcyclist refused to hand them the key so they shot at him but the bullet didn't penetrate. The motorcyclist on his part picked a stone and hit it one of the suspects with it. He also raised an alarm which attracted people to the scene.

"One of the suspects escaped while the other was unlucky as the people who got to the scene to help the cyclist set him ablaze," the food vendor said.

The Police Public Relations Officer for Benue Command (PPRO), DSP Catherine Anene, stated that only one of the two incidents was reported.

"At Wurukum area, information was received that a young man attempted to snatch a motorcycle and was arrested by a mob.

"The police on reaching the scene discovered that the suspect had been set ablaze. The command condemns such lawlessness and warns that members of the public should seek justice through the appropriate channels," she said.

# Court convicts 9 for flouting COVID-19 protocols

An Oredo magistrate court in Benin presided by Chief Magistrate Bright Eraze Oniha, has convicted nine persons for violating the coronavirus protocols in the state.

The convicts were sentenced to community service for not wearing facemasks in public and breaking the 10 pm to 5 am curfew in the state.

Twelve suspects were arraigned before the mobile

court for violating coronavirus protocols, while eight were sentenced for refusing to wear face mask in public while one other was sentenced for breaking the curfew.

The suspects convicted for facemasks violation include Abu Sani, Umaru Ali, Emmanuella Sylvester, Desmond Victory, Peter Nyashi, Franca Osas, Kashatu Mahmud and Clement Palmer while Sylvester Alufokhai, was convicted for curfew violation.

They were convicted for violating Regulations 8(6)(c) of the Edo State Dangerous Infectious Diseases (Prevention) Regulations 2020 and Section 203 of the Criminal Code Law as well as Regulation 16 (3) of the Edo State Dangerous Infectious Diseases (Prevention) Regulations (2020).

The court found nine of the accused guilty of the offence preferred against them and discharged three other persons.

# Man, 23, beaten to death over phone theft

Oyeyemi said the corpse of the deceased had been deposited at the morgue of General Hospital, Ota for post mortem.

He said the suspects would be transferred to the homicide section of the State Criminal Investigation and Intelligence Department.

## Gunmen kill Ibadan socialite, Gatuso

# Anxiety as Niger gov panel acts on Kwara APC crisis today

There is anxiety in the All Progressives Congress (APC) in Kwara State as the panel mandated to look into the crisis rocking it is expected to announce its decision on the way out of the feud between camps in the party today.

Even before the swearing in of Governor AbdulRahman AbdulRazaq after winning the 2019 governorship election in the state on the pedestal of the 'Otoge' revolution, the APC in Kwara State had been deeply polarised. Rather than thaw, the internal squabble has continued to worsen.

On one hand, are those categorised as Abuja-based politicians and on the other are the governor who has done and is doing everything possible to assert his authority as the overall leader of the party who should command the respect and obeisance of every member.

But as this seems a tall expectation, peace has been elusive in the party from day one, after the governor took over the mantle of leadership on that incredible mantra of 'Otoge' which upset the status quo.

Virtually all the aspirants who contested against the governor have deserted him and the battle for the soul of the party has been vociferous.

Also, those who referred to themselves as 'Otoge' champions, like the Minister of Information and Culture, Alhaji Lai Mohammed, a one-time chairman of PDP in the state, Akogun Iyiola Oyedepo, former chairman of the Federal Character Commission (FCC), Prof. Shuaib Abdulraheem, and several others are not only

disappointed with the running of the government, but are equally disenchanted.

This, observers said, is where the state chairman of the party, Bashir Omolaja Bolarinwa, a onetime House of Representatives member in Lagos, belongs.

But the governor is not an orphan in the political sphere. In fact, he has a long list of stakeholders and chieftains of the party queuing behind him as the governor's men. They include but are not limited to Senator Mokanjuola Ajadi, Hon. Iliyasu Ibrahim, Barr. Kunle Sulaiman, Senator Ahmed Mohammed, among others who align with the AA Group being championed by the governor.

The composition of the cabinet by the governor in December 2019 came as a disappointment to many party members who felt they were not consulted or their candidates were not considered in political appointments, thereby deepening the division within the party.

However, the lingering war deteriorated penultimate week when news filtered in that Hon. Bolarinwa has been sacked by the national caretaker committee of the party chaired by Governor Mai Mala Buni of Yobe State.

The news, which seems like a rumour, was later confirmed by the secretary of the committee, John Akpanudoedehe, amidst shock by the aggrieved members who are solidly behind the suspended chairman.

At a press conference addressed in Abuja on the day the news of Bolarinwa's suspension was confirmed, Oyedepo who is well known for his stiff opposition to

the dominance of former Senate President Senator Bukola Saraki in Kwara politics which was demystified in the 2019 election when APC won all the elective seats 100 per cent, rejected the sack of Bolarinwa.

But the national caretaker committee has referred the issue to the North Central Zonal Committee to reconcile the aggrieved members with a resolution being expected on Monday (today) but as it is, that is not likely to resolve the impasse, except the sack of Bolarinwa is reversed which is the condition given by his group.

A source who spoke with our correspondent on condition of anonymity said, "The challenge here is that the people appointed to reconcile the aggrieved members are governors who have not hidden their preference for their colleague's candidate. So do you expect any fair deal in this kind of circumstances? We are waiting to see what will happen on Monday before deciding on the

Another source, however, added

that the North Central Committee under the leadership of Governor Sani Bello of Niger State and Governor Yahaya Bello of Kogi State is committed to resolving the impasse fairly and freely with the interest of all the parties protected.

Speaking with our correspondent, Akogun said his group is waiting for the decision of the national caretaker committee on Monday before deciding on the next move.

He blamed the crisis in the party on what he called indiscipline on the part of members and failure of leadership on the part of the governor who is supposed to be the leader of the party.

According to him, the governor is not running an inclusive administration. "And what is bad in consulting people? That's why I said it is a leadership failure," he added.

But Hon. Ibrahim, a former House of Assembly member and one of the loyalists of the governor, insists the suspension of the chairman stands.

He also took a swipe at those who contested the primaries with the governor, accusing them of working against the governor even during the elections.

Even as stakeholders await the decision of the national secretariat on Monday, the crisis may persist until the 2023 elections as the gladiators warm up to take over from the governor. But the governor, too, on the other hand, may want to take a shot for a second term as his people have started making a case for him. This, analysts say, may jeopardise the fortunes of the party in future elections and create room for the possible return of PDP to power.

# Nigeria ripe for female

He said that four other persons had died in another accident on Thursday close to the NYSC camp while another, which occurred on Wednesday, claimed two lives.

In the Kwara accident four persons were said to have died in an auto crash that happened in on Sunday afternoon.

The accident occurred at Otte town, close to Ilorin International Airport road along Ilorin-Ogbomoso highway

It was a collision involving a

commercial Toyota Hummer bus with registration number FFA717YR and a truck.

It was gathered that the accident, caused by excessive speed and dangerous driving, caused the bus to burst into flames.

It was gathered that the four dead passengers were two males and two females, while no item was recovered at the scene.

Kwara Sector Commander, FRSC, Jonathan Owoade, confirmed the incident.

"Resumption by all tertiary institutions will be in phases as provided by the Institutions and according to their academic levels and subject to school's compliance with guidelines in place," it stated.

# 3 arrested over killing of Taraba council chair, nephew

The Taraba State police spokesman, DSP David Misal, has revealed that three persons have been arrested in connection with the killing of the Chairman of Ardo-Kola Local Government Area of Taraba State, Hon Salihu Dovo, and his nephew, Timothy Aminu.

DSP Misal said the gunmen suspected to be kidnappers invaded the deceased's residence at the Sabon-Gari area of Jalingo at about 1 am on Sunday and shot sporadically for over 30 minutes before abducting the council boss.

DSP Misal said the gunmen took away the chairman and crossed River Lamurde at the border between Jalingo and Ardo-Kola LGAs.

He further stated that vigilantes and policemen

trailed the gunmen and that the gunmen then shot the victim on noticing they could not escape with him and dumped his corpse in Nahuta village across the River Lamurde.

He said Aminu, a nephew of the chairman, who attempted

to prevent the abduction of the council boss, was also killed.

The police spokesperson explained that, "We have arrested three suspects and I can assure you that the killers of the council boss and his nephew would be brought to book."

Liverpool have never got past the fifth round in Klopp's reign, but that will be the least of his concerns as he tries to spark a revival from his spluttering team.

# Pol Pot, Shah, Hirohito and Mobutu

s President of the United States, leader of the Western World and **1** most prominent political figure in the world, Donald Trump was a shock experience, but only for youngsters. From the day in 1970 when my primary school teacher Mr. Obinwe handed to me his newspaper when he noticed that I sneaked up and was reading the back page while he read the front page, I have read stories about thousands of world leaders. Some of them were queer, some were nasty, others tyrannical, some others comical, many were despotic, still others incredulous, while some others were garrulously expensive. To my then young mind, they looked at a time like they will be here forever. Most of them are gone now, so I no longer entertain fears about permanency when a man like Donald Trump comes around.

Being around here for several decades and reading newspapers, magazines, books and surfing the net has almost taught me the patience of Chinese. Henry Kissinger wrote in his memoirs that the most patient statesmen he ever dealt with were the Chinese. With 5,000 years of civilization behind them, they have a very patient attitude to life, unlike our old comrades the Soviets. When, in 1898, the British forced China to lease Hong Kong to them for 99 years, some other countries will go to war over that, but the Chinese patiently waited until 1997, and told the Brits that the time was up.

Americans themselves never thought that they would ever have another president as crookish as Richard Nixon, who stonily covered up the Watergate scandal perpetrated by his men. When Trump came along, his lying, philandering, immorality, arrogance, impatience, egotism, tax evasion, bullying, racism, autocracy, nepotism, revolving door appointments, aversion to media scrutiny, subversion of justice and diplomatic tradition, abuse of office for personal gain and concerted effort to subvert the will of voters suddenly made Nixon to look like a saint.

From our standpoint here in the Third World, US President Ronald Reagan was another nightmare that we could not wait to see the back of. In the 1980s when Africa's top quest was to dismantle apartheid rule in South Africa, that arch-conservative resolutely stood in the way. He blocked all efforts at international sanctions. We also feared that Reagan could start a nuclear war with his anti-communist obsession. One day when he was asked to test a microphone before a studio interview, he said, "I will sign a law to outlaw the Soviet Union and we will start bombing in five minutes."

Reagan's fellow traveller, equally hated here in Africa, was British Prime Minister Margaret Thatcher. She was hard as steel towards labour unions and immigrants, and just as resolute as Reagan against imposing sanctions on Apartheid South Africa. Although Mrs. Thatcher ultimately hosted the 1979 Lancaster House talks that led to Zimbabwe's independence, she did so when Ian Smith and his White minority Unilateral Declaration of Independence [UDI] could no longer stand.

We Africans tolerated other Western leaders while they lasted. French Presidents Charles DeGaulle, Georges Pompidou, Giscard D'Estaing, the socialist Francois Mitterrand and Jacques Chirac were all exceedingly patronising to Africa, kicking Francophone African nations about like a local football made of bull's bladder. German Chancellors Willi Brandt, Helmut Schmidt, Helmut Kohl and Angela Merkel treated us as their lost step-children, as if we were the ones who told the Kaiser to start and lose a war in 1918

We Africans were grateful to the Soviets and their East Bloc allies who, together with Cubans and Chinese, gave us material support to rid Guinea Bissau, Cape Verde, Angola, Mozambique, Zimbabwe, Namibia and South Africa of colonial rulers. Apart from Fidel Castro, those guys were hardly genuine friends. The veteran Soviet Foreign Minister Andrei Gromyko, for example, never set foot on any African country except Egypt during his nearly 30 years as Foreign Minister of USSR. I can however still see the picture of Fidel Castro attending Ethiopia's revolution day anniversary parade in 1977. He was suffering from jet lag after the long flight from Havana to Addis Ababa and he drew his famous cap over his face and dozed off during the parade.

During our lifetime, we saw the coming and going of General Alfredo Stroessner of Paraguay. This father of sittightism was elected to five consecutive seven-year terms as president of his country. He had one Interior Minister for 30 years. Nasty Latin American rulers such as General Augusto Pinochet of Chile, General Anastasio Somoza of Nicaragua, the murderous El Salvador right-wing politician Roberto "Major Bob" D'Aubisson, Haiti's Jean Claude "Papa Doc" Duvalier and his equally despotic and highly corrupt son "Baby Doc" Duvalier have all passed into history, so who is Trump?

For decades it looked like the Shah of Iran will never go away. Mohammed Reza Pahlevi had accumulated more American weapons than anyone else in the Middle East. He made all his soldiers to swear an oath to "Zhoda, Shah and Mihan" [God, King and Country]. Please take note of the order of allegiance. The Islamic Revolution suddenly swept him away in 1979. His wife, Queen Farah and his sister Princess Ashraf were probably the most

expensive women in the Third World.

After Mrs. Imelda Marcos, I am sorry. While Ferdinand Marcos tyrannically ruled over the Philippines, his wife Imelda was the top customer of the most expensive Western shops. When they fled to Hawaii in 1986 following the People's Power revolution, Imelda left behind 6,000 pairs of shoes, after taking some along with her. Her husband defended it in an interview, saying she may not wear all of them but it gave her a choice whenever she was dressing.

Marcos was only one of the South Asian totalitarians that, during our young lives, we thought will never go away. Ngo Dinh Diem, Madam Nhu, Air Marshal Nguyen Cao Ky all of South Vietnam, South Korea's Park Chung-hee, Chun Doo-hwan and Roh Tae-woo, Indonesia's Suharto, Malaysia's Tunku Abdurrahman, Burma's Ne Win and Senior General Than Shwe, Bangladesh's Mujibur Rahman, Thailand's King Bhumibol Adulyadej, Prime Ministers Kriangsak Chamanand and Admiral Prem Tinsulanond, not to mention Cambodia's genocidal Khmer Rouge ruler Pol Pot, were all so much etched in our minds during our youthful years that it looked like they were here to stay. What is Donald Trump's four years?

Look, in Africa here, Apartheid Prime Ministers John Vorster and "Der Grut Krokodil" P.W. Botha once looked like they will never go away. In North Africa, Egyptian Pharaohs (sorry, presidents) Gamal Abdel Nasser, Anwar Sadat and Hosni Mubarak each looked like eternity. Other North African rulers King Hassan of Morocco, Muammar Gaddafi of Libya, Habib Bourguiba of Tunisia and Hoari Boumedienne of Algeria all looked eternal to us. When Emperor Haile Selassie of Ethiopia visited Nigeria in 1972, his white beard suggested that this grandson of the biblical King Solomon was there for eternity, until soldiers shoved him out in 1974.

Sergeant (sorry, President) Gnassingbe Eyadema of Togo, Siaka Stevens of Sierra Leone, General Aboubacar Sangoule Lamizana of Upper Volta [now called Burkina Faso], General Moussa Traore of Mali, Emperor Jean Bedel Salim Ahmed Bokassa of Central African Empire, Marshal Sese Seko Kuku Ngbendu wa Zabanga Mobutu of Zaire (now called DR Congo), Mzee Jomo Kenyatta of Kenya, Mwalimu Julius Nyerere of Tanzania, our neighbours Diori Hamani in Niger Republic, Ahmadou Ahidjo in Cameroon, Mathieu Kerekou in Dahomey (now called Benin Republic) and N'garta Tombalbaye on Chad, not to mention Agostinho Neto of Angola, Samora Machel of Mozambique, Siad Barre of Somalia and Field Marshal Idi Amin Dada of Uganda all looked to us like they were here to stay.

In 1989, I first heard on BBC of the death of Japanese Emperor Hirohito. I read much about this man, who became Emperor in 1926 and disastrously steered his country into World War II. Our military president Ibrahim Babangida took off for Tokyo to attend the funeral, which Margaret Thatcher boycotted and said Hirohito was a war criminal. These days I think like a Chinese Confucian philosopher; time does not scare me.

World Cup-winner Ozil, whose Arsenal contract was set to expire at the end of this campaign, was among the highest-paid players at the London club but had not featured since March.

He was signed in 2013 for a thenclub record fee of about 42 million pounds from Real Madrid.
