NLN to Drive Global Rating of Nigerian Journals

The National Library of Nigeria is to partner academic institutions in Nigeria in promoting and enhancing the global rating of research and academic journals in the country.

The National Librarian and Chief Executive Officer of the apex library, Prof. Lenrie O. Aina stated this when he received in audience, the University Librarian of the Benue State University, Makurdi, Prof. John Agada.

According to the National Librarian, there are so many journals emanating from the country which are not captured in the world research output.

According to Prof. Aina, only five out of 217 journals published in Nigeria, are captured by "Web of Science" while "Scopus" which seem to be magnanimous, only captures 27 out of this lot".

He further informed his guest that on assumption of duty, he set it as priority, to partner with relevant stakeholders to reverse this trend and expressed happiness that someone else is equally thinking along that line.

Earlier on, the University Librarian, Prof. Agada who was on a courtesy visit to the National Librarian, stated that his visit was to seek the support and collaboration of the National Library of Nigeria in promoting the use of local journals in Nigerian Universities. He expressed worry over the reliance on foreign journals which are products of research carried out in and around those societies, when we have so many current local journals in and about the country.

The National Librarian promised the University Librarian of his utmost support as well as personal donations of back issues of some journals to the Benue State University.



What You Need to Know about National Library

The main function of the National Library of Nigeria is "to assemble, maintain and extend a collection of books, periodicals, pamphlets, newspapers, maps, musical scores, films and recordings and such other matters as the Board considers appropriate for the library of highest standing."

It is pertinent to point out that the National Library of Nigeria is a depository library and a data bank where books published in Nigeria are deposited and preserved, and it is mandatory for all publishers – private, state or federal government to send the correct number of copies of their publications to the National Library of Nigeria for preservation.

The National Library of Nigeria, like any other national libraries all over world, is essentially a reference and research library. While public, academic or special libraries can select materials that are relevant to the needs of their clientele, the National Library of Nigeria has no option but to preserve all materials produced in Nigeria as part of the heritage of the country.

Unfortunately, due to the dearth of public libraries in Abuja and other state capitals, the National Library outlets are forced to engage in retail library services to fill the void.

It might interest you to know that the National Library of Nigeria that operates in more than one location and in fact the institution is currently operating twentysix (26) state branches with headquarters in Abuja. In each of the National Library locations, authors and publishers have no problem obtaining International Serial Book Numbers (ISBN) and International Serials Standard Numbers (ISSN).

Authors equally do deposit copies of their publications at any of our branches nearest to them. The National Library of Nigeria according to the law that set it up, must be replicated in every state of the federation. Due to paucity of funds, the National Library is yet to have branches in about 10 states but efforts are still on,

to attain that. Though federal government finances the National Library of Nigeria, the funding is hardly adequate for library to fulfill its mandate. Every year, the library sends its budget estimates to the government, including its plans to build prototype branches in the states that lack them but government is at liberty to approve or reject what is submitted, based on the financial situation of the Federal Government.

Our books may look old but that is because they have to be preserved for other generations. In fact, the older the books in the library the better for the researchers. Unknown to many people, the National House, Central Business District, Abuja is an administrative block. The greatest challenge National Library of Nigeria is facing is office space to accommodate library resources and users.

However, the good news is that the Ultramodern and multi-storey Permanent Headquarters Building is near completion. The building is adjacent to the National Mosque in the Central Business District, Abuja.

Apart from the promise of being one of the most magnificent national monuments in the heart of the city, among other things, it will have the capacity to simultaneously

National Library of Nigeria is poised to fulfill its statutory mandates by establishing branches in all state of the federation and to promote reading culture among Nigerians.

Guidelines and Requirements For ISSN

The ISSN is an eight digit number that uniquely identifies serials globally.

Publishers requesting for ISSN must first verify their title(s) with the ISSN Centre before publishing in order to avoid duplication of title

Requests made by means other than contacting our Head Office in Abuja or any of our State Branches/Web or contradicting information may not be processed

Refusal or revocation of an ISSN, if subsequently, it comes to light that misleading and contradicting information has been provided by the requestor is inferred.


All free/available titles will be reserved for a period of three (3) months from the date it is officially declared.

Publishers requesting for ISSN must also indicate the different medium/formats of their publication(s) so as to ensure each

format is issued with an ISSN as appropriate, (e.g print/on-line continuing resources).

In the case of on-line continuing resources, the URL page as well as the web page password must be supplied before an ISSN can be assigned to the serial. The name and address of the publisher must be displayed on the publication and a minimum of five (5) articles are considered appropriate to a publication.

IF YOU ARE CIRCULATING IN PRINT, IT IS THE PRACTICE IN NIGERIA THAT PUBLISHERS PUBLISH THE FIRST EDITION OF THEIR SERIAL (maiden issue, i.e. vol.1, No.) AND FORWARD. Either three (3) copies, if the publication is a private publication, ten (10) copies – State Govt. Publications, twenty-five (25) copies – Federal Govt. Publications, to the Nigeria ISSN Centre, Abuja.
