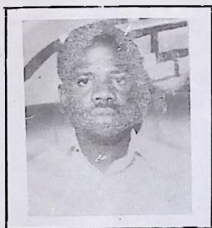

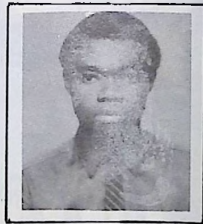

The music is played in remembrance of dead heroes, it goes further to teach the originality of the IFUNNU MASQUERADE, the belief of the Gwari in this god, as well as the DONTS during its ceremony. Musical instruments for the KABULU Music is also described with emphasis on the "MOLON-KABULU while the presenter - Yeriwa Gwari teaches the

dance-step.

On December 20, Sunday Emokpare takes on the EGEDEGE Music from Anambra State. The slot features Theresa Onuorah, an 18 year old student. The programme will also feature the "AGAFU" Music from Plateau State with Itze Izang and His Guap on December 27, 1983.

Popular Sounds is a programme designed to feature a particular State every week. As it comes up every Monday and Thursday at 9.03 a.m.

Bororo music is usually played on Market days in villages, mainly during the raining season when growing pastures is very beautiful. Oludeyi Amosu who introduces the programme will tell the listeners more about Bororo music on Sunday, 4th December, 1983 at 16.45hrs; 1745 hrs on Tuesday 6th and Friday 9th at 1930 hrs for the repeats.

Apart from the languages, there are many other things which bind us together like farming, hunting, fishing and music. Gohun music which you will listen to in this programme is popular among the Egun people both here in Nigeria and the Republic of Benin.

The music is played on all social occasions and the dancing usually demands a lot of energy. It has no age or sex restrictions.

Listeners will learn about the musical instruments employed by Gbejemi Brothers and Gohun Band from Badagry in Lagos State. In this edition, listeners will be treated to Kuntugi music played by Momman Sokoto, from Sokoto State.

# EDUCATIONAL SERVICE

## 18½ Hours Programmes For Young And Old

**EIGHTEEN** and a half hours of educational broadcasting has come to stay in Nigeria. It is difficult to believe, but it is true; thanks to Federal Radio Corporation of Nigeria. It is the first of its kind in Africa.

It all started at 12.15 in the afternoon of November 2, 1983 on 4.932 MHZ in the 60 metre band, short-wave. Before this time there was test transmission for several weeks.

The programmes broadcast cover all levels of education as enunciated by the National Policy on Education. These include primary schools, junior secondary, senior secondary and technical schools. Other aspects of education covered in the broadcast are teacher education, adult education, vocational and continuing education, as well as Open University.

This implies that every Nigerian stands to benefit from the Educational Service, whether young or old. It does not matter whether one is in school or out of school. The programmes are designed in an easy-to-follow method. All that one requires is to have a radio set nearby.

Since the programmes run from 5.30 a.m. to 12 midnight, the programmes are arranged in such a way as to cater for a particular listening audience at a time. It will save a lot of time for one to know when programmes intended for one's listening group will be broadcast. The table below shows the broadcast time for each listening group or audience.

Radio lesson per se is not new in Nigeria or Africa. In fact, Radio Nigeria started termly broadcast to schools and colleges since April, 1961. Countries like Ivory Coast and Tanzania have had years of experience in Educational broadcasting. What is entirely new about the present educa-

tional broadcast in the country is that the programmes are broadcast on separate channel on 4.932 MHZ in the 60 metre band.

Until recently, educational programmes were broadcast from the National Network of Radio Nigeria, Lagos, with other programmes. But now, educational programmes can be heard everyday including Saturdays and Sundays on a separate channel.

The National network news and reports from the National Assembly can also be heard from the same channel.

# Judiciary Vs Finance

## —Who Decides Inadequate Funding Case?

**THERE** is a basic assumption about our present system of government and that is, the fact that each of the three areas of government - the Executive, the Legislature and the Judiciary should exercise a high degree of autonomy in the way they carry out their constitutional responsibilities. This is what the so-much discussed checks and balances are all about.

That is, every arm of government should go about its business without any form of interference with each other. This is why it is often said that the pride of democracy lies in the ability of the three areas of government to guard their independence jealously for the protection and benefit of the people. And it is often argued that where each of the areas is assertive and alive to its responsibilities, it will be impracticable for any arm to claim to be first among equals.

It is of utmost importance that Nigeria has been finding its feet in trying to move towards this utopia. Nevertheless there still remains a very sensitive area to tackle. That has to do with finance.

The usual argument is that the executive requires more money than any other area of government. The contention is that it is the executive which will carry out capital projects and run recurrent programmes of

frightening dimensions. Therefore, in sharing revenue, its peculiar position must be appreciated and accordingly given the right attention it deserves. Once this has been done, the executive goes ahead to disburse its funds in accordance with the proposals approved by the legislature.

The National Assembly, too in recent times has fought and won the right to control its own funds. The rationale is that no legislature worth its position under the present dispensation will allow its financial administration to lie elsewhere.

This is where the third arm of government comes in. The retired Chief Justice of the Federation, Mr Justice Adu Fatayi-Williams has put the case across in clear terms. First, the competence of the judiciary is taken for granted. And so, when funds are allocated, what gets is a paltry sum of money. The average federal allocation is meagre 1.45 per cent. Only three states, Oyo, Niger, and Benue manage to give the judiciary up to four per cent of their total expenditure. Some states even provide less than one per cent of their expenditure for the judiciary. Besides, when the money is provisioned paper, no one could be sure of when the liquid cash will be released. As the retired Chief Justice has said, the situation has deteriorated so badly that the courts cannot even buy stationery to carry out their routine duties.

In a statement by the retired Chief Justice on the financial condition of the judiciary has raised a number of issues the first of which is that the judiciary has been unduly quiet about its plight. While it is true that the best must maintain a high degree of dignity, there is no reason while it should suffer in silence.

It is not tenable in a democratic environment where there is ample freedom of expression. The courts know more than anyone else. Revolutions like the ones that are just being waged public would have put them in a position on the side of the judiciary to enable it to receive a more favourable attention at the areas where

funds are allocated.

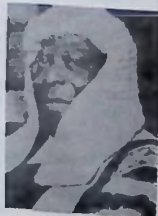
Another issue is that the independence of the judiciary is sacrosanct. Therefore, it should have been allowed to control its own funds just like the other arms of government. The Judicial Service Commission should be in a position to determine priorities of the courts and allocate funds to them accordingly.

Above all, no one should dismiss the problems of the courts with a wave of the hand. This is because, there is a tacit agreement among all of us that the judiciary is the last hope of everyone. Therefore, now that the facts have been known, there is the need for a renewed look at the financial position of the judiciary. Such a reappraisal must necessarily aim at improving the current deplorable situation.

On a global basis, the Nigerian Judiciary has proved that it can hold its own anytime. More and more men and women committed to the cause of justice are continuing to go to the bench to uphold the enviable image of our judiciary. The only thing required of the nation is the provision of the minimum facilities the courts will need to continue to do a work which most of our people are indeed proud of.

# Nigeria And World Energy Situation

*IN the first Radio Talk of the 1983 "October Lectures" carried in last month's issue of this magazine, Dr. P.C. Onianwa, the Lecturer, treated our readers to a talk on the "Existing Sources of Energy In Nigeria and the socio - economic implications of the diminishing energy sources". In this edition, and the second part of the talks, the erudite Scholar and Specialist in Nuclear Physics, deals exhaustively but interestingly on the "Place Of Nigeria in the world of energy situation". Read on:*

THE end of the second World War saw the emergence of a triangular formation of power groups with distinctive group interests. At the apex of this triangle stood the two super-powers, the United States of America and the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics, and world events were dominated and controlled by these two super-powers.

At the other corner of the triangle was a group of industrialised countries concentrated in the northern hemisphere which consisted of old European powers and the rising economic giant of the Far East, Japan, all catering to either Washington or Moscow and concurring with the policies of the super-powers in return for economic aid which these countries badly needed to enable quick economic recovery of their war-torn countries. At the third corner of the triangle was sitting a third group of impoverished countries, the so-called third world, of the south.

This group consisted of countries which were politically subjugated as former colonies of the industrial nations and which, after political independence, remained economically tied to their former masters. The roles of these countries as suppliers of cheap raw materials and dumping ground for finished goods were perpetuated through so-called economic aids that

were not without strings.

Political independence of most of these countries was not sufficiently backed by drastic re-orientation of the economies of these countries with the result that they soon found themselves more and more unable to solve the basic economic and social problems of their teeming populations.

Out of these third world countries emerged the most powerful cartel ever known in history, namely the Organisation of Petroleum Exporting Countries (OPEC) to become a relatively prosperous group, which broke the pater of dominance of world affairs by the super-powers and succeeded in wresting the economic destiny of its members from the hands of the multinational monopolies of the industrialised nations. It is to this group that Nigeria belongs.

Today, the total amount of energy consumed by the world from all sources such as oil, coal, natural gas, hydraulic power, solar, geothermal, wind, biomass wastes, etc. is the oil equivalent of some 100 million barrels of oil per day. Of this, 80 million barrels per day is oil. In other

words, the contribution of oil to our energy requirements is as much as 60 per cent despite all the other sources of energy available to man.

One third of this 60 million barrels of oil per day comes from the Persian Gulf area alone. This disproportionate use of oil is solely due to the fact that oil is versatile, i.e. it can be used in a wide range of applications; it is convenient and cheap. Oil is therefore a principal determinant in the world energy super market. In examining the place of Nigeria in the world energy situation, we shall therefore dwell more on oil than any other source of energy.

Just about a decade ago, crude oil price was a mere pittance of 3 US dollars per barrel. This low price stood in sharp contrast to the relatively high price of oil products in the consumer countries with the result that huge profits accrued to the oil companies and the various governments of the industrialised world which added their own consumer taxes to swell their respective national coffers at the expense of the oil exporting countries.

With the disturbing realisation by petroleum exporting countries that their precious commodity is finite in quantity and therefore exhaustible, coupled with the events of 1973/74 Arab oil embargo, crude oil prices quadrupled from 3 US dollars per barrel to 12 US dollars. This unprecedented price escalation sent a shock wave throughout the large industrial nations, none of which, except the Soviet Union could produce all the oil it needed.

Dismaied by the dwindling purchasing power of the US dollar, OPEC had no choice but to continue to adjust the price of oil upwards in accordance with growing world energy demands. By 1980, the benchmark price had been set at 32 US dollars per barrel. Our Nigerian crude oil

even attracted higher premiums because of its superior quality. Many countries, particularly developing countries, found themselves increasingly unable to pay their oil bills. The political events in one of the more turbulent areas of the world added a new dimension to the already troubled world energy situation, namely the use of oil as a political weapon.

One of the two super-powers which by now found itself heavily dependent on oil from this part of the world had no choice than to take adventurous measures which ended in utter disaster for the super-power aroused the haunting fear that the world was at the brink of a new major war. It is against this background that we have to view the place of Nigeria in the world energy situation, bearing in mind that it is not strict logic but expediency that governs international economic relations.

The legitimate action of OPEC in taking its destiny into its own hands was seen by the industrialised world as a threat to their very economic survival and a series of counter measures were soon unleashed against OPEC, individually and collectively. A 21-nation International Energy Agency signed an agreement in 1975 which provided that in the event of major cut-off, they were to share their oil.

The industrialised countries even singled out Nigeria which, in view of its huge population and more

pressing needs for foreign exchange required to execute its ambitious developmental programmes, was therefore considered by them as the weakest link in the OPEC chain and was, therefore, earmarked to be severed in order to weaken OPEC. A chain is as strong as its weakest link. International agreements became dishonoured by the oil companies which refused to lift Nigerian oil in the vain hope that Nigeria would succumb to the temptation of a price war against its OPEC members.

Nigeria, though plagued with economic problems, remained steadfast in observing to the last letter the price policy of OPEC. Frightened by the

force of the Organisation of Petroleum Exporting Countries, the industrialised nations adopted more desperate measures to break the backbone of this formidable cartel. However, neither the gun-boat diplomacy of old nor the age-old celebrated divide-and-rule strategy, nor even the carrot-and-cane stance of the industrialised world were effective enough to break OPEC.

By regulating production volume and price parameters, while taking cognisance of the world economic situation, OPEC has succeeded in forcing the consumer countries to realise sooner than they would that oil is a depletable commodity which has to be substituted by alternative sources before it is too late. OPEC therefore performs a regulatory function that is helping to curb the apparently insatiable oil appetite of the industrialised world.

By examining the place of Nigeria in the world energy situation, we would in fact be re-assessing our strength vis-a-vis an energy-hungry world that is always quick to castigate members of OPEC. Though Nigeria is blessed with a wide range of various other sources of energy, it is oil, however, that has placed the nation in the limelight, our strength therefore derives primarily from oil.

With a production capacity of 2 million barrels per day, Nigeria is certainly far below the production capacity of the Soviet Union which, at 12 million barrels per day, is the largest oil producing country in the world, followed by Saudi Arabia and the United States of America in that order. The United States which produces about 9 million barrels per day from its domestic wells has to import the remainder of its needs from members of OPEC who themselves produce half of the world's oil, and lately from Mexico which is not a member of OPEC.

Our oil with its low sulphur content has until now found a ready market in pollution-conscious United States and some other countries of Europe. The United States' dependence on import of oil is much less than that of Europe, which in turn is less than that of oil-poor Japan whose industry depends entirely on giant oil tankers that stream into Japan at the rate of four a day, from foreign sources located largely in the trouble-infested Middle East areas.

At her current production, the

United States has the equivalent of 9 years of oil reserves left, in which time it is practically impossible to substitute oil with nuclear energy source in commercial quantities, nor with any other renewable source of energy, except coal from which synthetic fuel can be produced, at economically prohibitive costs with the attendant hazards to health.

Natural gas closely leads crude oil in respect of reserves. Here too the Soviet Union may be blessed with large reserves of gas, but it is hardly difficult for the mind to see the ulterior motive behind the policy of the Soviet Union which supplies oil and natural gas through massive network of pipelines to the socialist states of eastern Europe and plans to extend this service to the capitalist countries of western Europe, a policy dictated more by geo-political than commercial considerations. At the current rate of production, it may take about a decade before the Soviet Union changes its present status of an oil exporting country to that of an oil importer.

In fact oil production in the Soviet Union is expected to peak in the early 1980s and even the rich North Sea fields will probably begin to decline by 1985. The United States may also have an enormous potential for non-conventional sources of natural gas such as are found in geo-pressured zones, coal seams, Devonian shales and tight sands, but unlike natural gas, the cost of harnessing these non-conventional sources of gas is astro-

nomical. The United States has vast reserves of coal and the largest concentrations of nuclear power stations will nevertheless soon find themselves running out of conventional sources of energy within one and a half decades, without sufficient capacity being readily available from unconventional sources to replenish the depleted amounts.

If Nigeria should practise a conservation policy and so decide to maintain, for instance, a reserve/production ratio of 30: 1, it means that we could expect our oil to last another 30 years at our current production rate. It follows therefore that our oil would still continue to flow at this rate when the largest oil producing countries of the industrialised world will have long run out of their oil reserves.

It will be observed that what we are looking at is not the absolute quantity of oil reserves a country may have but its ability to find an appropriate energy policy when all factors will have been taken into consideration, including want and availability, which in turn determine an energy conservation policy, in order to maintain a reasonable reserve to production ratio and at the same time satisfy its own domestic requirements and still remain an energy-surplus country much longer than it would have taken the country to run out of oil.

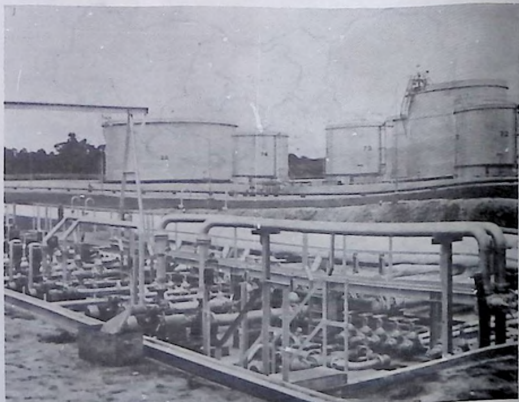
Therein lies the importance of an energy policy for Nigeria which can

take cognisance of all factors of our development to arrive at our energy requirements over a short, medium and long term plan period weighted against our revenue requirements, that is assuming oil would continue to be our main source of revenue. Only when all these parameters are known can an appropriate reserve/production ratio be determined, which again has to be streamlined with OPEC requirements which are dictated by the exigencies of our changing times.

It will be noted that for a long time between 1973 and 1980, our reserve/production ratio was 20: 1 which was solely determined by demand in the world oil market and our badly needed oil revenue for the development plans without due consideration being given to our conservation policy, until our production dropped to the current figure around one million barrels per day to give a reserve/production ratio of 40: 1.

If we are prepared to see the other side of our position in the world energy situation, we must recognise an unfortunate weakness imposed on us by our geographic position relative to the major oil importers of the world which makes more economic sense for the United States to buy oil from Mexico which can be pumped across the border through pipelines or buy natural gas also from Mexico and Canada than to import these com-

nomical. # Local Govt. Elections

## —Moving Democracy To Grassroots

PRIOR to the unified local government system in 1976, administration at the local level varied from one part of the country to the other. In some parts of the north, the traditional authority exercised executive, legislative and some judicial powers. Local administration was run with the help of district heads appointed by the traditional authority. In the south, divisional counsellors were elected although their powers at the time were not as elaborate and defined as they are at present.

The head of local administration was a career civil servant and councillors merely performed in advisory capacity. It is therefore to the credit of the military government that local government administration throughout the country was reformed and given the same character and status.

Under the new system, counsellors are popularly elected and the chairman who is the political head of the council is appointed. Also from the elected members, supervisory counsellors in-charge of departments like education, works and health are appointed.

It was under this setting that the democratically elected local governments throughout the country were inaugurated in 1976. In fact it was after this that many communities felt for the first time the impact of local government. The administration was run in compliance with modern and accepted practice.

With the expiration of the tenure of

office of the governments elected in 1976, those whose duty it is to conduct local government elections found themselves ill-equipped for such a venture. Consequently the only option was for state governments to dissolve the councils.

Some councils were reappointed on caretaker basis while in many others entirely new caretaker committees were appointed. Although there is a mandatory period beyond which local government caretaker committees cannot function. That is to say popular election should be held within that period. But what has been witnessed since the dissolution of the first democratically elected local governments is the dissolution of one caretaker committee and the appointment of another.

What is more, the whole exercise has been given a political colouration since the return of party politics. To qualify as a member of local government caretaker committees, one's overt political inclination to the party in-power in a state must never be in doubt. The result is that, instead of the counsellors to be primarily responsible to the local community, their preoccupation was to demonstrate their unalloyed loyalty to state chief executives by whose benevolence they were appointed counsellors in the first instance. So, merit and qualification for the job were sacrificed on the altar of party identification.

This situation accounts for the slow tempo of development activi-

ties in some local communities across the country. Instead of working for the improvement of the living condition of the rural people, members of the local government caretaker committees occupied themselves with fighting for the renomination and re-election of their benefactor governors.

In fact in many states, they were the architects of the success of some incumbent governors in their bid for renomination. This, some of them did, since they wielded a lot of influence because of the powers conferred on them by law.

But with the election into local government councils coming up soon it is hoped that this sad state of affairs would be a thing of the past.

Local communities will once again have the golden opportunity of electing their own true representatives whose fortunes will depend first and foremost on the goodwill of the people rather than on a political father figure.

If this is done, the people will now be in a position to know how the revenue accruing to local government from both the federation accounts and the state government is spent. Under the present dispensation, this cannot be possible since members of the local government caretaker committees do not go to the people to renew their mandate.

Therefore the coming election into local councils should be taken as seriously as the just concluded general elections. It can be recalled that during the verification of signature exercise in places agitating for new states by the senate and House committees on states creation, the issue of whether now elected counsellors were qualified to sign the document featured prominently. This in itself demonstrates the degree of importance of elected counsellors.

The local government election taking place in due course is of great significance because it will bring down to the grassroots, the democratification process which started with the presidential election.

modities from far away Nigeria, whose price policy is regulated by the external organ of OPEC.

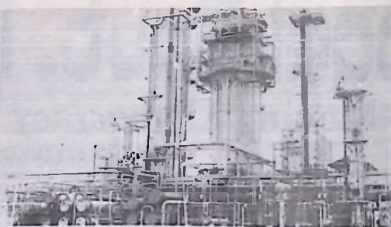
Similarly, the European world for the same reason of geography would prefer in the first instance the North African source of oil to ours as they have already shown in the case of natural gas supply. It is for the same reason that far-away Japan imports nearly all of her oil requirements from the Middle East and since we would not sell to nearby South Africa as a matter of policy, it follows therefore that Nigeria has to continue to pursue a policy that can reconcile our conflicting interests.

Our membership of the Organisation of Petroleum Exporting Countries (OPEC) in a way has enabled the nation to avert a terrific price war which could have resulted from the combined effects of our geographic location and the high premium which our quality crude oil would normally attract. In other words, we would either have had to price ourselves out of the oil business or sell our oil at give-away price and be prepared to be played against other oil exporting countries by the industrialised world.

As a matter of fact, our presence within OPEC enables us to collectively counter the various moves of the industrialised world aimed at weakening our strength for the good of their own economies. It is little known that most industrialised countries are haunted by the fear that if they should invest billions of dollars in such ventures as synthetic fuel production from coal or shales or bituminous sands at very high costs, the OPEC suddenly lowers prices in an attempt to snuff out the infant industry?

No company, no matter how large, could survive a synthetic fuel plant sitting idle, producing no revenue to help pay back the colossal cost of construction. It can therefore be seen that the spectre of OPEC that haunts the industrialised countries does not come from high oil price alone, but also from the regulatory power of OPEC.

We do hope that Nigeria must have learned in the last eighteen months, her bitter economic lesson in the 23 years of her existence as an independent nation, that in times of dire need as she now finds herself, she cannot hope to depend even on the country it once helped to overcome

her energy shortfall when that country was beleaguered by Arab oil embargo. New found friendships and sudden conflicts in international economic relations are all manifestations of shifting national interests.

With the relative calm in the country, following a very hotly contested election, Nigeria has managed to be winning back the confidence of a world that was severely critical of her economic performance and sceptical her ability to maintain peace and order in her pursuit of the normal democratic processes.

This relative stability will once again strengthen the faith of her trade partners and encourage them to enter into long term trade negotiations with Nigeria. The balance of world oil supply is so delicate that any destabilising force that even remotely threatens oil production quickly sends a shock wave through the industrialised world and the cessation of supply even from a minor oil producing country and even for a short time causes dislocations in supply and price.

Energy is basic to development. After all the hue and cry against the oil exporting countries, this precious commodity will continue to be required into year 2000 and beyond because it is versatile and easy to use and because science has no answer for a cheaper substitute in the immediate future, not even the synfuels. In 1980, for instance, the United States alone consumed more than a fourth of the world's production of 60 million barrels per day to propel aeroplanes, ships and cars, heavy trucks, to fuel industry and to provide raw materials for the petrochemical industry.

Nuclear energy cannot find such a versatile application nor does hydro-power, at least not for the moment. It will take decades of engineering research to produce new generations of aeroplanes, cars, trucks, etc. propel-

led by nuclear energy, a problem which is compounded by the hazards of nuclear wastes.

It will have been noticed that this talk about the place of Nigeria in the world energy situation has not been presented in the form of a comparative study of our coal, oil, gas, hydro, nuclear and other sources of energy vis-a-vis other countries. Compared with world reserves or even compared with reserves of many other energy-rich countries, Nigeria's contribution to the world inventory of energy resources would seem little and that would have led us to erroneously conclude that Nigeria's place in the world energy situation is insignificant.

Rather, we have approached this question from the aspect of relative values. Relative to our needs, we are more important to the world as a supplier of energy than the United States who rank third in terms of absolute reserves, behind the Soviet Union and Saudi Arabia in that order.

As long as we can evolve a judicious management of our oil, Nigeria will continue to be a force to reckon with and as long as we do not succumb to the temptation of quitting the Organisation of Petroleum Exporting Countries for momentary gains, our collective bargaining power will not diminish; if anything, it will continue to be enhanced, even with the not-too-remote probability of extreme radicalism gaining the upper hand in the most important area of the OPEC world.

It behoves us therefore to remain solidly within OPEC, for therein lies our strength, and try to seek dialogue with its members in times of crisis within the organisation, in preference to seeking the sympathy and understanding of the industrialised nations of the western world whose logic is governed only by their own material gains, a tradition that derives from centuries of economic exploitation.

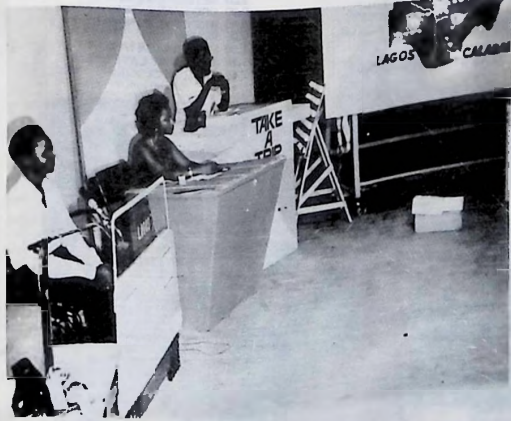

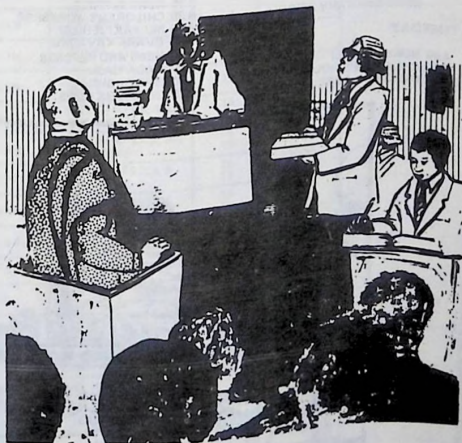
