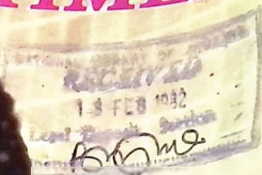

the same chart, though this has been rectified.

In Britain and America, the idea is to group together all brands of music, be it Jazz, Soul, Rhythm, Blues, Reggae and what he a you. The producer Top-Ten should look into this because what is worth doing at all is worth doing well.

STATE OF THE ECONOMY

Nigeria's Financial Standing X-rayed

QUITE recently, some highly placed Nigerians have claimed that the nation's economy is on the decline. Some of them went to the extent of addressing news conferences at home and in some world capitals that Nigeria's economy is seriously sick.

Unfortunately, these eminent Nigerians have failed to tell their audiences the basic truth. They forgot that the average Nigerian is more informed about the state of the nation now than what obtained before the second republic.

The country's economy cannot be discussed outside the basic principles of elementary domestic and international economics or outside the context of the principle of effective financial management. Elementary economics admonish us that is mere courting of economic disaster or beckoning to economic ruin to budget over and above visible and expected income within a given period. Some States, for instance, in the last budget session, for reasons best known to them, deliberately announced deficit budgets.

The elementary question to ask is: How reasonable is it for a man to know that his total income including possible loans stand at 100 Naira per annum and still budgets and announces 500 Naira for that year? For little did these states which were playing to the political gallery by announcing with fanfare and pride deficit budgets realise that sooner or later, contractors and other beneficiaries would begin to look forward to the profits they would make through the implementation of projects for which money would not be available.

Some of these states, under the wrong illusion that they will fall from heaven squandered the lean resources at their disposal within the first few months of this financial year on projects that could have been and were in fact being provided by the Federal Government.

Prudence, for instance, would have taught some of these states to leave the implementation of expensive projects, to the Federal Government while concentrating on the provision of basic amenities and items of other urgent

needs for the benefit of people.

Through misunderstanding or misconception of Federalism or the Presidential System, some of these States went into confrontational instead of complementary projects. And having made such tactical and costly blunders, and thus failed to reap where they sowed nothing, these States have refused to face realities but have turned round to look for scape goats. Perhaps we should emphasise the fact that the Presidential System we are operating is a system of co-operation through the separation of powers for better results and the improvement of national well-being.

It is therefore, unpatriotic for these States or individuals to turn round to paint an ugly picture of the country's economy. The average man would have expected the critics to use the known and accepted indexes to determine the buoyancy of the nation's economy. Although, it will be unnecessary to go into serious details of economic analysis here; examples of the application of elementary principles should drive the point home.

First, of all, a look at the Central Reserve, makes it abundantly clear that Nigeria's economy is relatively sound without any immediate remote threat of decline. A Central Bank of Nigeria report says the money supply for January this year was 36 per cent higher than the respective levels a month and a year earlier.

The deposit liabilities of the Central Bank was also about thirty per cent higher than the respective levels at the end of the preceding month. According to the report, net foreign assets in the banking system in Nigeria at the end of the month of January this year stood at 5343.7 million Naira which is an increase of 66.3 per cent from the levels a month and a year earlier.

The mere fact that while some countries in Africa cannot pay their labourers 70 Naira per month, Nigeria is confidently and legislatively fixing her minimum wage at 125 Naira shows that there have been improvements. And in the private sector, companies have been returning enormous dividends.

Records are scarce on limited liabilities companies returning losses on their balanced sheets. Indeed, most companies in Nigeria have been doing good turn overs and profits. With further evidence do we need to prove the buoyancy of Nigeria's economy? There is no doubt that international market fluctuations will affect our financial standing, but relative to other countries, our financial situation is not as bad as being painted.

It is time Nigerians learnt to cooperate and co-operate in order to improve the state of the economy instead of creating panic and seeking to destroy the essential fabrics which are needed to enhance the lot of the nation.

One can only hope that the consequences or ill-effects of deficit budgets and duplication of projects are not clear in the minds of those States and will therefore make them to face the realities of their situations relative to their plans to the needs of the people and allow 1982 to witness less of deficit budgets.

TRADITIONAL HEALERS

—Their Roles In Primary Health Care

THE conference which was organised by the Federal Ministry of Health in collaboration with the World Health Organisation and the University of Ibadan has as its theme: 'Health Education In Primary Health Care'.

It is unique in the sense that for the first time African Health Education, analysts and medical experts came together to examine the general life style of the peoples of the continent and ways of spreading awareness in this direction.

It will be recalled that in 1977, the thirtieth World Health Assembly in a resolution had adopted the slogan, Health for all by the year 2000. It was with this in mind that the Organisation for African Unity approved at its first economic summit in April last year, the Lagos plan of action aimed at improving the life of the entire population of the continent.

The attainment of this noble goal as contained in some of the recommendations of the conference, required among other things, attention to health education and provision of health care to the community as a whole particularly to its poorest segment within the context of an integrated rural development project.

In one of its resolutions, the conference noted that the co-operative and collective efforts of all OAU member nations in regional and national plans will be required if the continent was to attain the global objective of health for all by the year 2000.

It remarked that emphasis should be placed on the basic fact that at the moment 85 per cent of African population use and have an immeasurable faith in traditional medicine, medicinal herbs, traditional healers and herbalists for their health care.

Therefore improving health standards in the continent cannot make considerable impact if the standards of the traditional healers and herbalists were not improved and governmental support accorded the use and development of medicinal plants. A commendable step is already being taken in this direction with the setting up of an OAU Inter-African Committee for Traditional Medicine and the Use of

African medicinal plants in more than 17 centres working on joint projects in this regard.

The Nigerian organisers of the first conference on health education also made sure that particulars were made up of both orthodox and traditional medical practitioners in the continent. In realisation of the need for gross root awareness the conference recommended the promotion of school health education from kindergarten to University level as well as the use of appropriate media technology in educating the people on health. Most of the recommendations of the conference are in line with Nigeria's Basic Health Scheme, which has shifted emphasis to preventive rather than curative medicine. This involves mass immunization, environmental sanitation provision of clean drinking water, elimination of flies, mosquitoes, vermins and other disease vectors.

The health education unit of the Federal and State Ministries of Health with the aid of the mass media have

mounted campaigns on the need for changing insanitary habits, proper nutrition, maternal and child health services.

Above all, the aspect of active involvement and participation of traditional healers and the target population in defining health problems and planning for suitable solutions have since been in practical demonstration in Nigeria. But despite the achievements of the past decade, health educators still have a formidable challenge of changing the lifestyle of the majority of people who either through social or cultural upbringing indulge in habits detrimental to the promotion and maintenance of good health.

It is therefore necessary to appeal to the various governments in Africa as well as individuals and agencies to ensure that the recommendations of this conference received favourable attention and subsequent implementation.

SPEED LIMITS

New Measure To Check Accident Rates

THE PROPOSED law among other things would empower the police to impose immediate fines on motorists found to have exceeded stipulated speed limits. The fines imposed would range from M50 to N300 depending on the degree of the excess speed of the offending motorist. It is expected that motorists travelling at upwards of 140 kilometres would pay between M50 and N200 depending on the gravity of the offence.

For the purpose of the new law, police vehicles fitted with radar and computers would photograph any offending vehicle registering its plate number, speed date and time of the offence. The data thus registered will be kept and used by the police as proof of their case against the motorists in question. Offending motorists would have their licences and other vehicle documents seized and will only be released when they tender treasury receipt as proof of payment of the fine that had been imposed.

The import of the proposed law regulating speed on the countries highways can best be appreciated on two scores. The first is that it would be the first law in the country clearly stating what amounts to excessive speed. What exists presently in the high way code is a law which empowers the police to charge a driver for "failure to conform to road signs." But this left too much at the discretion of the police and other traffic regulators as failure to conform to road signs could be interpreted to mean anything possible.

Secondly, there is the alarming rate of violent accidents and carnage on our highways. Most of the so called express roads have been turned into death ways through either the negligence or excesses of motorists.

Casualty figures on our highways could be very disheartening. For instance a recent police release stated

that as much as 3,221 persons were killed in motor accidents in Bantol State alone between July 1977 and July 1981. The police figures showed that there were 12,269 accidents during the period in question.

The picture in other states is not quite different from this disturbing portrayal of Bantol. As its often said accidents do not just happen they are always caused. Several reasons can be attributed as the causes of accidents on our highways, but one of the factors that can be most easily pinpointed is excess speed by motorists. Motorists, particularly public transport drivers using the highways often drive as if their vehicles are not mechanical instruments that can easily defy human control.

One therefore appreciates the frustrations of Governor Clement Isong of the Cross River State when he recently demanded from drivers in his state whether the construction of good roads by government was an "invitation to destroy lives". The Governor also put his poser to those who sell driving licences to unqualified persons and those public officers who respect and pass vehicles that are not road worthy.

✓ In trying to enforce the proposed

law the police would certainly be having a hard time with motorists. There will be the need to increase substantially, the number of police personnel engaged in regulating movement on the highways to the detriment of other important police functions. In fact we shall be needing a considerably more efficient Police Force to carry out the proposed law. The sophisticated system involving the use of radar for the collection of relevant data would require a more competent and dedicated police force than we can presently speak of. This is not casting doubts on the quality and ability of our police force, but the fact is that the proposed law can be easily abused.

However in spite of this reservation the need to regulate speed on our highways is very paramount. Beside, the intended law, one way of curtailing the excesses on our highways is to join Governor Isong in constantly appealing to the conscience of all those involved in the issuance of licences and inspection of vehicles to perform strictly and according to stipulated rules of the work. We should all realise that after all, life cannot be duplicated.

COAL INDUSTRY IN NIGERIA

—Plan For Reactivation Under Way

COAL, as most of us know, is one of the many resources that Nigeria is endowed with. Deposits are mainly found in Anambra where we have the oldest coal mines in the country and Kwara whose mines are near the Ajaokuta Iron and Steel Project. There are also coal deposits in Benue and Plateau States.

The coal industry in Nigeria dates back to the second decade of this century, when the production of coal was started at Udi near Enugu in 1915. From then, production increased gradually to a peak of 900,000 tons in 1959.

With time however, there was reduction in demand and production fell by over 60 percent in 1975. For instance, the Nigeria Railway Corporation, which had been a major local consumer of coal seriously reduced its use of the commodity when it started a Programme to convert its locomotive engines to diesel engines in the early 1960's. This period also saw an increase in other types of fuel.

It was at this point in time, that the production of crude petroleum which was discovered in the country in 1956 increased very rapidly from 13.3 million barrels in 1966 to over 100 million barrels years later. In fact, crude oil eventually turned out to be the country's principal earner of foreign exchange.

In 1968 when coal was still a vital source of energy, oil formed only 0.8

percent of total receivable Nigerian export earnings. By 1985, however, this figure, had risen to about 28 percent.

After the civil war, one of the problems that faced the coal industry was the re-activation of the defunct coal fields. It was realized that if the Coal Corporation was to be a profitable organization, it must seek to produce at reasonable cost for export. Another important problem was the question of finding alternative uses for coal as well as exploring new export markets. Transportation and Shipping facilities also posed problems to the industry.

It became clear that the railway was unable to serve the needs of the industry and that lack of shipping facilities at Port Harcourt could disrupt any export arrangements. From time to time, there were also problems with power supply.

The 1970 - 75 Development Plan period saw the rehabilitation of the Nigerian coal industry. In addition to the re-opening of Enugu Coal Mines, the Nigerian Coal Corporation, during the same period, undertook studies of alternative uses of coal, such as coal tar, fertilizers and synthetics. It also found new export markets in Ghana and Sierra Leone.

On the whole, in order to rehabilitate the coal industry, the Federal Government committed well 100 million naira in the third National Development Plan to the industry. Of this amount 28.6 million was set aside

for the carbonization of Coal.

The sum of 22.6 million naira was earmarked for the development of workings and extraction of coal in Enugu mines. Furthermore, five million naira was provided for the purchase of coal-specific rail transportation equipment to solve the evacuation problem. Arrangements were also made to develop other coal mines.

The importance of coal in Nigeria has substantially increased in recent years. The industry has become one of the main vehicles of growth of the Nigerian economy. For instance its products are valuable to the cement industries and power stations. More important, however is the role of the industry in the development of the Iron and Steel Complex at Ajaokuta from the Lafite Mines. It is expected that 50,000 tonnes of coal would be required annually for the Ajaokuta Blast Furnace Factory.

Now that the Federal Government has made available the sum of 10 million naira to improve the finances of the coal industry and new incentives have been awarded to coal mines, the aim is to reach the all-time production level of 900,000 tonnes which this country achieved in 1959 thereby putting the coal industry once more in a position to regain its importance as a factor-to-be reckoned with in the economic well-being of the nation.

NNSC AND FOOD SUPPLY

—Suggested Remedy To Scarcity

THE Nigerian National Supply Company (NNSC) was established by Government primarily as an instrument for combating inflation and scarcity of essential commodities.

To this end, it engages in mass importation of items in constant demand, such as rice, salt, sugar, milk and cement, at regular intervals. In this way the Company is supposed to supplement importation by private entrepreneurs in such a way as to influence prices in the local market.

The Supply Company has since its inception, extended its operations to all parts of the country with branch offices and warehouses in every State of the Federation. It has registered distributors in all the States.

Regretably however, the company has not made the expected impact on the soaring prices in the country. This is due to the activities of saboteurs both within the distributive network and outside it. Within the company there have been allegations of diversion of commodities in transit by some members of staff of the company and cases of frauds and misappropriation of funds have been recorded.

Some of those concerned have been disciplined while investigations are going on in other cases. Secondly the individuals and organisations, appointed as distributors have also been exploiting the situation by hoarding commodities, thereby creating artificial scarcity.

The situation is aggravated for consumers by the fact that retailers who buy essential items at inflated prices from greedy distributors always sell at exorbitant rates. Consequently, consumers obtain these items at four or five times the purchasing price.

In order to remedy the situation to some extent, the company decided to adopt the open sales system. From April, 1978, the company distributed all items it procured through cooperative societies, and reduced the groups of customers with which it had direct dealings to three. But the cooperative distribution system has its own problems, the greatest of which is the inability of cooperative societies to pay for commodities supplied to them.

The NNSC's most current measure

of setting up a retail office at Tafawa Balewa Shopping Centre which is to function like a supermarket is a most welcome move. The retail shop is expected to provide consumers with essential commodities at reasonable prices.

As an official of the Supply Company put it, the idea is meant to beat unscrupulous traders to their game.

But this is only one retail office whose effect can only be felt in the small zone it caters for on Lagos Island. More retail shops should be set up in each State of the Federation, and it will even be more effective if each local government could be provided with one.

The company should also publicise its activities on a larger scale so that the public has first-hand knowledge of its prices and where to purchase its commodities.

Different methods of price regulation have been tried in the past without much success mainly because of the urge in many of our traders to make quick money. The Price Control Board was established for the purpose of bringing prices down. However, the board could not solve the problems of hoarding and profiteering.

The Government direct involvement in importation and distribution of commodities through the National Supply Company should have been the way out. But every effort is being made by some selfish people to render that system unworkable too.

What is therefore required is determination on the part of the government to withstand the present pressure from all sides and strengthen the supply company.

Eddie Okonta

— A Legend In His Own Field

THE NAME Eddie Okonta comes readily to mind when recalling Nigeria's top musicians of his days. Among his 42 major recording hits are "Umuibe", "Black Rose", "Oriwo", "Akara Gbasa", "Ukokoko", and "Bisi". His first was "Okokoko", jointly produced with the late Babyface Paul, a remarkably fine single, which won him the title "Eddie Nwamama".

"Umuibe" and "Oriwo", which came much later, however, emerged, as perfect examples of the now-grown-up matured Eddie Okonta. The two hits really gave Eddie Okonta the most deserved satisfaction, though some critics had a different view about the songs which they said were common.

Okonta's songs have one outstanding quality — a retrospective feel — looking back, over one's life. Besides, there is always a strong underlying moral message to impart to the listener.

Okonta's rise to fame was meteoric. At the age of 19, he was discovered by the late Olu Mofay (a renowned pianist), during a musical performance

at a bazaar held on the grounds of Olowogbowo Methodist Church, and thereafter he was introduced to Bobby Benson. Through Bobby Benson, Eddie acquired a tremendous musical skill, and he was afforded the opportunity to travel wide.

Okonta derived his inspiration from the late Louis Armstrong, whose trumpeting adroitness he emulated and still hangs on to till today. Eddie Okonta recalled and paid tribute to his late aunt, Mrs Etim (a nursing sister), who encouraged him to take up music as a career.

In July, 1959, Okonta left Benson to lead the Jofabro Aces, owned by Josiah Fajimolu Olayoyegbe. The band later shifted its base to Paradise Hotel Ibadan, where it established itself as one of the most popular band of its time.

This popularity was later given a more reassuring recognition when, the following year, it was invited to play before the country's state guests at a dance (the Governor-General's Dance) organised to mark Nigeria's independence. Besides, the Aces had, on several

occasions, been invited to entertain at star shows featuring such visiting legends as Louis Armstrong, Cosy Cole, Lionnel Hampton, Wilbe de Paris, and Chubby Checker.

In 1962, Okonta single-handedly took over the affairs of the Aces. He changed its name to Top Aces, with 18 boys on the bandstand, and succeeded in turning out 42 albums within four years of its being taken over. The following year, Okonta won the "best-trumpeter-of-the-year" award at a musical poll organised by the Daily Times of Nigeria.

Okonta, like most successful big names in music all over the world, suffered a number of setbacks. The most crucial of them was the ghastly accident he had in 1966, on his way to Lafia Hotel which left him a deformed musician. But inspite of this, he still waxed strong and out of the 18 old hands he started with in 1962, only six managed to stay on and are still with the band as pioneers. Prominent among these are Akanbi (drums), Nat Buckle (Vocals), and Kayode (lead guitar).

Born at Onitsha on May 17, 1938, of a Roman Catholic parentage, both of whom are now dead, Okonta had his primary and secondary school education at St. Joseph's Catholic School, Akwukwu, St. Brigid Catholic School, Enugu, and New Bethel College, Onitsha.

On leaving college in 1955, Okonta travelled down to Lagos to study Accountancy. Meanwhile, he played music on a part-time basis with well-known groups like Jide Smith's Kokoma Band, Tunde Amuwo's Mambo Band, and Sam Akpabot's All Stars.

Today, Okonta keeps the Top Aces still kicking. He entertains his numerous fans at the Ikoyi Hotel Lounge, at weekends alongside with eminent musicians as Agu Noris, Sam Akpabot and Akinremi Cole. He is married with children.

Traditional Medicine And Its Philosophy

A NATUROPATHIC Physician, Dr. Joseph O. Muma is the Speaker on Radio Nigeria's October Lectures for this year and his exciting and educative six talks are based on "Traditional Medicine" in Nigeria.

In his six lectures, Dr Muma will talk about Herbalism, Traditional surgery and psychiatry. The lecture which was launched on Friday September 25, 1981, at the National Theatre conference Hall, Iganmu, really pulled a crowd among who were traditional healers, herbalists, faith-healers and natural healers.

Below is the full text of his first lecture. We shall publish in the subsequent issues of Radio/TV Times the remaining five lectures.

THE TERM traditional medicine, denotes the system of healing as practised by our forefathers, and handed down to the present generation of traditional doctors. Among these traditional doctors are the herbalists, faith-healers, the massuers, the bone-setters and natural healers.

The philosophy of traditional

medicine centres on the study of health and how to promote it, rather than the study of disease and how to suppress it. It regards disease as desecration and a breach of natural laws which regulate our lives and health. In actual fact, disease is the result of our trespasses against the binding rules of health.

The philosophy of traditional medicine indicates that an acute disease has a definite constructive significance and

purpose, namely, to cleanse the body of those harmful substances which have accumulated in the tissues of the body as a result of bad eating habits, drug abuse and chemical pollution among many others. In this regard; for example, a traditional medical doctor will not regard a 'cough' as disease in such, but as a manifestation of dis-functioning lungs which have been clogged with contaminated dead cells.

If this fact — that by means of an acute outburst of a certain disease, the body rids itself of any latent accumulated toxins in order to keep itself fit — is understood and taken advantage of during treatment, there would be a considerable reduction in the chronic ailments from which so many people suffer today.

In view of this fact, the traditional medical practitioner directs his efforts towards facilitating the body's struggle in acute diseases and interpreting them to the patient. In this way, the patient can understand the cause of his illness and so can participate intelligently in the planning of his cure and the future maintenance of health. Any arrest or suppression of this process by drugs, sera, vaccines, excessive stimulants, narcotics, or ill advised surgical operations is considered, proposterous prac-

tice traditional medicine.

A traditional medicine doctor works towards restoring a normal and harmonious condition of the body forces by employing such natural methods as water and heat treatment, herbal medicines, massage, bone-setting and manipulation, diet and mental readjustment in order to bring about the state of health which characterises a poised vigorous and radiant individual.

The philosophy of traditional medicine logically repudiates both the germs theory of disease, the indiscriminate practice of vivisection and inoculation. Traditional medicine co-ordinates and incorporates that which is good in all philosophies and works in harmony with that force in Nature which makes for regeneration of mind and body. It is generally supposed by allopathic doctors that most of our diseases originate in the system as a result of bacterial infection. But bacteria are present in every body. They can do no harm unless there is a suitable soil for them to develop. That soil in the thinking of the traditional medicine man is formed by the accumulated waste poisons of the body.

When the body becomes encumbered or poisoned by chemicals or bacteria to such an extent that it cannot function properly, nature will try to cleanse it up by some strong measure or manifestation. We call it disease. Fever, diarrhoea, dysentery, catarrh or an eruptive disease are simply various attempts on the part of nature to cleanse the system.

So they should by no means be suppressed. To suppress a disease is to retain it in the body and to lay the foundation of a chronic disorder.

The creed of traditional medicine, agrees with what Stanley Lief, Britain's foremost Nature Cure advocate has always maintained:
that health is the normal condition of the human body and the birthright of every human being;
that health is the result of living in accordance with the natural laws that govern our being;
that sickness is the result of transgressing those laws;
that there are certain diseases caused by astral and cosmic influence, and cosmic influence, and diseases caused through evil machinations and diabolic spells of men;
that when health is lost, it can only be restored through a return to a natural

way of life, and employing such traditional medical agencies and forces that can control and protect one from destructive cosmic external attacks from men of evil inclinations.

That the power to cure, which traditional medicine doctors refer to as 'Vital force' is inherent in the animal organism provided that it is allowed to assert itself without interference; such power can be stimulated in the human body with traditional medical preparations to produce a curative effect; that people who live simple, natural lives with positive minds have been known to possess a kind of force which immunised them against destructive spells of witches and wizards. That the main factors which constitute a natural way of life are correct diet, proper exercise, abundant fresh air, rest, a positive mental attitude, and avoidance of all habits which devitalize the system and disturb the chemical balance of the blood. That dietetic errors are the principal causative agents in many of the common diseases of civilized life, that a wicked mental attitude, sin, jealousy, hatred, strife and over-ambition generate inner conflict which can lead to physical and mental diseases.

The orthodox medical viewpoint that parasites, germs and viruses are the primary causes of many diseases and that destruction or inactivation of these micro-organisms by means of poisonous drugs, sera inoculations and anti-biotics is the proper method of treatment, is therefore in contrast with the philosophy of traditional medicine. We regard micro-organisms as

mere scavengers which are incidental to the disease process and not the primary cause. They feed upon the body wastes and poisons which, due to failure of elimination, have accumulated in the tissues and fluids of the body. They are not the primary cause of disease. As I have said, disease is primarily a defensive reaction of the body against an irritating agent or unfavourable environment and situation created by man. To these disturbing factors the body responds by increasing or decreasing function, either locally or generally.

An acute disease is a vigorous effort of the body to correct our bad ways of living and to get rid of the disturbing elements, be it bacteria or toxic matter or harmful spell. Function is increased and the organism marshals all its defensive mechanism and concentrates all its energies against the disturbing factor. The outcome of this struggle depends upon several factors, a very important one being the care or treatment that the body receives while fighting for its health.

When the body cannot eliminate the disturbing element and restore its equilibrium, chronic disease results. Chronic disease represents an adaptation of the body to certain conditions. In chronic diseases, decreased function is usually found. It is curious that for all our scientific learning and modern medical equipment, nearly all doctors seem completely oblivious of the ill-effects of living contrary to Natural laws.

One would expect that, as far as the more prosperous countries of the

world are concerned, the advent of the X-ray exact chemical analysis, more hygienic household conditions, modern sanitation and water supply, closer government supervision of food factories and abattoirs, and the many other modern discoveries and improvements bearing on public health, would all have combined to raise the general standard of health of citizens of these countries. But the contrary is the case. The health of citizens in those countries is in the main deteriorating at an alarming rate. Whilst tuberculosis is, it seems, on the wane, serious identify and unidentified diseases are on the increase, some assuming epidemic proportions.

Now one may wish to ask; why is it that disease tends to be on the increase in developed countries, where one should normally expect them to be on the decrease? The answer is simple. The more civilization man acquires the more he transgresses natural laws and deviates from natural ways of living. The food he eats becomes devitalized through over

refining. The air he breathes and the environment he lives in become polluted by the wastes from his artificial way of living.

After a lecture I delivered at the Sociology and Anthropology Department, Millersville State College, Pennsylvania, U.S.A., a professor who was in attendance to listen to the talk asked me to explain the situation about innocent children and some other people who never violate any natural law yet are suffering from diseases of one kind or the other.

The answer to that question is not far-fetched. The mistakes of others can affect us. During the two world wars, the explosion of Atomic and hydrogen bombs released deadly radioactive elements in the air. Both the people who caused the war and innocent peace loving people suffered the consequences which arose from the wars. History and statistics reveal to us that the number of people who died as a result of epidemics brought about by the poisons of war, were greater than the soldiers who were killed in the actual

fighting. Innocent people had to die for the sins and transgressions against natural laws committed by other human beings.

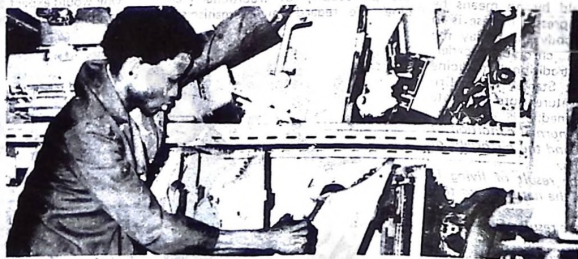
Death has been caused, by accident to careful motor drivers as a result of careless drivers who are drunk; whose attitude constitutes violation of natural laws. Natural laws which evil people violate in casting destructive spells on their fellow human beings, have resulted in chronic diseases and death to righteous people who never disobey the rules of nature.

A mother who refuses to breast feed her child but instead places him on factory-made milk is violating a natural law. A negligent mother who fails to provide a balanced diet for her children at regular times is violating a natural law. A woman who smokes cigarettes while carrying a pregnancy is violating a natural law. All these violations can cause serious health problems for the child. It is on these principles that the philosophy of health and disease is based.
