## REPORT OF THE MANPOWER SURVEY 1968

### Introduction

A manpower survey was carried out in 1968 by the National Manpower Board in collaboration with the Federal and State Departments of Statistics. The purpose of the survey was two-fold.

- (1) To identify manpower shortages and surpluses in various occupational grades in both the private and the public sectors.
- (2) To obtain quantitative basis for assessing the capacity utilisation in educational institutions and training facilities both in governmental and non-governmental sectors.

The survey was the most recent in the series of similar surveys conducted by the National Manpower Board with the co-operation of State Statistical Agencies. In a country where the supply of skilled high level manpower constitutes a bottleneck to a rapid growth of development, it is important to avoid situations where surpluses of skilled labour exists in certain sectors of the economy while shortages occur in other sectors of the economy. Surveys of this type assist in bringing to public view such situations whenever they occur so that those who formulate programmes for the effective utilisation of manpower resources will be guided by its findings.

The questionnaires used were designed by the National Manpower Board. The statistics Division of the Ministry of Economic Planning and Social Development organised the field collection of data, the tabulation, analysis and the publication. The project was jointly financed by the National Manpower Board and the State Government.

The survey covered three types of respondents:

- (1) Commercial and industrial establishments employing five persons and above
- (2) Educational institutions; and
- (3) Training institutions.

Three types of educational institutions were contacted. They were the primary school, the secondary modern and the secondary grammar schools. The survey also covers training institutions in both the public and the private sectors. These are comprised of training institutions outside the formal educational system, *e.g.*, driving schools, school of agriculture, schools of nursing and midwifery, typing and stenographic training institutes and so on.

### Methodology

Because so many establishments were to be covered in the survey, to minimise costs, it was decided that the postal questionnaire method should be used. This was, of course, later supplemented with personal visits to some of the defaulting establishments.

The questionnaires used were of three different kinds. The first one sought for information on the manpower shortages and surpluses in establishments employing five or more persons. The second form was used in collecting information from training institutions in the public and private sectors while the third one surveys educational institutions. Specimen copy of these forms are in Appendix I.

The edited questionnaires received from the respondents were analysed and tabulated. The various tables are contained in the body of this report.

## Reference Period

Information collected during the survey related to the position as it was on 30th September, 1968.

## Definition of terms used in the survey

### (a) Establishment

An establishment was defined as an organisation such as an office, workshop, school, hospital, retail store, shop, factory and so on located in a single geographical unit and engaged in one main line of activity, e.g. administration, repairs, education, medical service and so on.

### (b) Occupational Category

Five major occupational groupings were used in the survey. They were the senior category, the intermediate, clerical, skilled, semi-skilled and a residual group consisting largely of unskilled labourers. Other important terms used and their definitions are contained in the questionnaires at the Appendix.

## Results of the Survey

The tabulated summary of the results of the survey is as follows:

It would be observed that the level of response from the training institutions, the commercial and industrial establishments was rather low; for instance, reports were received from only 20 per cent of the institutions contacted while 30.6 per cent of the industrial and commercial establishments covered by the survey responded. The level of response from educational institutions was fairly satisfactory. Some of the reasons for the low level of response from training institutions and business establishments are as follows:

- (1) The traditional fear that all government enquiries might be connected with taxation.
- (2) Some of the establishments were out of production but had not had their names struck off the register of firms kept by the Federal Ministry of Commerce.
- (3) General apathy towards completing questionnaires most especially when the filling of these questionnaires will add additional cost to the operations of the business enterprise.

## Findings of the Survey

Tables I to IV show the number of vacancies reported by establishments in both the private and public sectors. The analysis shows that most of the vacancies existing on the reference date were in the services sector. In the senior category, for instance, the services sector accounted for 89.9 per cent of the reported vacancies. In the intermediate category, the same sector accounted for 87.7 per cent of all vacancies reported while in the clerical, skilled and semi-skilled categories, the services sector accounted for 74.3 per cent and 63.7 per cent respectively of the total number of vacancies reported. The private sector which appeared to have been hard hit by the strains and stresses of the civil war accounted for only one out of the 2,530 vacancies reported.

Two major reasons were given for the occurrence of these vacancies. The most important reason was that qualified State indigenes were lacking. Next to this was inappropriate salary structure. No surplus or over-establishment was reported except for the residual or unskilled category where seventy-two surpluses occurred side by side with 406 vacancies.

### Difficulties encountered in the recruitment of teachers in educational institutions:

Tables 68, 69, 85 and 86 show the analysis of difficulties encountered in recruitment of teachers in reporting educational institutions.

Because of its rather unrealistic nature, no attempt was made to analyse teacher-recruitment difficulties relating to primary schools.

In post-primary schools, 'lack of qualified Nigerian personnel' was reported as a major recruitment difficulty. Another difficulty of almost equal importance was 'inappropriate salary structure'. To a lesser degree, location of some of the rural schools made recruitment of teachers difficult.

### Difficulties encountered in getting maximum possible enrolment in educational institutions:

Data on causes of under-enrolment in schools are presented in Tables 23, 58 and 77. The difference between maximum possible enrolment and actual enrolment in reporting 2,776 schools out of the 4,000 primary schools in the State was 192,031. The 1968 actual enrolment in these reporting schools was 503,921 as compared with 715,429 for all primary schools.

Reported enrolment difficulties, in order of importance, were:

- (i) Lack of 'qualified/suitable' candidates—41.9 per cent
- (ii) Lack of 'equipment/accommodation'—2.3 per cent
- (iii) Shortage of staff—10.8 per cent
- (iv) 'Others' 20.3 per cent.

Major causes of under-enrolment in secondary modern and secondary grammar schools, in order of importance, were:

- (i) inability to pay fees
- (ii) unavailability of 'qualified/suitable' candidates
- (iii) lack of equipment/accommodation—and
- (iv) shortage of staff

### **A study of training facilities in the private and public sectors**

Data received from training institutions were not analysed because of the very low response and inaccuracies of the returns.

#### **Limitations of the data**

Figures in the tables relate to reporting establishments and educational institutions. No adjustments were made for non-response.

1. **State of Location**

2. **Name of Establishment**

  - (c) *Private* includes all establishments owned and managed by firms or individuals and do not belong to either the government or corporation.
6. **Nature of Business Activity**  
Please state the main business or activity of the establishment. For example a vehicle repair workshop normally has an office, but the whole installation should be treated as one establishment, engaged in the repair of vehicles. Manufacturing establishments should quote their principal or end-product. Code—The column should be left blank.
  9. (2) **Occupational Category**—The occupations are divided into the Senior, Intermediate, Clerical, Skilled/Semi-Skilled and Residual categories.
    9. (2)(i) **Senior Category (SC)**—This includes all persons who are normally required to hold a university degree, high technical or professional qualification. Persons promoted into occupations in this category on the basis of *experience* should be regarded as belonging to this category even if they do not possess the academic, or professional qualifications. Examples of occupations that come under this category are Directors, Managers, Administrative Officers, Engineers, Accountants, Education Officers, Agricultural Officers, Doctors, Research Officers, Lawyers, Statisticians, etc. Those that qualify to be in this group should not earn less than £730 per annum.
    9. (2)(ii) **Intermediate Category (INT.)**—Persons in this category are normally required to have at least one to two years' specialist training after obtaining the West African School Certificate or its equivalent. Persons can also be promoted into this category on the basis of experience even if they do not possess the basic educational and professional training. Persons in this category generally come under the supervision of Senior Officers. Examples of the occupations that come under this category are Nurses, Engineering Assistants, Executive Officers, Secretary Typists, Stenographers, Assistant Managers, Accounting Assistants, Foremen and Supervisors, Sales Representatives, Laboratory Technicians, Assistant Surveyors, etc.
    9. (2)(iii) **Clerical Category (CL)**—Those in this group compile and maintain records of financial transactions and other business (Office) activities, handle cash, record oral or written matter by shorthand writing and typing, operate various kinds of office machines and perform other clerical duties.  
In Government and Public Corporations, it includes all officers in the clerical and sub-clerical grades. Examples are Accounting Clerks, Typists and stenographers and clerical grades in Governments, in Business, Industry and Commerce, all workers dealing with correspondence, cash and office machine operations are included.
    9. (2)(iv) **Skilled/Semi-Skilled Category (SK)**—Those in this group have had apprenticeship or craftsman training in an instruction or appropriate practical experience. They work with tools and on materials such as metal, wood, leather and fibre. They include tailors, fitters, carpenters, plumbers, electricians, mechanic-repairmen, welders and flame cutters, etc.
    9. (2)(v) **Residual Category (RES.)**—This group includes all those whose duties call for no previous experience or training. They normally perform simple and routine tasks involving principally physical effort; e.g. Labourers, cleaners, watchmen, attendants, messengers, etc.
  9. (3) **Full Complement of Establishment as at 30-9-68**—This is the approved establishment irrespective of whether or not all the posts are filled.
  9. (4) (i) (ii) (7) and (8) **Actual Number of Employees as at 30-9-68**—This should be the total number of persons actually employed, and should be sub-divided into:
    - Nigerians**
      9. (4)(i) (ii) (7) **State Indigenes (4)** These are persons who belong by birth to the particular State in which they are working as of the survey date 30-9-68.
      - Other Nigerians (5)**—Nigerians working in States other than their State of birth or origin.
      - Non-Nigerians (6) and (7)**—Persons who are not Nigerians either by birth or naturalization.
    9. (4) (ii) (8) **Vacancies—Posts which are not filled**—This should be the difference between 'Full Complement' Col. (3) and 'Actual Number of Employees'—Total Col. (8). Thus Column (3)—Column (8)=Column (9).
    9. (10) **Surplus or Over-Establishment**—This should be the excess of employees over and above the approved 'Full Complement of Establishment' i.e. Col. (8)—Col. (3)—Col. (10). In case there is no surplus, this column should have a nil return.
    9. (11) (12) **Additional Requirement to Approved Establishment**—This should be the additional employees that would be needed even if all the vacancies were filled. The 6 months duration Column (11) represents the very immediate pressing needs during the present financial year of the Government or the Business Establishment. In Column (12) the 6—12 months period represents additional that could be taken care of during the next financial year.
    9. (13) & (14) **Number on in-service training, etc.**—This should include all serving members of staff who are undertaking 'In-Service' or other Training Courses and those on 'Study Leave' and are expected to return to the Establishment or Ministry on the completion of their courses either in the short space of 6 months Column (13), or the longer period 6 months to 2 years Column (14).

10. **In What Occupational Groups has your establishment experienced considerable difficulties in filling vacancies?**  
In answering this question, the specific or individual occupations should be mentioned in the space provided, for example Doctors, Surveyors, Forest Officers, Administrative Officers, etc.
11. **Recruitment Difficulties**
