Again, commuters count losses as FERMA repairs bridge on Keffi-Abuja highway

Commuters and travellers on the busy Abuja-Keffi expressway were on Tuesday thrown into anguish following a gridlock which forced many of them to abandon their missions or devise ways to beat the traffic. The highway is notorious for hold-ups either due to accidents or repairs.

The axis, which is the gateway to Nasarawa, Kaduna and Plateau states from the FCT is host to thousands of residents who daily commute to Abuja in search of livelihoods.

Daily Trust reports that Tuesday's gridlock was caused by the closure for repairs of one lane on a bridge at Ado village in Karu LGA of Nasarawa State by the Federal Roads Maintenance Agency (FERMA).

A source told our correspondent that the bridge developed cracks which prompted the repairs.

Though the lane was later opened for traffic, many commuters said they were subjected to so much hardship while the repairs lasted from Sunday to Tuesday.

Our correspondent reports that the situation took many by surprise as there was little or no publicity prior to the commencement of the work.

Security deployed

Daily Trust further reports that a team of security operatives was deployed to the area, with the army and the police playing lead roles.

It was observed that the security personnel, including men of the Federal Road Safety Corps (FRSC), were on ground throughout the repair period to direct traffic.

However, motorists and other travellers said they didn't get information prior to the repairs.

Many commuters accused the officials of also not providing alternative routes before commencing work thereby grounding economic activities in the area and causing untold hardship to the people.

Traders from Ado, New Karu, New Nyanyan, Auta Balefi, Kuchikau and Masaka, who spoke with our reporter, said the development had negatively

affected them as they could not go to their various business places.

A tailor who gave his name as Francis, said, "I can't bear it any more. I won't go to work tomorrow. I can't kill myself. How can a road be locked up?"

Similarly, a cake seller who gave her name as Mama Blessing, told Daily Trust that the situation affected her business, adding that if she did not make sales she might find it difficult to feed her children.

Mama Blessing, who spoke in pidgin English said, "E no dey easy. We just dey suffer. My brother, if I no go my children no go survive."

People walk long distances

Hit by the gridlock people, among them women and children, especially pregnant and nursing mothers, were seen trekking along the road as there were no vehicles to carry them.

A nursing mother who declined to mention her name said, "I'm tired. Imagine, my child is sick; we are just coming from the Medical Centre, Mararaba. This is the worst day of my life."

Also, some travellers from Calabar in Cross River State said they were forced to sleep in their vehicles.

Okada riders hike fares

Residents of Ado, New Nyanyan, Masaka and others told Daily Trust that motor cycle operators, popularly called Okada riders, took advantage of the situation and increased their fares.

A resident of Ado said, "One Okada rider collected N600 from Nyanyan. I was to dismount by Ado junction, but the worst happened. The road was blocked, so he ended up dropping me in One Man's Village."

Daily Trust gathered that the fare from Nyanyan to Ado, which was N300 before the gridlock, rose to between N500 and N600; while from Mararaba to Ado which was N200 rose to N300 and N400 on Sunday and Monday.

Shop owners in One Man's Village who also said they witnessed low sales accused government officials of being insensitive to the plight of the people, stressing that the bridge ought to have been repaired during the festive period when a large number of people were on break for Christmas and New Year.

Residents call for other routes

Residents of the axis have appealed to the federal government to address the issue of a single-route to Abuja by constructing more roads to link with the expressway.

They also called for the immediate

completion of the Apo-Karshi road which was awarded to Kakatar Limited, an indigenous company, in 2011, with a completion period of 20 months.

A civil servant who pleaded anonymity said, "Providing alternative routes will resolve many issues on the axis. The accidents that occur on this axis during the rush hours alone should be a strong reason for the completion of the Apo-Karshi project and opening of other routes."

A construction engineer, Sunday Asongo, said the notice for the repair of the bridge was given earlier, but that work was delayed as FERMA did not mobilise the contractor to site.

Asked why an alternative route was not provided, he said, "I know the area you are referring to. It's a tight area; you can't provide another route, and especially because it was a repair that was billed for just a few days."

He added that blocking the lane under repair was normal if public notice had circulated and diversion signs stationed appropriately.

When contacted, FERMA's Deputy Director, Information, Maryam M. Sanusi, did not pick her calls or reply to an SMS sent to her mobile number by our reporter.

Wrong choices responsible for Nigeria's woes – Kwankwaso

The presidential candidate of the New Nigeria People's Party (NNPP), Rabiu Kwankwaso, yesterday blamed Nigeria's current woes on the wrong choices made by those ruling the country from 1999 to date.

Speaking at the Chatham House in London, Kwankwaso lamented that Nigeria was beset by numerous challenges, including high rate of unemployment, insecurity and growing poverty.

The former governor of Kano State said while many would blame the economic hardships facing the country on the effects of the COVID-19 pandemic and global economic recession, he would hold the past and present leaders responsible.

He said, "Our country today is facing numerous challenges - insecurity, growing poverty, growing and uncontrolled inflation, growing unemployment and despondency, decaying infrastructure, high rate of maternal and neonatal deaths, collapsing education system, crises in the health care services, weak institutions, growing corruption and graft, unbelievable theft of crude oil and other mineral resources and growing mistrust among the constituents, communities of our country and so on.

"We can point fingers at all sorts of factors allegedly responsible for our situation - from coronavirus to global economic recession; from western powers to international capital etc. But for me, we are where we are because of the mistakes in wrong choices made by the very people entrusted with the business of governing Nigeria in the last 24 years."

According to Kwankwaso, he is aspiring to become the next president of Nigeria because he understands the issues involved, the mistakes made and the wrong priorities set.

"Together with our team, we are better connected with the hopes and aspirations of Nigeria citizens. We understand, agree with and share grievances and we have a practical plan for addressing every challenge bedeviling our country," he stated.

Kwankwaso said his proposed alliance with the presidential candidate of the Labour Party (LP), Peter Obi, collapsed owing to the media hype enjoyed by the latter.

He explained, "On Labour Party, I was initially interested in working with them. But at that time, they were at the peak of the media hype and we couldn't reach a compromise. Our party (NNPP) is a national party and we're commanding the support of the masses.

"If you have a party, which is based on ethnicity and religion, that is the difference between the Labour party and our party, which is a national party, New Nigeria Peoples Party".

Atiku to PDP members: You'll show election results to get appointments, contracts

The presidential candidate of the Peoples Democratic Party (PDP), Atiku Abubakar, yesterday gave party members conditions for appointments and contracts if elected as the next president. He said all party members must show results of their polling units to benefit from the government.

Atiku insisted that if party members and leaders deliver at their polling units, it would be easy for the PDP to win the elections.

He said this in Abeokuta, Ogun State, during a town hall meeting with the stakeholders, attended by PDP National Chairman, Iyorchia Ayu; former Vice President, Namadi Sambo; Governors Aminu Tambuwal (Sokoto); Udom Emmanuel (Akwa-Ibom); Ademola Adeleke of Osun State and Senate Minority Leader, Phillip Aduda.

Also in attendance were a former Senate President, Bukola Saraki; former Governors Olagunsoye Oyinlola (Osun), Liyel Imoke (Cross River), Sule Lamido (Jigawa), the governorship candidate of the party in the state, Ladi Adebute and his deputy, Adekunle Akinlade and the Lagos State governorship candidate, Abdul-Azeez Adediran, were also in attendance.

Responding to questions from the audience, Atiku said "You are all members of the PDP and supporters of the PDP, you want

PDP to return to power, please I beg of you, make sure you win your polling booths.

"The fact that you are following the gubernatorial candidate or the senatorial candidate or the House of Reps candidate or the presidential candidate to campaigns is no qualification that you will get an appointment. It is not a qualification that you will get a contract whether at the local government level, state or the federal level.

"The only way as far as I'm concerned, if I'm president, if you come and say you want a job or you want a contract, I will ask you: let me have the result of your polling booth and that is what I'm going to direct to everybody because unless we do that, we'll not win the elections.

"You cannot be following the governor all the place or the senator all the place and then you don't win your polling booth and you come and say you want to be a minister or you want to get this contract. So, please as members of our party, let us make sure that we go back to our constituencies and make sure that we deliver our polling units."

Atiku promised to revamp the education sector in such a way that the incessant strike by the academic union in the universities will end.

He also promised to expand the nation's economy to improve on the living standards of Nigerians and the workers.

Reject my husband after 4yrs if he underperforms-Tinubu's wife

Wife of the All Progressives Congress (APC) presidential candidate, Senator Oluremi Tinubu, has asked Nigerians to "drive out" her husband after

four years if he is elected and fails to perform.

She spoke at the South-East women rally for Tinubu/Shettima Presidential Campaign in Owerri, Imo State capital.

She said, "Let's leave religion aside; I am a Christian. Have you ever thought that one day a Christian-Christian candidate would emerge? What would be the reference point? We have tried the Muslim-Christian ticket, let us try this one too and after four years if they don't do well, you can drive them out," she said.

She said Nigeria's election should not be about faith but about voting for a candidate who has the fear of God.

"When you have a person who fears God, not a person who is a Christian or Catholic or Muslim, but a God fearing person. When a man who fears God is in power, he will treat you right," she said.

Noting that she had served Nigeria as a governor's wife and senator, she said: "This is work time for Nigeria. We are not playing games. Women, we'll remember you and I can assure that Asiwaju for sure will remember you.

"The Tinubu/Shettima have a big package for our youth. We will sit down and work with every region on their needs," she further assured the women.

She stressed that the election was about a renewed hope of a country that is safe, progressive and possible, with investment in entrepreneurship and human capital.

Tinubu, who noted that she had served Nigeria as a governor's wife and senator, assured the women that they would form a major percentage of the Tinubu/shettima

administration.

In his remarks, Governor Hope Uzodinma urged the South-East women to make a wise decision by voting for the APC presidential candidate.

Uzodinma said: "I have decided to embark on political evangelism. I will continue to preach. I will continue to speak to my people to shine your eyes because this is the time for us to take the vital decision.

"We have decided that you are better off being in a united Nigeria. A united Nigeria will best accommodate the population of Ndigbo.

"The geographical strength in the South East is not enough to accommodate us," the governor said.

Don't vote along ethno-religious lines, Obi tells Kaduna electorate

The Labour Party's presidential candidate, Peter Obi, yesterday cautioned the electorate against voting on the basis of religious and tribal affiliations.

He said competent people should be allowed to lead the country not people whom educational background was not known.

Addressing his party's supporters at a campaign rally in Kaduna, Obi said he would strengthen the security architecture as well as secure and unite Nigeria.

The former governor of Anambra State blamed the insecurity on lack of good leadership.

The party's vice-presidential candidate, Datti Baba Ahmed, described Obi as a patriotic Nigerian contesting to provide good leadership in the country.

'Bad belle' prevented Abiola from becoming president – Obasanjo

Former President Olusegun Obasanjo on Wednesday said "bad belle" (envy) prevented Chief MKO Abiola, the presumed winner of the June 12, 1993 presidential election, from becoming president.

He spoke yesterday at a lecture titled "Eyin Ni Iwe Wa: You Are Our Epistle," which was delivered as part of the centenary celebrations of the Baptist Boys High School, Abeokuta, Ogun State.

The event was organised by the Old Boys Association of the BBHS. Obasanjo said without the moral virtues and sound education impacted on him by BBHS, he would not have become what he is today.

He also noted that the school moulded the late sage, Obafemi Awolowo, and former judge of the International Court of Justice (ICJ), Prince Bola Ajibola, among others, into what they all became in life.

Awolowo was at BBHS in 1928, Ajibola graduated in 1955, Abiola was among the 1956 set while Obasanjo left the school in 1957.

Obasanjo noted that aside from education, the 100-year-old school had at different times inculcated godly virtues in

all its products.

The retired general said apart from him, the BBHS would have had MKO Abiola as another former president, but "bad belle" prevented him from becoming president.

Obasanjo said, "Today, there are distinguished old boys in all walks of life, i.e., private sector, academia, military and paramilitary, civil society, traditional rulership, etc. Such is the present president of Old Boys Association of BBHS, Prof. Kayode Oyesiku.

"I believe that I must not be too forgetful to leave out yours truly, the son of Obasanjo, a modest war-victorious general and former military head of state and former president of Nigeria. Chief M.K.O. Abiola, the first communication industry millionaire in Nigeria and the acclaimed winner of the 1993 Presidential election who was in a class by himself.

"If not for Nigerian bad belle, MKO Abiola would have been president and with

me as president, we would have needed one more old student of BBHS to be president for us to permanently locate it in BBHS after three times. And that is a challenge for up-and-coming generations of old boys," Obasanjo said. He urged the new generation to preserve the moral virtues and discipline impacted on them by the school and pass it on in perpetuity.

The former president said, "What all these great products of BBHS have in common is godly virtue inculcated in them by the school. That was education plus. We carry it to anywhere we go as epistle written by BBHS to our families, our communities, our states, our country, and our continent of Africa and indeed our world.

"We must impact with humility, honesty, integrity, wisdom, courage, competence and fear of God - these must continue to be our characteristics and our attributes to make a change for good wherever we are. We must be different."

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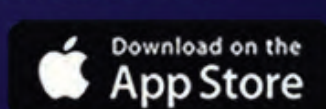
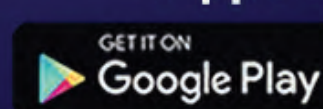
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Benchers chair asks N/Assembly to remove INEC power to review results

The Chairman of the Body of Benchers, Chief Wole Olanipekun (SAN), has asked the National Assembly to remove section 65 of the Electoral Act, which empowers chief returning officers to review their decisions after returning winners in elections.

He said the power to

do and undo granted a returning officer and by extension, the Independent National Electoral Commission (INEC) was very dangerous to the electoral system.

“To me, it is a very dangerous section, so novel in the sense that, here you have a section that empowers a returning officer after returning to review his decision within a period of seven days.

“The returning officer is not a court of law; not a tribunal; not vested with jurisdiction to exercise quasi-decision or to assume jurisdiction over any matter that is judicial in nature,” he said.

Olanipekun spoke when he paid a courtesy visit on the Ekiti State governor, Biodun Oyejibani, in his office in Ado-Ekiti yesterday.

He pointed out that he was not aware of any similar section in

previous electoral acts or the electoral act of any country in the world.

“The Chief Returning Officer is the chairman of INEC, meaning he can return someone as president today, and

when there are agitations here and there tomorrow, he may withdraw his decision and return somebody else.”

The former Nigerian Bar Association president urged the

National Assembly to remove the proviso and called on all stakeholders, particularly the political parties to “shine their eyes” by monitoring INEC and returning officers.

The Edo State government has said that two traditional rulers and five other persons have been arrested in connection with the kidnapping of 20 passengers from Igueben train station

in Edo state on January 7.

The Commissioner for Communication and Orientation, Chris Nehikhare, disclosed this yesterday in Benin while briefing journalists shortly after the state executive council meeting.

“The success story in the

kidnapping is that seven persons and two village chiefs have been arrested in connection with the incident.

He added that two persons remaining in captivity of the kidnappers had been rescued by security agencies.

Bayelsa residents accuse Conoil of using toxic chemicals

Residents and fishermen in Koluama II community in Southern Ijaw Local Government Area of Bayelsa State have raised the alarm over alleged use of toxic dispersants to contain an oil leak at Conoil's field in the area.

The fishing settlement on the Atlantic coastline said the toxic chemicals had wiped out fish species, distorted aquatic life and threatened the main occupation of the people of the area.

Dispersants are chemical agents that help break up an oil slick into very small droplets, which dilute throughout the water.

The chairman, Koluama II Community Development Committee (CDC), Mr

Patrick Ileberi, said the chemical posed hazards to residents and aquatic life.

He explained that the dispersant pollutes the air in the neighbourhood and leaves a choking sensation and respiratory difficulties.

He said the community's leadership had already reported the oil spill to the Yenagoa office of the National Oil Spills Detection and Response Agency (NOSDRA).

He disclosed that oil workers at the facility had shut down the pressure on the production pipelines, leading to the disappearance of the gas flare flames at the oil field.

He urged the various tiers of government to come to the aid of the community with relief materials and healthcare missions to Koluama 2.

When contacted, Mr Idris Musa, Director-General of NOSDRA, disclosed that the agency did not approve the use of dispersants in the area.

The Media Relations Manager of Conoil, Mr Abiodun Azeez, did not respond to an inquiry by our correspondent on the development as he did not pick up his calls or reply a text message sent to him.

FGC Yauri: Emir urges govt to rescue remaining female students

Emir of Yauri, Dr Muhammad Zayyanu Abdullahi, has appealed to the federal and state governments as well as security agencies to rescue the remaining female students of the Federal Government College, Yauri, Kebbi State abducted by bandits since June 17, 2021.

The emir made the appeal while receiving the governorship candidate of the All Progressives Congress (APC), Dr Nasiru Idris, and

his campaign train at his palace in Yauri.

Daily Trust reports that 19 months after the abduction of 80 students from the school, about 11 girls are still in captivity.

Parents of the remaining 11 students have resorted to crowd-funding to raise the N100 million ransom demanded by banditry kingpin, Dogo Gide.

The emir said parents of the students still in captivity were worried and traumatised over the whereabouts of their children.

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ACP Kyari offered me N10m, visa to implicate Saraki – Suspect

A principal suspect in the Offa bank robbery, Ayoade Akinnibosun, has said the former head of the Intelligence Response Team (IRT) of the Inspector General of Police, Abba Kyari, offered him N10m and a visa to implicate former Senate President Bukola Saraki.

Akinnibosun, Ibikunle Ogunleye, Adeola Abraham, and two others were charged to court by the police for criminal conspiracy

to rob the banks, murder of nine policemen and other citizens, and illegal possession of firearms.

He told a Kwara State High Court, Ilorin, at the resumed trial yesterday that Kyari also offered him a visa to any country of his choice if he implicated Saraki but he turned down the offer.

During cross examination by the defence counsel, Mathias Emeribe (SAN), Akinnibosun said, "He asked me to think over his offer very well. At this point, he

ordered officers Hassan and Mashood to return me to the cell. A separate one different from where others are and they should stop torturing me," he said.

The suspect said he was not allowed to write any statement in Ilorin except his bio data until they were conveyed to Abuja in a tinted bus, where he was later kept in a place called "abattoir".

The suspect alleged that some herdsmen were killed in his presence there, adding that he was mercilessly tortured and shot in the leg

in order to implicate Saraki, adding that Saraki had nothing to do with the robbery case.

The defendant then went ahead to show the gunshot wound on his legs to the Court.

Akinnibosun added that one of the robbery suspects, Micheal Adikwu, was shot dead in his presence, a situation that got him terrified and made him agree to implicate Saraki in a prepared statement before the press.

The presiding judge, Justice Alimat Salman, adjourned the case till February 13.

Abasi Otu re-affirmed as Obong of Calabar

His Royal Majesty Edidem Ekpo Okon Abasi Otu V has been re-selected and proclaimed as the Obong of Calabar.

The proclamation was done by the Etuboms' Conclave of the Efik Traditional Rulers' Council, after a lengthy meeting and processes which climaxed at 7.30pm with the declaration by 13 Etuboms who signed it.

The re-selection and proclamation was carried out in accordance with the Supreme Court judgement of 13 January 2023 which ordered that the exercise must be done not later than Wednesday 18 January 2023.

Former minister of finance under late Gen Sani Abacha regime, Chief Anthony Ani had approached the high court

up to the Supreme Court following his denial to participate in the selection process in 2008, during which Edidem Ekpo Okon Abasi Otu emerged as Obong.

In its judgement, the Supreme Court had relied on the judgment of the appellate court which ruled that Ani was not capped as a rule by the Obong of Calabar before the exercise and so was not qualified and was not eligible to stand another selection process.

The apex court however ruled that Ekpo Okon Abasi Otu must undergo the selection process, which order has been complied with by the proclamation of the Etuboms' Conclave.

Buni slashes price of newly constructed modern markets

Governor Mai Mala Buni of Yobe State has approved a 35 per cent reduction in yearly rents of shops in the newly commissioned modern market to support and encourage traders.

The Ground Floor Prime View Double with an initial price tag of N468,000 per annum is now N304,200 while the Ground Floor Prime View Single initially put at N390,000 is now N253,500p.a. against the initial recommendation by the State Committee on Allocation of Shops.

Similarly, the Ground Floor Prime View with two face that was to attract N442,000 is now N287,300 per annum, and Ground Floor others Double put at N390,000 is now reduced to N253,500.

The Ground Floor Others Single initially with a rent tag of N325,000 will now cost N211,250p.a while

Ground Floor Others Two Face is to attract N253,500 against the initial price of N390,000.

The Upstairs Prime View Double has been reduced to N253,500 against the former rate of N390,000 while Upstairs Prime View Single will now cost N211,250 against N325,000 initial price.

The Upstairs Prime View two face now costs N236,600 and the Upstairs Others Double is pegged at N169,000 while Upstairs Others Single is now to attract N152,100p.a.

The two face Upstairs Others earlier approved for N260,000 is now to be rented out at N169,000 while Block B Standard now attracts N211,250 against N325,000.

Block B Regular will be given out for N185,900 against N286,000 while Block C now goes for N211,250 against N325,000 and the Meat Shop Slabs goes for N105,625 against the initial rate of N162,500.

Vote candidates without discrimination, Catholic Bishops tell Nigerians

The communiqué signed by the president, Most Rev. Gabriel Abegunrin, and Secretary, Most Rev. John Oyejola, was made available to newsmen in Ado-Ekiti yesterday by the Bishop of Ekiti Diocese, Most Rev. Felix Femi Ajakaye.

The bishops expressed sorrow over the Sunday killing of Rev. Fr. Isaac Achi of the Catholic Diocese of Minna in his residence.

They commended the governors of the South West for setting up

and sustaining the Western Nigeria Security Network (WNSN) codenamed Amotekun Corps and others for the relatively improved security situation in the region.

They called on the government to bolster existing security measures with new technology and prosecute arrested criminals.

The clergymen advised politicians to ensure nobility and fairness in their speech and actions toward free, fair and peaceful elections.

Hoodlums in military uniforms abduct 4 truck drivers in Kwara

Hoodlums dressed in military uniforms have abducted four tipper drivers from a farm in Ilorin, the state capital, where they went to excavate sand for supply to their customers last Saturday.

The four abductees, sources said, were members of the Oyun Garage branch of the Association of Quarry and Sand dealers, Ilorin.

It was learnt that the kidnappers had

already contacted their families and placed N5m ransom on each of them.


However, some women who claimed to be wives of the drivers on Wednesday in Oyun area, Kwara State Polytechnic Road, Ilorin yesterday took to the street to solicit for alms from commuters and passersby to raise the ransom.

One of the women identified as Aishat said that they took to begging to raise money.

She appealed to philanthropists and the public to come to their aid to free their husbands.

The Police Public Relations Officer (PPRO) in the state, Ajayi Okasanmi, confirmed the abduction on Wednesday.

Okasanmi who said the victims were yet to be rescued as of Wednesday, said that two suspects had been arrested and were helping the police in their investigation.

Chatham House invitation a form of neocolonialism – Ex-AIG

● 'It's a vote of no confidence on Nigeria's electoral process'

A former Assistant Inspector General of Police (AIG), Ambrose Aisabor (Rtd), and a Human Rights Activist, Barrister Osagie Obayuwana, have described the invitation of presidential candidates for the February 25, 2022, general elections to speak about their policy thrusts at the Chatham House in the United Kingdom (UK) as a form of neocolonialism.

Speaking yesterday in Benin, Edo State, Aisabor said, "Chatham House address is a distraction. The issues the candidates are going to tackle are Nigerian problems. So, on what basis are they going to Chatham House?"

He wondered why Nigerians are still subservient to their colonial masters, noting that, "We have an equivalent (Chatham House) in the National Institute for Policy and Strategic Studies (NIPSS) in Jos."

He noted that going to Chatham House would only enhance the economy of other countries as candidates invited would go with other party officials who were going to use airlines, accommodation, feeding and other services in Britain at the expense of the Nigerian economy.

He said, "Therefore, the pilgrimage by presidential candidates to Britain is uncalled for and a waste of our meagre resources. It is also another form of neocolonialism."

On his part, Obayuwana, a former Commissioner for Justice and Attorney General in Edo State, described the development as being subservient to colonial mentality.

He said, "The British are not voters in Nigeria, and those who go on pilgrimage to Chatham House are not going there to see Nigerians, but to beg for approval and kind consideration of the British government."

"I think it is a vote of no confidence on our electoral

process in Nigeria. Candidates want to flaunt that (Chatham House) as additional qualification that they have won approval of the British government; thinking it would enhance their chances of winning the election."

He lamented that the candidates going to Chatham House were not courageous enough to accuse the British government of being responsible for the mess the Nigerians and other Africans found themselves in.

Why there is low PVC collection in some states – INEC

The Independent National Electoral Commission (INEC) has explained why some states are witnessing low turnout of prospective voters for the collection of the Permanent Voter's Card (PVC) in some states.

INEC National Commissioner and Chairman of the Outreach and Partnership Committee (OPC), Prof. Kunle Ajayi, told newsmen on Wednesday in Abuja that the off-season elections held in 2022 contributed to low PVC collection in the affected states.

Prof. Ajayi spoke in an interview with newsmen

during a national dialogue with Nigerian women groups and candidates with the theme: "2023 Elections: Women's Participation in PVC Collection and Election Day Processes", organised by INEC's gender and inclusivity department in collaboration with IFES.

He explained that, "There are states where elections were held in 2022. In states like Ekiti, Osun and Anambra, voters have already collected their PVCs because of off-season elections. So, you don't expect much from there. But we are appealing to voters nationwide not to wait till the last minute. Collect your PVCs now."

"Women are a major power bloc and a voting force to contend with in the forthcoming general elections. With the power of your PVCs and the opportunity of the coming elections, there is an avenue for women to change the narrative, speak with one voice and grasp the mantle of leadership in their favour."

On her part, INEC's acting Director, Gender and Inclusivity, Lakunuya Dorothy Bello, said the dialogue was aimed at encouraging women participation in politics and ensuring they collected their PVCs to enable them vote on February 25 and March 11.

It will amount to blasphemy if Nigerians reject Tinubu – Yuguda

A former governor of Bauchi State, Isa Yuguda, has said it would amount to blasphemy for Nigerians to reject the presidential candidate of the All Progressives Congress (APC), Bola Ahmed Tinubu, as a special gift from God.

Yuguda who spoke yesterday during a symposium on 'renewed hope 2023', organised by the APC Professionals Forum at the Yar'adua Centre in Abuja said Tinubu should succeed Buhari because he is patriotic and an anti-corruption crusader.

The former governor said, "Nobody can doubt

the progress in Lagos and we can see the leadership qualities in him to lead people from all parts of the world.

"Tinubu is very patriotic and that is who we need today as a leader. He is an anti-corruption crusader. We know it and everybody knows it. If there were corruption in Lagos, that state would not be where it is today.

"It would be to, should I say, blasphemy to turn against him. At least, he is there for you. Tinubu is very patriotic and that is who we need today as a leader.

"Anywhere there is corruption, there can't be progress; there can't be

economic progress that we can see. In society, we can't say there is no corruption but, at least, it has been brought down to the barest minimum."

Speaking at the event, wife of the APC presidential candidate, Senator Oluremi Tinubu, said her husband would lift many families out of poverty and hunger if elected on February 25.

Tinubu's wife who was represented by the Director General of National Centre for Women Development, Asabe Bashir, said if elected, the Tinubu-led administration would increase opportunities and create the right environment for women and youth to flourish.

Muslim-Muslim ticket: Court dismisses suit seeking Tinubu's disqualification

A Federal High Court in Abuja has dismissed a suit seeking the disqualification of the All Progressives Congress (APC) presidential candidate, Bola Ahmed Tinubu, over the issue of the Muslim-Muslim ticket ahead of the February 25, 2022, polls.

Justice Ahmed Ramat Mohammed yesterday ruled that the lawyer who filed the suit lacked the locus standi since he was neither a member of the APC nor a participant in the process that produced Tinubu and his running mate, Kashim Shettima, as candidates.

The suit was filed by an Abuja-based lawyer, Osigwe Ahmed Momoh, seeking an order nullifying the candidature of Tinubu and the APC from participating in the presidential election on the ground that the nomination of the Muslim-Muslim candidacy was unconstitutional and against the spirit and letters of Sections 14, 15 and 224 of the 1999 Nigerian Constitution.

Momoh argued that the Muslim-Muslim

candidacy ran counter to the spirit of national cohesion, integration and unity.

He asked the court for an order of perpetual injunction restraining the Independent National Electoral Commission (INEC) from publishing the name of APC and its presidential candidate for the 2023 elections.

SDP bars presidential candidate, others from comments

The National Chairman of the Social Democratic Party (SDP), Alhaji Musa Gabam, has said that only the National Working Committee (NWC) members of the party have authority to determine its direction with regards to elections and related matters and therefore asked the party's candidates to stop making unapproved

comments.

In a statement yesterday by the National Publicity Secretary of the party, Ambassador Rufus Aiyenigba, the party stated that no member or candidate of the party was authorised to make any commitment on behalf of the party without the NWC's approval.

The statement reads in part: "And for the avoidance of any doubt, the SDP national headquarters

further makes itself clear by defining 'members' to include zonal chairmen, state chairmen, local government chairmen and ward chairmen and 'candidates: to include the presidential, governorship, senatorial, House of Representatives and Houses of Assembly candidates."

The party warned that any member who went contrary to the guidelines would be sanctioned accordingly.

Nigeria's survival lies on restructuring – Okotie

A former presidential candidate and interim government campaigner, Rev. Chris Okotie, has said that Nigeria's future is

guaranteed only when the country is restructured.

In continuation of his interim government campaign which he began in 2019, Okotie, yesterday, said that for Nigeria to overcome the 2023 global

economic headwinds predicted by experts there was the need to put in place strong governance structures and a stable polity, noting that such ingredients were absent in the 1999 constitution.

Kano gov'ship candidates sign peace accord, demand proper implementation

Governorship candidates in Kano State yesterday signed a peace accord, with the promise to maintain peace during the elections.

The event was organised by the Kano Peace Committee (KPC) in collaboration with the National Peace Committee (NPC), United Nations and the Kukah Centre.

The candidates pledged to conduct themselves peacefully during the electoral process.

They also called for proper implementation of the peace accord processes.

The governorship candidate of the New Nigeria Peoples Party (NNPP), Engr. Abba Kabir Yusuf, said the last

peace accord was not implemented properly, alleging that there were instances where peace was disrupted but nothing was done.

He urged the police and the Independent National Electoral Commission (INEC) to remain neutral and perform their duties professionally.

Speaking to *Daily Trust* on pockets of violence being recorded during the campaign season, Bashir I. Bashir, the candidate of the Labour Party, said for his commitment to peace, his children followed him to campaign rallies.

He said electoral violence is mostly caused by desperate politicians, urging Nigerians to avoid them and make the right choice.

A representative of the United Nations, Giovanie

Biha, urged the candidates to caution their supporters against violence.

"Election violence continues to undermine inclusive electoral processes, especially with regards to women participation and the respect for human rights and the rule of law.

"Hence, we are expected to be more proactive in identifying ways to peaceful electoral processes and take the necessary measures to either address them or mitigate their impact both in Kano State and Nigeria," Biha said.

The state's Commissioner of Police, CP Mamman Dauda, represented by DCP Mu'azu Muhammad, assured that the police would be fair to all candidates and parties.

"We have all what it takes to provide adequate

security for each party in the state during elections. But we want the candidates and their parties to caution their supporters against disrupting the process," he said.

The state's governor, Dr Abdullahi Umar Ganduje, appealed to the peace committee to monitor offenders and call out anyone flouting the agreement signed.

The gubernatorial candidates who signed the peace accord are: Sha'aban Ibrahim Sharada (ADP), Salibu Tanko Yakasaai (PRP), Abba Kabir Yusuf (NNPP), Bashir I. Bashir (LP), Muhammed Abacha (PDP), Bala Gwagwarwa (SDP) and deputy gubernatorial candidate of APC, Murtala Sule Garo, and that of ADC, Dr Aminu Anas.

We'll review El-rufai's policies – Kaduna gov'ship candidates

The PDP Presidential Campaign Council (PCC) has vowed to furnish Nigerians with the compendium of corrupt activities of the APC presidential candidate, Ahmed Bola Tinubu.

Addressing a press conference at the PDP presidential campaign office in Abuja on Wednesday, a spokesman of the campaign council, Kola Ologbondiyan, explained that the plot by Tinubu to divert attention from his litany of atrocities by seeking to impugn the impeccable character of Atiku Abubakar, with unfounded controversy of corruption, has failed.

He said, "Tinubu, sensing that his many corrupt activities, especially his fleeing of Lagos State with many Special Purpose Vehicle (SPV) companies, were about to come to light, rushed to hire a serial blackmailer, as he has always done, to foul the public space with fabricated allegations against Atiku Abubakar."

Listing some of the alleged corrupt activities, the PDP Campaign said, "It is now in the public domain how Alpha Beta, which has for over 20 years held the exclusive rights to collect taxes in Lagos State in return for a commission under very shady arrangements through which it reportedly siphoned billions of naira belonging to Lagos State.

"The public is now aware of a petition before an anti-corruption agency wherein Tinubu's alleged SPV

company was reported to have used another company which shares the same address with Tinubu's office on Idowu Taylor Street in Lagos to launder Lagos State funds."

But reacting, the APC Presidential Campaign Council, in a statement by the Director, Media and Publicity, Bayo Onanuga, said the PDP should "address the allegations of criminal money-laundering and reckless abuse of public trust" against Atiku and should not introduce a

diversionary tactic into the matter.

The APC Campaign Council said, "The issues the Nigerian people want the PDP and his candidate to address are simple. They are, was the whistleblower, Michael Achimugu, who swore to an oath, employed by Atiku?"

"Did Atiku make a scandalous confession in a telephone conversation on how he and his former boss, President Olusegun Obasanjo" set up SPVs, such as Marine Float, to steal public money? Was the taped voice not Atiku's?"

"It is obvious that the PDP presidential candidate has no defence to these allegations, which he admitted in his viral confession.

"Rather than address the allegations of criminal money-laundering and reckless abuse of public trust levelled against Atiku Abubakar, by one of his closest aides, the PDP tried in vain to defend its presidential candidate by embarking on a puerile diversionary journey by drumming up a stale allegation against his rival."

In 2021, IHP supported the SMOH, HSMB and SMEP in the three states to build the capacity of select Medical Lab Scientists (MLS) to form a State malaria EQA Team, conduct EQA Assessments, and set up EQA centers, provide supportive supervision and capacity building of MLS, lab technicians and service providers on malaria diagnosis (through microscopy and mRDTs), case management and quality assurance. In mid-2021, IHP collaborated with the state to implement external quality assurance facility visits to assess malaria diagnostic services in supported secondary and primary health facilities. The outcome of the visits was presented to the states and stakeholders and remedial plans developed to address identified gaps and challenges. Each facility and settlement is then allocated an arbitrary population data for microplanning purposes. Under this approach, hand-drawn maps are used, which can be inaccurate and have the potential for missed settlements.

IHP FCT, will support its facilities, using GIS for microplanning process, which will help improve access to RMNCH+NG services as the accuracy in determining fixed, outreach and mobile strategies will be enhanced. This will consequently improve integrated micro plans with better population estimate developed, that will improve RI coverage and provision of other PHC services.

Sometimes, I wonder why human nature is so obsessed with self-victimhood. The fact that I have to wonder is itself a figment of that moral and intellectual convenience institutionalised by the culture of social self-interest and apparently this is at the heart of every human being. Since there is an exception to every rule, I refer to those of us who are mere mortals of course.

This spirit, what Friedrich Nietzsche called “the instinct of vengeance” typifies many human events in which a duplex relationship goes sour, or someone(s) felt wronged by someone(s) else’s acts of omission and commission.

As a Nigerian, born and bred, I have cause to believe that this self-righteous persecution complex is an auxiliary device found in the package deal we are all created from. About half the time, this gets in the way so much we end up blind, deaf and dumb – clinically incapable of reason and objectivity.

In about a little more than a month, it will be one of those days we have to bathe ourselves – and this will be like nature holding up a mirror to us, both individually as whoever we are and collectively as Nigerians. It will show us what we really look like – warts and all, without the self-serving delusions. Nigerians will decide those who will rule them at all the three tiers of political administration.

We have complained about the quality of those who have led us since before Dan Fodio showed up and that has not yet changed. It boggles many minds to learn that even the consecrated founding fathers of this nation were political villains to many during their time. We have been like lost sheep in the desert, with no Moses in sight probably since the beginning of the political history of our part of the Sudan and that still persists.

But all said and done, the big picture emerges, our problem is not leadership even though this also circles back to being a symptom of the problem. When you really think about it, those we call our leaders are in fact our victims, not just the other way round. We keep stuffing round pegs down the throat of round holes and in the process we compromise and break the peg, while also decimating the board itself. That means you end up with an eyecore.

This scenario mirrors that hypocritical sentiment against lawmen almost everyone in the world harbours. A cop is a pig much more than he is not an accoutrement of civil sophistication even though they are meant to be the latter and never the former. Their crime is falling victim to the “curse of Nietzsche” – “Those who hunt monsters must take care lest they become monsters themselves. If you stare down into the abyss long enough, the abyss will stare back at you.” Nigerian cops are an especially repugnant eyecore indeed... but when there is a documented mass propensity by a whole social demographic for something, you need to take a closer, objective look at the fundamentals. We send our lawmen into the abyss of society so we are shielded from it but they stayed and stared too long – what do you expect?

The foregoing is just the functional logic the context is derived from. Through the

instruments of society, we encourage and goad and coax and seduce and bait mere mortals into the lawlessness of frontline leadership – that exposure appears to mangle and spoof a moral compass no matter how tightly wound it is. They become plutocrats, monsters without even knowing it. As products of lawlessness, plutocrats are apex predators who do not recognise the supremacy of the law over them, the lawlessness having gone into their heads and it became their new normal. The Hausa translation of the word “jungle” is the compound word – dokar daji, literally “law of the jungle”. A jungle denotes lawlessness, and you do not expect someone natured and nurtured by a jungle to understand or recognise any limit to the frivolity of their carnal whims. The political frontier in Nigeria is lawless because our institutions of state have proved incapable of policing and enforcing all relevant laws and regulations in that sphere anywhere near the extent at which the rest of society is under the leash of civilised order in a way that echoes and institutionalised Louis XIV’s “Le etat cest moi” – the “state is me” sentiment. His immediate successor, Louis XV perfected the articulation of that totalitarian ideal in his own declaration, “après moi, le deluge”. That is Leadership 101 in Nigeria. For all our “leaders” care, society can crash and burn by the time they are done with it.

They were never leaders, they were not equipped for life in neither Sodom nor Gomorrah, but that we never cared about or never cared to care about. Either way, the verdict is right in our faces.

The hypocrisy here is in our petty contempt for our policemen as well as our politicians. A policeman is not only a pariah but an abomination. The eugenicist culture of ancient Sparta somewhat looked at the disabled veterans of its wars with disgust, so much so they chose not to return to the city and formed a colony of their own somewhere. If you believe this was unconscionably outrageous, you might be right. But back then, there was no moral question here. The way there is no moral question about why our policemen and politicians disgust us – because we sent them out into the abyss and they were left mangled after the abyss stared back into them.

On the February 25 and two weeks after that, Nigerians will have to go naked for a bath. The Hausa people have a saying – “ranar wanka, ba’a boyon cibi”. Literally, this translates into, “on bathing days, you cannot hide the navel”. On those days there will be nowhere to hide... you will have to see your cibi, the umbilical livewire of who we are both individually and collectively. You will have to take a hard look at your nakedness.

There is a silver lining though. It will be a bathing day. You know what that means. Take a good hard look at our belly button, drop the victimhood platitudes and make that an opportunity to cleanse and redeem that nakedness. Part of the pain we must face that day will come from the fact that all the foreseeable outcomes would be choices between the devil and the deep blue sea. Such is our predicament, but we can start from there.

Averting 2022 flooding disaster in 2023 through proactive measures

The year 2022 witnessed flooding as never seen in recent years in different parts of the country. The damage caused was massive resulting in loss of lives, property and farmlands.

The incident also caught the attention of the international media with BBC reporting that “Nigeria is suffering its worst flooding in a decade, forcing 1.4 million people from their home”.

“This year’s flooding has the highest death toll since the 2012 flooding”, the National Emergency Management Agency (NEMA) was quoted by the media as saying.

But the flood disaster did not come without a warning. On Sept. 7, the Nigeria Hydrological Services Agency (NIHSA) had predicted an “abnormal” rainy season for 2022 only comparable to what was witnessed in 2012.

Experts say that as the dry season continues, relevant agencies should collaborate to take necessary measures to ensure that the 2023 rainy season does not bring the magnitude of disaster experienced in 2012 and 2022.

Between July and October 2012, flooding in Nigeria pushed rivers over their banks and submerged hundreds of thousands of acres of farmland.

According to NEMA, it forced 1.3 million people out of their homes and claimed 431 lives.

Both rivers Niger and Benue had burst their banks, engulfing the small lakes and ponds. South of Idah, the Niger River sparked into a sprawling temporary lake.

The United Nations Integrated Regional Information Networks had reported that many farmers had lost everything they labored for.

Similarly, Nigerian Red Cross statistics showed that no fewer than 120,000 people were made homeless while thousands of displaced residents had to flee temporary shelters as the floods overwhelmed those camps.

Nigeria was not alone in coming with floods in 2012; floods had affected several other countries in west and central Africa by mid-September

Comparing 2012 flooding to that of 2022, NEMA Director-General, Ahmed Habib, told newsmen that this year flooding has the highest death toll since the 2012 flooding.

On its part, NIHSA explained that Kainji and Jebba dams had started spilling excess water from their dams,

with Shiroro dam, expected to shed excess water by October.

“In 2012, there was flooding in Kogi and Benue states, due to two reasons, namely, heavy rainfalls and the release of excess water from Cameroon’s Lagdo dam. The floods killed over 430 people leaving 566, 466 people displaced.

NIHSA explained that Kainji and Jebba dams had started spilling excess water from their dams, with Shiroro dam, expected to shed excess water by October.

“In 2012, there was flooding in Kogi and Benue states, due to two reasons, heavy rainfalls; and the release of excess water from Cameroon’s Lagdo dam. The floods killed over 430 people leaving 566, 466 people displaced.

The agency’s Director-General, Mr Clement Nze, had indicated that it was conscious of the impact of Lagdo dam in Cameroon on flooding in Nigeria if its reservoir level approaches 216m.

“The water from the dam will cascade into Nigeria through River Benue, affecting communities in Benue, Kogi, Nassarawa, Kebbi, Niger, Taraba, and Adamawa,” most of the catastrophes present would not be different from that of 2012,” he said.

According to the United Nations Office for the Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs (OCHA) Nigeria is among the eleven countries listed as flooding hotspots in 2022.

The Republic of Congo occupies the number one spot in the West and Central African region.

The West and Central Africa region accounts for 265,400 internally displaced persons (IDP’s) due to disasters such as flood, storms and landslides.

The region accounts for approximately three per cent of total IDPs on the continent as of the end of 2021, according to the Internal Displacement Monitoring Centre.

Millions of people are globally exposed to flooding every year, with no fewer than 800 million people living in flood-prone areas while 19 per cent of the world population is directly exposed to substantial risks during 1-in-100 year flood events, according to environment experts.

Experts say that as the dry season continues, relevant agencies should collaborate to take necessary measures to ensure that the 2023 rainy season does not bring the magnitude of disaster experienced in 2012 and 2022.

They advise that Nigeria and Cameroon governments should immediately take concrete steps to mitigate the impact of the Lagdo dam on Nigerian communities in the event of excess water storage.

It is important that enough public enlightenment campaigns are carried out ahead of the rainy season to raise emergency preparedness among coastline communities.

Environmentalists also advise that among others, where necessary, dredging should be carried out to ensure that rivers can accommodate more rain water in the event of continuous heavy rainfall during the 2023 rainy season. (NANFeatures)

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Nigeria must win fight against corruption

The more successive administrations in the country claim to have tackled and curbed corruption, especially in the public service, the more corruption cases involving public officers are exposed; raising doubts even in the assertions of the present administration that it is winning the fight against corruption.

In its latest ethics and transparency index report released on Monday last week, the Independent Corrupt Practices and Other Related Offences Commission (ICPC) scored the Ministries of Finance, Power and Education low. The report by the ICPC is part of its mandate to deploy the Ethics and Integrity Compliance Scorecard (EICS) in federal government's ministries, departments and agencies (MDAs) to assess their compliance to extant ethical, integrity, statutory, policy and regulatory standards and practices.

The assessment is provided for in Section 6(b)-(d) of the Corrupt Practices and Other Related Offences Act, 2000 with a view to reinforcing the drive to strengthen probity, accountability and transparency in government. The goal of the EICS deployment in MDAs is to diminish corruption risks, system abuse and revive ethics and integrity benchmarks in government offices.

The tool was deployed between April and July 2022 in 360 MDAs. The index showed that 260 MDAs responded and were rated according to the degree of compliance with the scoring criteria.

A breakdown of the report shows that 52 agencies scored zero in the ranking, meaning that they did not respond to enquiries on them. They were marked as "High Corruption Risk (HCR)" agencies by the commission. Such agencies were flagged for the attention of the public and for further inquiries and actions.

Prominent among the agencies in this category include the Federal Ministry of Education, the Supreme Court, the Court of Appeal, National Judicial Institute, Nigerian Christian Pilgrims Commission, National Bureau of Statistics and the National Pension Commission.

Others include Nigerian Content Development and Monitoring Board, National Population Commission, Nigerian Investment Promotion Commission, Standards Organisation of Nigeria, National Centre for Disease Control, National Broadcasting Commission, National Hospital, National Examinations Council, Universal Basic Education Commission, and the Assets Management Corporation of Nigeria.

It is worrisome that some strategic MDAs including finance, justice, and power ministries, the Fiscal Responsibility Commission, the NDDC and many others that should expectedly earn first-rate grades in ICPC's EICS failed the compliance test by scoring below the pass-mark of 50. While the Ministry of Power scored 46.15, FCDA got 44.25. The Federal Ministry of Finance and the Ministry of Niger Delta Affairs respectively failed with 42.45 and 42.10 per cent respectively.

Further examination of the report also shows that about 15 federal MDAs scored below 30 marks. They include the Federal Ministry of Petroleum Resources (29.55), and the Bureau of Public Procurement (20.40).

What is more worrying is the abysmal rating respectively earned by the Ministry of Justice (18.95) and the Police Service Commission (15.78). With the National Lottery Trust Fund earning the highest score (86.05) in the entire transparency assessment, the Ministry of Justice should be ashamed of its outing.

Speaking on how the ICPC scored MDAs, spokeswoman for the commission, Mrs Azuka Ogugua, said the anti-graft agency looked at compliance level of MDAs to existing government policies, which according to her, are categorised under three groups; namely management measures and culture, financial management systems and administrative systems. She said MDAs were required to print existing documents to support their compliance in the three broad areas of operations.

If MDAs that are strategic in the fight against corruption such as the justice ministry, the two highest courts, which are the principal enforcers of law as well as protectors of fundamental human rights would fail ICPC's integrity test so woefully, it is easy to conclude that the attempt by citizens to seek justice at the appellant and the Supreme Courts is simply an exercise in futility; dashing the hope of Nigerians for a just society.

The very poor rating of these courts in the ICPC's recent transparency index only confirms that some key actors in the war against corruption have rather become a part of the problem than of the solution. This report by the ICPC coming at the tail end of the present administration further seeks to puncture the latter's much-advertised claim that it has done so much to tame corruption in government.

We advise ICPC to seek explanations from MDAs that scored zero in the exercise. Those without reasons to explain their inactions should be blacklisted, named and shamed stringently, and where applicable, have their allocations in budgetary appropriations withheld until they comply.

While we commend ICPC for its courage in naming and shaming corrupt MDAs, we equally encourage Servicom units of all MDAs and other anti-graft agencies to take after ICPC in blowing the whistle against MDAs that fail to comply with extant rules guiding various operational systems and procedures in the public service. We insist, however, that such ethics and integrity tests must also be carried out in Nigeria's many anti-corruption agencies themselves, after all, they are also government agencies.

Secondly, it is most preferred that such indices are designed and implemented by non-governmental agencies or research centres, rather than anti-graft agencies that are also government departments like any other. But overall, the report is a positive step towards winning the fight against corruption in Nigeria.

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On the power of dreams

Iam writing this on Martin Luther King Jr. Day and it's got me thinking about worthy legacies and living in such a way as to leave one behind. Often when we think of great men and women of history, we forget that they were like us: warts and all. They were not born great (yes, I know the Winston Churchill quote about some being born great, and I don't agree with it because greatness and privilege are two different things), but they became great. They achieved greatness.

MLK's "I have a dream" speech is arguably one of the most famous and one of the most memorised speeches of all time. Even a child knows the refrain, "I have a dream." The success of that speech in galvanising the civil rights movement and its enduring popularity is testament to the power of words. However, it is illustrative of the power of dreams.

MLK wasn't born fully formed. He didn't just pop up, preaching and giving eloquent speeches that have stood the test of time. He was once a cranky baby. He once had snot running down his nose. He was once a little boy who ran around and played and fell and cried. He did not have two heads. He was simply a normal human being who got angry enough about the status quo (there's something to be said for righteous anger) and dared to make a change (there's something to be said for courage). He wasn't a saint (there are enough stories that testify to his flaws) but he had a heart large enough that made him uncomfortable with fighting for just himself and his personal gains (all those supporting corruption and nonsense because it benefits you pay attention oo).

He promoted nonviolence and civil disobedience as means of achieving racial equality and social justice (proving that there are things truly mightier than the sword) and inconvenienced himself to pursue them. Today, he is deservedly being remembered. Schools and government offices are closed all because of one man, a mere man like you and I whose message of love, whose courage and compassion, whose life continues to inspire millions all over the world.

When the 1963 March on Washington for Freedom and Jobs was held, MLK had a different speech prepared, "a short and somewhat formal recitation of the sufferings

King paused. In that brief silence, Mahalia Jackson, a gospel singer and good friend of King's, shouted "tell 'em about the 'dream.'" Few people heard her, with the exception of Jones, Ted Kennedy, and, of course, King. Here's what happened next...King push(ed) the text of his prepared remarks to one side of the lectern. He shifted gears in a heartbeat, abandoning whatever final version he'd prepared...he'd given himself over to the spirit of the moment." And

"Encouraged by shouts from the audience, King drew upon some of his past talks, and the result became the landmark statement of civil rights in America — a dream of all people, of all races and colours and backgrounds, sharing in an America marked by freedom and democracy."

Buhari extends IGP's tenure

The Minister of Police Affairs, Mohammed Dingyadi, says the Inspector-General of Police, Usman Alkali Baba, will not be retiring midway into the general elections as expected.

He stated this yesterday while fielding questions from State House reporters after the first Federal Executive Council meeting of the year.

Dingyadi, who said Baba already had an appointment letter extending his term in office, added that the Police Act 2020 had changed the rules for an IGP's retirement.

Media reports had suggested that the IGP would be clocking 60 years on March 1 and would be expected

to honour the rule that mandates public servants to go on retirement at 60.

But reacting to a question on this, the minister said: "I don't know where you got your record, but let me say that by the provision of the Police Act 2020, the IG is now supposed to have a kind of four-year period and Mr. President has already given him letter of appointment in that regard.

"So, the issue of IG going out during this election period does not arise," he said.

Baba, appointed as acting IGP on April 6, 2021, was confirmed by the Police Council as the substantive IG in June 2021.

Dingyadi also said the FEC approved draft bill for an Act to establish Nigeria Police Institutions which, he said, is to provide legal

backing and financial autonomy to the existing training institutions across the country for effective and professional policing services.

He said the council had directed the Attorney-General of the Federation and Minister of Justice, Abubakar Malami, to transmit the draft bill to National Assembly for consideration and final passage into law.

He also said reforms initiated by the All Progressives Congress-administration had led to a drastic reduction in the level of corruption within the Nigeria Police.

He said the main objective of the bill was not to establish new training colleges but rather boost the seven existing police colleges, 15 training institutes, and other allied professional institutions across the country.

Census not political, economic tool — NPC

He spoke in Abuja during the opening ceremony of an orientation programme for census training and field coordinators.

He appealed to Nigerians to join

the commission in its bid to give the country accurate and reliable data through the forthcoming 2023 Population and Housing Census.

He stressed the need for "a shift in national attitude that sees census data as a tool for seeking economic and political advantages."

Kwarra said the NPC was committed to positively rewriting the history of censuses in Nigeria by delivering accurate and reliable census data this year.

Emefiele: Court adjourns \$53m judgment debt suit to March 20

A Federal High Court in Abuja yesterday fixed March 20 for the hearing of the suit against the governor of the Central Bank of Nigeria (CBN), Godwin Emefiele, over a \$53m judgement debt arising from the Paris Club refunds.

Justice Inyang Ekwo noted that due to the pre-election matters before the court ahead of the 2023 general elections, the application would be heard on the adjourned date.

The court had, earlier in an application for garnishee made on October 20, 2022, ordered Emefiele to appear yesterday for the matter.

The order followed

the application by a Senior Advocate of Nigeria, Joe Agi against Linas International Ltd, the Minister of Finance and the CBN through his lawyers, Isaac Ekpa and Chinonso Obasi seeking an order to direct the Inspector-General of Police to arrest Emefiele and bring him to court alongside his lawyers: Damian Dodo, Audu Anuga, all Senior Advocates of Nigeria, and Ginika Ezeoke, Jessica Iyoke, Abdullahi Afolayan and Olayemi Afolayan.

The suit arose over an alleged \$70m judgment against Linas over the lawyer's services in the Paris Club refund, which Emefiele was said to have released only \$17m leaving an outstanding \$53m.

We'll go tougher on drug barons, cartels – NDLEA

Chairman/Chief Executive Officer of the National Drug Law Enforcement Agency (NDLEA), Mohamed Buba Marwa, has warned that drug barons and cartels will face tougher times in 2023 if they fail to back out of the illicit drug business.

He gave the warning yesterday in Abuja at a media briefing to update the public on efforts by the NDLEA to rid the country of illicit substance abuse and drug trafficking on the second anniversary of his leadership of the anti-narcotics body.

He said 34 barons were already in the agency's net and were facing the music in court.

"We've secured orders for the temporary forfeiture of their assets. With our prosecution being topnotch, they can look forward to a long time in prison and final forfeiture of their wealth and assets.

"Those involved in the illicit drug trade should take a cue from our actions. They can again look forward to a tough time this year," Marwa said.

According to him, the signs of what to come are clear as the agency in the first two weeks of this year took down

three major drug cartels, one of which had built extensive networks across the world while at least six of their kingpins are in NDLEA custody.

He said, "In these two years, we arrested 26,458 drug traffickers, among them, 34 barons. In 24 months, we successfully prosecuted 3,733 offenders who were convicted and handed various jail terms in court.

"Of the conviction figure, 2,346 were recorded in 2022 alone, which is the highest in the history of the agency and almost doubled the highest ever recorded in the 33 years of NDLEA."

Kidnappings: Reps ask IGP, COAS to beef up security in Edo

FG seeks end to deforestation

The Federal Government yesterday sought support from stakeholders for the fight against deforestation.

He said, "In the fight against illegal activities in the forest sector, all hands must be on deck. Thus, the ministry urges all critical stakeholders to join this fight in order to bring sanity to the forest sector by stopping this ugly situation.

"Hence, the reconstitution of the JTF with the mandate to ensure strict compliance with the guidelines."

NNPC, partners to complete drilling of 14 oil wells this year

The Nigerian National Petroleum Company Limited (NNPC) along with its partners has a target to deliver the drilling of two oil wells on the Bonga oil well with the drilling of about 12 more oil wells in Imo State and Anyala-Madu near Port Harcourt, this year.

The company is also working on adding over 20 oil and gas wells within the next four years which could raise oil production to nearly 3 million barrels per day (bpd) for Nigeria.

Nigeria currently produces about 1.4mbpd of oil rising from 1m in November 2022, a rebound that occurred after massive onslaught against oil thieves. The oil theft menace which grew worse in 2022 dropped oil production from over 1.8mbpd previously.

According to a record of ongoing partnership projects obtained from NNPC Ltd yesterday, NNPC and SNEPCo (Shell) started drilling the Bonga oil field OML118 since April 2022 and is expected to complete it by April 2023 to add about 20,000bpd of oil from two oil-producing wells and three injectors. Already one of the wells was ready as of November 2022 and the second is nearing completion.



Oil well

By the third and fourth quarters of this year, NNPC and Shell Petroleum Development Company of Nigeria (SPDC) will deliver the ANOH Gas project in Asa North and Ohaji South of Imo State. This project is for drilling six gas wells with a gas processing plant for 250 million metric standard cubic feet per day (MMscf/d).

And in Rivers State, the company working with First Exploration & Petroleum Development Company Limited (First E&P) will deliver five oil wells and a gas injection well on the Oil Mining Lease (OML) 85 Anyala-Madu field.

Still this year, NNPC is starting

three projects with partners. The first is the Preowei field in Bayelsa to drill 16 wells (eight oil wells and eight water wells) which it hopes to complete by 2026 along its partner - Total Upstream Nigeria Limited (TUPNI). The Agbami gas monetisation project is starting this year with Stardeep to raise gas compression from 450MMscf/d to 600MMscf/d; the tender is in progress and it is expected to be ready by 2027. The Bonga North on OML118 is on to drill about 20 oil wells between 2023 and 2027 with a \$2.9 billion funding projection.

From 2027 to 2031, NNPC and SNEPCO are working on the

Bonga South West Aparo field on OML118 to drill about 20 wells; the Owowo field on OML154 is also in process but will begin in phases from 2029 with over 13 oil wells.

Commenting on this, an oil gas consultant, Jide Okoroafor, noted that if the projects are delivered, the country's daily oil production output could rise to over 3 million bpd which means higher oil revenue.

"I think it is achievable for NNPC and its partners especially with the Petroleum Industry Act (PIA) 2021 that encourages settling host communities," said Okoroafor, the head of WellHead Consult Ltd.

NESG predicts 2.98% real GDP growth, 37% unemployment rate

The Nigeria Economic Summit Group (NESG) has said Nigeria's Real Gross Domestic Product (RGDP) growth will average at 2.98 per cent in 2023 just as it said employment rate could reach 37%.

The NESG stated this yesterday in Abuja during the virtual launch of the 2023 macroeconomic outlook report for the Nigeria economy titled "Nigeria in Transition: Recipes for Shared Prosperity."

Dr. Olusegun Omisakin, head of research at NESG in a presentation, projects that Nigeria's unemployment rate which currently stands at 33 per cent will rise to 37 per cent in 2023.

The 2.98% aligns with that of World Bank but lower than the 3.75% projected for the 2023 budget.

As efforts to contain crude oil theft in Nigeria intensify, crude oil production will average 1.35 million barrels per day in 2023, the report had explained.

"The unemployment rate will increase to 37% and the poverty headcount will amplify to 45% due to weak performance in the job-elastic sectors, low labour absorption of sectors that will drive growth, and population growth estimated at 3.2 percent will lead to a decline in real per capita income," it added.

The group further stated that the inflation rate will average 20.5 per cent in 2023.

Shubham Chaudhuri, Country Director for Nigeria, World Bank said for the government to end extreme poverty, there must be finances for adequate investments.

"These ensure that private enterprises are empowered, not to start but to grow and flourish and create the jobs that provide the economic opportunities that are important," he said.

Redesigned naira: CBN sensitises marketers in Bauchi, Jigawa

Speaking during the exercise yesterday at the Wunti market in Bauchi, the CBN branch controller in Bauchi, Idris Andaza, said, "We are calling on all traders especially those who are in the habit of keeping their monies inside shops or houses that they should endeavour to, within the span of these 12 days,

hasten to their commercial banks and make sure they deposit all their old naira notes."

In Jigawa, the sensitisation was held at the Dutse ultra modern market where Hajjya Sa'adatu Ibrahim Aminu, the branch controller CBN Dutse, explained the benefits.

"We believe that this exercise would help in increasing financial

inclusion, moving towards a more cashless economy, and ensuring greater formalization of the Nigerian economy," she noted.

Chairman, Jigawa marketers Alhaji Yahaya Kwaimawa, appreciated CBN for the efforts noting that it was with the view to reduce armed robbery and other Money laundering across Nigeria.

FG, states, LGAs get N990.189bn for Dec 2022

The federal, state and local governments have shared a total sum of N990.189 billion to the three tiers of government, as Federation Allocation for the month of December 2022.

Amount shared includes Gross Statutory Revenue, Value Added Tax (VAT), Exchange Gain and Electronic Money Transfer Levies (EMTL).

The federal government

received N375.306bn, the states received N299.557bn, the local government councils got N221.807bn, while the oil-producing states received N93.519bn as derivation (13% of Mineral Revenue).

The communiqué issued by the Federation Account Allocation Committee (FAAC) at the end of the meeting indicated that the gross revenue available from the Value Added Tax (VAT) for December 2022

was N250.512bn, which was an increase distributed in the preceding month. From this amount, N7.215bn was allocated to NDDC project and N10.020bn to Cost of Collection to FIRS and NCS remaining N233.277bn which was distributed as follows; federal government got N34.992bn, the states received N116.639bn, local government councils got N81.647bn.

Accordingly, the Gross Statutory Revenue of N1136.1bn

was received for the month which was higher than the sum received in the previous month. From this amount, N31.531bn was given to Cost of Collection and N396.896bn to Transfers, Savings and Refunds remaining the balance of N707.756bn which was distributed as follows; federal government was allocated N325.105bn, states got N165.897bn, LGCs got N127.129bn, and Oil Derivation (13% Mineral Revenue) got

N90.625bn.

Also, the sum of N24.315bn from the Electronic Money Transfer Levies (EMTL) was distributed to the three tiers of government as follows; the federal government received N3.648bn, states got N12.157bn, local government councils received N8.510bn.

The balance in the Excess Crude Account (ECA) as at January 17th, 2023 stands at \$473,754.57.

Free Trade Zones attracted over \$30bn investments to Nigeria – Buhari

President Muhammadu Buhari has said his administration's designation of Free Trade Zones (FTZs) in the country has attracted investment worth over \$30 billion into the country.

The president, who spoke through the Minister of Industry, Trade and Investment, Amb. Maryam Katagum in

Kano, at the inauguration of Kano Free Trade Zone new administrative building and Nigeria Special Economic Zones Institute, said the zones have become the Launchpad for economic development and growth.

He also said the government has designated six special economic zones, four international airports as free trade zones and attracted \$30 billion investments expected to increase in the next few years with sustained

incentives and aggressive investment drive.

"Incentives in the free trade zones include tax-free operations, free fiscal duty for imported goods, machinery and equipment, exemption from levies.

"Under this administration, there has been a geometric increase in the number of FTZs from 21 to 46," the president said.

Earlier, Prof. Adesoji Adesugba, the Managing Director, Nigeria Export Zones

Authority (NEPZA), noted that the development of the largest US consulate in the world at Eko Atlantic free zone, Lagos as one of the achievements of the administration "estimated at \$500 million dollars and will employ about 1,500 Nigerians in five years."

The chairman of Kano FTZ investors' forum, Alhaji Umar Marshall, appealed to the minister to clarify issues on the planned concession of Kano and Calabar free zones and how it would affect investors.

Fuel scarcity bites harder amidst fare hike in Lagos

There is no sign of respite yet in Lagos over the biting fuel scarcity as motorists yesterday decried the long queues in few filling stations dispensing the fuel.

This is just as the situation has resulted in hike in transportation fares in parts of Lagos amidst lamentation from Lagos residents.

Checks by *Daily Trust* indicated that intra-city transportation has risen by more than 50 per cent

with commercial motorists blaming the hike on fuel scarcity.

They said they had to resort to black marketers and independent marketers to source fuel at the cost of N260 per litre.

Our correspondent who monitored the situation in parts of Lagos yesterday reported that many major filling stations in Lagos metropolis, especially the Ikeja axis were not dispensing. Only a few stations were dispensing with long queues of motorists scrambling to fill

their cars.

It was also learnt that many drivers had to abandon their cars at homes after running out of fuel; the situation which eased vehicular movement in some parts of Lagos while there was gridlock in few filling stations dispensing.

The stations dispensing at Grammar School, Berger were NNPC station and Bovas along Ogunnusi/Isheri road.

Also, Mobil filling station at Agidingbi-Ikeja started selling around 12 p.m. yesterday with queues

extending to Fela Shrine from Ashabi Cole Crescent/CIPM Avenue road.

Our correspondent however observed that some independent filling stations are selling at N260 and N270 per litre along Oba Akran, Awolowo road.

While the scarcity has persisted, many residents of Lagos are suffering from a hike in transportation fares across the state. For example, Berger to CMS costs as much as N1000 as against N500, N600 it was being charged before.

PenCom recovers N10bn outstanding pension contributions

The National Pension Commission (PenCom) has recovered over N10 billion outstanding pension contributions, and the payment of outstanding pension liabilities.

PenCom also added that the different reforms it initiated under the Contributory Pension Scheme (CPS) have reduced the challenges faced by Nigerian employees.

PenCom stated this recently in a video message, highlighting the gains of the scheme to Nigerians.

The Contributory Pension Scheme (CPS) is an arrangement where both the employer and the employee contribute towards the payment of the worker's pension at retirement.

"The several reforms which PenCom has implemented have led to the recovery of over N10 billion outstanding pension contributions and liabilities and recently approved

the increase of monthly pensions for retirees on "programmed withdrawal" under the CPS," it said.

The pension sector regulator added that, "The online enrollment and verification exercise, multi-fund structure, non-interest fund, retirement savings account transfer system, and data recapture exercise have eased all the challenges that contributors experience.

As we speak, the total pension assets in the country have amounted to over N14 trillion and PenCom has launched the new edition of pension enhancement for retirees on programme withdrawal under the contributory pension scheme.

The most exciting benefit is that [it is] not only public and civil servants will be enjoying pension in our country; private sector, traders, tailors, fashion designers, shoemakers, civil societies and almost all citizens can enroll in the pension scheme under the micro pension plan."

Inflation: Economist tasks FG on innovative borrowing

The Managing Director/Chief Economist at Analysts Data Service and Resources Limited, Dr Afolabi Olowookere, has tasked the federal government to revive and concentrate on production, review its trade-industrial policy and borrow innovatively for Nigeria to tame rising inflation.

Olowookere stated this while speaking during a one-day forum organised by the Capital Market Correspondents Association of Nigeria (CAMCAN) in Lagos.

Although the National Bureau of Statistics (NBS) had, on Monday, reported that inflation had eased to 21.34 per cent in December from an all-time high of 21.47 per cent in November, 2022, Olowookere believes that the federal government,

especially the incoming administration, should seek ways to revive production, the country's trade-industrial policy and must borrow innovatively.

"Inflation has been on the rise and in response, the Monetary Policy Committee (MPC) raised the Monetary Policy Rate (MPR) four times in 2022.

"Rising debt stock has been a major concern for the government and citizens alike.

"For example, the FG's revenue increased from N2.57 trillion in 2011 to N4.64 trillion in 2021," he said.

Olowookere noted that expenditure had risen from N4.30 trillion to N11.08 trillion within the same period while outflow for the half year of 2022 stood at N7.91 trillion.

"We need to look at our trade and industrial policy, again and again, to see how we can grow.

Major issues confronting cabbage farmers

Cabbage farmers in the northern and central parts of Plateau have said the cultivation of cabbage has been very favourable because of the well-drained sandy loam soil and the climate of the areas.

Plateau State is the home of exotic vegetables, including cabbage, and stakeholders said due to the cool weather condition, the state produces the crop in commercial quantities, with tonnes being transported to the southern parts of the country.

The stakeholders added that the production of the crop and its demand in the country should provide the farmers in Plateau and other areas the crop is cultivated, a reasonable income.

However, there are challenges the cabbage farmers say are obstacles to the cultivation of the crop in the state. The most challenging include lack of capital, fertiliser and insects repellants they said.

Abdulkadir Abubakar, a farmer in Jos North LGA of the state, said the cost of pesticides in the market was worrisome, and that many farmers could not sufficiently apply them in their farms.

He said apart from that, "Fertiliser has become a source of concern. A bag of fertiliser that we used to buy between N10,000 and N15,000 is now between N20,000 and N27,000. It is too costly and is preventing farmers from expanding their cabbage cultivation.

"Virtually all farming inputs are very expensive now and that is why cabbage farming is also capital intensive. If you don't have reasonable money at the moment, you can't sustain cabbage farming especially for those cultivating it in large quantities," he said.

Abubakar also said having money to buy fertiliser and pesticides was not enough to succeed in cabbage farming as inadequate water could also hinder its success.

He said "even when you have the money, you still need to have dam or reservoir to source water from for the crop. So once all these are available, you will earn money from cabbage cultivation."

Daweng Thoma, another farmer in Dorowa community of Barikin Ladi LGA of the state, also reiterated that the success of cabbage farming was dependent on the availability of capital in the hands of the farmers, saying inadequate resources to obtain farm inputs had always been a challenge.

He said, "If you are able to apply both manure and fertiliser sufficiently, you will have a bumper harvest because the fertility of the soil would be increased.

"Once you are able to obtain everything - fertilizer and pesticides and enough water for the crop, you will harvest bags of cabbage, and no matter the condition of the market, you will get some money with you because you will have cabbage in hundreds."

Zaka Rajak, a cabbage farmer also in Dorowa village, said though capital was the major challenge, getting suitable land for the crop was another challenge associated with farming it.

He explained that "when you plant the crop on the land that is not suitable, you will definitely encounter problem. If it is land that is often dominated by grasses, you must always apply pesticides to kill the grass.

"If you don't spray enough chemicals to kill the grass, the crop would be dominated by the grass, and thereby prevent the cabbage from growing.

"Another thing with even the pesticides is that even if you are able to buy it, if you are not lucky, it wouldn't work because in some cases, the pesticides are not always effective.

"You will have to look for effective pesticides. This is very challenging. The immediate challenge of the cultivation is the issue of farm inputs which generally this year were difficult to get and very expensive in the market.

Market challenge

All the farmers who spoke with *Daily Trust* also said the success of the market was dependent on how much you sell the crop in the market, noting that if you harvest the crop and it is not expensive in the market, you are likely to incur loss.

The farmers said if you didn't properly time when to cultivate the crop, you might miss the high demand period and your investment affected.

They added that one had to target festive periods like Christmas and New Year when the demand for it was high as many farmers last year were not happy with the price.

Another thing with the cabbage farming according to the farmers was that you could cultivate it three times in a year unlike other crops. They said you can grow it after every three months.

Benefits

The farmers said there is money in the cultivation of cabbage. The crop is patronized, especially during the festive periods when many people are in need of it.

They said buyers sometimes followed them to the farms because of the demand, and at that time, they record good return.

Rajak said, "Selling the crop at the appropriate time was the best in order to benefit from its cultivation. So, there is money in it.

Cabbage farming is even better than farming other crops because you can get more money than other crops, particularly, if you target the season.

How to succeed in cabbage farming

The farmers said cabbage farming would be profitable if certain measures are taken by both the government and the farmers.

They said if a farmer has enough capital, he would enjoy the farming as fertiliser and

pesticides would not be issues to him.

They added that if there were enough dams, especially during the dry season, farmers succeed as cabbage needs water to grow. They said when all the requirements are provided, cabbage farming would thrive better in the state.

According to the state chairman of All Farmers Association of Nigeria (AFAN), John Chindap Wuyep, "If government would provide dams for the farmers, it will go a long way in helping us to farm year round because climate change is a reality and rain would go and the only thing that would assist the farmers is water from the dams. Without water, farming would not be possible."

Farmer breaks into Abuja church, steals pulpit

A Dei-Dei Grade I Area Court, Abuja on Wednesday sentenced a 25-year-old farmer, Salisu Sule to 12 months imprisonment for stealing church glass pulpit and wheelbarrow.

Sule of Yimi, Zuba, Abuja pleaded guilty to two counts of criminal trespass and theft and

begged the court for leniency. The judge, Saminu Suleiman, however, gave the convict an option of N40,000 fine.

Suleiman ordered the convict to pay N140,000 as compensation to the complainant and warned him to desist from committing crime.

Earlier, the prosecution

counsel, Mr Chinedu Ogada, told the court that the complainant, Emeka Ucheare, of Dangerous Fire and Miracle Ministry, Ruryi Zuba, Abuja reported the matter at Zuba Police Station on Jan. 4.

Ogada said on the same date at about 11pm, the convict criminally trespassed into the complainant's church at Zuba

through the fence without his consent.

He said the convict intentionally stole the church glass pulpit valued at N100,000 and wheel wheelbarrow.

He said in the process, the convict dishonestly broke the church glass pulpit but was caught and handed over to the police for proper investigation.

He said iron rod was recovered from the convict and that the offence contravened sections 348 and 288 of the Penal Code. (NAN)

Phone snatcher nabbed in Kubwa

A suspected phone snatcher was on Wednesday afternoon nabbed in Kubwa, a satellite town in Bwari Area Council of the Federal Capital Territory (FCT).

City & Crime learnt that the suspect successfully snatched a phone on December 15 last year from a shop at the popular Madam Edo junction in Kubwa.

A woman, who identified herself as Mama Chidera, told our reporter, "On December 15, he went to my son's shop at Madam Edo junction here in Kubwa and snatched his Samsung phone and escaped in a waiting Okada.

"Then, today again, he came back there (opposite NYSC camp in Kubwa), just a stone throw from where he snatched my son's phone.

"This time around, he stole four phones from two shops and wanted to escape, but he was caught.

"When he was caught, people recognised him as the same person that snatched my son's phone last year."

Our reporter, who was at the scene, observed that a few minutes after the suspect was nabbed, policemen from the Kubwa division arrived and took him away.

City & Crime reports that the suspect was found with wraps of substances believed to be Indian hemp.

Man jailed for stealing curtain from Plateau govt guest house

An Area Court in Jos on Wednesday sentenced Emmanuel Dashe, 26, to one month's imprisonment for stealing decorative drape from the government house's guest house.

The judge, Mr Shawomi Bokkos, sentenced the convict after he pleaded guilty to theft and begged the court for leniency.

The judge gave the convict an option of N10,000 fine.

Earlier, the prosecution counsel, Insp. Ibrahim Gokwat, told the court that the case was reported at the Anglo Jos police station on Dec. 5, 2022 by Insp. Onuh Onoja attached to the guest house.

The prosecutor further told the court that during police investigation, the convict confessed to having committed the act.

The offence, he said, contravened the Penal Code law of Northern Nigeria. (NAN)

Court remands domestic help for stealing diamond ring worth N1.1m

A Dei-Dei Grade I Area Court, Abuja, on Wednesday ordered the remand of a 22-year-old domestic help, Abigail Sunday, who allegedly stole her employer's diamond ring.

The police charged Sunday, a resident of Behind Duru Dawaki, with theft, but she pleaded not guilty.

The judge, Saminu Suleiman, ordered that Sunday be remanded in a correctional centre at Suleja and adjourned the matter until Jan. 20.

Earlier, the prosecutor, Mr Chinedu Ogada, told the court that the complainant, Stephanie Udoju, of Kanebi Avenue Dawaki, reported the matter at the Dawaki Police Station on Jan. 6.

Ogada told the court that on Jan. 3, the complainant noticed that her diamond ring was missing and confronted the defendant who confessed that she took it.

The prosecutor further told the court that during police investigation, the defendant could not give a satisfactory account of the missing ring, valued at N1.1 million.

He said all efforts by the police to recover the ring failed and added that the offence contravened Section 289 of the Penal Code.

After N.4m ransom, abductors of couple at late Jere emir's residence want bike

The abductors of a couple at the residence of the late emir of Jere have demanded a brand new motorcycle after collecting N400,000 ransom before releasing them.

City & Crime had reported that the couple was kidnapped alongside five other people on January 1, 2023, when the bandits invaded the private residence of the late Jere emir, Dr Saad Usman.

The Jere Emirate Council secretary, Malam Ajiyu Zubairu, who disclosed this to our reporter over the phone on Tuesday, said the bandits' leader made the request through relatives of one of

the victims, who took the ransom to them at an agreed location in the area.

He said the bandits' leader gave the condition that only three of the seven victims in their captivity would be freed after getting a brand new motorcycle, while the four other victims would be set free only after N30 million ransom was paid.

"You know, according to information I received, the bandits' leader said they would free only three of the seven victims in their captivity since the three victims were not their target.

"But they collected N400,000 and are also demanding for a new motorcycle before the three victims would be set free," he said.

He said the bandits' leader insisted that the families of the four other victims in their captivity must raise N30 million before they would be set free.

"So, that is the situation we are in now. They are insisting that a brand-new motorcycle has to be given to them before the three other victims would be released.

"In fact, all the kidnapping that has been happening in Jere axis, they have been collecting ransom, including motorcycles," he added.

There was no official comment from the spokesman of the Kaduna State Police Command as of the time of filing this report.

Customs recovers NASS member's jeep snatched at gunpoint in Abuja ... Rakes 187 seizures worth N302.6m in 1yr

The Nigeria Customs Service, North Central Zone, Sector 3, Ilorin, Kwara State, on Monday, said it has recovered a Toyota Land Cruiser jeep belonging to a House of Representatives member from Rivers State, Hon. Chidi Frank Nwiyoka, which was snatched at gunpoint in October last year in Abuja.

The customs said the vehicle, with registration number KUJ 570 MB from Abuja heading to Kaduna, was intercepted after operatives of the Joint Border Patrol Team (JBPT) deployed to Suleja axis in Niger State requested for its documents from its two occupants.

Instead, they disembarked, pretending to be making a call to the owner, and ran into the bush, abandoning the vehicle.

"During a search, operatives found a complimentary card bearing details of a National Assembly member, Chidi Nwiyoka, who later said the vehicle was snatched from his driver at gunpoint under the Gwarinpa axis of Abuja, when contacted.

"Once the customs duty is produced and confirmed to be genuine, the sector will hand over the vehicle to the

police for further investigations and theft clarification," the co-ordinator of JBPT, Olujoboyega Peters, said while briefing journalists on Monday on its activities for last year.

He said the command also recorded 187 seizures with a duty-paid value of N302,590,252.

Peters said items seized during the period under review included four trailer loads of 50kg foreign parboiled rice (2,052 bags), 4,598 litres of PMS, 40 drums of 800 litres of diesel, 28 units of used vehicles, 16 units of motorcycles, 11 kegs of 25 litres vegetable oil, 102 bales of secondhand clothes, and 19 sacks of 2,166 pairs of used shoes.

Others were 427 wraps of Indian

hemp, four packets of 120mg Tramadol (200 pieces each), 90 pieces of used tyres and 39 cartons of tomato paste.

He said most of the inflammable products had been auctioned to the public and the funds remitted to government coffers in line with the extant laws.

Peters said the briefing was his last having been elevated to Assistant Comptroller General of Customs (ACG).

He said the command lost an officer, Saheed Aweda, in October, after operatives were ambushed by hoodlums, adding that three other officers who sustained life-threatening injuries have recovered.

1 killed in Kogi robbery attack

Tension has gripped residents of Akpanya community in Igala Mela/Odolu LGA of Kogi State following the killing of one Peter Abah in a robbery attack.

"Though some people are saying, it was herders' attack. It's a pure robbery incident. His neighbours said he put up a resistance which annoyed the hoodlums and they descended on him with machetes, inflicting him with multiple cuts," he said.

The state Police Public Relations Officer (PPRO), SP William Aya, did not reply to calls and text message sent to him on the incident.

574 vigilantes, hunters graduate in Edo

Police nab 11 over lynching of man mistaken for motorcycle thief in FCT council

The police in the FCT have arrested 11 suspects in connection with the lynching of a man identified as Salihu, by a mob, which mistook him for a motorcycle thief in Anguwar Dodo, Gwagwalada Area Council.

City & Crime reported that a mob last Friday afternoon lynched a man mistaken for a motorcycle thief in Anguwar Dodo after the suspect they were chasing, abandoned the motorcycle and escaped.

A resident of Anguwar Dodo, Shuaibu Yunusa, who spoke with our reporter on Wednesday, said policemen from the area command stormed the area and arrested 11 people in connection with the incident.

He said the police were able to trace some of the suspects through some residents of the area, who witnessed the lynching of the man.

"On that day, when people were hitting the man with all manner of objects, some people around there identified some of them, including some Okada riders," he said.

According to him, some of the suspects were traced and picked up at the tipper garage in the area.

A police source in the area also confirmed the arrest but declined further comment.

The spokeswoman of the FCT police command, DSP Adeb Josephine, is yet to confirm the arrest as at the time of filing the report.

Delta community petitions IGP, seeks fresh investigation on killing of youth

A community in Delta State, Otulu-Ugo, Aniocha South LGA, has petitioned the Inspector General of Police, urging him to re-open investigation into the circumstances that led to the killing of a youth in the community in 2021.

In a petition to the IGP, HRM Francis Medolunwa, the Obi of Otulu-Ugo, said all those involved in the incident that led to the shooting to death of Cletus Okpala should be investigated and brought to book.

HRH Medolunwa alleged that the decision by the police to charge only one suspect in connection to the crime was unsatisfactory to the

community. The monarch in the petition, alleged that "The Otulu-Ugo Community and Ogwashi-Uku Community all in Aniocha South Local Government of Delta State have a traditional dispute with the matter in court of competent jurisdiction in suit No 0/38/2021.

"HRM Obi Ifechukwude Aninshi Okonjo wrote a letter to our community giving us seven days to meet with his community knowing full well that both communities have a matter still pending in court. But before the expiration of the seven days, Obi Ifechukwude Aninshi Okonjo came to our community to perform rituals and also destroyed some

building projects that belong to our community but when the youth fell angry and he tried to caution them, one of the vigilante members shot Cletus Okpala to death, whose corpse presently lay in the mortuary of Specialist Hospital in Asaba."

He faulted the legal department's decision to charge only the man who is suspected to have shot late Cletus Okpala, appealing to the inspector general of police to revisit the legal advice and "possibly assign a neutral person to review and charge all the suspects involved as there is clear evidence before him so that the court can determine whether they committed such act or not."

Kwara: Vigilante, 2 others regain freedom after 19 days in captivity

Three victims of a recent kidnapping in Asa LGA of Kwara State have regained their freedom, after spending 19 days in the den of their abductors.

The trio of Sulaiman Saheed, Abdulmumin Abdulwahab and Uthman Tsaragi (vigilante) were released after their abduction on a poultry farm in Obate area, along Bala community, Asa LGA.

It was gathered that the incident

happened in December 2022, when the kidnapers stormed the farm and whisked away the farm manager, a staff, and the vigilante.

According to a resident of Obate, who simply identified himself as Lukman, "The kidnapers stormed the farm to steal chicken when the vigilante raised the alarm. The manager and other staff then came out, and they were all kidnapped."

He noted further that the vigilante operative was attacked

to the VGN headquarters at Gaa Saka, Oke-fomo area of Ilorin.

When City & Crime visited the VGN headquarters on Sunday, the chairman and Serikin Daji of Ilorin, Alhaji Ibrahim Abdullahi, confirmed the incident, adding that it happened 19 days ago.

"Information got to our office, and we informed the police command; we deployed our operatives to support the police officers in searching for the victims.

"After we got information, we searched for them at Shao, Asa Dam, and Eiyenkorin areas, but found nothing after combing the bush for days.

"The suspects called, and they said they knew that we were looking for them while they were monitoring all our movements and efforts. They demanded N20m ransom.

"Thereafter, they called and gave the phone to our kidnapped operative, Tsaragi, who told us

that they threatened to kill him if any of us searched for him and others again," the VGN chairman noted.

He said the collective effort made later got them released, adding that the victims are currently at a private hospital receiving treatment.

However, a village source told our reporter that N15m was paid to secure the release of the victims, who are still recuperating at the hospital.

Untold story of Nigeria's effort to tackle Out of School Children

The Out-of-School Children (OOSC) phenomenon in Nigeria has generated a lot of reports and counter reports especially on the figure. While the federal government has a figure below 10 million, the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organisation (UNESCO) reports recently put it at 20 million, a figure that has raised concerns among stakeholders.

A report of UNESCO in 2022 said Nigeria now has about 20 million out-of-school children out of the about 200 million population. This is 20 per cent of the entire population and is more than the population of many countries including those in Africa.

The report said there are 244 million children and youth between the ages of six and 18 worldwide who are still out of school and "the region with the second highest out-of-school population is Central and Southern Asia with 85 million." The top three countries with the most children and youth excluded from education are: India, Nigeria and Pakistan.

But the Federal Ministry of Education in an unpublished response tagged, "UNESCO Global Education Monitoring Report 2022 and the Phenomenon of Out-Of-School Children in Nigeria," obtained by Daily Trust, said, "Though UIS has attempted to justify the methods used in arriving at the 20 million figure, the fact remains that this report is capable of misinforming the public, misrepresenting the actual situation of the out-of-school children in Nigeria and underrating the significant efforts made by the government in addressing the OOSC challenge."

While noting that it's the responsibility of states and local governments to provide primary and secondary education in Nigeria, the report said, the federal government has been working closely in partnership to develop the sub-sector generally and address the OOSC challenge.

"The federal government provides financial and technical assistance to the states and local governments as part of its intervention in the delivery of Universal Basic Education (UBE) which covers primary and junior secondary," the report said.

The report explained that the 2018 Nigerian Publishers Association (NPA) study established the number of OOSC, age six – 11 (Primary School-going age), at 10,193,918, regionally distributed as follows: North Central: 1,329,111, North East: 2,001,038, North West: 3,490,671, South East: 713,176, South South: 1,208,183 and South West: 1,451,740.

Similarly, the figure of 6,192,081 was established for age 12– 14 for Junior Secondary School going age.

"The 2018 NPA took cognizance of Nigeria's designated age bracket for universal basic education (primary and junior secondary, age six – 14) and did not extend to the senior secondary cadre (age 15 – 17) and the post-secondary school age of 18, which are both part of the UNESCO's 20 million figure."

The report however said, in the proper context, the 2018 NPA provides an authentic representation of the OOSC population in Nigeria, within the confines of basic education (primary and junior secondary school) as defined by the UBE Act 2004.

Causes of OOSC

According to Dr Aminu Abdu Bichi, in presentation on "Root Causes, Dimensions and Manifestations of the Out-of-School Children Phenomenon in Nigeria" the Economic, demand-side barriers that causes OOSC is poverty, children engaged in labour; residence

location/rural-urban migration, and pursuit for material wealth by youths and limited employment opportunities for school leavers.

He said the socio cultural barriers that are hindering children's access to continuous education include too young to attend school, early marriage, poor perception of western education, lower status accorded the Girl-child in the family and peer pressure.

Nigeria's slow but steady efforts at cutting the out-of-school children rate

Imo state, along with 13 other Nigerian states and the Federal Capital Territory (FCT) witnessed a significant decline in the rate of OOSC to less than 10 per cent within four years, between 2018 and 2021.

This is coming at a time when there are global concerns of children of school age not being in school and exposed to child labour as well as other vices.

The report is according to analysis of data obtained from the Multiple Indicator Cluster Surveys (MICS) by the National Bureau of Statistics (NBS) and the National Personnel Audit (NPA) by the Universal Basic Education Commission (UBEC).

The data was for OOSC at Primary Level by State across the years.

14 states, FCT recorded significant drop

Leading the 15 states that hit a single digit decline in out of school children within four years is Imo as its rate dropped from 17.2% to 0.6% as of 2021. Ekiti dropped from 17% to 2.4%, Lagos which had 19.2% dropped to 2.5%, Bayelsa that had 24.9% of out of school children saw it decline to 2.9%, while Abia dropped its figure from 23.3% to 2.9% between 2018 and 2021.

Three states comprising Cross River, Ebonyi and Akwa Ibom had their out of school children rate dropped to a 3% range from over 20% within the four years while Rivers and Ondo states got 4.3% and 4.5% decline from 34% and 21.8% respectively.

Edo state dropped from 23.6% to 5.1%, Kogi dropped to 6.1% from 24.1%, Delta had its figure declined to 7.2% from 20.4%, and Oyo got 8.3% from 202.2%. FCT-Abuja, the nation's capital, slightly fell into the single digit range with a 9.1% rate in 2021 from a 13.9% out of school children rate in 2018.

7 states' efforts to tackle education challenge

Seven states were said to have some significant efforts in tackling the education deficiency among children. While they had over 20% negative growth trajectory in 2018, the states recorded some decline in the number of out of school children in 2021 dropping to below 20%.

Enugu state led this category as its high OOSC rate dropped from 20.3% to 10.1% followed by Ogun from 26% to 10.3%. Benue dropped from 28.7% to 12.8%; Osun's figure declined from 26.6% to 13%, Plateau's dropped from 33.7% to 17.8%, Kaduna dropped from 21.6% to 18% while Kwara's figure which was at 20.1% dropped to 18.4%.

15 states grapple with high out of school children rate

The analysis further shows that Kebbi and 14 other states have contended with higher percentages of the number of children that are out of school between 2018 and 2021.

Kebbi, which had a 22.3% rate in 2018, shot to 64.8% of children that are not in school by 2021, an over 200% rise that placed the state negatively above all other states during the period.

Zamfara, ravaged by banditry and communal clashes is next among the 22 states with an alarming rate of OOSC at 61.4%, rising from 41.1%.

The third state with negative growth is Bauchi at 60.8% rising from 26.6% four years earlier. There are four states within the 50% range and they are Yobe, Gombe, Sokoto and Borno. These states all had less than 50% OOSC growth rate in 2018.

Jigawa and Niger states were within the 40% growth band recording 43.9% and 40.4%. Jigawa grew negatively from 25.8% while Niger rose from 24.2%. Three other states comprising Katsina, Kano and Adamawa rose from around 22% to between 30% and 33.5% just as three other states – Taraba, Nasarawa and Anambra had negative growths within the 20% growth band.

Efforts of government, partners

The federal government has always received the knock-on issues of OOSC, thus took the various efforts at tackling the menace such as

reinforcing the implementation of the UBE programme in partnership with States towards ensuring that all children of school-going age acquire a minimum of basic education.

According to the federal ministry of Education efforts were stepped up in improving access for vulnerable groups in UBE delivery especially the Almajiri and learners in the Qur'anic schools, saying, this has provided access for over 2,292,439 learners in basic education predominantly in the Northern States.

Also the implementation of the Better Education Service Delivery for All (BESDA) with a view to reducing the number of OOSC using both formal and non-formal approaches in the 17 States with the highest number of OOSC in the country.

"The target of 3 million children set in 2019 to be brought into school through the BESDA programme has been surpassed. Between 2019 and 2022, there were a total of 5,076,830 learners in the non-formal centres made up of 1,600,123 in cohort 1 (2019/2020) and 3,476,707 in cohort 2 (2022), as verified and confirmed by the National Bureau of Statistics (NBS)."

Despite all efforts challenges persists

A document obtained from Universal Basic Education Commission (UBEC), tagged : "Addressing the Challenges of Out-of-school Children phenomenon in Nigeria: Efforts and Lessons Learned" said despite recent improvements and persistent efforts of the Federal Government, the challenge of OOSC still poses one of the most significant areas of concern affecting Nigeria's educational development.

The paper said 1 in 5 of the world's OOSC is in Nigeria – approximately 10.2 million children in Nigeria who are OOS at the primary level and another 8.1 million who are OOS at the junior secondary level, accounts for 15% of the total number of OOSC globally.

One in three children is OOS in Nigeria, with 12.4 million having never attended and 5.9 million having left school early.

66% of all OOSC are in the northeast and northwest, 86 percent are from rural areas, and 65% are from the poorest socio-economic quintile.

More than 50% of girls are not attending school at the basic education level, and only 1 in 3 adolescents eligible for senior secondary education are attending.

UBEC's position

UBEC which is central to ensuring that children attend school in Nigeria, has said with Nigeria's commitment to provide equal access to free, universal, and quality basic education to all children of primary and junior secondary school age, the number of students in primary education increased by 45%, and in JSS, student enrolment tripled between 2000 and 2018.

"GER in primary education improved from 85.1 in 2010 to 87.5 in 2018. School Net Attendance Rates improved from 64% in 2007 to 68% in 2021. The primary OOSC rate declined from 37 percent to 32 percent between 2018 and 2021," the paper said.

Expert speaks

An Educationist, Michael Ojonugwa, said the issue of OOSC can be addressed if government pushes so hard to ensure that parents and local government authority faces penalty if they failed to send their wards to school, this of course is after government has made the necessary provisions in terms of infrastructure, good environment and learning materials.

"If children have a good learning environment, I believe many will not want to be on the street to hawk. And if a law that bans children from being at home or street during school hours are enacted and religiously implemented, I believe the OOSC menace will be history," he said.

He also noted that having relevant data and evidence of what is being done will help in addressing the discrepancy in the figure being given out by different organisations.

NEDC signs MoU with North East universities for scholarships, research projects

As the North East development Commission continues to seek to carve a path to normality is restored in the region through intervention in developmental projects, the commission has entered into agreement with six universities to produce top-notch researches on ways lingering issues militating socio-economic activities will be tackled.

The agreement which is enabled through the Multi Sectoral Recovery Project – Additional Financing (MCRP AF) had over 30 participants from the six universities consisting of Vice Chancellors, Head of Departments and researchers in the region brainstormed on various research topics to be carried out during 2-day workshop.

The participating schools which are based in the Borno, Adamawa and Yobe (BAY) states include; Modibbo Adamawa University, Yola, Federal University Gashua, Yobe (FUGASHUA), University of Maiduguri (UNIMAD), Borno State University, Maiduguri (BOSU), Adamawa State University Mubi (ADSU), Yobe State University, Damaturu (YSU).

The project is being facilitated by the North East Recovery and Stability Program (NERSP).

The Federal Coordinator of the programme, Muhammad Danjuma stated that the programme would fund research on five thematic areas of agriculture, climate change mitigation, regional planning, peace building and social cohesion.

Danjuma noted that apart from the research to be carried out by renowned scholars in the schools, 90 postgraduate students would be sponsored to also conduct researches in the areas identified.

He stated that these would involve 30 PhDs and 60 masters students with a \$700,000 (N316m) research grant to identify solutions to the recovery process of the region.

He added that the project is a \$376m World Bank loan that the federal government took to resuscitate socioeconomic activities in the three states and given as a grant to respond to the needs across the three states as well as implemented up until 2024.

“The grant will also support higher institutions with very critical equipment that will further aid in research capabilities in those universities, making provision of things like laboratory equipment and other resources that are needed to aid research in those institutions.”

He stated that through the project, the commission has been able to provide over 350 hospitals, primary and tertiary secondary hospitals, rehabilitate over 300 classrooms as well as hundreds of kilometres of roads.

He said the research that

emanated from the project would quickly be implemented to further the development of the Northeast as it is in response to the devastation of the insurgency.

He added that the commission has been able to disburse almost 100 percent of the original financing of the MCRP and implementation has been in top gear.

“Not just the numbers in terms of how much we have disbursed but we are engage in the practical walk on ground with over 350 hospitals, primary and tertiary secondary hospitals rehabilitated over 300 classrooms and classroom blocks built as well as hundreds of kilometres of roads with the Mubi- Baza road was rehabilitated, which is a 34 kilometer road in Adamawa was rehabilitated under this project. The Lokwa bridge in Mubi was rehabilitated under this project. And of course, Maiduguri Bama Road which is 50% Completion now it's been rehabilitated under this project, as well as the Gujba/Ngalda road that has already been implemented. So, the project is making a huge impact in the North East and I am very optimistic about the outcome. Especially after the implementation of the second phase.”

Speaking on the MoU the Vice Chancellor of the University of Maiduguri, Prof. Aliyu Shugaba, said the agreement is to collaborate with the commission to help provide solutions to some issues that emanated after the Boko Haram insurgency.

He added that the MoU would help to revive the region as with another agreement signed with the Lake Chad Basin on ways the academia would be a strong support.

“The researchers will look at problems within the area and we have suffered a great

devastation in the region during the more than a decade of insurgency. We are trying to look at what are the things that led to the crises and how it impacted and devastated the sub region and how do we prevent them. Whatever the researchers will come up with will lead to the development in the region and what will be the way to sustain such development.”

On the utilization of the research from the project, he said “The outcome of the research that will be conducted by these academics will be looked at viz a viz bringing about a recovery process and how we sustain it. We have already told them that this is not research they will do and keep on their shelves or publish it for the purpose of promotion but the purpose of development. In this case, we are saying that they are generating knowledge but it is not knowledge that will be without application as they will be applied to solve the problems that exist within the

One of the participants from the Yobe State University, Dr. Ibrahim Muhammad, said the research carried by his team is to look at the value chain of agricultural products to study the chemicals used for planting and storage.

He stated that the research was chosen due to high cases of kidney problems in the region.

FEC approves N1.9trn for NNPC to build 44 roads

●N2.29bn for assemblage of training aircraft, N1.35bn for 31 Ogoni cleanup project vehicles

The Federal Executive Council yesterday approved the recommendation by the Ministry of Works and Housing for the Nigerian National Petroleum Corporation Limited (NNPC Ltd) and its subsidiaries to invest the sum of N1.9trn for the reconstruction of 44 selected federal roads across the country.

The Senior Special Assistant to the President on Media and Publicity in the Office of the Vice President, Laolu Akande, announced this Wednesday after the FEC meeting presided over by Vice President Yemi Osinbajo.

Akande said the expected expenditure was in furtherance of the Federal Government's Road

Infrastructure Development and Refurbishment Investment Tax Credit Policy, phase two by the NNPC Ltd and its subsidiaries.

He said the council also approved concessionaires for nine road corridors under the pilot phase of the Value Added Concession of the highways development and management initiative following the issuance of the requisite full business case compliance certificates by the Infrastructure Concession Regulatory Commission for a period of 25 years.

The road corridors approved for the first phase were the Benin-Asaba corridor, Abuja-Lokoja-Onitsha-Owerri-Abba-Shagamu-to Benin, Abuja-Keffi-Akwanga-Lafia-Makurdi, Kano-Maiduguri, that is the Kano Shauri, Enugu-Port

Harcourt, Lagos-Ota-Abeokuta, and Lagos-Badagry-Seme.

Akande said the FEC also approved the augmentation of contract for the rehabilitation of the Oshogbo-Ilesha Road in favour of Messers Orizon construction company in the sum of N1.2bn, thereby revising the subsisting contract sum from N3bn to N4bn, representing an increase of 33% of the original sum.

The Minister of Aviation, Hadi Sirika, said the FEC approved N2,296,897,404 for the local assemblage of Magnus Centennial Aircraft and Stimulator in Zaria, Kaduna State.

He said the local assemblage of Magnus training aircraft in the country was expected within the next 18 months,

stating that two of such aircraft should ready before the end of the present administration in May this year.

Sirika assured that in not too distant future, Nigeria would commence manufacturing of aircrafts.

According to him, the manufacturer of the airplane is based in Hungary and has local company called Ingenious to be done in Zaria.

He said his ministry presented two memoranda bordering on the local assemblage of Magnus aircraft and review of the cost of Instrument Landing System (ILS) in three airports by additional N546,109,336.33 with 7.5 percent VAT.

The minister said the FEC also approved the memorandum that revised the estimated

total cost and augmentation of contract for procurement and installation of Instrument Landing System (ILS) at Port Harcourt International Airport, Kano International Airport, and Katsina Airport.

He said the contract, awarded earlier, had to be reviewed due to fluctuations in foreign exchange.

The Minister of Environment, Mohammed Abdullahi, said the council approved N1,354,016,250 for the procurement of 31 project vehicles for the hydrocarbon pollution remediation projects in Ogoni land of Rivers State.

He said the vehicles of various brands would be deployed for the monitoring of power and remediation projects in some polluted areas.

Freitas, listed as the number two seed in the Men's singles behind Brazil's Hugo Calderano-winner of the WTT Contender Durban, began his contest against Quadri with a defeat but won the three other sets to secure a spot in the round of 16.

The Portuguese will battle against Chinese's tennis star Zhou Qihao today.

The match between Freitas and Quadri, a semifinalist at the Star Contender Doha 2022 during the ongoing WTT Contender in Doha made it the third time the duo had played each other.

In their first encounter, Freitas won against the Nigerian star 4-2 at the Hong Kong Open in 2018 while the latter defeated the former 4-0 at the Swedish Open in 2018 as well.

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The *kaiya-kaiya* of *kayan lefe*: The bane of bachelors

It is tough to be a bachelor these days in Arewa. The economic downturn aside, the lack of opportunities and the rising inflation have meant that everything else has gone up, including an essential requirement for marriage—*kayan lefe*.

There has been some significant chatter about *kayan lefe*—which in essence is the bridal gifts (we are using gift here very liberally since it is a cultural requirement) that the groom must present to the bride to secure a marriage.

These gifts are often of expensive clothes—laces, fabrics, underwear, cosmetics and jewellery—stacked in an impressive range of a full set of suitcases, sometimes twice that, and delivered with pomp to the bride's family. It has always been a tradition for the bride's family to display the wares in these suitcases and invite friends and neighbours to admire the gifts that the potential bride had fetched. Of course, these displays are often ostentatious but also serve a social function.

Since, according to the norms, a child is raised by the community, each member of that community, especially relatives and neighbours, is invited to the viewing in acknowledgement of the roles they played in raising the girl into a woman and to offer prayers for her.

Inevitably, this also presents cynics a chance to criticise the quality or quantity of the gift, or to compare it with what another bride got. No matter the length the groom goes to, there will always be that person or persons who have made it their business to find fault. So often, the groom goes out of the way to impress not only his bride but all of her relatives and friends. There is also always that person who would want to pilfer a bra, a pantie or a bale of cloth if they get the chance. The practices around this viewing are rather fascinating.

Over the years, these practices have changed as much as the concept of *kayan lefe* itself has evolved from the modest beginning from which it derived its name when a few bale of clothes and some trinkets were collected in a special basket (*lefe*) and delivered to the bride's family, to the generation when it became the norm to put them in *kwalla* (a cylindrical metal containers) to the days of pantimoti and finally now, the age of the set(s) of suitcases.

The cost of putting these things together has gone up so much that it

has prompted questions about why it is necessary for a wedding and critiques about how ambitious potential brides and their families have become to make such exorbitant demands and what should be the average cost.

In a trending video online, a woman categorically declared that for an average wedding today, the *kayan lefe* should be assembled for between four and six million naira. "Ba yabo, ba fallasa," she had said as if talking about the price of bread.

My God was I shocked! Has it come to this? It made me think of the many bachelors who are in love but are afraid to propose marriage because the fear of *kayan lefe* is the beginning of the 'head over heart' philosophy.

The reality is that marriage, like everything else, is becoming expensive and the cost of *kayan lefe* is both a reflection of contemporary reality and inflation.

While earnings have shrunken for a good number of people, they have increased for others. The one thing that has impacted every class of Nigerian is the fall in the value of the naira, which has affected the prices of even tomatoes in the market, not to talk of the abayas that go into the suitcase.

But where did this practice come from and why are these expensive set of gifts necessary in the first place especially when one considers that this demand is often made of young people who are trying to start a family?

For some, the cost is not an issue. But not many people can afford to spend four to six million naira on *lefe* alone if they have ever had that much money in the entirety of their lives. Of course, some spend far less but you won't see their *kayan lefe* showcased on Instagram or Tik Tok for sure and that is just fine. Each according to his means.

The origins of *lefe* may derive from the Islamic tradition that asks, not demands or imposes, that the man should present a gift of fine things according to his means to his bride. It is not one of the cardinal requirements of marriage from a religious perspective, it is a cultural one.

While thinking about this, there is another consideration. In the typical northern tradition, while *kayan lefe* is required of the groom, the requirement on the bride or her family tends to be a lot. The groom is expected to provide an apartment and the bride and her family are expected to provide the furnishing

down to broom and packer. In addition, there is the *kayan gara*, or food stock to last the newlyweds a good few months.

Some years back, while walking down the street with a friend, we met Dan Kurma, who had gotten married the weekend before. Yet, there he was walking with a storm on his face. With little prompting, in a flurry of mumbled words and furious hand gestures, he expressed his disappointment in the quality and cost of what his bride had brought into the marriage. The furniture was cheap, he said. The *kayan gara* was deplorable and he had paid a premium bride price for an average joe. "Wallahi I will not take it," he raved.

Shocked as he was, he persuaded him to calm down and go build his home to his liking.

The conversation around *lefe* has often ignored the demands placed on the bride. As much as it has often ignored the fact that when marriages unfortunately end in the North, often with the man proclaiming *talaq* on the wife, she leaves with no support. It doesn't matter if she put in 20 or 30 years into the marriage raising children, doing chores and keeping house while the husband made the money.

A few years ago, then Emir Sanusi II raised the conversation for marriage reforms in the North to mandate husbands to provide financial support or some sort of alimony for their divorced wives. He was heckled rather wildly.

The concept of alimony however is not entirely strange to Islam. The Qur'an for instance says: "Divorced women shall also have such maintenance as is considered fair: this is a duty for those who are mindful of God." [Al-Baqarah, 241]

The interpretation of this verse according to the various schools of jurisprudence varies as to the length of this support and to what kind of divorcee is entitled to it but the generality agrees that a divorcee is entitled to some kind of support for at least some time, depending on the nature and circumstances of the divorce.

However, the social structures of the North have rather loose provisions to protect women in divorces. So, while we consider the demands for exorbitant *lefe* and condemn it for its exuberance, we should also consider it paradoxically with what the woman is expected to bring to the marriage and what she leaves with when it ends.

I don't necessarily think it is ideal to impose excessive demands on both the bride and the groom, especially where the means are in short supply. Young people starting out together should be able to grow together. Marital unions should be built on love and understanding, not material demands.

Perhaps, something in the marriage culture needs to change because a society that makes it impossible for young people to cohabit the right way opens the door for its own perversion.

Injured Nadal makes early exit, Gauff edges Raducanu

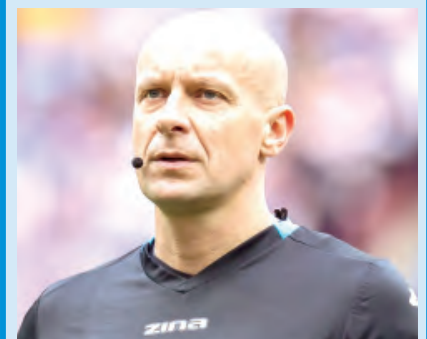
Defending champion Rafael Nadal hobbled out of the second round in a huge upset at the Australian Open on Wednesday, as Coco Gauff beat Emma Raducanu in a battle of the rising stars.

Nadal's wife Mery was in tears as the injury-hampered Spanish great lost to 65th-ranked Mackenzie McDonald at Rod Laver Arena, where the roof was closed because of more rain in Melbourne.

The 36-year-old Nadal was clearly hindered by a hip issue that required a medical timeout, as he went down 6-4, 6-4, 7-5 to the American.

Meanwhile, 18-year-old American Gauff, seen as the heir to now-retired Serena Williams, defeated former US Open champion Raducanu 6-3, 7-6 (7/4).

Referees to explain VAR decisions to stadium, TV audiences

Referees will explain VAR decisions to stadium crowds and television audiences in a 12-month trial starting at next month's FIFA Club World Cup in Morocco, soccer's law-making body said on Wednesday.

IFAB said in a statement after a meeting at London's Wembley Stadium that it discussed clarifications relating to the laws of the game, including the guidelines on 'deliberate play' in offside situations.

English Football Association (FA) chief executive Mark Bullingham, who chaired the meeting, told reporters conversations between the referee and the VAR official would remain private.

Referees would however have a microphone to explain the outcome.
